For the purpose of this By-law, "Heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers, sawn or hewn, split and other timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, salt, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight thereof including any load exceeds 10 cwt. per wheel, both inclusive.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895.

PURSUANT to paragraph 5 of Regulation (4) of the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1927, as amended on the 23rd day of November, 1927, I, the Minister for Agriculture, do by this notice constitute that portion of the State comprised within a radius of thirty (30) miles on either side of the Great Southern line from Spencer's Brook railway station to the Albany railway station, and also that portion of the State comprised within a radius of thirty (30) miles on either side of the following railways:—Narrogin-Corrigin-Merredin, Narrogin-Narembeen-Merredin, Brookton-Corrigin, York-Bruce Rock, Wagin-Lake Grace, Katanning-Pingrup, Tambellup-Ongerup, Narrogin-Bowelling, Wagin-Bowelling, Katanning-Boyup Brook, Narrogin-Wuraming, a Quarantine Area for the purposes of the said Regulations, and in relation to swine for the prevention of the spread of disease.

PLUMBERS (PERTH AND DISTRICTS).

(Registered 10/1/28.)

No. 2 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this ninth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between the Perth and District Master Plumbers' Industrial Union of Employers (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the West Australian Plumbers' and Sheet Metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree, the one with the other, as follows:—

1. Scope of Agreement.—This Agreement shall apply to workers employed to do in or about a building any work of a permanent nature in lead, or any of those metals which have superseded lead, particularly including the following classes of work:—

- (a) (i) Work in sheet lead, galvanised iron, or other sheet metal generally used by plumbers;
- (ii) Pipe work in lead, sheet metal, wrought iron, cast-iron, copper or brass;
- (iii) Work connected with the installation of gas, water (including appliances for heating purposes), steam or air for heating purposes;
- (iv) Sanitary and general plumbing;
- (v) Fitting and fixing baths, metal water troughs, and metal sinks.
- (b) Workers employed in ship or chemical plumbing;
- (c) Workers employed in fire sprinkler fitting;
- (d) Workers employed in fitting and fixing of corrugated asbestos.

2. Hours.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in six days.

3. Wages.—Base: £4 5s. per week.

The minimum rate of wage payable to workers under this Agreement, other than a duly registered apprentice or probationer, shall be 2s. 9d. per hour.

Where the work involves opening up drains four inches in diameter and upwards for the purpose of clearing chokages there shall be paid in addition to the prescribed rate of wage the sum of one penny per hour, with the minimum of one shilling for any such additional payment.

Workers employed on ships or in chemical plumbing, 1s. per day extra.

Licensed journeymen plumbers who are called upon to use their license for their employer shall be paid 1s. per hour extra.

4. Casual Employees.—Any employee who is employed for a period of less than five consecutive working days, exclusive of hours of overtime worked, shall be classed as a casual employee, and shall be paid one shilling per day extra for the time employed. Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a worker dismissed for misconduct or incompetence or owing to weather conditions.

5. Overtime.—Overtime shall be paid for all work required to be performed outside the usual working hours as follows:—Time and a half until midnight; double time from midnight till the usual starting time.

6. Travelling Time.—All travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another during the hours of work shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

7. Payment of Wages.—Workers shall be paid at the shop or on the job within fifteen minutes of the time of ceasing work.

8. Holidays.—All work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Eight Hour's Day, Christmas Day, and Union Picnic Day shall be paid for at double time rate.

9. Country Work.—Any worker sent by his employer to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be paid six shillings per day extra, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging. All travelling time not exceeding eight hours in any one day to and from the job shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares.

10. Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union, stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

11. Apprentices:

(a) In this Agreement a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause: Provided that an apprentice or a probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form (Form B and G in the Appendix hereto).

(c) If at the date of this Agreement any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him: Provided that an employer who is himself a certificated plumber working at the trade and employing at least two journeymen, shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time: Provided, however, that in the case of a partnership only one partner shall be entitled to be regarded as a journeyman for this purpose. Provided further, that an apprentice in his fifth year shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(g) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form—Transfer of Apprenticeship in the Appendix hereto.)

(h) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

- (1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (o), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form—Certificate of Competency in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this Agreement, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form—Transfer of Apprenticeship in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
- (3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(i) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

(j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination,

(l) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the Workers' Union, one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the Master Plumbers' Union, and one person to be nominated by the Director of Education, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination (Form 4 in the Appendix hereto), and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this Agreement, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(p) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

(q) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.

(r) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed, at the employer's expense, to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

12. Tools of Trade.—The following tools shall be provided by the employer:—

Metal pots, plumbing irons (but this shall not include copper soldering bits), mandrills, long dummies, stock and dies, for iron and brass pipes, cutters, all tongs over 12in., vices, hack saws and blades, taps and drills, hatchets, files, cramps, caulking tools, and chisels for brick and concrete.

The employer shall also supply all tools required for work to be performed on wrought iron and lead pipes over 2in. in diameter.

The worker shall supply only the usual kit bag of tools and blow lamp.

13. Time and Wages Book.—A Time and Wages Book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the Union during working hours.

14. Area.—This Agreement shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office in the city of Perth.

15. Term.—The term of this Agreement shall be for three years from the ninth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven: Provided, however, that any party hereof may, after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months therefrom, make application to the Court of Arbitration for a variation hereof.

(c) In the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiner or examiners appointed by the Arbitration Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(d) That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," or any Act or Acts amending the same, and any Regulations made thereunder, as far as the same concern the apprentice; and, also, the conditions and stipulations of any relative Award or Industrial Agreement for the time being in force.
