ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any Public Work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide a school at South Perth (East) on the land shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., No. 24161 (L.T.O. Having made the trenches the baits must be laid therein not more than six feet apart.

The bait to be used shall be either phosphorised polard, or poisoned grain, or poisoned fruit.
