*The Bankruptcy Act, 1924.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia intituled "The Bankruptcy Act, 1924," it is enacted that the jurisdiction in bankruptcy of a State Court may be exercised in the case of a State Court by such one or more Judges of the Court as the Governor General, with the consent of the Governor of the State, appoints for that purpose: And whereas it is expedient that each and every of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia should exercise such jurisdiction in bankruptcy: Now, therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, D.S.O., Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council, hereby consent to the appointment by the Governor General of each and every of the Judges of the Supreme Court to exercise such jurisdiction in bankruptcy.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to construct a Tank for Water Supply at Tineurrin, and to provide a Water Catchment in connection therewith on the land shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 25555 (L.T.O. Diagram 7758), which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the within enactment of Regulation 175a of the Bunbury Harbour Board Regulations, in respect to compelling fishing or pleasure boats to carry a light when navigating the Estuary and the Harbour, as adopted by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the 3rd February, 1928.

The Regulations made by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the first of October, 1909, are hereby amended by enacting the following new Regulation, viz :—

##### No. 175a.

##### *A.—Lights when Under Way.*

Open boats, sailing boats, and lighters of more than two tons measurement and less than 28 tons, when under way, shall not be obliged to carry the coloured side lights; but every such boat and vessel shall in lieu thereof have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on one side and a red glass on the other side, and on approaching to or being approached by another vessel,

such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

Every rowing or sailing boat not exceeding two tons measurement navigating the river at night shall be provided with a lantern of approved design, from which shall be temporarily exhibited a white light in sufficient time to prevent collision.

##### *B.—Anchor Lights for Boats.*

Every yacht, fishing vessel, launch, and every open boat, when at anchor between sunset and sunrise in an unauthorised anchorage, shall exhibit a white light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

##### *C.—Stern Lights.*

A vessel which is being overtaken by another shall show from her stern to such last-mentioned vessel a white light or a flare-up light.

## THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

*Belmont Park Road Board.**By-laws of the Belmont Park Road Board.*

P.W. 317/27.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Belmont Park Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

## Part I.—Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is to say:—

"The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.

"Board"—The Belmont Park Road Board.

"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

"District"—The District under the jurisdiction of the Belmont Park Road Board.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or Regulations thereunder.

## Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:—

- (a) To attend all Board meetings;
- (b) to attend all Committee meetings;
- (c) to take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees;
- (d) to conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;
- (e) to answer all questions on the Board's business;
- (f) to see that the accounts are audited quarterly, and the balance sheets prepared and published in the *Government Gazette* yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Districts Act, 1919."
- (g) to prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year;
- (h) to supervise the preparation of the Rate Books and the Board's electoral lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the supervisor, in accordance with the Board's resolutions;
- (i) to summon the members to Board and Committee meetings;
- (j) to keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;
- (k) to check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;
- (l) to report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto;
- (m) to see that no payments to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary, or such other officer as may be acting temporarily in that capacity;
- (n) to readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;

- (o) to see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;
- (p) to report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him;
- (q) to exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board;
- (r) to see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts;
- (s) to be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

## Appointment of Officers.

3. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

4. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands unless a ballot be demanded.

5. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present.

6. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

## Meetings and Proceedings.

7. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meeting adjourned.

8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified therein for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called for: Provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provision of the Act shall be first complied with.

9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is present.

11. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

12. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 min-

utes after time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

13. The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the Minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

#### Voting.

14. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

#### Minutes of Meetings.

15. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the Minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

#### Standing Orders.

16. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any).
- (b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.
- (d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the Chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.
- (e) Reports of sub-committees and officers.
- (f) Deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof.
- (g) Reading of correspondence received and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (i) Presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment.
- (j) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (k) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19).
- (l) General business.
- (m) Notice of motions.

17. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all others.

#### Tenders.

18. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of 5 per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory sureties.

#### Order of Debate—Speakers must not digress.

19. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

#### Correspondence.

20. All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary and submitted to the Board. No letter addressed to the Board shall be presented or read by a member.

#### Consideration of Reports.

21. (a) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(b) The recommendations of any committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be resolutions of the Board.

