purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it

is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 18648 (near Mt. Barker) should vest in and be held by the Plantagenet Road Board, in trust for the purpose of Recreation and Public Utility: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Plantagenet Road Board, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Subsection 3 of Section 14 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921," the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions for the enfor any part of ris Majesty's Dominions for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State, extend the provisions of the said Act to that part of His Majesty's Dominions, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's Dominions to which the acid Act articles. Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends: And whereas the Lieutenant-Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions are about to be made by competent authorities in the Northern Territory of Auspetent authorities in the Northern Territory of Australia, the Territory of Norfolk Island, and the Territory of Papua, for the enforcement within those territories, respectively, of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to the Northern Territory of Australia, the Territory of Norfolk Island, and the Territory of Papua.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act. 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1478/23.

Regulation 6:

In line 4.—After the words "Class VII." add "during the second half of the year."

Regulation 18:

Add at end of first sentence, "or in passing in all but one or two of the number of subjects required for the whole examination."

Regulation 22:

In paragraph 3, between the words "Head Teacher" and "elected by," delete the words "of a central school."

In paragraph 6, delete the first sentence and substitute the following:—"No Head Teacher is eligible for election unless he or she holds the A1 classification, and is drawing a salary equal to that provided for such a teacher in a school classified 1A.'

Regulation 24:

In line 7.—After the words "one year" insert the word "continuously."

In line 15.—After the words "Spent as" insert the word "permanent."

The fourth clause of Regulation 24 has been amended, as follows:—From A2 to A1.—Three years' good service as Head Teacher, of which at least one year shall have been as permanent Head Teacher in a school not lower than Class II.

If they are appointed as assistants, their salary in the first year will be that of the higher grade of 'C2' ex-students, in the second year that of the higher grade of 'C1' students''
