WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of January, 1925, the 1st day of March, 1925, was fixed as the date on which "The Workers' Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1924," should come into force, subject to the proviso that the operation of Section 5 of the said Act, so far as it extends to the diseases mentioned in the first column of the Third Schedule to the said Act set opposite the words "Mining or quarrying or stone crushing or cutting" as the description of process, should be limited to the South-West Division of the State as prescribed by "The Land Act, 1898": And whereas it is desirable that Section 5 of the said Act and the Third Schedule therein referred to, except as regards Pneumoconiosis, Miner's phthisis, Ankylostomiasis, and Nystagmus, should come into operation throughout the State as from and after the 1st day of March next: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 1st day of March, 1925, as the date on which the Workers' Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1924, shall come into operation throughout the State, except so far as Section 5 thereof and the Third Schedule therein referred to extends to Pneumoconiosis, Miner's phthisis, Ankylostomiasis, and Nystagmus as the description of diseases set opposite the words "Mining or quarrying or stone crushing or cutting" as the description of process in the said schedule; and do order and declare that the said Section 5, so far as it extends to the said diseases, Pneumoconiosis, Miner's phthisis, Ankylostomiasis, and Nystagmus, shall not come into operation until such date as may be fixed by a subsequent Proclamation.

Advertising Hoardings.

Whereas by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the South Perth Road Board, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-law:—

- In the construction of this By-law:—
 - The word "hoarding" shall mean a hoarding erected for advertising purposes.
 - The word "occupier" shall mean the person having the use and control of a hoarding.
 - The word "owner" shall mean the owner of the land on which a hoarding is erected.
 - "Building Surveyor" shall mean the Building Surveyor for the time being of the South Perth Road Board.
 - The word "Board" shall mean the South Perth Road Board.
 - The word "District" shall mean the South Perth Road District.
 - The word "advertisement" shall mean and include papers, bills, or posters and all other advertisements of any nature or kind whatsoever stencilled, painted, embossed, affixed, pasted, or placed in any way on any hoarding.

2. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding unless and until a plan and specification, showing clearly the position and size and the method of and the materials to be used in the construction of and the manner of fixing same shall have been deposited with and approved by the Building Surveyor, and except in accordance with such plan and specification.

3. No person shall erect a hoarding unless the distance from the face of such hoarding to the alignment of the nearest street or way shall be at least equal to the distance from the level of such street or way to the highest point of such hoarding. Provided that in no case shall the height of any hoarding exceed twenty-one feet. The top of the hoarding shall be finished level and, save as provided in the succeeding section, in a straight line. The name of the owner of the hoarding may, however, be fixed immediately on top of the hoarding near the centre of the length of same.

4. Every person erecting a hoarding, or the occupier or owner of a hoarding already erected at the corner of two streets, shall cause such hoarding to be rounded off or splayed off to its full height, as may be required by the Building Surveyor.

5. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any hoarding, unless and until the proposed alteration or addition shall have been approved in writing by the Building Surveyor.

6. No person shall allow any hoarding to become dilapidated or in a dangerous or neglected condition, and if any paper or other material affixed thereto shall become detached therefrom such paper or other material shall forthwith be removed and cleared away.

7. No person shall affix or attach to or paste or paint on any hoarding any bill, placard, or advertisement of an objectionable nature.

8. Every hoarding shall at all times have the name of the occupier clearly shown in a conspicuous place on the front of the hoarding.

9. If any person does any act contrary to or neglects or omits to do any act required to be done by or commits a breach of or offends against this By-law he shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this By-law and shall be liable for every such breach to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Schedule of Wharfage Dues and Handling and Haulage Charges.

All goods landed from or shipped into any ship shall pay wharfage dues and handling and haulage charges as under, provided that goods transhipped from Beadon Jetty to the Old Jetty at Onslow shall be liable to one full wharfage within the Port, but consignees shall make their own arrangements for handling at the Old Jetty. Such wharfage dues and handling and haulage charges, except where otherwise provided, shall be levied on ship's measurement or weight, at the option of the wharfinger or officer-in-charge.

Stores for consumption by the vessel by which shipped are free of wharfage dues, but handling and haulage charges shall be payable at ordinary cargo rates according to services rendered.

Lighting Goods Shed and Jetty—£2 per night or part thereof.

Overtime.—When salaried officers are called upon to work overtime in the interests of vessels or consignees, overtime shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hour per officer.

Handling Vessels Lines—Minimum £1.

Crane Hire—2/- per hour or part thereof.

Watering Sheep—3/- per hundred, minimum 3/-.

Watering Cattle—1d. per head, minimum 3/-.

Passenger Fares—Adult, Single 1/-; Return 1/6. Children, under 12, free, at the discretion of the Wharfinger.

Storage—M.O.P. Shell, 6d. per ton per week.
