Redivision into Wards and Alteration of Beundaries with Dumbleyung and Kent Road Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

6. The Board may at any time demand that the hier shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building or furniture.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building or furniture shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act, or any Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of any building.

any subject suitable to the branch he has been appointed to, shall be granted scale increase of salary three months prior to his birthday: Provided that in respect to (i.) the increase shall only apply to the ensuing scale increase, but in respect of (ii.) and (iii.) shall apply to future service. future service.

(b.) In addition, a junior male clerk who holds cer-tificates for Telegraphy and Railway Accounts, as per (a), and qualifies in Safe Working, or the qualifying

examination suitable to his branch, on or before attaining the age of 21 years, shall be granted a further ad-vance of three months on his scale increase, and such increase shall apply to his future service.

5. Hours of Duty.

(a.) The hours of duty of officers (other than Transport Officers) employed in the Head and District offices shall be:

Mondays to Fridays-9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (with interval of one hour for lunch);

Saturdays-9 a.m. to 12 noon.

(b.) The hours of Telegraphists shall be six and a-half per shift at the Perth Operating Room, exclusive of meal hour. At other stations, seven hours per shift, exclusive of meal hour.

(c.) Station-masters, Assistant and Night Station-masters, and Relief Officers shall work forty-eight hours per week, exclusive of Sundays.

(d.) The spread of shift for Station-masters, Assistant and Night Station-masters, and Relief Officers shall not exceed ten hours over all, except at stations where the train service renders it impracticable, where the spread may be extended to twelve hours.

(e.) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for Inspectors or other officers who are required to travel in the performance of their duties.

(f.) All other officers shall work forty-eight hours per week, exclusive of Sundays: Provided that where the present custom is to work a lesser number of hours, such custom shall continue.

(g.) Any time taken by an officer in handing over at change of shifts shall not be counted as time worked.

(h.) No officer shall be booked off for meals for adjustment of hours between 12 midnight and 6 a.m.

6. Overtime.

(a.) Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours in any one week and can only be claimed under the following conditions:---

- Less than 30 minutes—Not to be paid for. 30 minutes and up to 37 minutes—Half an hour. 38 minutes and up to 52 minutes—Three-quarters of an hour.
- 53 minutes and up to 67 minutes-One hour.
- 68 minutes and up to 82 minutes-One hour and a

quarter. 83 minutes and up to 97 minutes-One hour and ahalf.

and thereafter on similar basis.

(b.) Overtime shall be paid for at the ordinary rate of pay for all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours up to two hours per day; over that period, time and a quarter.

(c.) All officers engaged on work which may be defined by the Commissioner as special, in excess of the recognised working hours, shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a quarter for the whole of such overtime.

(d.) The recognised hours of duty shall be as laid down in Clause 5, Subclauses (a) to (g).

(e.) In computing the number of hours worked per week, time absent on sick leave and holidays, when paid for, shall be treated as time worked.

(f.) Any periods up to five minutes on any days are not to count in the week's total. The first two hours' overtime, or any portion thereof, in any one day may be adjusted in the week's total, but any overtime be-yond the two hours in any days will stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(g.) The foregoing subclauses (a) to (f) shall apply to:

(i.) The Head and Administrative Officers.

(ii.) Metropolitan and Suburban Station Officers,
 (iii.) Station and other officers at depôt stations.

(h.) The foregoing subclauses (a) to (f) shall also apply to all other stations regarding overtime worked through-

(i.) the late or irregular running of trains, (ii.) the running of special or conditional trains,

(iii.) on account of the absence of other members of the staff, or

(iv.) increased volume of traffic.

(i.) All other overtime worked shall be paid for at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(j.) Any officer in receipt of a salary of £385 per annum and over shall not be entitled to overtime pay.

7. Sunday. time.

(a.) Officers who are called upon for Sunday duty shall, if the work is of such nature that it cannot be carried out within the usual hours of duty, be paid for such duty as under, calculated at one three hundred and thirteenth of a year's salary for each full Sunday worked :-

- (i.) Officers who do not ordinarily work on Sundays, such as those specially brought on duty occasionally or in cases of emergency, shall be paid time and a-half;
- (ii.) Other officers to be paid at ordinary rates and allowed the following paid leave, viz., one day for working each four full, five three-
- (iii.) Christmas Day and Good Friday to be considered as Sundays in so far as this subclause operates.

