The Plant Diseases Act, 1914.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agric. No. 2430/1923.

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke Regulation 9 of Division 1 of the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published on page 1727 of the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921, as amended by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of May, 1924, and in lieu thereof substitutes the following:—

9. The following fees shall be charged for inspection, including disinfection (if any) of fruit and plants:—

Fruit in Cases or Trays.

1 bushel case and cases over 1 bushel	4d. per case
Cases under 1 bushel	2d. "
Nuts, per bag or portion thereof	3d. per bag
Large bulbs and roots, for every thousand or part of a thousand	1s.
Small bulbs, per thousand for the first two thousand	1s.
And for every part of a thousand in excess thereof	3d.
Strawberries and small plants, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
Apple seedlings and stocks, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
Pear, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.

Peach, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
Plum, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
Orange, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
Vine Cuttings, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
And cuttings of other plants, for every thousand and part of a thousand	1s.
For every hundred, and also for any fractional part of a hundred, of any plants (except such as are hereinabove mentioned)	1s. 6d.

Provided that the charges for any separate inspection shall not be less than one shilling.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the

said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Daglish Estate, Subiaco Municipality.

Link Mains.

(a.) Proposed 6-inch diameter cast iron water main from the existing main in Hay Street Southerly along Robinson Terrace to Troy Terrace (length about 7 chains).

(b.) Proposed 6-inch diameter cast iron water main from the existing main in Railway Road North-Westerly through Railway Subway at Daglish Station to the intersection of Stubbs Terrace and McCallum Avenue (length about 4½ chains).

(c.) Proposed 6-inch diameter cast iron water main from the existing main in Railway Road Westerly across railway via Nicholson Road Subway, and thence Northerly to the intersection of Cunningham Terrace and Stubbs Terrace (length about 8½ chains), including lifting 5 chains of existing 3-inch diameter cast iron water main.

KATANNING ROAD BOARD.

By-laws of the Katanning Road Board.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and other Statutes, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Katanning Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Acts and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

PART I.

Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is to say:—

"The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.

"Board"—The Katanning Road Board.

"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

"District"—The district under the jurisdiction of the Katanning Road Board.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the secretary shall be:—
- (a) To attend all Board meetings.
 - (b) To attend all Committee meetings.
 - (c) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees.
 - (d) To conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes.
 - (e) To answer all questions on the Board's business.
 - (f) To see that the accounts are audited monthly, and the balance sheets prepared and published in the *Government Gazette* yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Districts Act, 1919."
 - (g) To prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year.
 - (h) To supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's electoral lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the supervisor, in accordance with the Board's resolutions.
 - (i) To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
 - (j) To keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board.
 - (k) To check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.
 - (l) To report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
 - (m) To pay into the bank, after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or over, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, which are paid into the Treasury.

- (n) To see that all moneys received, with the exception of Treasury credits, are lodged to the credit of the Board in the Bank not less frequently than every second day, and more frequently if the total amount held exceeds £50.
- (o) To see that no payments to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary, or such other officer as may be acting temporarily in that capacity.
- (p) To readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.
- (q) To see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board.
- (r) To report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (s) To exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board.
- (t) To see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts.
- (u) To be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

Duties of Supervisor.

3. The duties of Supervisor shall be:—
- (a) The Supervisor shall have the control of works, plant, and all property of the Board, and shall issue instructions to the Foreman, and shall see that same are faithfully carried out. Should the Foreman be guilty of insubordination or disobedience, or be found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him, the Supervisor shall report the matter to the Chairman, who shall inquire into the matter and, if necessary, shall suspend the Foreman and report the matter to the next meeting of the Board.
 - (b) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
 - (c) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.
 - (d) To see that no labourers are engaged but those that are able-bodied.
 - (e) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
 - (f) To see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
 - (g) To attend all Board and Committee meetings if required.
 - (h) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least once each six months, or as required by the Board.
 - (i) To supply monthly, or as required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress with remarks thereon.

Duties of Collector.

4. (a) The Collector shall collect moneys that may be due to the Board, issuing receipts in the Board's printed forms for payment and entering particulars of all payments in the book provided by the Board for that purpose.
- (b) The Collector shall make his financial report and payments to the Secretary every three days.

Appointment of Officers.

5. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling

for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

6. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands unless a ballot be demanded.

7. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present.

8. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

9. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meetings adjourned.

10. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called for: Provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first complied with.

11. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board once in each month, on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

12. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is present.

13. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

14. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 minutes after time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

15. The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

Voting.

16. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

17. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the Secretary.

Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

18. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary also special meetings (if any).
- (b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.
- (d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.
- (e) Reports of sub-committees and officers.
- (f) Deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof.
- (g) Reading of correspondence received and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (i) Presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment.
- (j) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (k) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19).
- (l) General business.
- (m) Notice of motions.

19. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all other.

Petitions.

20. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

21. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of 5 per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory sureties.

Orders of Debate—Speakers must not digress.

22. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Correspondence.

23. All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary and submitted to the Board. No letter addressed to the Board shall be presented or read by a member.

Consideration of Reports.

24. (a) If, in a report of a committee, distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may be taken separately on each recommendation.

(b) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(c) The recommendations of any committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

25. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall preserve strict silence, so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

Notice of Motion—Absence of Mover.

26. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

27. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

28. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be withdrawn without consent.

29. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be moved.

30. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in writing.

31. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.

32. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

33. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Further Amendment may be moved on amended Question.

34. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How subsequent Amendments may be moved.

35. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

36. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment, when entitled to priority.

37. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Questions to be given.

38. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without argument.

39. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

Replies and Objections.

40. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions except by permission of the Board.

Mode of addressing Board.

41. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the Chairman and speak to each other by their official designation, as Chairman or Secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in order.

42. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as hereinafter provided for in pursuance of By-law.

Limitation as to number of speeches.

43. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

Determination of questions.

44. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the Chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the Chairman shall be final, unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division.

(b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

45. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary.

Chairman may repeat question.

46. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

Acts of disorder.

47. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

48. The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or

precedent applicable to the case, without further argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with, then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to order more than once.

49. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this By-law, or for any breach of decorum, shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room—Penalty for continued breach of order, etc.

50. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room, on being requested so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his retirement until the termination of the sitting, and should such member disobey such order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound.

Disorder.

51. If disorder arise at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the chair. The Board, on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

52. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

53. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the finance committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of moneys paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account at such bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's Bank or Treasury accounts must be signed by the Chairman and any one member of the Board, and in all cases countersigned by the Secretary of the Board.

54. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same.

The Regulations numbered 21 to 41 inclusive made by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council under Section 197 of the Act on the 2nd August, 1922, are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws.

Urgent Work.

55. The Chairman, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any three members, may in the case of urgent necessity authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding ten pounds on statutory works or undertakings: provided that in such case they shall report the matter at the next ordinary or special meeting of the Board.

56. Any member may in a case of very urgent necessity authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding two pounds on statutory works or undertakings within the Ward he represents: provided that he must report the matter at the next ordinary or special meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

57. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

58. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

59. Any person guilty of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds:—

- (a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other property under the control of the Board.
- (b) Placing any placard or other document, writing, or printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or any wall, fence, gate, or lamppost without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (c) Blasting any rock, stone, or other timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (d) Placing, stacking, or storing within the limits of any townsite, in the open air, any cases, paper, shavings, crates packed with straw or dangerous or inflammable substances so as to be or likely to become a source of danger through fire.

Preservation of trees.

60. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub, or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Prescribing removal of verandahs.

61. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or over the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah or balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Encroachment, etc.—Removal of.

62. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which shall not exceed £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Lighting.

63. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

Water supply.

64. Any person who shall injure or destroy any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage for water, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and also shall pay to the Board the sum of such damages.

65. Any person who shall waste, or allow to escape, foul, pollute, or taint any water contained in a bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

66. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, tank reservoir, or other water within the district.

67. Any person or persons leaving open the lid of any well, or any gate of an enclosure surrounding any dam or other water supply under the control of the Board, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws and notwithstanding any remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

68. Any person who shall remove any water from any well, bore, tank, or other place of storage under the control of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for *bona fide* camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and payment thereon of such reasonable fee as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Sand and timber.

69. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands under the control of the Board without a license shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

Barbed wire.

70. Barbed wire shall not be allowed on the outer or road side, or on top of any fence along any road within any townsite. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Fencing.

71. The owner of any land abutting on any road in any townsite shall fence all such boundaries so abutting with such description of fence as may be directed by the Board, and shall maintain every such boundary fence erected or to be erected, in good order. In the event of such fence not being erected or repaired after due notice has been given so to do, the Board may fence or repair such fences and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or owners of the land.

Bathing.

