PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Northam Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for street or way within the Municipality of Northam, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 561/25.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Waterworks, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Hills Water Scheme.

30in. diameter Steel Pipe Line from Wungong Brook Dam Site to Kelmscott and Pipe Head Dam; 30in. diameter Steel Pipe Line from Canning No. 2 Dam Site to junction with Churchman's Brook Pipe Line, and Pipe Head Dam; as indicated on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4253.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 24th day of July, 1925.

Boatline School and Road Approach.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 946/25; Ex. Co. 1906.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any Public Work, subject as to Railways to Section 96, and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Minister for Works to provide a School at Boatline with Road Approach, on the land shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 23931 (L.T.O. Diagram 6807), which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 843/09.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that that portion of Mullewa Townsite Reserve at present unsubdivided and not reserved for any specific purposes should be placed under the control of the Mullewa Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned area under the control of the Mullewa Road Board, for the purpose of a Temporary Common as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said area; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for direct-

ing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

The Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of 27th August, 1909, *re* the above is hereby superseded.