(b.) The following shall be the scale for calculating Sunday time:-

- (i.) Less than a quarter of an hour worked in continuance of a shift beginning on a Saturday or in commencement of a shift terminating on Monday-Nil.
- (ii.) Up to and including a quarter of a day's work -Quarter day.
- (iii.) Over one-quarter and up to and including half a day—Half day.
 (iv.) Over half and up to and including three-quar-ters of a day—Three-quarters.
- (v.) Over three-quarters and up to one day-One day.

(c.) An officer who on a Sunday works more than his ordinary week-day rostered shift shall be paid for the actual time worked.

(d.) If an officer works a broken shift on Sunday, each section of the shift shall stand alone for computing the time to be paid for.

(e.) No break of shift shall be allowed between the hours of 12 midnight and 6 a.m.

(f.) In computing Sunday time for Inspectors the ordinary hours of duty shall be deemed to be those worked at the Head and District offices.

8. Leave of Absence, Annual.

(a.) After twelve months' continuous service, all officers shall be entitled to annual paid leave of twelve

days and public holidays, or days in lieu thereof, up to a maximum of eight days in any one year. (b.) Two days extra annual leave shall be granted to officers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and North and East thereof, and on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe

Railway, and thereof, and on the inperformation averaging Railway, and twelve days extra annual leave to officers on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway. (c.) Leave of absence shall be calculated to the close of each financial year, and shall be paid for at the salary the officer is in receipt of at the time such annual leave is taken.

(d.) The leave shall be applied for and taken out at a time convenient to the department before the thirtieth June following the year for which it fell due; at the expiration of that time the leave shall lapse unless such leave shall have been deferred by the department or the permission of the Commissioner obtained for its accumulation.

(c.) In urgent cases leave in addition to the foregoing may be granted, without pay, for a period not exceeding six months. Any public holidays falling due during the period in which an officer is on leave without pay shall not be paid for.

(f.) Subject to the proviso hereto, any officer with more than six months' service who may resign or be dismissed from the service, shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays pro rata up to the time of leaving the service: Provided that if an officer be dismissed for being under the influence of liquor or for drunkenness, he shall be entitled to be paid for such leave (if any) as was due up to the thirtieth June previous, and if dismissed for peculation, tampering with ticket issues, or manipulation of the books of the department, he shall not be entitled to payment for any holidays.

(g.) The next-of-kin of a deceased officer shall be granted payment of pro rata annual leave to the date of the decease of the officer.

9. Absence without Pay.

Any term in excess of three months an officer is absent from duty from any cause without pay shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

10. Long Service Leave.

(a.) The Commissioner shall grant to any officer who has continued on the salaried staff for ten years long service leave for three calendar months on full pay or six calendar months on half pay. For the subsequent period of ten years the same conditions shall apply, and thereafter for every seven years similar leave shall be granted.

(b.) Service prior to attaining the age of eighteen years shall not count in computing long service leave.

(c.) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an officer is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(d.) If a deceased officer leaves a widow, dependent children, mother, or invalid sister, payment pro rata of long service leave up to the date of such officer's death shall be granted to such dependent or dependents.

(e.) In the case of an officer who, on account of the exigencies of the department, is regressed to the wages stail and subsequently reappointed to the salaried staff, the time served on the salaried staff prior to regression shall be counted in computing service for long service leave.

(f.) Any officer who resigns or is retired from the service, except as provided for in subclause (g), shall be paid for long service leave due at the time of resignation or retirement.

(g.) Any officer who retires or is retired upon reaching the retiring age, or through ill-health, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to date of retirement.

(h.) An officer dismissed from the service shall not he entitled to payment for long service leave.

(i.) A female officer resigning from the service for the purpose of getting maried and who has been con-tinuously employed for three years and over, shall be granted payment, *pro rata*, of her long service leave at the date of retirement, subject to the proviso in subclause (b).

11. Sick Leave.

(a.) Any officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall, as soon as possible, advise his superior officer in sufficient time to admit of airangements being made for the performance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave.

