ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend Regulation 24 made under the aforesaid Act by an Order in Council of the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921, as follows:—

Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation No. 24 of the Regulations made under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," on the 7th day of September, 1921, is hereby amended as follows:—

1. By the addition to paragraph (a) of the words "or territory."

2. By the excision of paragraph (c), and the substitution of a new paragraph therefor as follows:—

(c.) in case the export is from the State of South Australia, be accompanied by a statutory declaration, made according to the law of that State, to the effect that the cask has been effectually disinfected by being scalded or fumigated immediately before being exported from the State of South Australia to this State; or, in any other case, be accompanied by a certificate issued by an inspector of the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State or territory, stating the method and date of disinfection.

To His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia.

I, Theodore Ernest Cooke, Chief Electoral Officer for the State of Western Australia, do hereby certify as follows:—

1. A Poll of the Electors in every Electoral District in Western Australia on the proposal that Prohibition shall come into force in Western Australia was taken on the 4th day of April, 1925.

2. By notice published in the *Gazette* on the 5th day of June, 1925, I notified 1 p.m. as the time and the Chief Electoral Office, 62 Barrack Street, Perth, as the place at which I would deal with all the voting papers (connected with such poll) of all Electoral Districts throughout the State, and ascertain the results of such polling. And I did accordingly, at the time and place aforesaid, in the presence of two scrutineers for the Licensed Victuallers' Association and two scrutineers for the W.A. Prohibition League, deal with such voting papers and ascertain the results of the polling.

3. I have, after due scrutiny and inquiry, ascertained—

- That the number of electors on the rolls at the time of the taking of the poll was 200,212, and
- That the number of votes given in each District and throughout the State for and against the proposal was as set out in the following table:

REGULATION 70 is hereby amended by adding additional paragraphs as follows:—

- (c) That the speed of any motor wagon fitted wholly with pneumatic tyres and not exceeding 60 power load weights shall not exceed twelve miles per hour.
- (d) That the speed of any motor wagon fitted wholly with pneumatic tyres exceeding 60 power load weights shall not exceed ten miles per hour.
- (e) That the speed of any motor omnibus fitted with other than all pneumatic tyres shall not exceed twenty miles per hour.
- (f) That the speed of any motor omnibus fitted with all pneumatic tyres shall not exceed twenty-five miles per hour.

*Additional Regulations.*

New Regulation 163:

Subject to the provisions of Section 26 of the Act, no person shall drive any vehicle on, over, or upon any road in any town or within the prescribed metropolitan area at any speed exceeding twenty-five miles per hour except when crossing bridges, passing schools or turning corners, when the speed shall not exceed fifteen miles per hour.

- (c) Every tank shall be sufficiently covered to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.
- (d) Every tank shall be provided with a manhole with gastight cover composed of iron, slate, stone, or other approved impervious material, so placed as to allow of ready inspection.
- (e) The aerobic portion of every tank shall be provided with an approved method of ventilation, and the openings of all tanks shall be made mosquito proof by means of brass wire gauze.
- (f) All drains, fittings and connections of tanks shall be in conformity with the regulations of the Metropolitan Sewerage and Drainage Department.
- (g) The effluent of every tank shall be discharged into a soak well constructed in accordance with By-law No 25, or otherwise disposed of to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.
- (h) Water closets, slop sinks, and urinals only shall be connected with any tank.
- (i) No persons shall allow any stormwater or surface drainage to enter any tank.
- (j) No person shall allow any rubbish, disinfectant, or insoluble matter to enter any tank, or to be deposited in the pan of any water closet or urinal connected with any tank.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," the Governor may make such Regulations as may be necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to the provisions of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the whole of the Regulations made under "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912," and amendments, and doth substitute the following in lieu thereof:—

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT,  
1912-1924."

1. Every medical certificate to the effect that a worker is free from pulmonary tuberculosis, pneumoconiosis, and miners' phthisis, as required by Section 7, Subsection 11 of "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," shall be in Form A.
2. Notice that a worker is suffering from a disease mentioned in the Third Schedule of "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," shall be submitted by the employer to the Registrar in form B. Wherever the disease suffered by a worker is one which is marked in the Third Schedule with an asterisk, notice of such disease shall be submitted in duplicate by the employer (Section 8 (1.)).
3. Notice that a patient is suffering from a disease mentioned in the Third Schedule to "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," shall be submitted by the medical practitioner to the Commissioner of Public Health, in form C. (Section 8 (2.)).
4. Notice of an accident to a worker shall be submitted by the employer to the Registrar in form D. (Section 8 (3.)).
5. (1.) Every application for exemption from the provisions of Section 10 of "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," shall be in form E. Such application shall be accompanied by the sum of £5,000 or a bond or guarantee of an insurance company or bank, in form F, or such securities (to the value of £5,000) as the Registrar, with the approval of the Minister, may accept. In accordance with "The Insurance Companies Act, 1918," interest on cash deposited at the Treasury shall be paid at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum. Each bond or guarantee shall be for a period of at least twelve months and shall be deposited with the Colonial Treasurer. Every application for exemption shall state in respect of the business to be exempted:—
  - (a) The amount of the Fund.
  - (b) The number of employees.
  - (c) The annual amount of wages or salaries of the employees coming within the provisions of "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924."
  - (d) The general nature of the business.
  - (e) The number of accidents sustained within the previous five years by workers entitled to compensation and the amount of compensation paid in respect of such accidents.
  - (f) The annual amount of premium to be paid to the Fund in respect of the workers coming within the provisions of the Act.
  - (g) The period for which the exemption is desired.
- (2.) Every order granting exemption shall state the period for which it is granted and it shall not have any force or effect beyond that period.
6. Each employer who has obtained exemption from the provisions of Section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act shall, not later than 1st September in each year, submit such particulars of the accidents sustained by workers and the compensation paid during the twelve months preceding the last 30th day of June as the Registrar may require.

