WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 41360/55 (Ninghan Locations 773 and 774), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 8 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Recreation: Now, therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of the aforesaid Conditional Purchase Lease for the purpose aforesaid.

Water Boards Act, 1904.

Brookton Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 1058/27.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," it is provided that, before undertaking the construction of water works, the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval; and that if they

are approved, the Governor may forthwith by Order in Council empower the Minister to undertake the construction of the proposed works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the plans, descriptions, books of reference, and estimates marked P.W.D., W.A., No. 25506, for the construction of water works within the Brookton Water Area, which were duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the said works.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Bunbury Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1029/27.

WHEREAS by Section 202 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919" it is enacted that the Governor may in his discretion extend the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to any district or portion thereof; and whereas it is desirable to extend such provisions to portion of the Bunbury Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Order in Council, made under Section 202 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," extend such provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act, to that portion of the Bunbury Road District as described in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

All that portion of the Bunbury Road District bounded on the Westward and Northward by part of the District boundary from the Western corner of Wellington Location 29 to Pelican Point on the left bank of the Collie River; on the Eastward by lines commencing at Pelican Point and extending Southward along the left bank of the Collie River and the East boundary of Leschenault Location 26 to the South-East corner of the said location.

On the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner and extending Westward along part of the South boundary of said Location 26, part of the East boundary of Wellington Location 16; the North and part of the East boundary of Location 243 to the Northern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve and along said side of the Railway Reserve to the South-Eastern corner of Location 39; thence along the East and North boundaries of said Location 39 and the North boundary of Location 29 to the starting point.

Also that portion of Wellington Location 41 bounded on the Northward by the District boundary; on the Eastward by the Western side of the Bunbury Race-course Railway Reserve, to the Southern corner of Lot 222; on the Southward by part of the Western boundary of said Lot 222 to the production East of the South boundary of Lot 218; thence along said production and South boundary and the South boundaries of Lots 215, 214, 213, 212, 211, 210, 209, 208, 207 and part of the West boundary of the last-mentioned lot to the production East of the South boundary of Lot 205; thence along the production and South boundary of said Lot 205 and the South boundaries of Lots 204, 203, 202, 201, 200 to the Western boundary of Location 41.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Kondinin Road District—Redescription of Ward Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 368/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council include within the Wards of a Road District any territory transferred from an adjoining Road District; and whereas it is desirable to include within the Wards of the Kondinin Road District territory transferred from the Narembeen, Corrigin, and Kulin Road Districts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council,

under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in that behalf doth hereby redescribe the Ward boundaries of the Lake Grace Road District, as in Schedule hereto, so as to include all territory transferred from the Narembeen, Corrigin, and Kulin Road Districts.

Kondinin Road District—Description of Ward Boundaries.

Town Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the North-West corner of Kondinin Lot 91 and extending Eastward along a South boundary of Avon Location 15090, the Southernmost boundary of Location 15091, and the South boundary of Location 24664 to the South-East corner of the last-mentioned location.

On the Eastward by part of the West boundary of Location 16612.

On the Southward by the Southern boundary of Lot 40 and its prolongation Westward to the production Northward of a West boundary of Location 15093; thence along the said production and part of the said Western boundary and the Northern boundary of Location 22499.

On the Westward by the South-Western boundary of Reserve 18874 and an East boundary of Location 15090 to the starting point.

West Ward.

Bounded on the Southward, Westward, and Northward by part of the district boundaries from the North-East corner of Location 23421 to the intersection of the Southern boundary of Reserve 18065 (Billaricay) with the Western side of the Kondinin-Merredin Railway Reserve.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending Southward along the said side of the Railway Reserve to the South-East corner of Location 23997, and along the Southernmost boundary of the said location, part of the East boundary of Location 16140, and part of the East boundary of Location 16139, the Northernmost boundary of Location 21721, and again along the Western side of the railway reserve to the North boundary of Location 16624, part of the North, the East, and part of the South boundary of the said Location 16624, the East and South boundaries of Location 16621, the East boundary of Location 15096, an East, a South, and again an East boundary of Location 15090, the South-West boundary of Reserve 18874, the Easternmost boundary of Locations 15092 and 23228, the Easternmost and part of the South boundary of Location 15098 and a South-Eastern boundary of Location 12202 to the starting point.

East Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary from its intersection with the East boundary of the West Ward to intersect the East boundary of Location 23954.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Southward along part of the East boundary of said Location 23954 to its South-East corner; thence Southward to a North-East corner of Location 23937 and along the Northernmost, the West and the South boundary of Location 23937 aforesaid to its South-East corner; thence to and along the Western boundaries of Locations 18705 and 23770, and part of the Southern boundary of the last-mentioned location, the Western boundaries of Locations 18686 and 18685, part of the North and West boundaries of Location 18684 and part of the West boundary of Location 18690 to intersect the district boundary.

On the Southward by part of the district boundary from the last-mentioned intersection to the Western side of the Railway Reserve.

On the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the West Ward, part of the South, the East, and part of the North boundary of the Town Ward and again by the Eastern boundary of the West Ward to the starting point.

Bounded on the Northward, Eastward, and Westward by part of the district boundaries, and on the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the East Ward.

The Traffic Act, 1919-26.
Belmont Park Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1/27.
WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act; and whereas it is desirable to empower the Belmont Park Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Belmont Park Road Board, by the By-law in the Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose; also to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

Belmont Park Road Board.

The Belmont Park Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Belmont Park Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over that portion of the Belmont-Kalamunda Road within the Belmont Park Road District is prohibited.

For the purposes of this By-law "Heavy Traffic" shall be as defined by Regulation 149 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of September, 1924.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any district may make By-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act, the Rockingham Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Building By-laws.

1. Interpretation:—

The words "public building" shall mean and include every building used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship; also every building used for purposes of public instruction; also every building used as a college, public hall, hospital, theatre, public concert room, public exhibition room, public cinema or picture halls, amusements, or for structures or enclosures used for any other public purposes.

2. No residence, shop, factory, or public building shall be commenced or alterations to an existing building begun until a plan and specification thereof, in accordance with Regulations 2 and 3 of the Building Regulations, the Second Schedule of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and Section 122, ss. 1, of "The Health Act, 1911-19," be submitted to the surveyor, the license fees paid, and his approval on behalf of the Board obtained for the proposed works. At the same time a locality plan, and also a tracing not less than 22in. x 15in. in size of the ground plan (scale 8ft. to 1in.) of all buildings, showing the size of all rooms, position of doors and windows, the thickness of walls, and the covered floor area of such buildings, and the relative positions of all boundaries, outbuildings, proposed drains, and dry wells; also the relative position of buildings on the adjoining property if within ten feet of the common boundary, shall be deposited with the surveyor, to remain permanently in his custody.

3. Fees:—

License for new building of brick, stone, or concrete 5s.; License for new building of wood, iron, or other material 2s. 6d.; License for alterations or additions to any existing building 2s. 6d.

4. No dwelling-house, residence, shop, factory, nor public building shall be erected on any block of land of a frontage of less than sixty-six feet and a depth of less than one hundred and sixty-five feet, without the permission of the Board, except in the case of blocks of less dimensions which were subdivided subject to the passing of this By-law.

5. No residence, shop, factory, nor public building shall be erected on any block of land within twenty feet of the front boundary or within three feet of any side boundary, without the permission of the Board.

6. Rooms intended for sleeping in shall not be of less cubic capacity than five hundred cubic feet and less height than ten feet.

Where a skillion is erected, height at the lowest side shall not be less than eight feet.

All other rooms shall not be less than ten feet in height.

7. All persons offending against the provisions of these By-laws shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Fire Brigade Employees' Industrial Union of Workers of W.A.

Registered 26th January, 1928.

Industrial Agreement.

No. 5 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this 20th day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board, a Board duly constituted under "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," controlling the Fire Brigades of Western Australia, hereinafter styled the said Board, of the one part, and the Fire Brigades Employees' Industrial Union of Workers of W.A., a Union registered under the said Industrial Arbitration Act, and hereinafter styled the said Union, of the other part, witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree one with the other, as follows:—

1.

In the construction of these presents the term "worker" shall apply to and include the several classes of employees specified in Clause 3 of this Agreement, to be employed as permanent and auxiliary firemen by the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board throughout the State of Western Australia.

2.

The minimum rate of wages which shall be paid by the said Board to workers is set out in Clause 3 of this Agreement.

3.—Rates of Pay.

Station-keeper	£5 15s. a week.
Senior fireman	£5 10s. a week.
First-class fireman	£5 5s. a week.
Second-class fireman	£5 0s. a week.
Third-class fireman	£4 15s. a week.

Where less than the full week is worked, workers are to be paid at per daily rate of wages for seven days a week.