(b.) Any officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will be able to resume duty to enable any necessary arrangements to be made,

(c.) Should the absence be prolonged beyond one day the officer shall, except as provided in paragraph (d), forward to his superior officer on the second day thereof a certificate from any legally qualified medical practitioner, showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.

(d.) Any such officer who resides more than five miles from a legally qualified medical practitioner shall intimate that fact to his superior officer, within whose discretion it shall lie as to whether a certificate is required or not.

(c.) Any officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown in the first and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the period shown in the inst extribute shall thereupon furnish a further certificate, and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the periods respectively covered by such certificates: Pro-vided, however, that the maximum period between the dates of furnishing any two medical certificates shall be fourtien days be fourteen days.

(f.) In cases where incapacity for duty is obvious to the Head of the Branch, he may relieve the officer of

the necessity of providing medical certificate. (g.) Any officer shall, if so directed, present himself for examination by a medical officer at such time and place as may be fixed.

(h.) Any officer who has been absent for three days (not continuous) in one financial year shall, if instructed by his superior officer, furnish a medical certifi-

cate for absences of one day only. (i.) Officers who have conformed to the foregoing may be granted sick leave (exclusive of annual and long service leave) as follows:-

Officers with six, or less than six months' service-Nil.

Officers with more than six months but less than officers with three years' service. Two weeks on full pay for each completed six months' service. Officers with three years' service and over—Three months on full pay and three months on half pay.

[MARCH 6, 1925.

(j.) Such leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay provided for must not be exceeded.

(k.) In no case shall an officer be granted more than three months on full pay and three months on half pay in any one triennial period, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner. The triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which payment is claimed.

(1.) No payment will be made for any absence due to an officer s own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

(m.) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house will not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence will be granted under this seetion, excepting under special circumstances to be ap-proved by the Commissioner.

12. Away from Home Allowances.

(a.) Allowances to meet the travelling expenses of officers will be paid as under:--

(f.) The daily rate shall represent in equal portions (f.) The daily rate shall represent in equal portions the expenses for three meals and a bed. For the purpose of computing expenses, in the case of arrival at home station, breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later than 8 a.m., lunch if later than 1 p.m., tea if later than 6 p.m., and bed if later than 11 p.m. (g.) When an officer is absent from home station for less than a full day and night, reasonable actual ex-penses, with a maximum of 2s. per meal in suburban areas and 2s of year meal outside suburban areas will be

(h.) When a sleeping berth is provided, the bed allowance will not apply, except when a bed has been paid for classwhere for a portion of the night.

(i.) An officer on a weekly rate of expenses sleeping at a barracks where no other accommodation is avail-able shall be charged the sum of 7s. 6d. per week.

(j.) Incidental expenses, such as eab fares and cartage of personal luggage, will be allowed provided the time away from home station is sufficient to warrant such expenditure.
(k.) Where an officer stationed within the metropoli-

tan-suburban area is instructed to work during or over meal hour, he may be paid a maximum allowance of 2s. per meal, provided he could not conveniently have his meal in the usual way and that no payment for overtime is made.

(1.) In cases where an officer is engaged at other than his home station in receipt of weekly rate of

allowance and is temporarily away from such station, the daily allowance will be paid in lieu of the weekly rate for the period of such temporary absence for one day or over; it the absence is less than one day, reasonable actual expenses will be paid.

(m.) Where an officer is relieving on expenses for a period of less than twenty-eight days, he shall not re-ceive greater payment for relieving expenses than he would have received if he had been relieving for twentyeight days.

(n.) Engineering officers while in camp provided by the department shall be paid a daily allowance of 6s. in lieu of the scale allowance shown in subclause (d).

(o.) An additional allowance of twenty per cent. shall be granted an officer stationed outside the areas defined in Clause 15, subclauses (a) and (b), when travelling within such areas.

(p.) Where officers travel by steamer on which the fare paid includes sustenance, an allowance of fifteen per cent. of the passage money shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowances. (q.) Officers travelling on duty to the Eastern States via the Trans-Australian Railway will be paid such

allowance trom time of leaving Kalgoorlie until return

allowance from time of leaving Kargornie until return thereto, as the Commissioner may determine. (r.) Any unmarried officer who is required to under-take duties away from his headquarters and who remains at one foreign station for a period exceeding twenty-eight days, will not be granted away from home allow-ance, but will be paid any reasonable expenses incurred in twendling to and from his headquarters in travelling to and from his headquarters.

