WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities, to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a Reserve for Native Game, or any particular Native Game: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus Gigantus*.

The Proclamations dated the 24th June, 1913; 4th January, 1917; and 7th January, 1920, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of 27th June, 1913; 5th January, 1917, and 9th January, 1920, respectively, are hereby revoked.

Schedule.

All that portion of the State bounded on the Northward by a line commencing at North Point, on the West Coast, and extending East to a point North of the Kellerberrin Post Office; thence South to intersect a South-Easterly line extending from Mount Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River; thence following said line to a point West of Mount Madden; thence East (passing through Mount Madden) to the 123rd meridian of East Longitude; thence North along said meridian to a North boundary of the Eucla Division; thence East along said boundary to a West boundary of division aforesaid; thence North along the latter boundary to a point situate 12 miles North of the Trans-Australian Railway; thence East to the Eastern boundary of the State.

Bounded on the East by part of the Eastern boundary of the State; from the last-mentioned point to the Sea-coast.

Bounded on the Southward and Westward by the Southern and part of the Western Sea-coasts to the starting point.

James Bell, Cecil Thomas, and Reginald Court Harrison, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

Redivision into Wards and increase of Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 145/22.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, redivide a District into Wards and may, from time to time, declare and determine the number of members constituting a Road Board; and whereas it is desirable to redivide the Mullewa Road District into Wards and increase the number of members of the Board from seven to nine: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1.) Redivide the Mullewa Road District into five Wards, with the names and boundaries as described in Schedule "A" hereto.
- (2.) Declare and determine that the number of members constituting the Mullewa Road Board shall be nine in lieu of seven as heretofore, and shall be allocated as shown in Schedule "B" hereto.

MULLEWA ROAD DISTRICT.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

Central Ward.—Bounded on the Westward and Northward by lines commencing on the Eastern side of Forrest Road at the South-West corner of Mullewa Sub. Lot 20, and extending Northward along said side of the road to the prolongation South-Eastward of the South-Western boundary of Sub. Lot 26; thence along said prolongation and South-Western boundary to the West corner of Lot 26 aforesaid; thence North-Westward to the South-East corner of Mullewa A.A. On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner and extending Westward along the South boundaries of Lots 6, 5 and 4, part of the West boundary of Lot 8, the North boundary of Lot 1 and its prolongation Westward to the starting point.

North Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the District boundary from the intersection of the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 250/93 with the left bank of the Murchison River to a South-West corner of Pastoral Lease 2232/96; thence along an East, a North, a West, a North, a West, a North, the Westernmost and part of a Southern boundary of Pastoral Lease 272/94, the East boundary of Reserve 413, part of the North and an East boundary of and through Victoria Location 7238, the East boundaries of Locations 7066, 7064 and 7065, part of the North and the West boundary of Location 7165, part of the North, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 5489, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 4826, the East boundaries of Locations 4866, 4599 and 4865, South-Eastern boundaries of Locations 4865 and 3811, the South-Eastern boundaries of and along the North-Western side of a surveyed road through Location 7348, the South-Eastern and Southern boundaries of Location 3402 to the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward, and along part of the Eastern, the Northern and part of the Western boundary of the Central Ward to the South-East corner of Mullewa A.A. Lot 22;

thence along the South-Eastern boundaries of the said lot and the North-Western and Northern boundaries of Lots 41, 19, Locations 2314, 6469, 3459, 3460, 2440, 2448, and along the South-East side of the Railway Reserve through Locations 2447, 2446, 2445, and along the North-West boundary of Location 6918 to its Western corner.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said Western corner and extending Northward along an East, a South, an East and part of the North boundary of Location 5638, the West boundary of Location 6884 and its prolongation North to the South boundary of Location 4411, and along part of the South, the Westernmost, a North and a West boundary of Location 4411, the West boundary of Location 4410, part of the South, the West and part of the North boundary of Location 3970, the West and part of the North boundary of Location 7257 to the left bank of the Woodcarrung River and along same to the Eastern corner of Location 7606, the South and West boundaries of said Location 7606, part of the South boundary of Location 5178, the South and East boundary of Location 4612, part of the South and East boundary of Location 4607, part of the Northern boundary of Location 4606, the West boundaries of Pastoral Leases 3602/93 and 2705/93 to the District boundary, and along same to the starting point.

