WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 30616/55 (Williams Location 10092), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 7 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Water and Road Access: Now, therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of the aforesaid Conditional Purchase Lease for the purpose aforesaid.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is enacted that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said schedule, and also that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals or birds are added to the said schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation: and whereas it is deemed expedient to add the name of animals known as Wild Goats to the said Third Schedule but to restrict this Proclamation in its operation to Upper Gascoyne Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act do hereby add to the said Third Schedule to the said Act the name of animals known as Wild Goats, for the purposes of the said Act, but this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to that portion of the State constituted and known as Upper Gascoyne Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act.

WHEREAS by "The Electoral Act, 1907," it is provided that new Rolls for any Province or District and new Rolls generally shall be prepared under the supervision of and issued by the Chief Electoral Officer whenever directed by Proclamation, and shall come into operation at a date to be stated in the same or any subsequent Proclamation: And whereas the Chief Electoral Officer was directed by Proclamation dated the tenth day of August, 1927, to prepare under his supervision and issue new Rolls for each Province: And whereas the new Roll for the South Province was duly prepared and issued: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Tuesday, the 31st day of January, 1928, as the date upon which the new Roll for the said Province will come into operation.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 27th day of January, 1928, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council, to be published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, prohibit the introduction or importation into this State either by sea or land of any stock from any country or place; and whereas outbreaks of swine fever have occurred in the States of Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania, and it is deemed expedient to prohibit the introduction or importation into this State either by sea or land of pigs from any of the said States for a period of six calendar months: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, does hereby prohibit for a period of six calendar months from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette* the introduction or importation into this State either by sea or land of pigs from any of the States of Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania.

The above main to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and existing one-inch tubing to be lifted, as shown on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4727.

PUBLIC SERVICE APPEAL BOARD ACT, 1920.

Regulations.

Executive Council Chamber,
Perth, 1st February, 1928.

IT is hereby notified, for public information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal the Regulations under "The Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of February, 1921, and to make the following Regulations under the said Act:—

1. Every appeal or application to the Board shall be made in writing addressed to the Public Service Appeal Board, signed by the appellant or applicant, and served on the Clerk to the Board. Short particulars of the appellant's or applicant's claim or complaint must be stated therein.

2. Every appellant or applicant shall lodge with his notice of appeal or application as many copies as the Clerk to the Board may require for service on the other parties thereto and for the use of the Board.

3. Seven days' notice at least shall be given by the Clerk to the Board to the parties concerned of the date fixed for the hearing of every appeal or application to the Board.

4. Every appellant or applicant shall, within four days of the receipt of notice of the date fixed for the hearing, supply the other parties to the proceedings with lists of the witnesses he intends to call, and any party to an appeal or application who intends to oppose the same shall, if required so to do, forthwith supply to the appellant or applicant a list of the witnesses he intends to call.

5. Any person who, having been notified in writing signed by the Clerk to the Board that he is required to attend as a witness before the Board at a time and place specified in the notice, and has been tendered reasonable conduct money if resident more than two miles from the place of sitting, fails, without reasonable excuse, to attend before the Board accordingly, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. Notice of any appeal in respect of any reclassification must be lodged with the Clerk to the Board within one month after the publication of such reclassification in the *Gazette*.

The Board may in any particular case, in its discretion, extend the time prescribed by this Regulation.

7. The Board may at any time allow an appellant or applicant to amend the statement of the grounds of his appeal or application on such terms (if any) as to the Board shall appear just.

8. The Board may in its discretion adjourn the hearing of any appeal or application for any good or sufficient reason.

9. No appeal or application shall be heard by the Board unless the appellant or applicant supplies the Board at least four days prior to the hearing with three copies of a statement in writing of the facts upon which the appellant or applicant relies, and also serves a copy of such statement upon the representative of the Minister of Education or the Public Service Commissioner, as circumstances may require, three days prior to the hearing.

10. After the decision of the Board or of a majority of the members of the Board has been reported in writing by the Board to the Governor, any party to the appeal or application shall be entitled to receive a copy of such report, in so far as it affects him, on application to the Clerk to the Board.

