The Cemeteries Act, 1897, and Amendments.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

11897/00.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amendments, it is made lawful (in case it should appear to the Governor that burials in any Cemetery under any law relating to public cemeteries or other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification) for the Governor, by Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in any cemetery or burial place, ground, or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exception or qualifications mentioned in the same or in any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of February, 1916, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of February, His Excellency the Governor directed that from and after the 18th day of May, 1916, burials within the limits of the Public Cemeteries and Burial Grounds, East Perth, should be wholly discontinued: And whereas under Section 7 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," such Order was varied by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th November, 1919, to provide for burials to take place in cases in respect of which the consent of the Governor had been obtained and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is desirable to again vary the Order by excision of such proviso: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that said Order be again varied by eliminating said proviso, thereby closing the said Cemeteries and burial grounds against all burials.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. Forests 400/24; Lands and Surveys 6169/24.
WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may, by an Order in Council, dedicate any Crown lands as a State Forest within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act: And whereas the land described in Schedule hereto is Crown land under the provision of Section 67 of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby dedicate the Crown lands described in Schedule hereto as State Forest No. 7, within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Forests Act, 1918," subject to the conditions specified in Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th June, 1924.

Being the land coloured green on print page 3 of L. & S. Corr. 6169/24, and bounded by lines starting at the South corner of Avon Location 4665, and extending due South to the Southern side of the main road to York; thence Easterly and South-Easterly along said side of road and that of another one chain road to the North-East corner of Avon Location 16495; thence West, South, East, and North along the North, the West, the South, and the East boundaries of said location to the South-Western side of the last-mentioned road; thence South-Easterly along said side of road to the Western boundary of Helena Location 22; thence Southerly along part of said location's Western boundary and that of Avon Location 4564 to the Northern boundary of Avon Location 3444; thence Westerly, Southerly, and Easterly along part of the Northern, the Western, and part of the Southern boundaries of said location to the North-West corner of Avon Location 10382; thence Southerly along its Western boundary and that of late P.P.R. 8/197 and onwards to the Northern boundary of late P.P.R. 8/228; thence Eastward along part of the Northern boundary of the last-mentioned P.P.R. and due South to a point situate 180 chains due East from the 117th mile post on an Eastern boundary of the Goldfields Water Supply Catchment Area, near Mount Dale; thence Westerly to said mile post; thence generally North-Westerly and North-Easterly along boundaries of said catchment area as shown on Resumption Plan No. 245, Department of Lands and Surveys, passing through "Gunjin" to the South boundary of Swan Location 2621; thence East and North along parts of its Southern and Eastern boundaries to rejoin the said catchment area boundaries; thence North-Easterly and North-Westerly along same to the Southern boundary of Swan Location 1492; thence Easterly to its South-East corner and onwards to the Eastern side of a one-chain road; thence Northerly along the Eastern side of said road to the South-Western side of Road No. 3447; thence South-Easterly about 18 chains along said side of road to a level crossing; thence North-Easterly to and South-Easterly along the Western side of the Mundaring Weir Railway Reserve to the Northern boundary of Swan Location 1696; thence West, South, and East along part of the North, the West, and the South boundaries of said location to its South-East corner; thence East along part of the South boundary of Swan Location 1583 to the South-Western side of Road No. 3447 aforesaid; thence South-Easterly crossing said road to the South side of Road No. 1822 and Easterly along same to a point in the Southern prolongation of the Eastern boundary of Swan Location 2292; thence North to and along said boundary; thence East to the South-East corner of Swan Location 930; thence South, East, and North along part of the West, the South, and the East boundaries of Swan Location 1845 to its North-East corner; thence West along its North boundary and onwards to the East boundary of Swan Location 930 aforesaid; thence Northward and Westward along parts of its East and North boundaries to the South-East corner of Swan Location 929; thence North and West along the East and part of the North boundaries of said location; thence North and West along an East and part of a North boundary of Swan Location 928 to the East