#### Precedence of Chairman.

22. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall preserve strict silence, so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

#### Notice of Motion—Absence of Mover.

23. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until next ordinary meeting of the Board.

#### Withdrawal of Motions.

24. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

#### Motions to be seconded.

25. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

#### Motions not to be withdrawn without consent.

26. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

#### Amendment may be moved.

27. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

#### Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

28. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.

29. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

30. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

#### Further Amendment may be moved on Amended Question.

31. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

#### How subsequent Amendments may be moved.

32. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

#### Motions for Adjournment.

33. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

#### Mover of Adjournment, when entitled to priority.

34. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

#### Notice of Question to be given.

35. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

#### Questions to be put without argument.

36. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

#### Replies and Objections.

37. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions except by permission of the Board.

#### Mode of addressing Board.

38. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the Chairman and speak to each other by their official designation, as Chairman or Secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

#### Speaker not to be interrupted if in order.

39. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as hereinafter provided for in pursuance of By-law.

#### Limitation as to number of speeches.

40. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observation than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

#### Determination of questions.

41. (a) All question shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the Chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the Chairman shall be final, unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division.

(b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

#### Divisions.

42. Upon a division be so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary.

#### Chairman may repeat question.

43. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

#### Acts of Disorder.

44. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any Committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or Committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question or addresses or attempts to address the Board or Committee upon any subject which the Board or Committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or Committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

#### Ruling of Chairman.

45. The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without further argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

#### Members called to order more than once.

46. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this By-law, or for any breach of decorum shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

#### Removal from Board Room—Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

47. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room on being requested so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his retirement until the termination of the sitting, and should such member disobey such order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

#### Disorder.

48. If disorder arises at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the chair. The Board on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

#### Appointment of Committee.

49. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

#### Finance and Accounts.

50. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the finance committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of moneys paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account at such Bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's Bank or Treasury accounts must be signed by the Chairman and any one member of the Board, and in all cases countersigned by the Secretary of the Board.

51. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same.

The regulations numbered 21 to 41 inclusive, made by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council under Section 197 of the Act on the 2nd. August, 1922, are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws.

#### Unauthorised Expenditure.

52. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

#### Common Seal.

53. The Common Seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

#### Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

54. Any person guilty of the following offences shall, on the conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

- (a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other property under the control of the Board.
- (b) Placing any parcel or other document, writing, or printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or any wall, fence, gate, or lamp-post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.

- (c) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (d) Placing, stacking, or storing within the limits of any town-site, in the open air, any cases, paper, shavings, crates packed with straw, or dangerous or inflammable substances so as to be or likely to become a source of danger through fire.

#### Preservation of trees.

55. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub, or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10), and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

#### Prescribing removal of verandahs.

56. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or over the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah or balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### Encroachment, etc.—removal of.

57. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which shall not exceed £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

#### Lighting.

58. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

#### Damaging roads.

59. No person shall either wilfully or negligently damage or destroy by means of horse team or any other means any road under construction or repair; any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Any person who :—

- (a) Cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) erects, without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) draws upon any road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto or any portion of other attachment trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

60. Any person taking any plough, cultivator, or other implement over or along any road and thereby damaging or marking such road in such a manner which

in the opinion of the Board may indirectly cause ultimate damage to the road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

61. Any person who draws upon any road any vehicle the wheel or wheels of which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### To protect bridges from fire.

62. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board) or who shall place any rushes or other inflammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

#### Prevention of trees falling across road.

63. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

64. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

#### Park lands, reserves, and recreation grounds.

65. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district, for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, or trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds or reserves, and shall pay to the Board the fees as set out hereunder, and comply with the provisions of these By-laws and any other regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such exclusive rights are granted.

#### Hawking.

66. No person shall be permitted to hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables or any article of merchandise without having first obtained a license from the Board and payment of fees as per schedule "A" hereto annexed :—

#### Schedule "A"

##### Fees for a Hawker's License.

For a license to hawk fish, meat, poultry, game, fruit or vegetables	5s.
For a license to hawk merchandise	5s.

A hawker's license shall be issued for a term of twelve months from date of issue.

#### Penalties.

67. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

68. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

69. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

These By-laws were passed and adopted by resolution of the Belmont Park Road Board on the fourteenth day of November, 1927.

## THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

*Yilgarn Road Board—By-laws.*

P.W. 9/26.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Yilgarn Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

## Part 1.—Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is to say:—

The Act—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.

Board—The Yilgarn Road Board.

Board Room shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

District—The District under the jurisdiction of the Yilgarn Road Board.

Secretary—The Secretary of the Board.

Chairman—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

Member—A member of the Board, and includes the Chairman.

Road or Reserve—Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

Person shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

Footpath or Footway shall include any part of the roadway set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

Permission of the Board—The consent of the Board given in writing. All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act, or other Acts or Regulations thereunder.

## Meetings and Proceedings.

2. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary meetings at least seven days before such meetings and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding seven days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or, after being present, he shall retire, one of the members of the Board, chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

3. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, "Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary for the transaction of ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting, for which seven days' notice shall be given. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the meeting was called.

4. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the second Saturday in each month, at 2 o'clock p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution, carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.

5. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least four members of the Board, including the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

6. Any four members may require the Board room cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

7. At all meetings of the Board where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there

shall be less than a quorum present) such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

8. The minutes of the preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

9. The Minute Book prescribed by the Minister shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board shall be entered by the Secretary.

## Order of Business.

10. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any);
- (b) consideration of business arising out of minutes;
- (c) adoption of Financial Statement and passing of accounts for payment;
- (d) reading of correspondence outward and inward, and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto;
- (e) presentations or memorials and committee or other reports and consideration thereof;
- (f) consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts;
- (g) motions of which previous notice has been given;
- (h) General business.

(i) Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask any question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question or questions only, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

11. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all other.

All notices of motion shall be in writing, and shall be lodged with the Secretary seven clear days before the ordinary meeting of the Board.

## Order of Debate.

12. Any member moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall stand and address himself to the Chairman and shall not digress from the subject of the debate.

13. A motion or amendment once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of a majority of the members of the Board then present.

14. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order to which they are moved.

15. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put to the vote by the Chairman.

16. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

17. When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

18. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amendment as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments, and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative. Provided that no more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

19. No member shall speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last carried motion; nevertheless, any member who may have misunderstood or misrepresented shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but

not after, and after the reply the amendment or original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

20. A member moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

#### Voting.

21. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands (unless a division is demanded), before the next business is proceeded with.

#### Appointment of Committees.

22. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members of a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or resolution of the Board. The quorum of a Committee shall comprise three members.

#### Common Seal.

23. The Common Seal of the Corporation shall be kept in a strong box, with two locks and keys, one of which keys shall be kept by the Chairman and the other by the Secretary. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

#### Urgent Works.

24. The Chairman, with one member, or in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in case of emergency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds. Any one member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Two pounds ten shillings in case of very urgent necessity upon "declared roads," but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

#### Unauthorised Expenditure.

25. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board, other than by the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed an unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person or Committee, and shall be disallowed by the Board.

#### Tenders.

26. Tenders shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of tenders comes on to be considered under the standing orders, or by a Committee appointed for that purpose.

#### Petitions.

27. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures. Any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

#### Appointment of Officers.

28. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. In the event of there being more than one applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by ballot, so as to obtain an absolute majority of the members present.

29. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the election, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least five of the members present.

#### Duties of Secretary.

30. The duties of the Secretary shall be:—

- (a) To attend all Board meetings;
- (b) To attend Committee meetings when considered necessary;

- (c) to take notes of all minutes of any meeting of the Board or a Committee, and prepare reports of Committees;
- (d) to conduct all correspondence, and give to the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes;
- (e) to answer all questions on the Board's business;
- (f) to supervise the preparation of the Rate Book and the Board's Electoral Lists, examine proofs of the latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, and prepare papers, etc., for the clerks;
- (g) to summon the members to Board and Committee meetings;
- (h) to keep the Cash Book, as well as any and all other books issued by the Minister for Works and Labour in accordance with instructions inserted therein, and those required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be written up every month ready for inspection of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them;
- (i) prepare and place before the Board the monthly statement at the end of each month and enter the same on the minutes as required by the Act;
- (j) check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for work have stated on them the authority under which the works have been done, and to check all returns by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and to see that the counterfoils of the receipt books accompany all returns; to supervise and to attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;
- (k) report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto;
- (l) to pay in to the Bank as soon as possible after receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board, as provided under the Act;
- (m) have the Bank Pass Book made up in readiness for the ordinary meeting of the Board, and shall produce it and also the banker's certificate. Should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours the Secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the Bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, who shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (n) readily and cheerfully obey the lawful commands or orders of the Board, and attend to all matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board, and not herein specified.