72. No person shall bathe in any river or open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District within the jurisdiction of the Board without suitable bathing costume or clothing. Every person offending against this By-law shall, for every offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Depasturing of cattle.

73. Any person who shall turn loose, or suffer any kind of animal belonging to him or under his control to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in or upon any road, recreation ground, or reserve otherwise than within the Central Ward of the district, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

74. The owner of any animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall not permit such animal to be ridden or allowed to stray on any road, unfenced land, or reserve within the district. Any animal so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed without notice and at the owner's expense.

75. The owner or driver of any such animal shall be liable, if convicted, of a breach of this By-law to a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than £2.

Straying stock.

76. No owner or person having the custody or control of any animal shall cause, permit, or suffer such animal to stray on any road, public reserve, or other public place, or on any unfenced land abutting thereon within the boundary of the Central Ward of the District.

77. (a) Any contravention of By-law 76 shall be an offence punishable under these By-laws, if the animal is a bull, boar, or stallion, by a fine not exceeding £20 and not less than £2.

(b) In any other case, by a fine not exceeding £10 and not less than 10s.

78. Provided that this By-law shall not apply in the case of stock whilst in the charge of the Town Ranger duly appointed by the Board.

Registration of cattle.

79. Notwithstanding the registration of any dairy with the Local Health authority, the owner or person having the custody of any dairy or other cattle kept within the Central Ward of the District shall, during the month of July in each year, furnish full particulars required and make application to the Board in the prescribed form. Such application, accompanied by a registration fee of One shilling per head, shall be lodged at the office of the Board; and any person failing to comply with the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 or less than Five shillings.

Registered dairy cows.

80. Registered dairy cows may be placed in charge of the Town Ranger, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. daily, on payment to such Ranger of such herding fee as is from time to time prescribed by resolution of the Board.

Copulation of stock.

81. Any person who, as owner or otherwise, while in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to try to cover any mare or cow within any township within the district, or shall cause, permit, allow, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or in any other place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be tried or covered except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from public view shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £10.

Goats.

82. (a) No person shall keep any goat within the boundaries of the Town Ward of the Katanning Road District unless such goat shall have been registered and the registration fee of sixpence paid to the Secretary of the Board.

(b) Every registration shall be renewed in the month of July in each year.

(c) The Board may refuse to register any goat if in the opinion of the Board suitable accommodation has not been provided for keeping such goat.

(d) The penalty for breach of any of the preceding clauses shall be a sum not exceeding £5 for each breach, in addition to such sums as the justices may direct as compensation for damages done by such goats.

Crossing places.

83. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any public way requiring access thereto with horse or vehicle from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and thereafter keep and maintain the same in good repair. Any person not complying with this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Public pound, etc.

84. The Katanning Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers contained in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and "The Cattle, Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," hereby appoint Katanning Road District Public Pound, situated on Katanning Town Lot 310, Reserve 8646, to be the Public Pound for the Katanning Road Board.

85. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound, fence, gate, lock, shed, trough, or other premises, the property of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

86. Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle, Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

87. Any person who shall release or attempt to release any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle be in the pound or on the way to or from the pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Pound Fees.

88-89. Owner of impounded stock for the release of such shall pay—

For very bull or entire horse or camel over twelve months old	10s.
For every ram, he-goat, or boar	5s.
For every mule, ass, pig, or bullock	5s.
For every mare, gelding, cow, goat, heifer, or calf	5s.
For sheep, per head	3d.

Trespass Fees.

90.—

Trespass on unenclosed country land:

For every entire horse, ass, or bull, in the day time—
Not less than £2, nor more than £4.

For every such horse, ass, or bull, in the night time—
Not less than £3, nor more than £5.

For every other head of "Great Cattle," by day or night—Threepence.

For every other head of "Small Cattle," by day or night—One penny.

Trespass on enclosed land, whether town, country, or suburban, not being a public street or thoroughfare in a city or town, or public cemetery:

For every entire horse, ass, or bull, in the day time—
Not less than £2, nor more than £4.

For every such horse, ass, or bull, in the night time—
Not less than £3, nor more than £5.

For every other head of cattle, by day or night—A sum not exceeding 20 shillings.

Trespass on a public street or thoroughfare in a town or in an enclosed public cemetery:

For every entire horse, ass, or bull—Not less than £3, nor more than £5.

For every other head of cattle—A sum of 40 shillings.

For every other head of "Small Cattle," other than sheep, by night or day—The sum of 5 shillings.

For every head of sheep—Threepence.

