The Explosives Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

4294/11.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred by "The Explosives Act, 1895," may from time to time, by order, make, alter, or repeal By-laws or Regulations dealing, amongst other matters, with the storage and sale of Explosives: And whereas, on the 20th day of July, 1904, the Governor in Council made certain Regulations dealing with the storage and sale of Explosives which it is desirable to make: Now, therefore, the Governor in Council does hereby make Regulation 21a in Part 3 of the said Regulations to read as follows:—

21a. In respect to the issue of a store license, to enable the preparation and adaptation for immediate use in quarries and land clearing, the fee of ten shillings shall be charged for the issue of such license.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following amendment of Regulations Nos. 140 and 238 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Regulations.

Amendment of Regulations.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and dated the ninth day of November, 1923, are hereby amended as follows, viz.:—

1. By repealing Regulation No. 140 and enacting the following new Regulation in lieu thereof.

Regulation No. 140.

Kerosene or other Inflammable Oils or Spirits handled on Wharves.

Vessels arriving with kerosene, naphtha, petrol, benzine, turpentine, and other inflammable oils or spirits in cans and cases may be permitted to land it on a wharf for carting or railing to store, or for transhipment provided the same be removed from the wharf before 5 p.m. each day, and no person shall bring such goods for shipment on to any wharf until the vessel about to take the same is prepared to receive it. In no case will such goods be allowed to be stored on any wharf or in any shed, or in any other place within the Trust's boundary, without the expressed consent of the Secretary in writing.

No ship shall load or discharge any inflammable oils or spirits between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m. The Trust may, however, give permission in writing in special cases for this work to be extended until sundown, but no later. The Trust may also give special permission in writing embodying conditions necessary in each instance in the opinion of the Harbour Master, authorising ships having on board inflammable oils or spirits to discharge or load other cargo between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m., but only at hatches other than those containing such oils or spirits, but such special permission shall not be in conflict with the powers vested in the Director of Navigation under "The Australian Navigation Act, 1912-1920," or any amendment thereof, or prescribed in any statutory Rules or Regulations made under such Act.

Watchmen will be appointed by the Trust to supervise the handling of inflammable oils or spirits on the wharves, such watchmen to be maintained throughout the whole time such oils or spirits are being handled or remain upon the premises of the Trust, and the cost of such watching shall be a charge against the consignee or shipper of such goods.

A vessel having on board, whether to be landed at Fremantle or not, any oils or spirits of a lower flashing point than 105deg. Fah. may not be allowed to berth at Victoria Quay. Masters of all ships carrying oils or spirits as cargo must declare their cargo to the pilot before entering the Inner Harbour. Where the Trust Commissioners are not satisfied that any ship having on board inflammable oils or spirits is being efficiently watched to safeguard the interests of the port, by watchmen appointed by the master or owner of such ship in accordance with statutory Rules and Regulations made under "The Australian Navigation Act, 1912-1920," or any amendment thereof, the Commissioners will place watchmen on board such ship at the expense of the owners of same, and the cost of such watchmen must be paid before the ship is handed clearance.

2. By repealing the second paragraph of Regulation No. 238.