#### Duties of Supervisor.

31. The duties of the Supervisor shall be:—

- (a) To prepare plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings, street lighting, etc., under the control of the Board, situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly performed; lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all plans and specifications to the Board before tenders are called;
- (b) to see that the work of clearing and preparing all public roads and footpaths is properly carried out;
- (c) to see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience or insubordination, or found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him;
- (d) to see that all contracts are completed in accordance with the plans and specifications, and that the terms and conditions of contracts are faithfully fulfilled;
- (e) to see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency;



- (f) to see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently and to report any departure therefrom;
- (g) to examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year, or as required by the Board.

#### Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

32. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are forbidden, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

- (a) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any motor car, carriage or cart upon or along any footpath;
- (b) placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained;
- (c) burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place;
- (d) leaving any inflammable matter or material in any public place or shed, or on any open space or near any building, without first having obtained the permission of the Board;
- (e) damaging or destroying any well, dam, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate, or other property belonging to, in charge of, or under the control of the Board;
- (f) placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting on or contiguous to any public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, finger or lamp post, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;
- (g) opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or road without the permission of the Board first having been obtained;
- (h) rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game, to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath or road;
- (i) throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road or public place to the damage or danger of any person;
- (j) having an awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, by hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway, without the permission of the Board;
- (k) blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any road, without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto as shall be given by the Board;
- (l) furiously or negligently riding or driving along any road;
- (m) making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.

33. No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against these By-laws; and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.

#### To prevent obstructions on Footpaths and Roads.

34. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, firewood, sand, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road or footpath within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing the same.

35. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or material whatsoever on the surface of any road, footway, or public Reserve within the District without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

36. Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a

permit to deposit rubbish or material on the surface of any road, footway, or public Reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise, during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited.

#### Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footways or Roads.

37. Any person who shall throw vegetable or other offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any footway within the district shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed, or broken, in or upon any road, footway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils without first having obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine upon conviction not exceeding Two pounds, in addition to the amount of damages caused thereby.

#### Signboards, etc.

38. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, swing, awning, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without obtaining the consent of the Board shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

#### Encroachments or Obstructions to be Removed.

39. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal, within fourteen days, of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment upon any road, footpath, or public place under the control of the Board. In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and damages of the persons so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall not be more than Two pounds for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed herein.

#### To prevent Damage to Footpaths and other Board Property.

40. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board or under the control of the Board.

#### Damaging Roads.

41. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse teams, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### 42. Any person who—

- (a) cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Board, timber, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road;
- (b) erects any structure without the consent of the Board upon any road so as to encroach thereon;
- (c) draws, without the consent of the Board, across the water-table of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other vehicle;
- (d) draws upon a road any timber, stone, or other material, when carried principally or in part on a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage, any portion of which, or any portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion of any attachment trails or drags upon the road;

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.



**Heavy Traffic.**

43. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for the damage done.

44. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load of material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace and speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert; and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**Removal of Sand, Gravel, or Timber.**

45. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, stone, or other material from any lands belonging to or in charge of or under the control of the Board, without first obtaining permission from the Board and paying such fee or license as may be decided upon.

46. No person shall cut or remove any timber or bush on any land belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without first obtaining permission from the Board, and also paying such fee or license as may be decided upon.

**Careless Use of Fire.**

47. No person shall make or leave a fire on or near any road, track, or Reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

48. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

**Lamp Posts, etc.**

49. No lamp post, bridle post, telegraph, telephone, or electric light pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person upon any road without the written consent of the Board, and upon such consent being obtained, such post, pole or flagstaff shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, or as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts and poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

**Camels.**

50. (a) The owner of any bull camel or stallion straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(b) Any bull camel straying whilst "in season" shall be destroyed, and the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

(c) A yearly license fee of Five shillings shall be paid for every camel driver.