Great cattle trespassing, not branded with registered brand—Double fee.

3s. 6d.

For every colt, foal, or head of horned cattle under twelve months old

For sheep, per head

0s. 6d.

For every pig

3s. 0d.

For every goat

2s. 0d.

Such rates to be charged for each day of 24 hours.

No charge to be made for less than three hours.

Description and Quantity of Sustenance.

92.—

For each head of great cattle—28lb. of chaff.

For each head of small cattle other than pigs—6lb. chaff.

For each pig—9lb. pollard or corn.

Mileage Fees.

93.—

Great cattle—One shilling and sixpence per head per mile, with a minimum of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.).

Small cattle—Threepence (3d.) per head per mile, with a minimum of threepence (3d.).

Heavy Traffic.

94. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Damaging Roads.

95. No person shall either wilfully or negligently damage or destroy by means of horse team or any other means any road under construction or repair; any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Any person who—

(a) cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or

(b) erects, without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or

(c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or

(d) draws upon any road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto or any portion of other attachment trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

96. Any person taking any plough, cultivator, or other implement over or along any road and thereby damaging or marking such road in such a manner which in the opinion of the Board may indirectly cause ultimate damage to the road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

97. Any person who draws upon any road any vehicle the wheel or wheels of which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To protect Bridges from Fire.

98. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board), or who shall place any rushes or other inflammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Prevention of Trees falling across Road.

99. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or reserve without taking proper precaution against such fire spreading.

100. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

101. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, or trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds and reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasion, and comply with the provisions of these By-laws and any regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such exclusive rights are granted.

102. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation grounds without the written permission of the Board.

103. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police officer or officer of the Board.

104. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on a Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

105. No person shall offer for sale on any reserve any provisions, refreshments, or other goods of any kind, nor carry on any games, or boxing, or other similar shows, nor use any fire-arms, except with the express sanction of the Board and payment of such fee as may be demanded.

106. The Board, or any person duly authorised, may make charges for admission to any reserve or defined portion thereof, but such charges shall not exceed 1s. for adults and sixpence (6d.) for children under fifteen years of age, with free entry for children (accompanied) under five years of age, and for horses and vehicles or motor cars 1s.

107. Such person to whom the use of any reserve is given for picnic sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and a deposit not exceeding £5 shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish. On the removal of such rubbish, to the satisfaction of the Board, the deposit shall be returned.

108. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

109. No horses other than those attached to vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves under the control of the Board.

110. The Board may allow to any person who pays the rates for which he is liable, within thirty days of such rates becoming due, a percentage by way of discount of five per centum on the amount of such rates.

Hawking.

111. No person shall be permitted to hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise without first having obtained a license from the Board and payment of fees as per Schedule "A" hereto annexed:—

Schedule "A."

Fees for a Hawker's License.

For a license to hawk fish, meat, poultry, game, fruit, or vegetables	5s.
For a license to hawk merchandise	5s.

A hawker's license shall be issued for a term of twelve months from date of issue.

Penalties.

112. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

113. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

114. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

Previous By-laws.

115. All By-laws which obtained in this District previous to this date are hereby repealed.

PART II.

RELATING TO THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF TOWN HALL.

Application for Hire.

1. Applications for the hire of any hall, room, or furniture shall be made to the Secretary not less than 24 hours before the time that such hall, room, or furniture is required. Each application to be accompanied by the scheduled fee, as may be prescribed by the Board from time to time. Each application for hall, room, or furniture shall be in the form of Schedule "A" hereto annexed, duly completed as to details, and the Board reserves the right to accept or refuse any such application.

Cancellation of Engagement.

2. The Board may at any time, by giving 24 hours' notice, cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any hall, room, or furniture.

Priority of Application.

3. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall, room, or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such hall, room, or furniture shall be granted.

Responsibility for Damage.

4. The hirer of any hall, room, or furniture shall be held responsible for any damage to buildings, fittings, furniture, or crockery, and shall pay to the Board the amount of such damages as shall be assessed by the Board.

Deposit.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of engagement.

Replacing Crockery.

6. The hirer shall, as soon as practicable after the term of engagement, and when the use of the hall crockeryware is allowed, deliver all such crockeryware in a clean and sound condition, and any article not accounted for, or in a cracked or broken condition, must be paid for at current prices.

Compliance with Acts.

7. The hirer of any hall, room, or furniture shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act, or any other Act in force during the term of engagement.