East Ward.—Bounded on the Westward by lines commencing at the intersection of the District boundary with an Eastern boundary of Location 7599 and extending Northward along part of said Eastern boundary, continuing along the Western side of the Mullewa-Wongan Hills Road through Locations 4222 and 7599, along North-Eastern boundaries of Reserve 14686 and Location 7476 and 6041 through Locations 3037 and 3035 to the South-East corner of Location 1303 and along its East and North boundaries and again along the Western side of the Mullewa-Wongan Hills Road through Location 3035 and Reserve 18266, along Northern boundaries of Locations 4225 and 6040, North-Eastern boundaries of Locations 6032 and 6013, through Reserve 16934 along Eastern boundaries of Locations 6547, 6018, 6008, 6193, 5739, 7520, and 5736, through Wilroy Townsite along the North-Eastern boundary of Location 6786, through Location 5732 along the North boundary of Location 4386 and part of the North boundary of Location 4387, East boundaries of Locations 3989, 3736, 3737, 3988, 3987, 3836 and 7348; thence by the East boundary of the North Ward to intersect the District boundary.

On the Eastward, Northward, Eastward and Southward by part of the District boundaries to the starting point.

South Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the North-West corner of Location 5183 and extending along its North-Western boundary to the Southern boundary of the North Ward; thence by part of the said Southern boundary and by part of the Western, the Southern and part of the East boundary of the Central Ward and again part of the South boundary of the North Ward to intersect the West boundary of the East Ward.

On the Eastward by part of the West boundary of the East Ward from the aforesaid intersection to the South boundary of the District.

On the Southward by part of the District boundary to the South-West corner of Location 1916.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said South-West corner and extending Northward along the West boundaries of said Location 1916 and of Locations 1919, 1920, Reserve 9984, Locations 1922, 5182 and 5183 to the starting point.

West Ward.—Bounded on the Southward, Westward and Northward by part of the District boundaries from the South-West corner of Location 1916 to intersect the Western boundary of the North Ward.

On the Eastward by part of the said Western boundary and part of the North and the West boundary of the South Ward from the said intersection to the starting point.

Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve of the amendment of the By-laws relating to Explosives, framed under "The Explosives Act, 1895," and contained in the Port Regulations, by repealing Regulations 11 and 12 on page 37, and substituting in lieu thereof the following Regulations:—

No. 11.—Explosives shall not be conveyed in a boat, or ship, whilst carrying or plying for passengers without the written consent of the Inspector of Explosives, unless the quantity be less than 5lbs. and the same be securely covered, and all due precautions be taken for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion.

No. 12.—No explosive shall be put on board of, or discharged from, any boat or ship, or placed in or removed from any magazine, except between the hours of sunrise and sunset, except by special permission from the Inspector of Explosives.

SERPENTINE PUBLIC CEMETERY RESERVE.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, for the management of the Serpentine Public Cemetery (Reserve 10661).

PUBLIC CEMETERY, SERPENTINE.

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Serpentine, the said Trustees make the following By-laws.

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.
 6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
 8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.
 9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—
1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.
1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.
10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
 11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
 13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.
 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office at Serpentine.

Western Australia—North-West Coast.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that owing to the Middle Ground in Hare Channel, Cambridge Gulf (Wyndham), having shifted in a Westerly direction, two port hand buoys have been placed in this locality. The one near Pender Point bears 193deg. from Pender Point and 48deg. from Laffan Point, and the other near Laffan Point bears 206deg. from Pender Point and 100deg. from Laffan Point. Both buoys are steel, painted black, and fixed in 27ft. of water.

A new plan of the soundings recently taken in Hare Channel is being prepared for publication.

Masters of vessels approaching Wyndham when rounding Pender Point should steer for Laffan Point, keeping beacons slightly open to the Southward, and passing Pender Point buoy leaving the buoy on the ship's own port hand. When Hare Channel beacons come into line, steer down Hare Channel with these slightly open to the Westward, passing the Laffan Point buoy leaving the buoy on the ship's own port hand, when the depth of water should be not less than 27ft. L.W.O.S.T.

