WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 12548/56 (Victoria Location 4738), Conditional Purchase Lease 29314/55 (Victoria Location 4794), and Conditional Purchase Lease 39395/55 (Victoria Location 7628), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 13 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say for "Railway Water Supply": Now therefore I, Sir William Robert Campion, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 12548/56 (Victoria Location 4738), Conditional Purchase Lease 29314/55 (Victoria Location 4794), and Conditional Purchase Lease 39395/55 (Victoria Location 7628) for the purpose aforesaid.

WHEREAS by "The Ports and Harbours Act, 1917," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that any place bounded as set out in the Proclamation shall be a port or harbour for the purpose of Ordinances 18 Viet., No. 15 ("The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855"), and 37 Viet., No. 14; and may in like manner define, for the purposes of the said Ordinances, the limits of any port or harbour mentioned in "The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855": And it is also provided by the said Act that the Governor may revoke or vary any Proclamation made thereunder: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, the port of Onslow was declared and defined: And whereas I, the said Governor, and the Executive Council of the State are of opinion that it is desirable to revoke that portion of the aforesaid Proclamation declaring and defining the port of Onslow: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore recited and all other powers me in this behalf enabling, revoke that portion of the Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, declaring and defining the port of Onslow, and in lieu thereof declare that the area set out in the Schedule hereto to be the port of Onslow for the purposes aforesaid, and the said port shall be bounded and limited as therein appears.

All that piece of water bounded by a line starting from Entrance Point at the mouth of the Ashburton

River to Ashburton Island; thence to Direction Island; thence in a South-Easterly direction to Coolgra Point, and thence along the sea-shore to the point of commencement, but so as to include the navigable portion of all rivers and creeks flowing into that area.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of "The Inebriates Act, 1912," it is provided that the Governor may establish institutions for the reception, care, control, and treatment of inebriates, and it is also provided by the said section that an institution may, if the Governor thinks fit, be established by setting apart some portion of an existing hospital of whatever kind for the purpose of the said Act: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that it is desirable to establish an institution for the reception, care, control, and treatment of inebriates on Buckland Hill Suburban Lot 30: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of "The Inebriates Act, 1912," and of all powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby establish as from the 23rd day of October, 1924, that portion of the Greenplace Mental Hospital known as the Nurses' Quarters and situated on Buckland Hill Suburban Lot 30 as an institution for the reception, care, control, and treatment of inebriates.

Increase of Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2884/24.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, from time to time, by Order in Council, declare and determine the number of members constituting a Road Board and the number of members for each Ward thereof: And whereas it is desirable to increase the number of members of the West Arthur Road Board from seven to nine, and re-allocate the number of members for each Ward: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby declare and determine that the number of members constituting the West Arthur Road Board shall be nine in lieu of seven as heretofore, and shall be allocated as shown in the Schedule hereto:—

To come into force on and from the first day of March, 1925, and the two vacancies so created shall be filled upon the day set apart under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," for holding the annual elections.

All the existing members of the North-East and South-West Wards shall continue in office until the twenty-eighth day of March, when they shall retire apart and in addition to any other member who would retire from any of the other Wards under ordinary circumstances.

*Water Boards Act, 1904.**Pinjarra Water Area.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to constitute the district of a Local Authority or the districts of two or more Local Authorities or any part or parts of such a district or districts, a Water Area under such name as may be directed: And whereas, under the provisions of the said Act, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute a Water Board to manage and control such area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute an area having the boundaries described in the schedule hereunder, a Water Area for the purpose of the said Act, under the name of the Pinjarra Water Area, and does hereby appoint the Murray Road Board to be a Water Board, under the name of the Pinjarra Water Board, for the administration of the Act within such area.

Schedule.

Starting at a point on the right bank of the Murray River situate in the Eastern prolongation of the Northern boundary of Murray Location 3, and extending Westerly to and along part of the said boundary to the South-

West corner of Pinjarra Townsite; thence North along its Western boundary to the South boundary of Location 13; thence Easterly along part of said boundary and onwards to the right bank of the said river; thence in a general South-Easterly direction along said bank to a point about 3 chains North of the present bridge over the said river, on the Perth-Pinjarra Road; thence South-Easterly to the intersection of the North-Western side of said road with the Eastern side of the Pinjarra-Fremantle Road; thence North-Easterly along said side of first-mentioned road to its intersection with the Northern prolongation of the Eastern boundary of the Pinjarra Railway Station Yard Reserve; thence 173 degrees 46 minutes, 28 chains 1.9 links, along said Eastern boundary; thence about 89 degrees 38 minutes, 10 chains 50 links; thence 173 degrees 46 minutes, about 2 chains 88 links; thence 144 degrees 46 minutes, about 8 chains; thence 269 degrees 38 minutes to and along the Southern boundaries of Lots 11 to 2 on L.T.O. Plan 3242, and onwards to the right bank of the aforesaid river, and thence in a general South-Westerly direction along said bank to the starting point.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 21st day of January, 1925.