If, in the opinion of the Board, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts above mentioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such hall or room.

Forfeiture of Fees.

8. In the event of any engagement being stopped under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit and pay the full fees payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the engagement had been duly fulfilled.

Use of furniture supplied.

9. Any hall, room or furniture shall be let only on the distinct understanding that only the furniture and fittings supplied by the Board are to be used for the accommodation of the public.

Use of other furniture.

10. In the event of the hirer wishing to use any other furniture or fittings, before placing same in any hall or room under the control of the Board, he shall apply in writing for leave to do so, and before such leave is granted he shall sign an indemnity and furnish any security demanded by the Board against any claim for compensation which may be made on account of any injury which may be received by any person as the direct or indirect result of the use of any furniture or fittings other than those supplied by the Board.

Interpretations.

11. "Hirer"—The person making application or arrangements for the hire of hall, room, or furniture.
"Term of Engagement"—The time for which hall, room, or furniture has been allotted to the hirer.

Penalties.

12. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

Offences.

13. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or permits, or commits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, nor less than 10s., for every such offence.

Disposal of fines and penalties.

14. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of the Board and form part of the ordinary income of the Town Hall, except so much as shall be paid to informers.

PART III.

BUILDING BY-LAWS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Second Schedule to "The Road Districts Act, 1919," Building Regulations 36 and 37, the Katanning Road Board doth make and publish the following By-laws, and doth order that such By-laws shall apply to the Townsite of Katanning:—

1. No person shall erect any building or alter or add to an existing building, or shall permit any person to erect any building or alter or add to an existing building on land of which he is the owner or of which he has the control, except such building, alteration or addition is erected in conformity with these By-laws.

2. No person shall build any structure intended to be used for human habitation or occupation, or capable of being used as such, or shall alter or add to any such existing structure without having obtained a Building License from the Board and paying the fees prescribed herein, namely:—

(a) The fee for Building License.

(b) The fee for the use of the portion of the street abutting on the building during building operations, and deposit as security for the reinstatement and repair of such portion of such street.

(c) The charge of the Local Health Authority for providing the necessary pans and lids for the privy.

3. Before such Building License is issued plans and specifications, in the form prescribed herein, shall be submitted to the Surveyor, and a license will not be granted before seven days after the submission of such plans and specifications, unless in special circumstances of which special circumstances the Surveyor shall be the sole judge.

4. Plans shall be in ink, on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks without injury to the paper; and specifications shall be in typewriting or in ink manuscript clearly written and on strong paper.

5. Plans shall clearly show ground plans, elevations, and sections as are sufficient to make plain the construction and the dimensions of the proposed structure. The size of the rooms and thickness of walls shall be written on in figures.

Specifications shall show clearly both as to materials and size of same, the construction of the foundations, floors, internal and external walls, ceilings, and roof; also the ventilation of the structure, the number of privies and the construction of same, and shall provide for at least one privy of the prescribed construction, provided with the pan supplied by the Local Health Authority.

The ground floor level of any building to be erected abutting on any footpath shall not be less than ten inches above the level of the kerbing of the footpath upon which the building abuts, nor greater than ten inches above such kerbing, unless provision is made in the plan and specifications for safe ingress and egress at all doorways by means of either a suitable ramp or steps.

A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy. Such plan will be retained by the Board.

6. If the plans and specifications submitted are in accordance with these By-laws and the prescribed fees are paid, the Surveyor shall sign them on behalf of the Board, and issue a Building License in the form prescribed herein, and for the period set forth in such license; but if the plans and specifications contain any matter which, in the opinion of the Surveyor, is contrary to the principles of sound or sanitary construction, and such matter is not covered by these By-laws, the Surveyor shall refer such matter to the Board at its next meeting, and the Board shall have power to decide any matter referred to in Clauses A to K of Section 37 of the Building Regulations, when such matter is not defined by these By-laws, and a Building License will not be granted until the Board decides on such matter; provided that such decision will not be unreasonably delayed.

7. No external wall shall be erected on the building line of any street or nearer than eight feet to such building line, unless constructed of brick, stone, or concrete. Where any building is to be used wholly or in part as a shop or warehouse, the Surveyor may authorise on behalf of the Board, the external walls of such building to be constructed of wood or iron, with wooden framing, except the walls referred to before in this clause, but if any such building is to be erected nearer than six feet to an existing building, the external wall facing such existing building shall be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete.

