Corr. No. 592/02. WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other pub-lic purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas

it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 8129 (Jandakot A.A. Lot 263) should vest in and be held by the Fremantle Road Board, in trust for the purpose of Recreation and Show Ground: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held_by the Fremantle Road Board, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 459/24.

The Land Act, 1898. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

The Public Works Act, 1902. Hazeldean School. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2258/24; Ex. Co. No. 7006.
WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Administrator, by Order in Council, to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any Public Work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide a School at Hazeldean, on the land shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 23488 (L.T.O. Diagram 6595), which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Subsection 3 of Section 14 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921," the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions for the enforcement, within that part, of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State, extend the provisions of the said Act to that part of His Majesty's Dominions, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends: And whereas the Lieutenant-Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions are about to be made by competent authority in the Colony of Southern Rhodesia for the enforcement, within that Colony, of Maintenance Orders made by Courts within this State: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to the Colony of Southern Rhodesia.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the

purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by virtue of the powers aforesaid and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. In these Regulations-
 - "Diseased" means infested with or attacked by stickfast fleas.
- "Animal' means any dog.
- "Bird" means any domestic fowl.
- 2. No person shall-
 - (a) offer (either on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person) any diseased animal or bird for sale, or procure or permit any such animal or bird to be offered for sale;
 - (b) permit or suffer any diseased animal or bird of which he is the owner to go or remain outside the premises of such person.
- 3. Any inspector may at any time enter upon any premises on which he may know or suspect any diseased animal or bird to be, and may inspect such premises, and may require the occupier of such premises to cleanse such premises and to free any such animal or bird completely from stickfast fleas, and also to do whatever is in the opinion of the inspector necessary to destroy all stickfast fleas on the premises and to prevent or check the spread or propagation of such fleas thereon, and the requisition shall specify the particular steps which the occupier is required to take, and shall fix a time for the commencement and completion thereof.
- 4. Failure to comply with any such requisition as aforesaid shall be a breach of these Regulations.
- 5. Without prejudice to any liability incurred for a breach of these Regulations, any inspector may, in case of default in compliance with any such requisition, do or cause to be done all such things as may be necessary in order to carry the terms of the requisition completely into effect, and the expenses incurred in and about so doing shall be recoverable by the Crown from the person guilty of the default by action in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 6. (1.) If any inspector shall discover any diseased bird in any market or other place not being the premises in occupation of the owner of the bird, and whether such bird shall be under the control of any person or not, he may cause the bird to be destroyed or may impound or confine such bird in any place until it shall be completely freed from stickfast fleas: Provided that if such bird has been impounded and it shall appear to the inspector to be impracticable to free it from such fleas, he may cause the bird to be destroyed.
- (2.) Any expenses incurred by an inspector in carrying out the provisions of this Regulation shall be a debt due from the owner of the bird to the Crown, and be recoverable by action in any court of summary jurisdiction.
- 7. (1.) If any inspector shall discover in any railway carriage, truck, or wagon, or on any railway premises, or in any market, or in any other place whatsoever, any crate or other receptacle containing diseased birds, or which has been or is reasonably supposed by the inspector to have been recently used for the carriage of diseased birds or is infested with stickfast fleas, the inspector may cause such crate or receptacle to be disinfected in such manner as he shall deem fit, and shall have authority to do or cause to be done all such things as he may deem necessary for that purpose.
- (2.) The expenses incurred by any inspector in carrying this Regulation into effect shall be recoverable by the Crown from the owner of the crate or receptacle by action in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 8. When any bird is treated by an inspector under these Regulations he may charge a fee of sixpence for such treatment.

When any bird is treated pursuant to any direction of an inspector, the inspector may supervise such treatment and charge therefor a fee of threepence.

- 9. Any breach of these Regulations shall be an offence punishable on summary conviction by a fine not less than five pounds and not exceeding one hundred pounds.
- 10. These Regulations may be cited as the Stock Diseases (Stickfast Flea) Regulations, 1924.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

The Traffic Act, 1919.

Regulations.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 41 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," that the Governor may, amongst other things, regulate the routes to be observed by passenger vehicles plying as omnibuses: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the power so conferred by Section 41 of the said Act as aforesaid and of every other power him in this Act as aforesaid and of every other power him in this behalf enabling, make the following Regulations, that is to say:

- 1. In these Regulations the "Metropolitan Area" means the area prescribed by Regulation 2 and the First Schedule duly made under "The Traffic Act, 1919," and published in the Government Gazette on the 15th day of August, 1924.
- 2. The routes to be observed by vehicles licensed as passenger vehicles and plying as omnibuses in the Metropolitan Area shall be the routes indicated and set forth in the schedule hereto.

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle licensed as a passenger vehicle to ply as an omnibus within the Metropolitan Area elsewhere than along the routes indicated and set forth in the schedule hereto.

- 3. Every holder of a passenger vehicle license in respect of a vehicle plying as an omnibus within the Metropolitan Area shall, within seven days after the passing of these regulations, present his license to the proper licensing authority who shall cause to be endorsed thereon the route along which the vehicle is authorised to ply.
- 4. Every passenger vehicle license hereafter issued for any vehicle which it is intended shall ply as an omnibus within the Metropolitan Area shall have endorsed thereon the route along which such vehicle shall ply.
- 5. It shall be lawful for the proper licensing authority to alter from time to time the route endorsed on the license issued in respect of any passenger vehicle plying as an omnibus within the said Area, and such altered route (being one of the routes indicated by and set forth in the schedule hereto) shall for all purposes be deemed to be substituted for the route previously endorsed thereon.
- 6. No person shall cause or permit any passenger vehicle plying as an omnibus to ply along any route within the Metropolitan Area except that endorsed on the passenger vehicle license issued in respect of such
- 7. The contravention of any of these regulations, whether by act or omission, shall be deemed to be an offence on the part of the person committing the act or making the omission or being party or privy thereto, and the offender shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 8. These regulations may be cited as the Traffic (Omnibus Routes) Regulations, 1924.
