WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of the City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 26th day of November, 1924, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that His Excellency the Governor may order that the forest produce on any catchment area now or hereafter vested in or controlled by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, or other statutory authority, shall be placed under the management or control of the Conservator, subject to such conditions as the Governor may think fit, and thereupon such areas shall be deemed Crown land for the purposes and within the meaning of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby orders that the forest produce on all catchment areas proclaimed under "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," and vested in or controlled by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, or other statutory authority, be placed under the management or control of the Conservator of Forests, subject to his observing the provisions of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," and amendments thereof, and the By-laws made thereunder, and to the right being reserved to the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, or other statutory authority controlling the said catchment areas, to clear any portion of the same, at any time, for the purpose of increasing the run-off of water therefrom, should such a course be found necessary, and subject also to further conditions to be mutually agreed upon between the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, or other statutory authority controlling the said catchment areas, and the Conservator of Forests.

PORT REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the amendment, by virtue of Section two of Ordinance 37 Victoria, No. 14, of the Regulations governing Tonnage Dues published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of January, 1919, by the addition thereto of the following Regulation, namely:—

16. All vessels using the Fishing Boat Harbour, Fremantle, shall pay tonnage dues as under:—

(a) Crayfish boats and boats fitted with ice boxes—£1 per annum.

(b) Other fishing boats propelled by power other than oars—10s. per annum.

(c) Boats propelled solely by oars—5s. per annum. Such dues being payable annually in advance, on the first day of January in each year, providing that any vessel commencing operations after 30th June in any year shall pay dues for the balance of that year at half the above rates.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902.

C.S.O. 25/21.

WHEREAS by Section 22 of "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," the Governor is empowered from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, to alter the boundaries of the Harbour which is subject to the control of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners: and whereas it is desirable to alter the said boundaries and to establish the boundaries hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, D.S.O.,

the Governor of Western Australia, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and notify that the boundaries of the said Harbour shall on and after the publication of this notification in the *Government Gazette* be as follows, that is to say:—

That portion of the said Harbour which shall be known as the Inner Harbour shall be bounded as follows:—

By a line starting from the intersection of the North side of Lukin Road and the prolongation Northwards of the fence on the West side of Railway Reserve, North Fremantle, and extending Southerly along the fence on Western boundary of Railway Reserve and along Railway Bridge; thence along Railway fence to Western abutment of overhead Bridge; then following the North-Western foot of embankment of approach to overhead bridge to a point opposite 92 feet North-Easterly from South-East corner of Shed J; then South-Eastward to angle in Railway fence; thence South-Westerly along said fence to the Eastern side of Cliff Street; thence Southwards along said side of street for a distance of about two chains; thence Westward crossing Cliff Street, following along the South-Eastern boundary fence of the Fremantle Harbour Works Depot to its South-Western corner; thence South about four chains; thence on a bearing of 106deg. 30min. for about 11 chains; thence South to the sea-coast and generally Westerly along same and the Southern side of the South Mole to its Western extremity; thence West-North-Westerly to the Western extremity of the North Mole; thence Easterly and North-Easterly along the North side of the said North Mole and the sea-coast to its intersection with the prolongation North-Westerly of the South-Western boundary fence of the North Fremantle Store site; thence South-Easterly along the said prolongation and fence to the South-East corner of North Fremantle Store site fence; thence along said fence, on South-Easterly side, to its intersection with the prolongation of the North side of Lukin Road; thence along said prolongation and North side of Lukin Road to the starting point, as the said boundary is delineated in Plan deposited in the Public Works Department, No. 18538.

That portion of the said Harbour which shall be called the Outer Harbour shall be:—

Bounded by lines starting from the Western extremity of the North Mole and extending North-Westerly to the white buoy on Kingston Spit; thence Westerly to Duck Rock beacon; thence Southerly to Bathurst Point, Rottne Island, and along the Eastern and Southern shore of Rottne Island in a generally Southerly direction to Parker Point; thence South-Westerly to Entrance Point, Garden Island; thence Easterly, Southerly, and Westerly passing along the Northern, Eastern, and Southern shores of the said island to South-West Head; thence Southerly to John Point on the mainland; thence Easterly and Northerly along the sea-coast of the mainland and the Southern side of the South Mole to the latter's Western extremity; thence West-North-Westerly to the Western extremity of the North Mole, and thence Easterly and North-Easterly along the Northern side of the said North Mole and Northerly along the sea-coast of the mainland to the starting point; but there shall be excluded from the said Outer Harbour any lands or areas which have hitherto been and remain alienated from the Crown in fee simple or withdrawn from the jurisdiction of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners as prescribed by law.

And the said Harbour shall comprise the areas herein included in the said Inner and Outer Harbours.

#### *Regulations relating to all Types of Power-driven Cranes.*

1. Every new power-driven crane erected after 1st day of December, 1924, the manufacturer or his Agent shall supply to the Chief Inspector of Machinery:—

(a) A complete general arrangement drawing to scale, giving all leading dimensions, and the weights and centres of gravity of the com-

ponent parts of the Crane, which are necessary for computing the stability of the structure for the maximum load for which it was designed.

(b) A certificate stating the maximum safe working load at maximum radius of jib, and the safe working loads at various radii (where the jib is not a fixed one) and the load to which crane was tested by the makers, giving the radius at which such load was supported.

(c) A certificate from the maker of the ropes used both for hoisting and derricking purposes, or a certified copy thereof. Such certificate shall provide the following information:—

Name and address of manufacturer.  
Diameter or circumference of rope in inches.  
Construction of rope—  
Number of strands,  
Style of lay,  
Class of core.  
Construction of strands—  
Number of wires,  
Diameter of wires (decimals of an inch),  
Class of core of strand.  
Material of which wire is made,  
Breaking stress of material in tons per square inch (tons of 2,240lbs.),  
Breaking load of rope in tons per square inch (tons of 2,240lbs.)

2. If the Inspector has any reasonable doubt at any time as to the quality or strength of any crane rope, he may demand that a sample of the rope shall be tested at the Engineering Laboratory of the University of Western Australia, and that such test piece be cut off in his presence, and any expense incurred in connection with such test shall be borne by the owner of the crane.

3. All cranes fitted with jibs and designed to work at variable radii shall be provided with a reliable metal indicator (pendulum type or otherwise) showing the safe-working loads at various radii for the guidance of the operator.

4. In the case of cranes with fixed jibs, a metal plate shall be securely attached in a conspicuous position stating the maximum safe working load.

5. The driver in charge of each crane shall keep the reading on the metal load indicator or plate clean and legible whilst the crane is in use.

Any person who disfigures, destroys, conceals, or attempts to disfigure, destroy, or conceal the readings on the said metal plates shall be guilty of an offence under the above Act.

1. In the construction of this By-law:—

- The word "fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried; oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns, and shrimps.



- (c) Any person who travels or trades on foot and with or without any cart, horse, animal, or vehicle, who shall carry or sell or expose for sale, within the District of the said Board, any of the articles of merchandise in this By-law mentioned, shall be deemed to hawk the same.

2. No person shall:—

- (a) Hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise, within the District of the South Perth Road Board, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license so to do from the said Board.
- (b) Keep or conduct a stall for the sale of any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise within the District of the South Perth Road Board, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license so to do from the said Board.

3. No holder of any such license shall hawk or keep or conduct a stall, except within that part of the District of the said Board as shall be endorsed on the back of such license.

4. Every person who wishes to obtain a Hawkers or Stall-keeper's License shall apply to the Secretary of the said Board, stating the term; part of the District; and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed. The granting or refusing of a license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board, and when granted shall not be transferable.