8. No building shall be erected nearer than ten feet to the boundary of the block of land on which it stands unless such boundary is a street, or lane, or unless the external walls facing such boundary are constructed of brick, stone, or concrete, and the Surveyor may authorise, on behalf of the Board, the construction of any dwelling whereof the external walls are constructed of wood or of iron with wood framing, except any walls coming within the distance of ten feet referred to before in this clause.

9. On behalf of the Board the Surveyor may authorise the internal linings, partitions, and ceiling of any dwelling, if such building is not nearer than ten feet to any boundary of the block of land on which it stands to be constructed wholly or partly of inflammable material. Such authority shall hold good for not more than twelve months after the date fixed for the expiration of the Building License, but may be extended by the Board from time to time on the application of the then owner. If no such extension of time is granted such inflammable material shall then have become erected contrary to the provisions of Section 14 of the Building Regulation within the meaning of the said section, and the Board may at any time proceed in the manner set forth in the said Section 14.

10. No brick, stone, or concrete wall shall be erected nearer than two feet to the boundary of the block of land on which it stands unless it is a parapet wall rising to a height of not less than one foot above the roof gutter, and the Board will not approve of the subdivision of land which would have the effect of leaving an existing wall in conflict with this provision.

11. No structure of any kind shall be erected upon, over, or under any street, footpath, or public way unless the plans and specifications have been first submitted to and approved by the Board, and no verandah or signboard will be allowed over any footpath unless a clear way of not less than nine feet above such footpath is provided.

12. No street verandah shall be erected, except in accordance with a plan submitted to and approved by the Board, and every such verandah shall be provided with a suitable gutter to carry the water falling on such verandah. If the water from such gutter discharges into the street, it shall be carried into the street gutter by a cast or wrought iron downpipe of such size as the Board may direct, and such downpipe shall discharge into the street gutter in such manner as the Board may direct.

Any such street verandah, gutter, and downpipe shall at all times be kept in repair by the owner of the building in front of which it is built, to the satisfaction of the Board, and the owner shall carry out any repairs in such manner as may be ordered by the Board.

13. No privy shall be erected nearer than six feet to the block of land adjoining that on which it stands. Where a right-of-way adjoins such block, unless otherwise in special circumstances approved by the Board, the privy shall be erected so that the service door is three feet from such right-of-way, screened from observation therefrom, and accessible by means of an opening or gateway at one end of such screen.

14. Before the construction of any building is commenced a privy shall be provided on the land for the use of the workmen.

Fees Payable.

15. A Building License will be issued without fee. For permission, during the erection of a building, to occupy any part of a street abutting on such building:—For the first three months, Ten shillings; for every subsequent three months, One pound.

Deposit for the repair of such part occupied:—One pound, and the Board may at any time require the amount of such deposit to be increased to such amount as may be ordered, on giving notice to the builder by post or leaving the notice at the building, and the building license shall be suspended until the order of the Board is complied with.

Minimum width of shop fronts.

16. No plan of any new building or part of a building intended to be used as a shop shall be approved by the Board unless each such shop designed or intended to be let as a separate tenement has at least a width of twelve feet internal measurement of frontage to a street, and no alteration of any existing building shall be approved unless the provisions of this By-law are complied with.

17. Application for a Building License shall be made in the form of Schedule "A" hereto annexed.

18. A Building License shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto annexed.

19. Any person who contravenes or does not comply with any one of the provisions of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against such By-law and for every such offence shall be liable to a Penalty not exceeding twenty pounds and not less than ten shillings.

Extracts from Building By-laws.

1. Plans must be in ink on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks without injury to the paper.
2. Drawings must show ground plan and elevation, all clearly figured in feet and inches. Scale not less than 8ft. to the inch.
3. A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy. Such plan will be retained by the Board.

MARINE DIVERS AND TENDERS—PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND OTHERS.

(Registered 22nd March, 1926.)

No. 12 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this sixteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between the Minister for Works and Labour for the State of Western Australia, the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, the Bunbury Harbour Board, and the Commissioner for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the Employers), of the one part, and the Marine Divers and Tenders' Union of Fremantle, Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the Union) of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out herein shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, performed and complied with according to the true intentions and meaning thereof by the parties hereto.

1. *Interpretation.*—For the purpose of this Agreement—

"Union" shall mean the Marine Divers and Tenders' Union of Fremantle, Western Australia.

"Employee" shall mean any person embraced by this Agreement who is now employed in the Public Works Department, the Fremantle Harbour Trust, the Bunbury Harbour Board, or the West Australian Government Railways, or who may be hereafter employed during the currency of this Agreement.