POLICE BENEFIT FUND REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations under the Ordinance to regulate the Police Benefit Fund (30 Victoria, No. 10) and to repeal the Regulations previously in force.

Police Benefit Fund Regulations.

1. These Regulations shall not apply to the Commissioner of Police nor to any person who, prior to or since his appointment as a commissioned officer, was paid a gratuity from the Western Australian Police Benefit Fund, but, subject as aforesaid, shall apply to every member of the Police Force who contributes to the Fund, including probationary constables during probationary service, who under these Regulations are included in the term "Police Force."

2. The Fund shall be constituted as follows:—

(a) Such annual grant as may be voted by Parliament.

(b) A fortnightly deduction at the rate of 3 per cent. per annum from the pay of members of the Police Force, in accordance with the following scale:—

Inspectors and Chief Inspectors, three per cent. per annum on their respective annual rates of pay.

(c) All fines imposed on the members of the Police Force.

(d) Proceeds of unclaimed stolen goods sold under Section 75 of "The Police Act, 1892."

(e) Fees and mileage received by members of the Police Force in serving process of a Local Court under "The Local Courts Act, 1904," or a Court of Petty Sessions under "The Justices Act, 1902-20," except such fees as are allowed to members of the Police Force duly appointed as Bailiffs under Police Regulations.

(f) Fees, mileage, and other expenses received by members of the Police Force in the service of a writ of execution of a warrant of the Supreme Court.

3. The Board shall consist of five members, to be appointed from time to time by the Governor. One of such members shall be a member of the Executive Council, who shall be the Chairman of the Board; and two of such members shall be appointed, on the nomination of the Police Union, to represent the contributors to the Fund. The Police Union may also nominate one deputy to represent contributors during the absence of either of such members. Three members shall constitute a quorum at the meetings of the Board.

4. The members of the Board (except the Chairman) shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor; provided that a nominated member shall not hold office without renomination and reappointment for a longer period than three years.

5. Any member of the Police Force who entered the service prior to the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served therein for twelve consecutive years or over shall be permitted to claim his discharge therefrom, and a gratuity of one month's pay for each year's service. This provision shall also apply to any member who has drawn his gratuity upon enlisting for active service abroad, and who, upon returning to the State, rejoins the Force.

6. Any member of the Police Force who entered the service on or after the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served therein for twelve consecutive

years or over shall be permitted to claim his discharge therefrom and a gratuity on the following basis:—

Period of Service and number of Weeks' Salary for each Year of Service.

- Over 12 and under 15 years—two.
- Over 15 and under 20 years—two and two-thirds.
- Over 20 and under 25 years—three.
- Over 25 years—one calendar month.

7. The service of any member of the Police Force who resigned upon enlisting for active service abroad, and who, upon returning to the State, rejoins the Force, and pays arrears of contributions, shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be deemed to be continuous. The period allowed for repayment of such arrears shall be the same as that spent on active service. In the event of a contributor leaving the Force before the whole of the arrears are paid, the amount unpaid shall be deducted from any gratuity due under the Regulations. Provided that in cases where a gratuity was paid the amount of same shall be taken into account, when any further gratuity shall become payable, by deducting from the amount of such further gratuity as computed on the whole period of service, a sum calculated by taking the amount of the gratuity previously paid and adding thereto compound interest from date of payment at 1½ per cent. per annum with yearly rests.

8. Any member of the Police Force who may have served therein for seven consecutive years, and who may be reported on medical authority as unfit for further service, may claim a gratuity of one month's pay for each year's service.

9. Any member of the Police Force compelled to leave the service from injuries received, or ill-health contracted in the execution of his duty, may claim a gratuity not exceeding one year's pay in addition to any further claim he may have under these Regulations, provided that the Board may refuse any gratuity under this rule unless notice of the injuries or ill-health has been given by or on behalf of such member to the Commissioner of Police as soon as practicable after such injuries were received or such ill-health contracted and recorded on the personal file of such member.