THE PEARLING ACT, 1912-24.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Subsection 5 of Section 31 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," it is provided that: When the remuneration to which a diver or other pearl-fisher employed in pearling in connection with any ship consists wholly or in part of an allowance or lay calculated with reference to the quantity of pearl-shell or pearls fished by him or with his assistance, then the right to such allowance or lay shall be deemed to be a right to share in the results or proceeds of the pearling, within the meaning of this section, unless the allowance or lay is calculated on such basis as shall be prescribed, and at a percentage not exceeding the prescribed percentage: And whereas His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council of the State are of opinion that it is desirable to prescribe the bases and maximum percentages on and at which such allowances or lays as aforesaid shall be calculated with reference to the quantity of pearl-shell fished. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," and all other powers him in this behalf enabling, make the following regulation and order and prescribe that the bases and maximum percentages set out in the Schedule hereto shall be the bases and maximum percentages on and at which such allowances or lays as aforesaid shall be calculated with reference to the quantity of pearl-shell fished. Where such allowance or lay as aforesaid is paid to more than one pearl-fisher on any pearling ship, the aggregate of such allowances or lays shall not exceed the amount which would be payable to one person in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

THE LICENSING ACT, 1911.

(As amended.)

Prohibition Regulations.

1. In these Regulations—

"Prohibition poll" means a vote or poll taken under Part VI. of the Licensing Act on the proposal that prohibition shall come into force in Western Australia;

"Licensing Act" means the Licensing Act, 1911, and its amendments;

"Electoral Act" means the Electoral Act, 1907, and its amendments.

2. For the taking of a prohibition poll under Part VI. of the Licensing Act, the Governor may, by warrant under his hand, in the Form No. 1 in the schedule hereto, direct the Clerk of the Writs appointed under the Electoral Act to issue writs for the taking of a prohibition poll in each of the electoral districts in the State.

3. On receipt of such warrant the Clerk of the Writs shall cause a writ, in the Form No. 2 in the schedule hereto, to be issued to the Returning Officer appointed under the Licensing Act for each electoral district.

4. Before any warrant is issued as aforesaid, fourteen days' notice of the intention to issue the same shall be published in the *Gazette*.

5. The Chief Electoral Officer appointed under the Electoral Act shall, for the purposes of the prohibition poll, be charged (in addition to the duties imposed upon him by the Licensing Act) with duties corresponding, *mutatis mutandis*, to those imposed on him by the Electoral Act, 1907. In particular, the Chief Electoral Officer shall be charged with the duties of making all necessary arrangements for the taking of the poll and of supplying all necessary material to the Returning Officers concerned.

6. A Returning Officer shall be appointed under the Licensing Act for each electoral district in the State.

7. The Governor may also appoint Assistant Returning Officers to count the votes in the ballot boxes at the polling places respectively specified in their appointments. The duties of an Assistant Returning Officer shall correspond, so far as may be, to those of an Assistant Returning Officer appointed under the Electoral Act.

8. The polling places shall be such as are appointed by the Governor under Section 103 of the Licensing Act and notified in the *Gazette*.

9. (1.) The prohibition poll shall be taken on the Legislative Assembly rolls.

(2.) Each Returning Officer shall apply to the Electoral Registrar for his electoral district for the requisite number of copies of the roll for the conduct of the prohibition poll concerned, and such rolls shall be signed and dated by the Electoral Registrar. Prior to their issue for use at the polling places, such rolls shall also be signed and dated by the Returning Officer.

10. (1.) The Presiding Officer shall put to every person claiming to vote the following question:—

(a) Do you live in this electoral district? And if such question is answered in the negative, the following additional questions:—

(b) Have you within the last preceding three months *bona fide* lived within this electoral district?

(c) Where was your place of living in this electoral district?

(2.) The Presiding Officer may, and, at the request of any scrutineer shall, put to any person claiming to vote at a prohibition poll, all or any of the following additional questions:—

(d) Are you the person whose name appears as
(here state name
under which the person claims to vote) on the roll?

(e) Where is your place of living for this electoral district?

(f) Are you of the full age of 21 years?

(g) Are you a natural born or naturalised subject of the King?

(h) Have you lived in Western Australia for six months continuously?

(i) Have you already voted here or elsewhere at this poll?

(j) Are you disqualified from voting?