2. *Rates of Pay for Divers.*—Divers shall be paid thirty shillings (30s.) per day, or part of a day when diving. These conditions will be fulfilled if the Diver takes one dip only, without regard to length of time of same. When not diving, he shall be paid at a rate equivalent to 103s. 7d. per week of 44-hours.

3. *Rates of Pay for Tenders.*—Tenders shall be paid 17s. 10d. per day of eight hours or part of a day when tending; and at a rate equivalent to 86s. 4d. per week of 44-hours when otherwise employed; except when employed over that rate, ruling rates shall be paid.

4. *Hours of Duty.*—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. One day's work, Monday to Friday, inclusive, shall consist of 6 hours diving, half hour each forenoon and afternoon for smoke and one hour for dressing and undressing, preparing and returning gear; and Saturday shall consist of three hours diving, half hour for smoke and half hour for dressing and undressing, etc. Saturday's work shall finish not later than noon.

5. *Overtime.*—Should a diver and tender be required to work between 5 p.m. and midnight, they will be paid shift and a-half for that period or any part thereof; and from midnight to starting time next morning, they shall be paid double shift for that period or any part thereof.

From 1 p.m. on Saturday to 9 p.m. on Saturday shift and a-half rates shall apply, and from 9 p.m. on Saturday till starting time on Monday, double time shall be paid.

In every case 6 hours diving or any part thereof shall constitute one shift.

Sundays—Double time.

The foregoing overtime provisions shall apply to ordinary day-work.

If divers and tenders are required to work in two or more shifts, each shift shall be worked at ordinary rates, providing that operations for the week shall cease at midnight on Saturdays.

6. *Holidays.*—(a) All work performed on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day, shall be paid for at double time, provided it may be mutually agreed between the Union and the Employer that any worker may work at ordinary rates on any or all of the days above specified to facilitate arrangement under Sub-clause (b) of this Clause. (b) Twelve paid holidays per annum shall be granted to employees, and shall be taken on such days as may be mutually agreed by the employer and the Union. All employees employed for a period of less than one year's continuous service shall be entitled to holiday pay as follows:—After one month's continuous service, holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months. Payment for holidays shall be made in accordance with the usual hours of work. (c) In the event of a Diver and Tender working for a week immediately prior to a holiday and the work is to continue after the holiday, they shall receive a Diver's and Tender's pay for the

holiday, but if the diving job is finished before the holiday, they will not receive the Diver's and Tender's pay for the holiday.

7. *Travelling Time*.—The ordinary day's rate shall be paid to workers whilst travelling on duty, but no worker shall be entitled to more than a day's pay of eight hours in each 24 for the time spent in travelling. The ordinary day's rate in this connection shall mean the rate payable when not diving or when not tendering.

The employer shall pay all fares, including sleeper, if available. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

8. *Payment of Wages*.—(a) Workers inside the Metropolitan Area shall be paid weekly and those outside such area fortnightly. (b) All men dismissed from employment shall be paid within four office hours from the time of dismissal. If this period is exceeded, they shall be paid at the ordinary rates from the time of dismissal until payment.

9. *Away from Home Allowance*.—Divers or Tenders sent to work at a port other than the port at which they are usually engaged, shall be paid an allowance of six shillings per day, or shall be provided with board and lodging in lieu thereof.

10. *Absent from Duty*.—Should any employee be unable to report for duty owing to illness, he shall notify the Officer-in-Charge without delay. If the absence extends over twenty-four hours, he shall produce a doctor's certificate, which will retain to him the right to be taken on again when recovered.

11. *General*.—All air pumps shall be manned with two pumpers, and the Diver shall have the right to select one of the two men thus employed.

The Diver shall select his own Tender.

The diving gear, whether in or out of use, shall not be interfered with, except by the Diver or his Tender.

12. *Area and Scope*.—This Agreement shall apply only to workers employed by the Minister for Works, the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, the Bunbury Harbour Board, and the Commissioner for Railways, and shall operate over the coastline of the State from a point 20 miles north of Geraldton to a point 20 miles east of Albany, and for a distance of 15 miles inland therefrom.

This Agreement shall come into force from the date hereof, and shall have a currency of three years subject to three months' notice of termination or desire for amendment, by any of the parties, after the expiry of the first twelve months of the currency of this agreement.

SHOP ASSISTANTS AND WAREHOUSE EMPLOYEES—GERALDTON.

