KNOW Ye that We do by this Our Commission appoint
you to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report upon
the circumstances surrounding the last illness and
death of Constable George Ernest Hubbard, and his re-
ception into and treatment at the Geraldton Hospital on
the 3rd and 4th days of October, 1924, and to investi-
gate the conduct of Dr. Lancelot Machell Travers Hun-
gerford, the District Medical Officer at Geraldton, and
the other persons concerned in respect of the matters
aforesaid, with a view to ascertaining whether the said
Dr. Lancelot Machell Travers Hungerford or any other
person has been guilty of misconduct or negligence in
relation thereto: And we declare that you, the said
Alfred Bowman Kidson, shall by virtue of this Our
Commission constitute and be a Royal Commissioner within
the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act,
1902," and "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Subsection 3 of Section 14 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921," the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State, extend the provisions of the said Act to that part of His Majesty's Dominions, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's Dominion to which the said Act extends: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions are about to be made by competent authorities of Bechuanaland Protectorate, Basutoland, and Swaziland, for the enforcement within those territories, respectively, of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Basutoland, and Swaziland.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," it is enacted, among other things, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the Commonwealth and outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Majesty's Dominions of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of this State, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that the said Act shall extend to that part of His Majesty's Dominions: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the competent authority of the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Basutoland, and Swaziland, is about to make such reciprocal provisions: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by Section 8 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1921," doth hereby declare that the said Act shall extend to the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Basutoland, and Swaziland.