(s.) Subclauses (c), (e), (m), and (r) will not apply until an officer has received information that his stay at one place will be of such duration as to bring him under the provisions of these subclauses.

(t.) In special cases the above scale may be increased by the Commissioner.

13. Lodging Allowance.

(a.) Any junior in receipt of a salary of less than a board and lodging allowance equivalent to the difference between his annual salary and £120 per annum.

(b.) No allowance under this clause shall be continued-

- (i.) during absence from duty without pay;
 (ii.) during any period of annual leave;
 (iii.) during any period of other absence from duty with pay unless the officer concerned con-tinues to reside away from his home;
- (iv.) during any period (after the expiration of one month) in which the officer is continuously in receipt of travelling or away from home allowance.

14. Transfer Allowance.

(a.) Any officer transferred from one station to another over one mile distant, involving a change of residence, shall-

- (i.) be paid not less than £4 for a married officer and 15s. for a single officer;
- (ii.) be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred ;
- (iii.) be granted free passes for self and family, and free railway transport of his furniture and effects, including one cow or not more than two goats. (b.) Any officer who is transferred from one place to

is absent without pay, and in the ease of an officer leaving the service for any cause and due for payment in lieu of holidays, allowance shall not be paid for the period of such holidays.

16. Free Passes, Privilege Tickete, etc.

Free Passes:

(a.) After twelve months' continuous service an officer shall be allowed three first class passes per annum as ander:-

One station to station pass on the occasion of the annual or long service leave to cover the full term of leave due.

Two privilege passes from one given station to another, and return.

In addition to the officer, the passes shall be available for his wife and members of his family under eighteen years of age unmarried, unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, and the mother of an officer, pro-vided they are resident with and dependent upon him for support.

widower with his child or children resident with him and who regularly employs a housekeeper may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be granted passes for such housekeeper; in like manner an unmarried officer supporting younger brothers and/or sisters may be granted passes for such housekeeper. (b.) Upon request an officer may be granted a separ-

ate station to station pass for his wife and dependents, as mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, where it is in-convenient for both to travel at the same time. (c.) After six months' continuous service an officer

shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in subclause (a) in proportion to length of service; should any officer through illness be unable to use his station to station pass on the occasion of his annual leave, he shall be en-titled to the use of such pass on the occasion of taking leave without pay during the year in which same is due.

(d.) An officer who resigns or is retired from the service and has leave due shall be granted a free pass, station to station, for the term of such holidays.

(e.) On production of a certificate from the General Secretary of the Railway Institute, rasses shall be issued to an officer for the sole purpose of attending approved classes at the Railway Institute.

(f.) Officers in isolated parts may be issued free rasses, at the discretion of the Hend of the Branch, for the purpose of obtaining medical attention. (g.) Free passes shall not apply to Race Specials,

Guaranteed Specials, or Special Excursion Trains within fifty miles radius, or when in the opinion of the stationmaster at the station where the officer desires to commence his journey there is not ample room on the train.

Market Passes:

(h.) Officers stationed outside suburban areas will be issued market passes once per month to the most con-venient market town. The passes may be issued in The passes may be issued in avour of the officer, his wife or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years. An officer's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight if required.

Free Freight:

(i.) Domestic supplies, up to a maximum weight fortnightly of 2cwt. for married men and 1cwt. for single men, shall be carried tree by rail to home station from the most convenient market town and, in addition, meat, bread, vegetables, and dairy produce, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the nearest town where same are procurable.

All such supplies must be for the sole use of the officer and his family.

Market Towns:

(j.) The following shall be approved market towns: -rremantle, Perth, Northam, Merredin, Southern Cross, Kalgoorlie, Bunbury, Collie, York, Beverley, Pingelly, Narrogin, Wagin, Katanning, Albany, Geraldton, Mul-lewa, Cue, Port Hedland.

Privilege Tickets:

(k.) After six months' continuous service an officer shall be allowed privilege return tickets for himself, wife, and members of his family under eighteen years of age, also unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, provided they are resident with and dependent upon the officer's earnings. The charge for privilege tickets to be half the single fare for the return journey, with a minimum of 1s. for adults and 6d. for children.