10. The widow, or if there be no widow, then the orphan (or orphans), or if there be neither widow nor orphans, then the next of kin of any member of the Police Force who may have served therein for a period of seven years or over, may claim a gratuity not exceeding one month's pay for each year's service of the deceased.

11. The widow, or if there be no widow, then the orphan (or orphans), or if there be neither widow nor orphan, then the next of kin of any member of the Police Force who shall have lost his life in the discharge of his duty may claim a gratuity equal to one year's pay of the deceased, in addition to any further claim he might have had under these Regulations.

12. For the purpose of the foregoing Regulations a gratuity based on one month's pay for each year of service shall be calculated on the basis of the average monthly rate of pay received for the last three years of service.

13. The widow, or if there be no widow, then the orphan (or orphans), or if there be neither widow nor orphan, then the next of kin of any member of the Police Force who has served for a period of more than one year and less than seven years therein, may claim a gratuity of not more than £50.

14. The character and pecuniary position of the widow, and the number and pecuniary position of the children or next of kin, as the case may be, of the deceased member of the Police Force, will invariably be taken into consideration by the Board when recommending gratuities from this Fund, and it shall be lawful for the Board to apply the gratuity granted to such widow or orphans or next of kin for their benefit in such manner as the Board may deem fit.

15. It shall be competent for the Board to recommend the payment of gratuities in any deserving cases not comprised in the foregoing regulations.

16. All claims for gratuities must be supported by such certificates, vouchers, or testimonials as may be reasonably required by the Board.

17. In calculating the amount of gratuity awarded in any case, the period of service shall count from the date at which a member of the Police Force commenced to contribute to the Fund; except in respect of members who were contributors prior to 20th May, 1908. In such cases the period of service shall count from the date of appointment to the Force.

18. The moneys described in Regulation 2 shall be paid to the credit of an account in the Treasury to be

called "Western Australian Police Benefit Fund Account," and moneys shall be drawn therefrom only on the approval of the Governor in Council.

19. The Board shall cause to be kept a proper record of receipts and disbursements made under these Regulations, and such shall be audited every twelve months by the Auditor General, who shall affix his signature to the yearly statement, and every four years the condition of the Fund shall be examined by the Government Actuary, who shall report on such to the Board.

20. Of the amount to the credit of the Fund such sums as may be recommended by the Board shall be invested in Government Inscribed Stock or other approved security, and the balance, with all other moneys paid into the Treasury from time to time on account of the Fund shall be payable to an account in the State Savings Bank.

By-laws.

(1) The term "Board," in these By-laws, shall mean the Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," to control Reserve "A" 15513 (at Denmark).

The term "Reserve" shall mean Reserve A15513. "Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board expressed in writing.

(2) The Reserve shall be open to the public at the discretion of the Board.

(3) No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who is in a state of intoxication.

(4) No person, except those acting under the direction of the Board, shall remove or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein.

(5) No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure, or attach bills within the Reserve to any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(6) No person shall have or place within or on the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, dogs, or other animals without permission.

(7) No person shall camp on the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, nor offer or expose for sale or sell therein any fruit, drinks, or other article, without the permission in writing of the Board.

(8) Every person partaking of refreshment in the Reserve shall deposit all refuse in the receptacles provided.

(9) No assemblies for fetes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place on the Reserve without permission.

(10) No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers on the Reserve, nor shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

(11) No person, except by permission, shall bring into or use on the Reserve any cart, truck, bicycle, motor

car, motor cycle, aeroplane, airship, or any other vehicle of any description whatever.

(12) No person shall expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection on the Reserve.

(13) No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall, in addition to any other penalty which may be inflicted under these Regulations, be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

(14) No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport, or gymnastic exercise, or break in, train, or exercise horses on the Reserve without permission.

(15) No person, except workmen employed by the Board on the Reserve, shall enter any place therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, flowers, or shrubs, nor step or walk upon any plot therein which may be set apart for plants or flowers.

(16) No person shall carry, use, or discharge any firearms on the Reserve.

(17) No person shall in any part of the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer, gardener, keeper, labourer, workman, or other person employed in any connection therewith.

(18) Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.
