ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may alter the boundaries of any Health District constituted by the Governor under the said Act: And whereas it is desired to alter the boundaries of the Osborne Park Health District which was so constituted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby alter the boundaries of the said Health District in manner following, that is to say:—

To extend the boundaries so as to include all that land contained within the circumference of a circle, the centre of which is the North-East corner of Lot 217 of Swan Location 548, as described on deposited Plan 4431, Volume 811, Folio 188; and the radius of which is  $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

The Pearling Act, 1912-19. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-19," it is made lawful for the Governor to close any portion of a pearl-shell área and to prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls or pearl-shell within or from the portion so closed, for a specific period: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the whole of that portion of Shark Bay Pearl-shell Area known as South Passage Section, other than those portions held under Exclusive License, shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from that portion so closed shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the above mentioned portion of the said Pearl-shell Area shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited for a reriod of twelve (12) months from the fourteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

By-law No. 39.

Buildings.

#### (Amendment.)

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corpora-tions Act, 1906," and No. 39, for regulating the erection of buildings.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of the City of Perth order as follows :--

(A) Every person intending to erect any building or alter or add to any building within the Municipality of the City of Perth shall, before commencing to erect, alter, or add to the same, make an application in the form provided in Schedule (1) to this By-law, and de-posit with the Building Surveyor two sets of drawings abaving the place departies and actions (with full showing the plans, elevations, and sections (with full details of structural steel work and re-inforced concrete) of such proposed building, addition, or alteration, to-gether with full and complete specifications in duplicate of the work proposed to be done. One set of such drawings and specifications shall remain in the office of the Building Surveyor as a permanent record. A locality plan showing the position occupied or to be occupied by such building shall at the same time be deposited with the Surveyor, which plan shall remain permanently in his custody. A plan showing the existing and any pro-posed storm-water drain used or to be used in connection with any new or additional building shall at the same time be deposited with the City Engineer, which plan shall remain permanently in his custody. All plans and drawings shall be prepared in the manner hereafter provided.

- (a) All drawings shall be in ink on drawing paper, tracing cloth, or sun print of at least 15 inches by 22 inches in size. The drawing shall consist of complete plans of every storey, eleva-tions of external fronts, and one or more sec-tions transverse or longitudinal, showing heights of storeys, depths of foundations, level of ground, construction of walls, roofs, floors, etc., all clearly figured and dimensioned in feet and inches; also a locality plan showing loca-tion of proposed site, with cardinal or north point, showing the size and shape of the lot on which it is proposed to erect, alter, or make additions to the building, the position of the proposed building and any building or buildings already on the lot, the relative levels of the lot with the street or way adjoining, and the position and size of any existing drains or sewers, and the position, size, depth, and gradients of all proposed drains or sewers, and the position of inlet traps and ventilators. All sizes and positions shall be figured and shown on the locality plan. Existing sewers shall be shown in black full lines, and the existing storm-water drains by broken lines thus— All proposed drains for sewerage shall be shown in green full lines, and the proposed
- storm-water drains in red full lines. (b) Existing buildings shall be coloured "blue" and proposed new buildings shall be ''pink'' on the locality plan. coloured

insert the name of the drug or drugs required to be Insert the name of the drug or drugs required to be declared, and the quantity or proportion of each con-tained in the mixture or package), or EACH OF THESE TABLETS (pastilles, cachets, or capsules) CONTAINS (here insert the name of each substance required to be declared, and the quantity or propor-tion of the pack exclared, and the quantity or proportion of each contained in each tablet, pastille, cachet, capsule, etc.)

3. This Regulation shall not apply to a drug dispensed and supplied on prescription or order signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner, nor to a mixture supplied by a registered pharmacist extemporan-

eously prepared by a regretced plantactor extemplatin eously prepared for a specific and individual case. The words "four and a half" in the third line of Clause (2) of Regulation No. 6 are hereby deleted, and the words "five fluid onnees and six" are inserted in lieu thereof.

Regulation 61 is hereby amended by deleting the word "Lemonade" from the first line of Clause (1).

#### Vermin Boards Act, 1909.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL,

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 6 of "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," that the Governor may by Order in Council alter the boundaries of a District; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, alter as from the 19th day of November, 1924, the beendaries of the Ashburton, Gascoyne, Roebourne-Table and, and Meekatharra Vermin Districts: And doth order and declare that the boundaries of such Vermin Districts respectively shall be as set out in the schedule hereto:—

#### Schedule.

Ashburton Vermin District.—The boundaries shall be the same as those of the Ashburton Road District so as to exclude, however, that portion of the district lying to the Westward of the Gascoyne Rabbit-proof Fence.

Gascoyne Vermin District.—The boundaries shall be the same as those of the Gascoyne-Minilya Road District so as to include, however, that portion of the Ashburton Road District lying to the Westward of the Gaseoyne Rabbit-proof Fence.

Rocbourne-Tableland Vermin District.—The boundaries shall be such as to include the whole of the territory comprised in the Rochourne and Tableland Road Districts.

Meckatharra Vermin District.—The boundaries shall be the same as those of the Meekatharra Road District.