(1.) For the purpose of this clause a member of the tamity shall be deemed to be dependent provided such member's income does not exceed fifteen shillings per week, exclusive of old age or invalid pension, but a member of the tamily temporarily out of employment shall not be deemed to be dependent.

(b.) These season tickets shall be available only whilst the holder is in the employ of the department. (c.) Should the holder resign or change his place of

18. Resignations and Retirements.

(a.) No officer shall leave the department until the expiration of one month's written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b.) One calendar month's notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such officer whose services are no longer required, provided that this subclause shall not a piy to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct or to officers for whom the Commissioner is unable to find work or whom he may deem it unnecessary to employ by reason of any action on the part of any of his employees, of for any eause beyond his control.

19. Promotions.

(a.) Promotion and the selection of any officer to act in a higher position shall be governed by relative ability, suitability, record and experience. If everything else is deemed equal, the senior officer shall be selected for promotion.

(b.) As a general rule officers and employees of the branch in which the vacancy occurs will be promoted to the higher position, but the Commissioner may, when he considers it advisable for the good of the service, select an officer from one branch for position in another, either in the same or in a higher class.

(c.) When considered necessary, a person from outside the service may be appointed to any position in the service, provided there is not an officer in the service capable of filling the position. (d.) No officer shall refuse compliance with any order

directing his transfer from one position to another, but if on a peal the Commissioner is satisfied that the objection is sound, then such officer shall not be penalised. (c.) An officer desiring to be passed over in the event of promotion being offered shall, if his request be acceded to, forfeit all claim to promotion for two years, but if good and sufficient reason be given the Commissioner, he may restore such claim.

(f.) All officers promoted to a higher position shall be (i.) In other probability period of six months and paid the minimum rate of salary assigned to the class to which they are promoted, except as provided in subclause (j, ii.) of clause 24. At the end of such period the Head of the Branch shall report to the Commissioner as to the fitness of the officer for the higher nosition: to the fitness of the officer for the ligher position; if the report is satisfactory, the appointment will be confirmed as from the date of taking up the duty; if unsatisfactory, the officer will be provided for at the same salary as he was in receipt of prior to the period of prohetion in the hicker position

of probation in the higher position. (g.) When a vacancy occurs in the service, if the senior officer is not selected for promotion, applications shall be called for the vacancy from officers in the class lower to that in which the vacancy exists.

A list of promotions shall be published in the "Weekly Notice," and any officer who considers that he has been unjustly passed over may appeal, in the first place to the Head of his Branch, and, if not satisfied with the latter's reply, may then appeal to the Com-missioner, whose decision shall be final; but no appeal will be considered unless forwarded so as to reach the Head of the Branch within fourtaen days after receint Head of the Branch within fourteen days after receipt of the "Weekly Notice" and the Commissioner within fourteen days after date of receipt of the reply from the Head of the Branch.

20. Acting in Higher Capacities.

When an officer, other than Relief Officers in Class 5 or higher classes, performs the duties of a position higher than that in which he is classified for a term exceeding one hunar month (continuous or broken) within any one financial year, he shall be paid from the end of that month while performing any such duties at the minimum salary attached to such higher position.

22. General Regulation.

WHEREAS Model By-laws have been prepared in ac-cordance with the provisions of Section 295 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of November, 1914; and whereas the Canning District Road Board, being a Local Health Authority under the provisions of the said Act, did by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th of Mar. 1016, adopt such By laws to be its Dy laws. 5th of May, 1916, adopt such By-laws to be its By-laws; and whereas by the provisions of the said Act a Local Anthority may alter or amend by-laws so made; now, therefore, the Canning District Road Board, being the Local Health Authority for the Canning Road District, doth hereby amend such By-laws by the addition of the following By-law:-

Part IV.-Dairies and Milk Shops.

3A. No person shall carry on the trade of a dairyman, or vendor,

- (a) unless he is the holder of a subsisting license to earry on such trade, issued by the Local Authority; or
- (b) on any premises in respect of which he is for the time not registered by the Local Authority as hereinbefore provided.

Provided that the foregoing provisions of this By-law shall not apply during the first week in January in any year, in respect of a person who was lawfully carrying on the trade at the end of the preceding year.
