Traffic Regulations.

Additions and Amendments.

Amendments.

Regulation 28 :

Paragraph (d) of Subsection (7) of Regulation No. 28 is hereby amended by deleting the words, "Provided that a light from the rear shall not be insisted on if a 'red reflex' is affixed in such a manner as to adequately reflect the light from an approaching vehicle." This Regulation to come into force on and after the 1st day of January, 1925.

Additions.

Regulation 156 :

No plough or other agricultural implement shall be driven or drawn over or along any road in such a manner as to cause undue damage to any road.

Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in addition to the cost for reinstating any damage.

"The Traffic (Omnibus) Regulations, 1924."

9. Additional regulations for controlling Omnibuses, which vehicles, and the drivers thereof, are subject to the general Traffic Regulations, shall be limited in their application to the Metropolitan Area.

10. In these regulations—

"License" means a passenger vehicle license;

"Omnibus" means any vehicle plying, standing or used in any road for the conveyance of a number of passengers at separate fares;

"Traffic Inspector" means the Commissioner of Police or any member of the Police Force authorised by him, either by general or special order, to act as a traffic inspector for the purposes of these regulations.

11. The number of passengers which may be carried in any omnibus shall be determined by the Commissioner of Police and shall be set out in the license granted in respect thereof, and no greater number shall at any time be carried therein.

12. Every omnibus shall be equipped and maintained in proper order and condition to the satisfaction of a traffic inspector.

13. The route of any omnibus shall be such as is set out in the license, and such omnibus shall not be used or ply for hire on any road not comprised in such route except with the written permission of the Commissioner of Police: Provided that the Commissioner of Police may grant written permission for any omnibus to be used or ply for hire on another route than that mentioned in the license for such period as he shall limit in the permit, and during such period the omnibus shall not be used or ply for hire on any road not comprised in the route defined in such permit.

14. No omnibus shall be turned round during any journey, but must complete the journey on which it sets out.

15. No license shall be granted after the 1st July, 1925, for any omnibus, unless—

(a) The conditions set out in the Eighth Schedule hereto are satisfied and complied with in respect thereof;

(b) Such omnibus is so constructed as not to provide any seating accommodation to the right of the driver.

16. No person shall cause or permit any omnibus to stand for hire at or on any place other than a public stand appointed by the Local Authority for the purpose.

17. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

18. These regulations may be cited as "The Traffic (Omnibus) Regulations, 1924."

Eighth Schedule.

Conditions to be complied with before an Omnibus is granted a License.

1. The dimensions shall be—

(a) From floor to top of cushion, not less than 1ft. 0in., nor more than 1ft. 5in.

(b) From top of cushion to roof, not less than 3ft. 6in.

(c) Width of seat, not less than 1ft. 2in.

(d) Space between seats, not less than 2ft.

(e) Sixteen inches space to be measured along the front of each seat for each passenger.

2. A good sound bell and check strap or other suitable means of communicating with the driver shall be provided.

3. A reversible board shall be hung upon the front of each omnibus showing the stand such omnibus is plying to.

4. All other requisites for securing proper cleanliness and due provision for the safety and convenience of passengers shall be provided to the satisfaction of a traffic inspector.