(d) The yearly registration fee for all packing camels used within the District shall be Ten shillings.

(e) The yearly registration fee for all draught camels used within the District shall be Five shillings.

(f) The yearly registration fee for all packing bull camels over three years old used within the District shall be Five pounds.

(g) The yearly registration fee for all draught bull camels over three years old used within the district shall be Ten shillings.

(h) All camel owners or drivers shall register with the Board the brands with which all camels owned are branded and registered.

(i) Numbered discs will be supplied by the Board and must be attached to the neck of all licensed camels.

(j) One driver or attendant shall drive or attend any number of camels not exceeding eight, except in wagons, and shall pay a license fee of Ten shillings yearly. Any driver or attendant found driving or attending camels without such license shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

(k) Any owner, driver, or attendant of camels shall, on demand of a member or officer of the Board, produce his license or certificate of registration, and shall give such information respecting ownership or use of camels as may be required by such member or officer of the Board.

(l) Application for registration and certificate of registration shall be in the form of Schedule hereunder:

(m) Any driver or attendant riding, driving, or leading camels other than camels attached to a wheeled vehicle, shall, on the approach of or being overtaken by any wheeled vehicle or horse or horses, immediately pull off the road a distance of at least twenty feet therefrom and there remain stationary until such vehicle or horses shall have passed. Any driver or attendant refusing or neglecting to promptly comply with this By-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

For preventing the pollution of Rivers, Streams, Watercourses, Wells, Reservoirs, Tanks or Dams within the District.

51. (a) No person shall deposit or cause or suffer or permit to be deposited any offensive material or any rubbish upon any place where such deposit is likely to pollute any river, stream, watercourse, well, or reservoir within the District, the water of which is used or reserved for domestic or drinking purposes.

(b) No person shall spill, slop, throw, cast or deposit any soapsuds, foul water, slops, offensive liquid or urine upon any place from which it is liable to flow into or pollute in any way any such river, stream, watercourse, well, or reservoir.

(c) No person shall camp within one hundred yards of any such river, stream, watercourse, well, or reservoir.

(d) No person shall bathe in any such well, stream, watercourse, or reservoir, or suffer or permit any dog, pig, or other domestic animal to enter therein.

(e) No person shall establish any offensive trade within one hundred yards of any such river, stream, watercourse, well, or reservoir, unless with the consent in writing of the Board.

(f) No person in charge of a horse or horses shall camp and take water for more than one night consecutively from any well, dam, or tank under the Board's control.

(g) No person in charge of mobs of horses, camels, cattle or sheep, other than teams actually working, shall take any water whatever from any well, dam, or tank under the Board's control, without first obtaining the written consent of the Board.

(h) Any person in charge of mobs of horses, cattle, camels, or sheep shall camp on the low side of any well, dam or reservoir.

Any person offending against this By-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Damage to Street Lights.

52. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp, shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## Registration of Goats.

53. No person shall keep any goat within any townsite unless such goat shall have been registered and the registration fee of Sixpence for each goat be paid to the Secretary of the Board.

Every registration shall be renewed in the month of July in each year.

The Board may refuse to register any goat if, in the opinion of the Board, suitable accommodation has not been provided for the keeping of such goat.

No person shall permit any goat to pasture or be at large upon any road, street, or way, nor upon any Reserve or other land belonging to or under the control of the Board, and any goat found so trespassing may be seized, impounded, or destroyed by any officer of the Board acting under the authority of the Board.

The penalty for breach of any of the preceding clauses of this By-law shall be a sum not exceeding Five pounds for each breach, in addition to such sums as the Justices may direct as compensation for damages done by such goats.

## Pasturing Cattle on Common.

54. No person shall allow horses, cattle, goats, or other animals to pasture on any common or other lands under the control of the Board, unless such cattle shall have been registered and the registration fee of Five shillings per head, payable yearly in advance, shall have been paid to the secretary of the Board. Any unregistered animal found upon such common or other lands under the control of the Board may be impounded and the owner thereof prosecuted.