(Registered 19th March, 1926.)

No. 11 of 1926.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912," made this 10th day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, between The Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Geraldton Branch), (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and William Oswell; Frank Green & Co.; Sydney Fong & Co.; Carter & Co.; Millars' Timber and Trading Company, Ltd.; Bell & Co.; C. & H. Locke; Ezywalkin; E. Snell; Jos. Johnston; and The Geraldton and District Co-operative Society, Ltd., being persons, firms, or companies carrying on wholesale and retail businesses in Geraldton, in the State of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part: Witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. *Area*.—This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of seventy miles from the Post Office at Geraldton.

2. *Term*.—The term of this Agreement shall be for three years from the 10th day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

3. *Definitions*.—In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indicates:—

(a) The term "Shop Assistants" includes cashiers.

(b) The term "Casual Hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice. Provided a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four hours in any one day.

(c) The term "Weekly Hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the week, and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week. Provided that any worker employed for a period of four consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand, and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in Clause 10 hereof.

(d) The term "Carter" shall mean an employee engaged only in driving a horse or motor vehicle.

(e) The term "Packer" means a person who packs goods for transport by rail or ship.

(f) The term "Head Storeman" means a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in charge of two or more men.

(g) The term "Storeman working singly" shall mean a storeman working where no other storeman is employed in the establishment.

(h) The term "Despatch Hand" shall mean an employee who may handle goods or receive goods from departments and passes them over to the packing room or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery, and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages and for the proper branding and marking thereof, and keeping necessary records such as rail notes and cart notes.

4. *Hours*.—The ordinary working hours for shop assistants shall be in conformity with the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1922, insofar as the provisions of that Act limit the number of hours which the shop assistants may be employed during any one day or week, but the time for commencing work shall not be earlier than 8.20 a.m. and the time for finishing work shall not be later than 6 p.m. on every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 1 p.m. on Saturday.

5. *Overtime*.—For all time worked after the usual finishing time on the weekly half-holiday and for all time worked on Sundays and holidays, double time shall be paid. For all time worked before the usual starting time and after the usual finishing time on other days the rate shall be:—Males and females, time and a half throughout. Wholesale Establishments: The hours usually and customarily worked prior to the 10th day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, shall be observed during the currency of this Agreement, but shall not exceed forty-eight hours per week. And this shall also apply to workers only engaged in carting or driving.

6. *Holidays*.—The following days shall be observed for holidays and paid for, namely:—

New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday and Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

A holiday of one week on full pay and one week without pay, to be optional, shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service. Provided that when an employee is entitled to holiday under this clause he shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such employee should take his or her holidays. Provided further that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

7. *Wages*.—(a) Adults: The minimum weekly rate of wage payable to any male worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one years and upwards or to any female worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one years or upwards shall be as follows:—

A carter or driver over the age of twenty-one years who is engaged *only* in driving or carting shall be entitled to a minimum weekly wage of £4 10s.

At least one employee in each establishment, where a horse is used in the delivery of goods, shall be rated as a carter and receive not less than the minimum rate of wage hithertofore prescribed.

Where a canvasser or collector provides his own bicycle he shall be paid an extra 2s. 6d. per week.

8. *Proportion of Juniors*.—(a) The number of junior male assistants shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male seniors and thereafter one junior to every two male seniors or fraction thereof.

(b) Where no senior female assistant is employed one junior female assistant may be employed.

Where one senior female assistant is employed two junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two female assistants are employed three junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three female assistants are employed four junior female assistants may be employed.

Where four female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.

(c) In this clause the word "senior" shall mean a male assistant in receipt of £4 17s. 6d. a week, or a female assistant in receipt of £2 13s. a week.

9. *Higher Duties*.—A worker required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which she or he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

10. *Engagement*.—One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement, provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct or if after receiving one week's notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

11. *Time and Wages Book*.—Each employer shall keep and enter up or cause to be kept and entered up a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he or she has been employed. Such book shall be signed by each worker each week. The time and wages book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union at least one day in each week between the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

12. *Under-rate Worker*.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the adult minimum rate prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser rate (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient resident or police magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said secretary at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the magistrate and the secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the magistrate, and pending the decision thereon in either case the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by any employer at the proposed lesser rate. The magistrate may grant to such worker a permit to work for such wage and for such period not exceeding six calendar months as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned and for such period as may be therein stated until the wage shall have been again settled by the magistrate on the application of the said secretary.