(3.) The Presiding Officer shall make a note in writing of the name and number on the roll of such elector questioned under subsection (2) of this regulation, and of each elector under whose name any person questioned claimed to vote, and of each reply or refusal to reply on the part of such elector or person.

(4.) The Presiding Officer may, and shall when requested by a scrutineer, require any person claiming to vote, to make a declaration in the Form No. 3 in the schedule hereto, before receiving a ballot paper.

(5.) The electoral roll in force at the time of the prohibition poll shall be conclusive evidence of the right of each person enrolled thereon to vote as an elector, unless he refuses to answer fully any such question put to him by the Presiding Officer, or to make the declaration requested of him, or fails by his answer to satisfy the Presiding Officer that he is entitled to vote.

11. Electors entitled to vote by post under the provisions of the Electoral Act may vote by post in connection with the prohibition poll, after the issue of writs, before Postal Vote Officers appointed under the Electoral Act, and the postal ballot paper shall be in the Form No. 4 in the schedule hereto: Provided that for the purpose of a prohibition poll Section 89 of the Electoral Act shall have effect as if the words "the issue of the writ" were substituted for the words "the nominations have been declared."

12. An elector not entitled to record his vote by post must apply for a ballot paper at a polling place within the electoral district within which he lives and for which he is enrolled, and the ballot paper shall be in the Form No. 5 in the schedule hereto.

13. Instead of complying with Section 150 of the Electoral Act, the Returning Officer in each district shall, in accordance with paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of Section 104 of the Licensing Act, seal up the voting papers in two parcels and the rejected votes in the third parcel, and forward the parcels with the statement of the result of the count of the votes to the Chief Electoral Officer, who shall retain such parcels for a period of 40 days from the day fixed for the return of the writ, after which they may be destroyed. Unused ballot papers shall be retained by the Returning Officer for a similar period, after which they may be destroyed.

14. The Chief Electoral Officer's certificate of the result of the prohibition poll shall be in the Form No. 6 in the schedule hereto.

15. Subject to these regulations, the provisions of the Electoral Act, and the regulations made thereunder, and the authoritative directions issued in respect of parliamentary elections to the officials concerned, so far

as the same are applicable to the prohibition poll under the Licensing Act, 1911, shall *mutatis mutandis* apply.

16. The fees and allowances payable to electoral officials by regulations under the Electoral Act shall be payable in connection with the taking of a prohibition poll under the Licensing Act.

RIGHTS IN WATER AND IRRIGATION ACT, 1914.

*Harvey No. 1 District.**Additional By-laws.*

P.W.W.S. 442/23.

IT is notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," of the amendment of the By-laws for the Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th April, 1916, in manner following, that is to say, by deleting paragraph (b) of By-law 21 and substituting therefor:—

(b) Subject as provided by the said Act and the regulations, every ratepayer who has duly paid his rates for the then current year shall, during such year, so far as water is available, on payment in advance of the further sum of Two shillings and sixpence per acre for each watering of such area as he requires watering, with a minimum payment of £1 for each watering, be supplied with consequent waterings at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Minister may direct.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919.

Regulations.

P.W. 2660/21.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 41 of "The Traffic Act, 1919," and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, make the following Regulations:—

160. A "motor omnibus" is a motor vehicle used as a passenger vehicle and having seating capacity for not less than eight passengers (exclusive of the driver and conductor) and plying for hire at a fare for each passenger. (*Act No. 37 of 1924, Section 2.*)

161. The number of passengers that may be carried in a motor omnibus is limited to the number of passengers stated in the application for and in the particulars in the passenger vehicle license held for the motor omnibus, and the number so stated shall be the number of passengers the motor omnibus is licensed to carry.

No person being the owner of, or the person in charge of, a motor omnibus for which a passenger vehicle license is held shall carry or suffer or permit to be carried in such motor omnibus a number of passengers exceeding the number the motor omnibus is licensed to carry.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

162. The number of passengers that may be carried in any vehicle used for the carriage of passengers for hire, and licensed as a passenger vehicle, but not being a motor omnibus, is limited to the number stated in the application for the license and in the particulars in the license.

No person shall carry, in a vehicle licensed as a passenger vehicle, a number of passengers exceeding the number stated in the particulars in the license.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Northam made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 44, for the regulating of the standing of Motor Cars in Streets.

- (d) A stand on each side of Grey Street, beginning at a point 25ft. west from the western extremity of the footpath on the western side of Fitzgerald Street, and extending westward to Bernard Park.
- (e) A stand on each side of Peel Terrace, beginning at a point 25ft. west from the western extremity of the footpath on the western side of Fitzgerald Street, and extending westward to Bernard Park.
