Local Courts Act, 1904-1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Navigation Act, 1912-1920," of the Parliament of the Commonwealth that all disputes as to the amount of salvage, whether of life or property, shall in certain cases be determined summarily, that is to say by (amongst other courts) a Local Court of a State: And whereas it is desirable to provide the procedure to be followed in Local Courts in connection with the determination of such disputes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Local Courts Act, 1904," and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. Every proceeding in a Local Court under Section 318 of "The Navigation Act, 1912-1920," shall be commenced by bringing an action.

2. Actions under these rules shall be either *in rem* or *in personam*.

3. Actions *in personam* shall be subject, so far as may be, to the same procedure and rules as are applicable to personal actions under "The Local Courts Act, 1904," subject, however, as regards fees, to rule 7 hereof. Actions *in rem* shall be subject to the rules hereinafter appearing, and, subject to such rules, the procedure and rules applicable to personal actions in Local Courts shall (so far as applicable) apply.

4. Every action *in rem* shall be commenced by a summons which before being issued shall be indorsed with a statement of the nature of the claim and of the amount claimed. Forms of summons and of the indorsements thereon appear in the schedule hereto, and are therein numbered 1 and 2.

5. There shall be subscribed on every such summons memoranda and notices in the forms set out in the said schedule and numbered 3 therein.

6. Every action shall be heard without pleadings.

7. The rules and table of fees annexed to the Order in Council made on the 23rd day of August, 1883, by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria under the Vice-Admiralty Courts Act, 1863, shall (so far as applicable) apply and be in force in Local Courts to and in respect of proceedings *in rem* under these rules and also, so far as regards the said table of fees, to and in respect of

actions *in personam*: Provided that in the application of such rules and table of fees—

- “Court” shall mean any Local Court;
 “Registry” shall mean the office of the Court;
 “Judge” shall mean the Magistrate of the Court;
 “Registrar” shall mean the Clerk of the Court;
 “Marshal” shall mean the Bailiff of the Court;
 and
 “Writ of summons” shall mean a summons issued under these rules.

A Bill for an Act to further amend the Western Australian Bank Act, 1896.

3. That the branch register shall, as regards the particulars entered therein, be deemed part of the Bank's register number.

That such register shall be kept in the manner provided by the Deed of Settlement of the Bank.

4. That the Bank shall transmit to its head office at Perth a copy of any entry in its branch register or registers as soon as may be after such entry is made, and the Bank shall cause to be kept at its head office, duly entered up from time to time, a duplicate of its branch register or registers.

5. That, subject to the provisions of the Act, the share register in a branch register shall be distinguished from the Share Register in the principal register, and no transaction in respect to any shares registered in a branch register shall, during the continuance of the registration of such shares in such branch register, be registered in any other register.

6. That application may be made by any shareholder on the branch register to have his shares transferred to the register in the head office of the Bank.

7. Power to the Bank to discontinue to keep any branch register, and thereupon all entries in that register shall be transferred to some other branch register.

8. Power for the Bank to make provision in its Deed of Settlement with respect to the keeping of such branch registers.

9.
