Know ye that We do by this Our Commission appoint you to be a Commissioner—

To investigate the conditions under which the mining industry is carried on in Western Australia, and report upon possible measures for the stimulation and improvement of economic production of minerals, with recommendations as to action best to be taken for such purpose;

To inquire into and report upon possible improvements in the mining equipment and practices in use in Western Australia for breaking out minerals and extracting them from the mines, with a view to increasing the profit obtainable from the richer material, and making it possible to increase production by extracting lower grade ores profitably;

To inquire into and report upon possible improvements in the metallurgical treatment of Western Australian metalliferous ores, and preparation and marketing of other useful minerals;

To make investigation with the view to better organisation of the mining proprietaries which have the direction and control of mining and treatment of minerals, and to make recommendations thereon and with regard to the possible combination or amalgamation of com-

panies, and mining and milling plants, for the purposes of mining and treatment of minerals to better advantage;

To advise as to improvement of existing practice in respect of betterment of health and welfare conditions of mine-workers.

THE ELECTRIC LIGHTING ACT, 1892.

Regulations relating to work on alternating current overhead lines.

Low and Medium Pressure Supplies:

35. No person other than an experienced linesman shall be allowed to work on live overhead wires or do any work on the pole within three feet from the lowest cross arm or wire.

36. Where work is to be done on or about wires containing pressures exceeding 200 volts, the linesman shall be provided with an assistant.

37. The linesman shall at all times be provided with rubber gloves and a linesman's belt.

38. If the line construction is such that the linesman will be working in between two or more wires, then all the wires except the one being worked on for the time being shall be temporarily covered with a rubber covering not less than four feet long.

39. An approved remote control device to give the linesman or his assistant control over the electric supply to the section upon which work is being performed is to be provided and used wherever it is possible to do so.

High or extra high pressure supplies:

40. In all cases before work is started, the lines shall be bonded and, where possible, the bonds shall also be earthed.

41. In cases where there are more than one set of supply lines, each set shall be bonded and earthed as above.

42. In cases where the supply lines can be fed from more than one control point, the wires on the poles on either side of the pole being worked on shall be bonded and earthed as above.

43. In the case of non-attended sub-stations, the access to the switch shall be locked by the linesman who has to work on the line, and he alone shall have control of the key for the re-setting of the switch.

44. In the case of attended sub-stations, the name of the linesman who is to work on the line shall be clearly logged, and a disc shall be hung on the open switch stating that "this switch is open—Men are working on the line."

45. If the telephone is used for giving the "all clear" signal, the person giving the message shall be the linesman in charge of the particular work whose name has been logged, and the sub-station attendant receiving the message shall satisfy himself that the message is from that man.

46. The sub-station attendant shall not replace the switch on a message received from any person other than the linesman whose name appears in the log.

47. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding £50 for each offence.