*Examination of worker by medical practitioner.*

7. (1.) Where a worker has given notice of an accident or is in receipt of weekly payments under the Act, he shall not be required to submit himself, against his will, for examination by a medical practitioner provided by the employer except at reasonable hours.

(2.) A worker in receipt of weekly payments shall not be required, after a period of one month has elapsed from the date on which the first payment of compensation was made, to submit himself, against his will, for examination by a medical practitioner provided by the employer except at the following intervals:—Once a week during the second, and once a month during the third, fourth, fifth and sixth months, after the date of the first payment, and thereafter once in every two months.

Provided that where, after the second month, an application has been made to a Local Court for a review of the weekly payment, the worker may be required, pending and for the purposes of the settlement of the application, to submit himself to an additional examination.

*References to medical referee.*

8. (i) A worker who has procured such a certificate as is mentioned in Subsection (8) of Section 7 of the Act shall forthwith furnish a copy thereof to the employer. When any employer disputes such a certificate he may, within seven days after receiving a copy thereof, apply to the Clerk of the Local Court for the matter to be referred to a medical referee: Provided that it shall be within the discretion of the Clerk, on good cause being shown, to extend in any case by not more than ten days the period within which the application is to be made. Such extension may be granted although the period of seven days shall have expired.

(2.) An application under this section shall be in writing and shall be according to the form G hereto and shall be accompanied by a copy of the certificate of the medical referee.

(3.) The Clerk shall forthwith refer the matter to the medical referee and shall forward to him the relative documents.

The Clerk shall also deliver or send, by registered post, to both parties concerned a copy of the reference, and shall also send to the worker copies of the other documents forwarded to the medical referee.

9. (1.) The medical referee shall, on receipt of a reference under the last preceding regulation, send a notice to both parties concerned according to form H or I in the schedule, and in fixing any time or place for the examination the referee shall pay due regard to the condition or alleged condition of the worker.

(2.) Before giving any certificate the medical referee shall personally examine the worker, and shall consider any statements that may be made or submitted by either party.

The certificate given by the medical referee shall be according to the Form "J" in the Schedule hereto, as the case may require, and shall be forwarded by the referee to the Clerk of the Court from whom he received the reference, and the clerk shall send the parties notice that he has received such report.

10. The following shall be the scale of fees to be paid to medical referees in respect of references under the Act:—

*Appeals.*

11. (1.) An appeal to a Medical Board under Section 14, paragraph (b), of the First Schedule to the Act shall be brought by the party appellant giving notice to the other party and to the Clerk of the Court within 10 days after the report of the medical referee has been lodged with the Clerk, stating that he is dissatisfied with such report, and desires to appeal therefrom to a Medical Board.

(2.) The Clerk shall forthwith send notice to the Registrar that such appeal has been instituted, and request to be informed of the names of the persons who constitute the Board and of the time and place when such Board will hear the appeal.

(3.) The persons to constitute such Board shall be such as are approved by the Minister, and the time and place of the sitting shall be fixed by the Board, and the Registrar shall furnish information of the names of the members of the Board and of the time and place of the sitting to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the Clerk's request.

(4.) On receipt of a reply from the Registrar giving the names of the members of the Board and the time and place of sitting, the Clerk shall notify the parties thereof.

(5.) The parties shall attend before the Board at the time and place appointed, and shall adduce such evidence as they may, respectively, desire the Board to hear, and the Board may of its own motion call any evidence and require any examination to be made and information to be procured which it may consider necessary.

(6.) The Board may either affirm or reverse the report or vary the same in such manner as the Board may deem just.

(7.) The Board shall embody its decision in a report which shall be signed by the members of the Board, and shall be forwarded to the Clerk of the Court, who shall communicate the contents thereof to the parties.

*Enforcing charge on property.*

12. (1.) The charge created by Section 20 of the Act may be enforced by sale of the property, subject to the charge, at such times, in such manner, and subject to such conditions as the Court awarding compensation or damage orders.

(2.) For the purpose of this Regulation, the Court may make orders from time to time either on its own motion or on the application of the party entitled to compensation.

*Fees.*

13. All fees which may be received by the Registrar under or by virtue of these Regulations shall be paid into the Treasury to the credit of the general revenue.

*Modification of forms.*

14. When anything is required to be in any of the forms in the Schedule, it shall be sufficient if it be to the like effect and any of such forms may be modified to suit particular cases.

*Submission of statutory declaration as to amount of salaries and wages paid.*

15. Every employer who has not obtained exemption from the provisions of Section 10 of the Act shall furnish to the approved insurance office with whom he is or was insured, or desires to effect an insurance, a statutory declaration showing the amount of salaries and wages paid to, and the value of keep provided for, the employees engaged in the business described in the policy and coming within the provisions of the Act.

Such declaration shall be in form "K," and in the case of a company shall be made by the secretary, and in the case of a firm shall be made by one of the partners.

Such declaration shall be made by—

- (1) The employer who is insured within one month after the expiration of each period for which the policy was effected or renewed.
- (2) The employer who desires to effect an insurance at the time of effecting such insurance.

16. These Regulations may be cited as "The Workers' Compensation Regulations, 1925."

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 63 of 1925.
