  - "Builder"—Any builder, contractor, painter, or person engaged in the erection of any "building" within the meaning of these By-laws.
  - "Townsite"—Any townsite situated within the Mount Marshall Road District.
  - "Footpath" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of pedestrians, and whether the footpath be made or kerbed or otherwise.
  - "Chairman" The Chairman of the Mount Marshall Road Board.
  - "Secretary"-The Secretary of the Mount Marshall Road Board.
- No owner or builder within the meaning of these By-laws shall erect any building upon any land in any townsite within the District, unless he first submits to the Board a copy of the plans and specifications of the building to be erected, and setting out clearly the number of buildings proposed to be built on each particular townsite lot or parcel of land, the measurements, materials of construction, and use for which the building is intended.
- 3. No building shall be commenced unless a copy of the plans and specifications shall have been laid before and approved by the Board, and such copy of the plans and specifications shall receive approval by endorsement set thereto by the hands of the Chairman and Secretary.
- 4. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which have not, by reason of inflammable material proposed to be used or other reason, proper regard for the safety of persons or other buildings in the event of fire.
- 5. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which, in the opinion of the Board, do not bear proper consideration of size or design of construction or architecture to the adjacent buildings.
- 6. No builder or owner shall open up any road or footpath which by reason of building operations is found necessary, unless he first obtains a permit from the Board, and such openings shall be covered or railed and provided with lights to ensure safety to the general public using the road or footpath.
- 7. Every builder or owner shall, within reasonable time from the completion of any building, fill in and repair to the satisfaction of the Board's authorised inspecting officer all openings on any road or footpath which, by reason of building operations, it has been found necessary to open.
- 8. No verandah shall be erected over any footpath unless it is eight feet in height from the footpath, and if supporting posts be used these shall be placed eleven feet from the building line to the outside of the posts, and as close to the kerbing as the Board may direct to conform with the footpath width of eleven feet.

9. Any person who does any act contrary to, or neglects or omits to do any act required to be done within the meaning of these By-laws, shall incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty-five pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Twenty shillings for each day the offence continues.

WHEREAS by Section 295 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws; and whereas Model By-laws (Series A) have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1914: Therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Toodyay Road Board, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, to adopt Model By-laws (Series A) with the exception of By-laws 34, 35, and 36; and whereas it is further resolved and determined to make the following By-laws to stand as follows:—

#### Stables.

By-law 34.—The occupier of any premises whereon a horse is kept shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) No horse shall be kept at any less distance than 20 feet of any dwelling-house, nor less than 50 feet from the milking-shed or milk-room of any dairy.
- (b) There shall be provided a receptacle for manure, constructed of approved material; it shall be provided with a tight-fitting cover, and shall be emptied at least once weekly.
- (c) All manure produced on the premises shall be collected daily and placed in the receptacle for manure.
- (d) Any stable or enclosure in which a horse is kept shall be maintained in a cleanly condition, and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an inspector.

By-law 35.—No stable shall be erected unless and until plans, specifications, and the site of the proposed stable have been approved of in writing by the Medical Officer.

And to renumber By-laws 37 to 56 inclusive of Part 1 of the Model By-laws ("Series A"), to read 36 to 55 inclusive.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Western Australia-North-West Coast.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that owing to the Middle Ground in Hare Channel, Cambridge Gulf (Wyndham), having shifted in a Westerly direction, two port hand broys have been placed in this locality. The one near Pender Point bears 193deg, from Pender Point and 48deg, from Laffan Point, and the other near Laffan Point bears 206deg, from Pender Point and 100deg, from Laffan Point. Both buoys are steel, painted black, and fixed in 27ft. of water.

A new plan of the soundings recently taken in Hare Channel is being prepared for publication.

Masters of vessels approaching Wyndham when rounding Pender Point should steer for Laffan Point, keeping beacons slightly open to the Southward, and passing Pender Point buoy leaving the buoy on the ship's own port hand. When Hare Channel beacons come into line, steer down Hare Channel with these slightly open to the Westward, passing the Laffan Point buoy leaving the buoy on the ship's own port hand, when the depth of water should be not less than 27ft. L.W.O.S.T.

Owing to the Middle Ground Bank extending across Hare Channel beacons to the extent of 200 yards to the Northward and 600 yards to the Southward of Laffan Point buoy, the Western edge of Hare Channel is now about 1,200ft. to the Westward of the line of Hare Channel beacons.