Owing to the Middle Ground Bank extending across Hare Channel beacons to the extent of 200 yards to the Northward and 600 yards to the Southward of Laffan Point buoy, the Western edge of Hare Channel is now about 1,200ft. to the Westward of the line of Hare Channel beacons. When Laffan Point buoy is left 600 yards astern, Mariners may then gradually get the Hare Channel beacons in line or slightly open to the Eastward.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Second Schedule of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Schedule, the Bayswater Road Board, in exercise of the power aforesaid and every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following By-laws:—

BUILDING BY-LAWS.

Plans and Specifications of Buildings.

1. Every person intending to erect, alter, or add to any building within the Bayswater Road District shall, before commencing, deposit with the Secretary of the Board, for approval, plans in duplicate showing block and ground plan, elevation and section of such building, alterations or additions, and complete working specifications of the work to be done. One of such plans to be marked by the Board when approved of, and the other to be marked and retained by the Board for future reference; and the Board shall have full power to reject any plans and specifications of any proposed building that may, in its opinion, be prejudicial to the property in, or the inhabitants of, the neighbourhood.

Scale of Fees.

2. The following fees shall be paid by the owner or builder to the Road Board, in respect of all buildings to be erected or altered or any matter required or permitted under these By-laws or the Roads Act:—

For business premises, minimum fee shall be	0	5	0

For every service performed by the Surveyor which is required by the By-laws but not comprehended under any of the foregoing heads, a fee not exceeding	5	5	0

All fees shall become part of the ordinary revenue of the Bayswater Road Board.

External Walls.

3. (1) Materials of external walls of buildings within the Road District shall be built of brick or stone or artificial stone, wood or iron, or other material approved by the Board, and such material must be sound and subject to the approval of the Surveyor.

(2) All main walls of brick or stone must have a thickness not less than as prescribed below, viz.:—

- If the wall does not exceed 25 feet in height, it shall be 8½ inches thick.
- Over 25 feet but not exceeding 40 feet, 13 inches thick below the topmost storey, and 8½ inches thick for the rest of its height.
- Over 40 feet, 17½ inches thick for the height of one storey, then 13 inches below the topmost storey, and then 8½ inches thick.

(3) The party walls of brick buildings must have parapet walls with a damp-proof course at level of flashing and a capping of 1 to 1 cement mortar, and finished off with a pure cement wash, to level off flashing.

(4) In the case of a terrace of shops or dwellings and of dwellings only, the front room and that immediately behind it, may be built to the full width of the allotment or tenement. All other rooms must have a clear space on one side of at least 4ft. 6in. in the clear between the dividing line of such tenement and the external walls of such rooms, for the free admission of air and light. There must be 9 feet in the clear between the external walls of every pair of such constructed terraces, and all windows and ventilators must be opened on to the light and air space there provided for. No two or more dwellings or business premises will be permitted to have any yard or building in common save and except when in occupation of the same tenant or occupier.

4. If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one storey, or for the space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these By-laws directed for external walls must be taken down, and the same must be re-built in such manner and with such materials for and in all respects as by these By-laws directed for external walls hereafter to be built within this Road District, and it shall be within the power of the Secretary or Building Surveyor to enforce the re-building of same.

Party Walls.

5. In reference to the component parts thereof, every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or of such bricks and stones together, laid in with mortar or cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breastsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks, may be laid into the substance of a party wall, but no such beam, breastsummer, girder, joist, partition head, or sill, nor any part of a roof, being wood, nor any wood bricks, must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall; but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half of the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound hard bricks, set on edge in good mortar or cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently water-proof and fireproof covering.

Roofs, etc.

6. With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, any or every projection therefrom, and also balconies and shop-fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed and so supplied with gutters and pipes so as to prevent the water from dripping on to or running over the public way, and all such rain-pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

Rooms.

7. (1) With regard to rooms in any parts of any building in reference to height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used for the purpose of habitation must be at least the height of 10ft. 6in. from floor to ceiling, with the exception of skillions, which must be 9 feet high in respect to new buildings, and 8 feet high in respect to buildings already erected.

(2) Every room used for the purpose of habitation or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or the Board, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls; also by ventilators in the ceiling or at the top of the walls thereof, according to the size of such walls. No room shall contain less than 600 feet of air space when finished.

Breastsummers.

8. All breastsummers shall be either of iron or approved wood, and to be loaded to one-third only of their breaking weight.

