retailers, and the prices paid by consumers; and also  
into the fairness of rents of dwelling-houses of four,  
five, and six rooms in the Metropolitan Area; and to  
report upon what remedial action or legislation can be  
usefully taken or proposed:

And I appoint you, the said Alexander James Reid,  
to be Chairman:

And I declare this to be a Royal Commission within  
the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act,  
1902":

And I hereby desire and request you, with as little  
delay as possible, to report to me in writing the result  
of your inquiries and your recommendations by virtue  
of this Commission.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 39/25.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," it is provided that before undertaking the construction of waterworks, the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference, and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval; and that if they are approved, the Governor may forthwith, by Order in Council, empower the Minister to undertake the construction of the proposed works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the plans, descriptions, books of reference, and estimates marked P.W.D., W.A., 23847, for the construction of waterworks within the Narrogin Water Area, which were duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the said works.

*Constitution of Nungarin Health District under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19."*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-9," that the Governor may constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order: And whereas it is desired to constitute portion of the Nungarin Road District a Health District under the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced within the undermentioned boundaries (being portion of the area comprised in the said Road District) to be a Health District by the name of the Nungarin Health District, under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19." Alteration of Boundaries.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 380/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and either annex it to an existing Road District or constitute such severed portion a Road District, and may divide or redivide a District into Wards: And whereas it is desirable to:—

- (1.) Sever portion of the Roe Road District and annex it to the Lake Grace Road District.
- (2.) Sever portion of the Narembeen Road District and annex it to the Roe Road District.
- (3.) Sever portions of the Corrigin Road District and annex them to the Roe Road District.
- (4.) Sever portion of the Roe Road District (as amended) and constitute such severed portion a Road District to be called the Kondinin Road District.
- (5.) Redivide the Roe Road District into five Wards.
- (6.) Divide the Kondinin Road District into four Wards.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1.) Sever that portion of the Roe Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Lake Grace Road District.
- (2.) Sever that portion of the Narembeen Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex it to the Roe Road District.
- (3.) Sever those portions of the Corrigin Road District as described in Schedule "C" hereto, and annex them to the Roe Road District.
- (4.) Sever that portion of the Roe Road District (as amended by Schedules "A," "B," and "C" hereto) as described in Schedule "D" hereto, and constitute such severed portion a Road District, to be called the Kondinin Road District.
- (5.) Redivide the Roe Road District, the boundaries of which are described in Schedule "E" hereto, into five Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "F" hereto.
- (6.) Divide the Kondinin Road District into four Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward, as described in Schedule "G" hereto.

To come into force on and from the first day of July, 1925.

- (6.) Redivide the Wickepin Road District into five Wards and increase the number of members of the Board from eight to nine.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby:—

- (1.) Sever that portion of the Cuballing Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Wickepin Road District.
- (2.) Sever that portion of the Dumbleyung Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex it to the Wickepin Road District.
- (3.) Sever that portion of the Pingelly Road District as described in Schedule "C" hereto, and annex it to the Wickepin Road District.
- (4.) Sever that portion of the Wickepin Road District as described in Schedule "D" hereto, and annex it to the Pingelly Road District.
- (5.) Sever that portion of the Cuballing Road District as described in Schedule "E" hereto, and annex it to the Pingelly Road District.
- (6.) Redivide the Wickepin Road District into five Wards with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "F" hereto.
- (7.) Declare and determine that the number of members constituting the Wickepin Road Board shall be nine in lieu of eight as heretofore, and shall be allocated as shown in Schedule "G" hereto.

*Amendment of Regulations.*

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and dated the ninth day of November, 1923, are hereby amended by enacting the following new Regulation, viz:—

No. 362A.

*Unguarded Boats not allowed at Rottneest Island.*—During the period from 1st May to 30th November, inclusive, in each year no person having the use or control of any yacht or boat of any description shall leave such yacht or boat on the beaches of or anchored within one mile of low-water mark of the coastline of Rottneest Island, unless such yacht or boat is continually attended by some competent person. (v) To foster fair and legitimate enterprises in motor passenger transport.

(w) To make available the funds of the association for the purpose of protecting the interest of members in matters that affect motor passenger transport as a whole.

(x) To diffuse among its members information on all matters affecting motor passenger transport and the owners of omnibuses, and to print and circulate such papers, periodicals, books, circulars, and other literary undertakings as may seem conducive to any of these objects.

(y) To collect and circulate statistics and other information relating to motor passenger transport and owners and users of omnibuses.

(z) To improve and elevate the technical and general knowledge of persons engaged in or about to engage in motor passenger transport or in any employment, manual or otherwise, in connection therewith, and with a view thereto to provide for the delivery of lectures and the holding of classes.

(aa) To establish, form, and maintain a library and collection of models, designs, drawings, and other articles of interest in connection with motor passenger transport.

(bb) To regulate motor passenger transport services with a view to eliminating "shepherding."

(cc) To present a united front against any undue, unreasonable, or unjustifiable infringement of the rights and privileges of members engaged in motor passenger transport, in respect of routes, stands, and time-tables.

(dd) To regulate the time-tables of members for the convenience of the public and the betterment of omnibus services as a whole.

(ee) To act as arbitrator in the settlement of disputes between members arising out of the management and running of omnibus services.

(ff) To endeavour to obtain legislation of such a nature as tends to the improvement and betterment of motor passenger transport in general from a point of view of public convenience and public requirements.

(gg) To provide facilities for social intercourse between the members of the association and their friends, and if thought fit to afford them all or any of the usual privileges, advantages, conveniences, and accommodation of a club.

(hh) Generally to develop and foster a spirit of harmony and union among omnibus proprietors, and to provide mutual assistance and counsel in all matters affecting the welfare of the members.

(ii) To adopt such means of making known the objects of the association as may seem expedient, and in particular by advertising in the Press, by circulars, by purchase and exhibition of works of art or interest, by publication of books and periodicals.

5.
