WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1925, until the 31st day of December, 1925, inclusive.

Schedule.

(1) That area of water at Cottesloe, on the Southern side of the Cottesloe Pier, extending in a Southerly direction a quarter of a mile and in a Westerly direction a quarter of a mile.

(2) That area of water at Cottesloe, on the Northern side of the Cottesloe Pier, extending in a Northerly direction one-half mile and in a Westerly direction a quarter of a mile.

Road Districts Act, 1919.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made under Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of July, 1923, the area described in the schedule hereto was severed from the Jandakot Road District and annexed to the Melville Road District: And whereas the Road Board of such last-mentioned district was on the date aforesaid and is still indebted by way of moneys advanced to it by way of loan, and the area which was comprised in the Melville Road District immediately before the making of the said Order in Council appears to the Governor in Council to have specially benefited by the loan or loans in respect of which the said Board is so indebted as aforesaid, and it has been so determined accordingly: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 10 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby declare that all or any loan rates applicable to the loan or loans in respect of which the said Road Board was so indebted at the date aforesaid shall be levied on such area as was comprised in the said district immediately prior to the making of the aforesaid Order in Council to the exclusion of the area described in the schedule hereto.

*The Schedule.**Melville Road District.*

All that piece of land bounded on the Northward by part of the present district boundary from the South-West corner of Canning Location 28 to the West corner of Location 7/1471; thence by the Southern boundaries of the latter to its South-East corner.

On the Eastward by lines commencing to the said South-East corner and extending Southward to and along the South-East boundary of Jandakot Agricultural Area Lots 187 (Reserve 1709) and 188, the South-West boundary of Location 21, the West boundary of Jandakot Agricultural Area Lot 101 to intersect the production East of the Southern boundary of Lot 184.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending Westward along the Southern boundaries of said Lot 184, the South and part of the West boundary of Lot 183 (Reserve 4881 and 1761), the South boundaries of Lot 181 and Cockburn Sound Location 630, and continuing Westward to intersect the North-East boundary of Jandakot Agricultural Area Lot 172.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

*The Traffic Act, 1919.**Regulations.*

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 41 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," that the Governor may, amongst other things, regulate the routes to be observed by passenger vehicles plying as omnibuses: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the power so conferred by Section 41 of the said Act as aforesaid, and of every other power in this behalf enabling him, make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The route to be observed by vehicles licensed as passenger vehicles and plying as omnibuses between Kalgoorlie and Boulder City shall be the route indicated and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle licensed as a passenger vehicle to ply as an omnibus between Kalgoorlie and Boulder City otherwise or elsewhere than along the route indicated and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Any person who commits a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902.

WHEREAS by Section 22 of "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," the Governor is empowered from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, to alter the boundaries of the harbour which is subject to the control of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners: And whereas it is desirable to alter the said boundaries and to establish the boundaries hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, D.S.O., the Governor of Western Australia, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and notify that the boundaries of the said harbour shall on and after the publication of this notification in the *Government Gazette* be as follows, that is to say:—

That portion of the said harbour which shall be known as the Inner Harbour shall be bounded as follows:—

By a line starting from the intersection of the North side of Lukin Road and the prolongation Northwards of the fence on the West side of Railway Reserve, North Fremantle, and extending Southerly along the fence on Western boundary of Railway Reserve and along Railway Bridge; thence along Railway fence to Western

abutment of overhead bridge; then following the North-Western foot of embankment of approach to overhead bridge to a point opposite 92 feet North-Easterly from South-East corner of Shed J; thence South-Eastward to angle in railway fence; thence South-Westerly along said fence to the Eastern side of Cliff Street; thence Southwards along said side of street for a distance of about two chains; thence Westward crossing Cliff Street, following along the South-Eastern boundary fence of the Fremantle Harbour Works Depot to its South-Western corner; thence South about four chains; thence on a bearing of 106 degrees 30 minutes for about 11 chains; thence South to the sea-coast and generally Westerly along same and the Southern side of the South Mole to its Western extremity; thence West-North-Westerly to the Western extremity of the North Mole; thence Easterly and North-Easterly along the North side of the said North Mole and the sea coast to its intersection with the prolongation North-Westerly of the South-Western boundary fence of the North Fremantle Store site; thence South-Easterly along the said prolongation and thence to the South-East corner of North Fremantle Store site fence; thence along said fence on South-Easterly side, to its intersection with the prolongation of the North side of Lukin Road; thence along said prolongation and North side of Lukin Road to the starting point, as the said boundary is delineated in Plan deposited in the Public Works Department No. 18538.