9. Every fireplace constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built to a height of 3 feet from the level of the fire rest, and not less than 4½ inches thick, and the hearth of every such fireplace or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance; such hearth must consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, or slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least 12 inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same.

Wood and Iron Buildings.

10. The external walls of all wood and iron buildings must be built at least 4ft. 6in. from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected and the adjoining property. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, t. and g. jarrah, or other material approved of by the Board.

Temporary Buildings.

11. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Board for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings; all the walls may be of wood or iron.

Verandahs and Balconies.

12. (1) Awnings or verandahs to be erected over the footpaths are to be in accordance with the drawings and specifications approved of by the Surveyor and adopted by the Board. The minimum height is to be 8ft. 6in. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5in. x 5in. if in jarrah. The verandah must be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Secretary or Surveyor, who shall have the power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the Secretary or Surveyor, and must be completed within 14 days of such notice, or otherwise the verandah will be removed at the expense of the owner or occupier, to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

(2.) *Balconies.*—Verandah posts must be not less than 6in. x 6in. jarrah, 2 feet in ground, with a soleplate to be in one length equal to the extreme length of the balcony, of 9in. x 2in. jarrah, a top plate not less than 9in. x 2in. oregon or jarrah, bearers not less than 6in. x 3in. oregon, not more than 4ft. 6in. apart, joists not less than 4in. x 2in., with 1ft. 6in. centres, floor T. & G. 1½in. thick; verandah posts not less than 4in. x 4in.; rafters not less than 4in. x 2in.; top plate not less than 6in. x 2in. All plates to be bolted to the posts. The floor of balconies shall not be less than 10 feet from surface of footpath.

(3.) No balcony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted unless specially authorised in writing by the Board.

13. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractor or builder erecting a temporary office, shed, or workshops of wood or iron on any building site during the building operations, provided that special application must be made to, and permission granted by, the Secretary or Surveyor.

Chimneys, Domestic and Factory.

14. Every chimney-shaft or flue hereafter built, raised, or repaired must be carried up in brick or stone, work all round at least 4 inches thick to a height of at least 3 feet above the highest of such portion of roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. As to any chimney-shaft (except that of a steam engine, brewery, distillery, or manufactory), the brick or stone of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than 8 feet above the slope or flat or gutter which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney-shaft shall be built of increased thickness, or be built with and bonded with another chimney-shaft or be otherwise rendered secure.

As to the chimney-shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam-engine, or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such a manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Secretary or Surveyor upon special application made and approved in each case.

Chimney Pots.

15. As to earthen or metal chimney-pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatever: If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than 4 feet above the brick or stone work of the flue upon which the same shall be erected, then it must be fixed 2 feet at the least into the brick or stone work of the flue on which it shall be placed, or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the Secretary or Surveyor.

Power to Surveyor or Secretary to enter and remove.

16. Where anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention of these By-laws, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Secretary, at his discretion, to enter on the premises, and remove, or cause to be removed, any buildings or other things which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do, or cause to be done, any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of such doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these By-laws or Regulations.

Bench-marks, etc.

17. All survey levels, bench-marks, or other marks, denoting the same shall carefully be preserved, and any person removing, altering, or obliterating, or causing or permitting same to be removed, altered, or obliterated shall be liable to a penalty of £10 and to pay all costs incurred in replacing or restoring same.

Mutual and Parapet Walls.

18. All walls erected within 2 feet of the boundary of allotment must have parapet walls with copings, the walls in every case being carried up as per By-law No.

Cornices, etc.

19. No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18 inches, and must not be lower than 15 feet above the level of the footpath.

Cellars and Lights.

20. No cellars will be allowed under the pavement of the street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Board before being fixed.

Earth-Closets.

21. Under no circumstances must any earth-closet be built nearer to any dwelling or shop than 40 feet. In cases where the back line of allotments abuts on a right-of-way which runs alongside of other premises, the closets must not be placed nearer to the side of the right-of-way that forms the side line of another property than 34 feet, for a distance of 75 feet from the street line off which the right-of-way runs.

On all plans submitted to the Board the exact position of the earth-closets must be shown, and approval obtained for such position before plan will be passed.

Plans.

22. All plans of buildings and alterations must be examined and approved by the Board, and such approval certified to on the original drawings.
