WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that the Opossum shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State from the 1st day of January, 1928, until the 31st day of December, 1928.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Vermin Act, 1918," "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said

Schedule: And whereas the name "Emus" was added to the said Schedule by Proclamation dated the 12th day of May, 1926, but wherein the addition of such name was restricted in its operation to the Districts therein set out: And whereas it is desirable that Emus shall be declared vermin within the boundaries of the Mount Magnet Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers herein in that behalf enabling, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare Emus to be vermin within the boundaries of the aforesaid Mount Magnet Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the

powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:--

(1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1928, until the Thirtieth day of April, 1928, and as from the First day of August, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1928 inclusive.

(2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1928, until the Thirtieth day of April, 1928, and from the First day of November, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1928, inclusive.

(3) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of March, 1928, and from the First day of October, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1928, inclusive.

(4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1928, until the Twenty-third day of March, 1928, and from the Sixteenth day of May, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1928, inclusive.

(5) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1928, inclusive, provided that, subject to certain provisions (*vide* separate Proclamation), it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31 between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday, and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week.

(6) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the First day of July, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of October, 1928, inclusive.

(7) That all those waters mentioned in the Seventh Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the First day of January, 1928, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1928, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottneest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half-a-mile from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a quarter miles from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—

On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar; and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury).

Sixth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Seventh Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, and the Lower Canning Bridge.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 4th day of January, 1928, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Lake Grace Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with Kulin Road District and Redivision into Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 311/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District and redivide a District into Wards: And whereas it is desirable—(1) to sever portion of the Kulin Road District and annex it to the Lake Grace Road District; (2) to redivide the Lake Grace Road District into Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—(1) sever that portion of the Kulin Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Lake Grace Road District; (2) redivide the Lake Grace Road District into seven Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "B" hereto.

Schedule "A."

Kulin Road District—Transfer of Territory to Lake Grace Road District.

All that piece of land bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the North-Western corner of Williams Location 13197 and extending Eastward along the Northern boundaries of Locations 13197, 12699, 14041, 14042, 12698, and Roe Locations 668, 170, 343, 660, 167, 169, 344 and 345, the North and North-East boundary of Location 1084, part of the West and North boundary of Location 1085, part of the West and North boundary of Location 1086 and the last-mentioned boundary's production East to intersect the present district boundary.

On the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by part of the present district boundary from the said intersection to the North-Western corner of Williams Location 14202; thence along the Northernmost, an East and a North boundary of said Location 14202, and the last-mentioned boundary's production East to intersect the production South of the Western boundary of Location 13197; thence North to and along the West boundary of said Location 13197 to the starting point.

Schedule "B."

Lake Grace Road District—Description of Ward Boundaries.

Town Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by the South boundary of Williams Location 10151, on the Eastward by part of the West boundary of Location 14092, the West boundary of Location 11841 and part of the West boundary of Location 14146.

On the Southward by a Northern boundary of Location 9747 and on the West by an East boundary of Location 9747, the East boundary of Reserve 18139 and part of the East boundary of Location 11879 to the starting point. (1 member).

North Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary commencing on the South boundary of Location 10204 at its intersection with the production Northward of the Western boundary of Location 12948 to the North-Eastern corner of Location 12531; thence by the Northernmost, and Eastern and a Northern boundary of Location 14202 to the North-Eastern corner of the last-mentioned location.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-Eastern corner and extending Southward along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 14202 and 14272, an Eastern boundary of Location 12858, part of the East boundary of Location 12860, and North and East boundaries of Location 14243, an East and North and part of the Easternmost boundary of Location 12302, the Northernmost and the East boundary of Location 13302, the East boundary of Location 14228 and its production Southward to the North boundary of Location 13295, along part of the North and East boundary of the said Location 13295 and the last-mentioned boundary's production South to the North boundary of Location 14216; thence along part of the North and the Easternmost boundary of said Location 14216, part of the North, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 12880, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 12574, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 12480, 9507, 9512, and 9513 to the South-Eastern corner of the last-mentioned location.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-Eastern corner and extending Westward along the South boundaries of Locations 9513 and 9509, part of the East boundary of Location 9510 and the Eastern boundaries of Locations 12507 and 12929, the South boundaries of Locations 12929, 12261, 12930, and 13032, part of the East and the South boundary of Location 12484, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 10155 and 14092 and the Southernmost boundary of the latter location, the South boundary of Location 11841; thence by part of the East, the North and part of the West boundary of the Town Ward, and by the Northernmost boundary of Location 9517 and the Northern boundary of Location 9459 to the last-mentioned location's North-Western corner; thence North-Eastward to and along the North-Western boundaries of Locations 11879 and 8984, the Western boundary of Location 10154 and the South-Western boundary of Location 10158, part of the Southern boundary of Location 10164, the Eastern and part of the Southern boundary of Location 10166, the Eastern boundaries of Location 9458 to its Southernmost corner.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the said Southernmost corner and extending Northward along the Western boundaries of Locations 9458, 10166, 10174, 10168, 10169, 10170, and 10980, part of the Southern boundary of Location 12515 and to and along the Southern boundary of Location 12948; thence Northward along the Western boundary of said Location 12948 and its production North to the starting point. (1 member).

Jarring Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary and part of the Western boundary of the North Ward to the North-Western corner of Location 10980.

On the Eastward by part of the Western boundary of the North Ward to the South-Eastern corner of Location 10789; thence by the South boundaries of the said Location 10789, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 10787, 12274, and 14215, the South-Eastern boundaries of Location 10794, part of the South-Eastern boundary of Location 10795; thence by the Western shore of Lake Grace and along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 12488, 12097, 12482 and again by the Western shores of Lake Grace to and along the Eastern

boundaries of Locations 8811 and 10776, and again following the shores of Lake Grace to intersect the present district boundary.

On the South and Westward by part of the district boundary to the starting point. (1 member.)

Burngup Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the North Ward to the North-Eastern corner of Roe Location 1086.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-Eastern corner and extending Southward along the Eastern and Southern boundaries of said Location 1086, the Southern boundary of Location 1085, continuing Westward to intersect the production North of the Eastern boundary of Location 865; thence along said production and Eastern boundary and part of the Southern boundary of Location 865 aforesaid to the production North of the Western boundary of Location 887, thence South along the latter production and the Western boundary of said Location 887 and the Western boundaries of Locations 776 and 152 and part of the South-Western boundary of the last-mentioned Location, the Westernmost boundary of Location 889, part of the North and West boundary of Location 872 and the last-mentioned boundary's production South to the Northern boundary of Location 544, part of the Northern boundary of said Location 544, the Eastern boundary of Location 543 to its South-Eastern corner.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-Eastern corner and extending Westward along the Southern boundaries of Locations 543 and 542, the Southernmost, a West and a South boundary of Location 541, the Southern boundary of Location 336, part of the East and the South boundary of Location 6, the South boundary of Location 7, part of the East and the South boundary of Location 4 to the Eastern boundary of the North Ward.

On the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the North Ward and part of the district boundary to the starting point. (1 member).

South Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the South-Eastern corner of Williams Location 10789 and extending Eastward along the South boundary of the North Ward, part of the West, the South and part of the Eastern boundary of the Town Ward, and again by the Southern boundary of the North Ward and the Southern boundary of the Burngup Ward to the South-Eastern corner of Roe Location 543.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned South-Eastern corner and extending Southward along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 553 and 557, the North Eastern boundaries of Locations 558 and 566, the East boundaries of Locations 568 and 573 and their production South to intersect the district boundary.

On the Southward by part of the district boundary to the Eastern boundary of the Jarring Ward.

On the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of Jarring Ward to the starting point. (2 members).