That portion of the said harbour which shall be called the Outer Harbour shall be:—

Bounded by lines starting from the Western extremity of the North Mole and extending North-Westerly to the white buoy on Kingston Spit; thence Westerly to Duck Rock beacon; thence Southerly to Bathurst Point, Rottnest Island, and along the Eastern and Southern shore of Rottnest Island in a generally Southerly direction to Parker Point; thence South-Westerly to Entrance Point, Garden Island; thence Easterly, Southerly, and Westerly passing along the Northern, Eastern, and Southern shores of the said island to South-West Head; thence Southerly to John Point on the mainland; thence Easterly and Northerly along the sea coast of the mainland and the Southern side of the South Mole to the latter's Western extremity; thence West-North-Westerly to the starting point; but there shall be excluded from the said Outer Harbour any lands or areas which have hitherto been and remain alienated from the Crown in fee simple or withdrawn from the jurisdiction of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners as prescribed by law.

And the said harbour shall comprise the areas herein included in the said Inner and Outer Harbours; and the boundaries defined herein shall be the boundaries of the said harbour in lieu of those defined in the notification dated the 3rd day of December, 1924.

UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE following Statute, which has received the approval of the Governor, is published in the *Government Gazette* in accordance with Section 33 (i) of "The University of Western Australia Act, 1911":—

The existing Statute No. 15 dealing with the granting and conferring of degrees is hereby repealed, and the following Statute substituted therefor:—

Statute No. 15 (a)—Granting and Conferring of Degrees and Diplomas.

1. Students who have fulfilled all the conditions prescribed for any degree or diploma may, on presentation, be granted that degree or diploma by the Senate.

2. Graduates of any other University who have qualified under Statute No. 3 for admission to any degree may, on presentation, be granted that degree by the Senate.

3. The Senate after report from the Professorial Board may, on presentation, or may, on its own motion without presentation, grant an honorary degree to any person for distinguished service within or without the State.

4. On the report of the Professorial Board, the Senate may issue to a student any certificate to which he is entitled. Such certificate shall be signed by the Vice-Chancellor.

5. Presentations under Sections 1 and 2 shall be made by the Dean of the Faculty to which the degree or diploma belongs, or by his deputy.

Presentations under Section 3 shall be made by the Vice-Chancellor or by his deputy.

The candidate shall attend on presentation unless the Senate is satisfied that such absence is unavoidable, in which case the degree or diploma shall be granted *in absentia*.

The presentation shall be made in such one of the following forms as may be applicable:—

(a) *Form of presentation under Section 1:—*

Mr. Chancellor, Mr. Pro-Chancellor, and members of the Senate of the University, I present to you for admission to the degree or diploma of in this University A—B—.

(b) *Form of presentation under Section 8:—*

Mr. Chancellor, Mr. Pro-Chancellor, and members of the Senate of the University, I present to you for admission *ad eundem gradum* as in this University A—B— (insert name of candidate and title of degree in his own University) of the University of

(c) *Form of presentation under Section 3:—*

Mr. Chancellor, Mr. Pro-Chancellor, and members of the Senate of the University, I present to you for admission to the Honorary Degree of in this University A—B—.

In the unavoidable absence of a candidate, the above forms shall be modified by striking out the words "I present to you for admission" and inserting in lieu thereof "I submit to you for admission *in absentia*," and by inserting after the words "this University" the words "the name of."

6. The degree or diploma shall, on behalf of the Senate, be conferred by the Chancellor at a meeting of the Senate, in such one of the following forms as may be applicable:—

(a) *Where the degree or diploma is under Section 1:*

The Register shall not, except for the purpose of Section 9, be altered or amended unless to correct some manifest error or omission which the Senate directs to be so corrected.

No person shall be deemed to hold a degree or diploma of the University, unless the name of such person and the degree or diploma is recorded in the Register.

9. The Chancellor may, on recommendation of the Senate, revoke any degree or diploma which has been granted to any person if such person is convicted of felony or of any indictable misdemeanour in any part of the world, or the name of such person has in any part of the world been removed by a properly constituted authority from any official register or roll of members of the profession to which he belongs, and thereupon the name of such person shall be struck off the Register of Graduates.

On the recommendation of the Senate, the Chancellor may at any time thereafter, on good cause being shown to the satisfaction of the Senate, restore to any person a degree or diploma which has been revoked as aforesaid and direct the name of such person to be restored to the Register of Graduates.