These rates are based on the basic wage of £4 5s. a week, plus additional remuneration of 10s. a week to the base man.

4.—Auxiliary Firemen.

Auxiliary firemen shall receive a retaining fee of 12s. 6d. a month. At fires they shall receive 5s. for the first hour or part thereof, and 2s. 6d. for the second and each subsequent hour or part thereof.

5.—Seniority.

Seniority shall rank in the following order:—1, Station-keeper; 2, Senior fireman; 3, First-class fireman; 4, Second-class fireman; 5, Third-class fireman.

6.—Hours of Station Work.

The hours of station work shall be done on a system of two shifts, known as "A" and "B" platoons:—"A" from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., "B" from 6 p.m. to 8 a.m.

"A" platoon shall assume duty on the station at 8 a.m., and continue till 4 p.m., during which hours all station work and drills shall be done.

7.—Emergency Calls.

Any worker called out of his platoon hours to attend an emergency fire call shall be paid at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per hour or part thereof. Time to commence from signing on to signing off at station.

8.—Overtime.

Any work done outside the platoon hours, including travelling within the metropolitan area, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, except as otherwise herein provided.

This clause shall not apply to motor drivers whilst engaged in driving the Chief Officer's car, but for journeys extending beyond 24 hours an additional allowance of 5s. per day shall be paid.

9.—Meal Hours.

One hour shall be allowed for each meal. All meals to be taken on the station.

10.—Fire Calls.

From 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. the "A" platoon staff shall stand-by for fire calls only, at which hour they shall be relieved by the "B" platoon. The "B" platoon shall assume duty at 6 p.m. and shall stand by on the station until 8 a.m. the following morning. They shall not engage on work other than that incidental to actual fire calls, or station domestic work.

11.—Hours of Station Work (Night Shift).

The hours of rising shall be as follows:—The bells to go on at 6.45 a.m. If a fire call or calls be attended at 12 midnight or thereafter, and before 6.30 a.m., the bells shall ring one hour later for that morning.

12.—Watchroom Duty.

Each man shall take up watchroom duty as required by the Chief Officer.

13.—Change of Shifts.

On each third day a change of shifts shall take place, viz.:—"A" platoon shall commence duty at 8 a.m. and carry on until 8 a.m. the following morning, at which hour the "B" platoon shall relieve. "B" platoon shall be off duty from 8 a.m. on the third day to 8 a.m. on the fourth day, and vice versa.

One hour shall be allowed for each meal on the long shift. Meals to be taken on the station.

14.—Residence.

No restrictions shall be placed on men who are off duty as to residence, duty or otherwise, except as provided by Clause 7 hereof.

15.—Uniforms.

Permanent firemen shall receive in addition to the ordinary uniform issue a light undress coat for summer wear.

16.—Service Allowance.

After five years' service workers shall be paid a long service allowance of 5s. a week. After 10 years' service an additional allowance of 2s. 6d. a week, and after 15 years' service a further 2s. 6d. a week.

17.—Travelling Allowance.

Travelling allowance beyond the metropolitan area shall be granted on the following scale:—All ranks, actual travelling, 10s. a day; all ranks, relief, first 10 days, 8s. a day; all ranks, balance of time, 3s. 6d. a day.

18. Relieving.

Any fireman stationed within the metropolitan area, and required to take up duty outside the metropolitan area for a period of less than two months, shall be regarded as relieving, and shall be entitled to the allowance provided in Clause 17. Relieving shall be spread over as many of the staff as the Chief Officer finds workable.

19.—Annual Leave.

After the expiration of one year's service, workers shall be entitled to twenty-one (21) days annual leave, and thereafter a *pro rata* allowance in the case of a proportionate period, provided the service be satisfactory. Provided also that no leave shall accrue to any fireman until he has served at least three complete months.

20.—Sick Leave.

In case of sickness, upon production of a medical certificate of unfitness for duty, firemen shall be entitled to receive full pay in respect of 21 days over a triennial period. Further sick leave without pay may be granted at the discretion of the Board.

21.—Goldfields Allowance.

Workers on the goldfields shall receive an allowance of 15s. per week.

22.—Preference of Employment.

Every person employed as a permanent or partially-paid fireman must become a member of the Fire Brigade Employees' Industrial Union of Workers of W.A. before assuming duty, and remain a member of the Union whilst in the service of the Board.

23.—Duration of Agreement.

This Agreement shall remain in force from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, until the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, and shall not be subject to review or amendment during such period.