corner of Swan Location 1203; thence North-Westerly along its Eastern boundary and those of Swan Locations 1201 and 1199 onward across a one-chain road and along the Eastern boundaries of Mundaring Lots 54, 53, and a part of that of Lot 51 to its intersection with the aforesaid catchment area boundary; thence in a general North-Easterly direction along North-Western boundaries of said catchment area to the South-East corner of Swan Location 2013; thence Northerly along its Eastern boundary to its North corner; thence North-Easterly along the South-Eastern side of a one-chain road to the North-West corner of Chidlow Lot 60; thence South and East along its West and South boundaries to a South-Western boundary of Chidlow Lot 59; thence South-Easterly and Easterly along part of the South-Western and the South boundary of said lot and onwards across a one-chain road to its South-Eastern side; thence North-Easterly along said side of road to its intersection with one of the Northern boundaries of the aforesaid catchment area; and thence South-Easterly along said Northern boundaries to the starting point, and on the inner part by and exclusive of—

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 18788, at Albany, should vest in and be held by the Municipality of Albany, in trust for the purpose of Quarrying: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Municipality of Albany, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act, and to the condition that the Crown retains the right to enter and quarry stone at any time free of royalty for the construction or maintenance of any roads or other public works, whether effected Departmentally or by contract.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," it is enacted, among other things, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the Commonwealth and outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement, without that part of His Majesty's dominions, of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of this State, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that the said Act shall extend to that part of His Majesty's dominions: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the competent authority of the Federated Malay States is about to make such reciprocal provisions: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," doth hereby declare that the said Act shall extend to the Federated Malay States.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

Boyup Brook Ward.—Bounded by lines commencing at the North-East corner of Nelson Location 6128, and extending along part of the South boundary of Location 1872, parts of the West and South-Western boundaries of Location 441, the West boundary of Location 4174, part of the West boundary of Location 233, Northern boundaries of Locations 4173 and 308, and the Western and Southern boundaries of the latter to the right bank of the Blackwood River, and Southward along same to the North-East corner of Location 710, and along the North boundary of said Location 710, the West boundary of Boyup Brook Lot 185, and part of the West boundary of Lot 184 to one chain South from its North-West corner; thence West to the West side of Williams Street, and North along said side of Williams Street to the South boundary of Location 850, and along part of the South and the North-Eastern boundary of same, part of the South boundary of Location 303, the South and East boundaries of Location 6128 to the starting point. On the Southward by the said bank of the river from the aforesaid intersection to the boundaries of the Boyup Brook Ward and Northward, Westward, and Southward by part of said Ward boundaries to the production East of the North boundary of Location 800, and along the Northern boundaries of said Location 800, part of the East, the South, and part of the West boundary of Location 799, the North boundaries of Locations 722 and 1267, and part of the latter's West boundary, the North and part of the West boundary of Location 861, the North and North-Western boundaries of Location 1132, the North-Western boundaries of Locations 1689 and 2759, Reserve 10790, Locations 2736 and 2314, Northern boundaries of Location 5291, and along the Southern side of Road No. 2277, to the District boundary, and along same to the starting point. Two members.

Tweed Ward.—Bounded on the Northward by part of the Southern boundary of the Benjinup Ward, and part of the boundaries of the Boyup Brook Ward and the right bank of the Blackwood River to the production West of the Northernmost boundary of Location 3526 and along said production and Northernmost boundary to the North-East corner of the location.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the aforesaid North-East corner, and extending Southward along East boundaries of Locations 3526, 1851, 6429, 6436, Reserve 17496, part of the Northern boundary of Location 1807, East boundaries of Locations 7353, 1831, and 1832, and part of the South boundary of the lattermost, the East boundary of Location 1833, part of the North boundary of Location 1556, the West boundaries of Location 1554, 1316, and 1667, part of the North, a West, a South, a West, and a South boundary of Location 7471, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 724, East boundaries of Locations 1219, 1220, 2846, 2185, and Tweed A.A. Lot 750, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 1600, the West and part of the South boundary of Location 1646, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 1838, a West boundary of Location 2349, East boundaries of Locations 3822, 3498, and 1533, part of the North and the East boundary of Location 2905, the East boundary of Location 4422, and its production to intersect the District boundary.

On the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundaries to the starting point. Two members.

Dinninup Ward.—Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the District boundaries, from a South-East corner of Wellington Location 2484 to the South-East corner of Nelson Location 2778.
