*Alteration of "Prohibited Period" in the Narembreen Road District.*

"Food for Starving Stock.—In *bona fide* cases in which hay, straw, chaff, green fodder, ensilage, mangel-wurzels, molasses, maize, turnips, and all classes of food has been used within the State solely for feeding horses starving grazing stock, including horses, through mileage rates will be charged, and a rebate of 25 per cent. off such rates will be allowed, subject to the following conditions:—

"The rebate will be made after the expiration of one month from the date of application, conditionally upon the production of a statutory declaration to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, from the pastoralists or other settlers affected, that the natural feed has failed through the drought, and that the food carried by rail has been used within the State solely for feeding horses

and grazing stock that would otherwise have perished through starvation. No rebate will be given on consignments to stations within a radius of 100 miles from Fremantle.

"In those cases where the full rate is levied in the first instance, no reduction on such charges will be allowed unless application for the concession is made and the necessary certificate tendered within three calendar months from the date of trucking.

"These concessions operate on Government lines only."