Biddy Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary from the North-Eastern corner of Location 1086 to the production North of an Eastern boundary of Location 951.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Southward to and along an Eastern boundary of said Location 951 and a Northern and Easternmost boundary of the said Location, part of the Northern boundary of Location 108, the East boundary of Location 113, the East and South-Eastern boundaries of Location 110 and part of the Southern boundary of Location 618 and again the South-Eastern boundary of Location 110, part of the East and South-East boundary of Location 441, the South-Eastern boundary of Location 663 and part of the South-Eastern boundary of Location 119, the South-Western boundary of Location 101 to its South-Western corner; thence South to intersect the production West of the Northern boundary of Location 828 and along the last-mentioned production to the North-Western corner of the said Location 828; thence South along the Western boundaries of Locations 828 and 408, part of the North and West boundary of Location 406, the Western boundary of Location 403, part of the North and Western boundary of Location 405 to the South-West corner; thence South to intersect the district boundary.

On the Southward by part of the district boundary to the Eastern boundary of the South Ward.

On the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the South Ward and the Eastern boundary of Burngup Ward to the starting point. (1 member).

Newdegate Ward.

Bounded on the North, East and South by part of the district boundary, and on the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the Biddy Ward. (2 members).

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1678/27.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvement, Bassendean Road Board:—(1) Proposed four-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at existing eight-inch main in Perth-Guildford Road at the junction of the said road and Kenny Street, and proceeding thence in a Southerly direction along Kenny Street to connect with the existing two-inch tube main at the junction of Shackleton Street and Kenny Street (length about twenty-nine chains), and (2) proposed two-inch tube main commencing at the above-mentioned proposed four-inch cast-iron main at the junction of Shackleton Street and Kenny Street, and proceeding in a Westerly direction along Shackleton Street to connect with the existing one-inch tube main at the junction of Kathleen Street and Shackleton Street (length about five chains), and (3) proposed two-inch tube main commencing at the above-mentioned proposed four-inch cast-iron main at the junction of Bridson Street and Kenny Street, and proceeding thence in an Easterly direction along Bridson Street to connect with the existing two-inch tube main at the junction of Wilson Street and Bridson Street (length about ten chains).

The above mains to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and existing two-inch and one-inch tubing to be lifted, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4725.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 6th day of January, 1928.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 318/27.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvements—Bassendean Road District:—(1) Proposed four-inch main at the intersection of Whitfield Street and Watson Street (length about sixteen chains), and (2) proposed two-inch diameter tube main commencing at the end of the above-mentioned proposed four-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at the intersection of Whitfield Street and Watson Street, and proceeding thence in a Southerly direction along Whitfield Street to Deakin Street to connect with the existing one-inch tube main at that point (length about fifteen chains).

The above mains to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary fittings, and existing one-inch tubing to be lifted, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4724.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 6th day of January, 1928.

Audit Act, 1904.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Sections 55 and 59 of "The Audit Act, 1904," provision is made for the opening of Suspense Accounts for the purposes therein mentioned: And by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of March, 1912, the Governor directed that a Suspense Account be opened for the purchase and sale of stock by the Department of Agriculture and Industries: And whereas it is enacted by Section 71 of the said Act that the Governor may make regulations (not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act) for carrying out the provisions of this Act: And the Governor has made regulations for the control of the said Stock Suspense Account, and the same were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th day of August, 1926: And whereas it is deemed expedient to amend Regulation 9 of the said Stock Suspense Account Regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend Regulation 9 of the said Stock Suspense Account Regulations by deleting therefrom all the words after the word "deceased" in line 8 thereof and by inserting in place thereof words as follows:—"In the event of the death of an animal, the Department to which the same is on hire shall send notice thereof in writing, together with that portion of the hide of the animal which bears the Register Book number provided for in Regulation 7 to the Stock Department immediately, and upon receipt thereof by the said Department the hire charges for the said animal shall be terminated."

After the termination of the engagement of a pearl-fisher the owner of the pearling ship on which such pearl-fisher was engaged shall, at or before the time of the discharge of the pearl-fisher, produce and show or cause to be produced and shown to the Superintendent any wages accounts in the possession,

custody, or power of himself or any agent of his relating to or in connection with the employment of the pearl-fisher during the said engagement.