Every registration shall be renewed during the month of July in each year.

The Board may refuse to register any animal that may be suffering from any contagious or infectious diseases, and may order the owner of such animal to have the same destroyed.

## For Regulating and Licensing Hawkers and Stall Holders.

55. (a) No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, vegetable, or merchandise within the Yilgarn Road Board District without first having obtained a License from the Board.

(b) Any person who trades or travels on foot with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carries to sell or expose or offer for sale within the said District any articles or things, shall be deemed to hawk the same. Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to any person or persons paying rates or liable to pay rates for any shop or store carrying on the usual business, trade, or delivery of goods therefrom.

(c) No person shall keep, manage, or conduct, any moveable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of clothing or merchandise without having obtained a License from the Board, and the payment of the License Fee as set forth in this By-law.

(d) Any place, tent, or other temporary structure, wherein goods are exposed or offered for sale, shall be deemed a stall within the meaning of this By-law.

(e) A License for Hawkers shall be in the form "G," and for Stalls in the form "H" of the schedule attached hereto.

(f) Every hawker whilst engaged in hawking must produce his License when requested to do so by any police constable or officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket or vehicle a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly written thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

(g) No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any position other than that fixed by the Board and endorsed on such License.

(h) No person to whom a Hawker's License or a Stall Holder's License has been granted shall lend, transfer or assign his License, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such License granted to a person other than himself.

(i) The following fees shall be paid in advance for Licenses issued to Hawkers and Stall Holders, and no such License shall have effect beyond the period for which such payment in advance has been made:—

For every hawker with basket or tray—12s. per half-year.

For every hawker with wheelbarrow or handcart—15s. per half-year.

For every hawker with motor vehicle or vehicle drawn with horse or other animal power—15s. per quarter.

For every Stall the license fee shall be fixed from time to time by the Board, but in no case shall the fee be less than Ten shillings per week, payable in advance.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## Fencing Land.

56. Within any Townsite the Board may order that any land abutting upon any street or way shall be fenced to the satisfaction of the Board with a fence of the following specification:—Posts shall be of jarrah or other approved timber not less than 5in. x 3in., placed not more than 9 feet apart and sunk in the ground to a depth of not less than 2 feet 6 inches. Rails shall be of jarrah or other approved timber, shall be at least two to each span, and not less than 4 inches x 2 inches in dimension, scarfed flush with the face of posts and well jointed on each alternate post. Pickets shall be of 3 inches x 1 inch dimension jarrah or other approved timber, 4 feet 6 inches in length and securely nailed to rails with 2 inch nails, four nails to each picket. Pickets to be spaced not more than 3 inches apart.

If the work is not carried out within the time specified in such order, the Board may execute the work, and the cost thereof shall be a charge upon the land and may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

57. No person shall erect any fence abutting upon any street or way within a Townsite with projections beyond the building line, nor use any barbed wire upon any fence unless such barbed wire is recessed from such fence a distance of at least one foot.

Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## Vacant Lots in Townsites.

58. The owner of any vacant lot in any Townsite shall, upon notice served on him by the Board, clear such vacant lot of trees, scrub, and undergrowth to the satisfaction of the Board. Penalty Two pounds.

## Poisonous Plants.

59. When any road has been cleared of poisonous plants by the Board, the owner or occupier of land abutting on such road shall keep the same clear of poisonous plants. Penalty Two pounds

## Penalties.

60. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence.

61. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of the Board, and form part of the ordinary revenue of the District, except so much as may be payable to an informer.

62. All By-laws which obtained in this District prior to this date are hereby repealed.

#### THE ROADS DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

*Harvey Road Board—Building By-laws.*

P.W. 4/27.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes under the Act recited, the Harvey Road Board, in pursuance of powers vested under the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following, which shall be known and cited as "The Building By-laws":—

"The words 'public building' shall mean and include every building used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship; also every building used for purposes of public instruction; also every building used as a college, public hall, hospital, theatre, public concert room, public exhibition room, public cinema or picture halls, amusements, or for structures or enclosures used for any other public purposes."

1. No person shall lay out a block of ground for building unless and until a plan showing clearly the number of houses or buildings proposed to be erected thereon, and the area to be occupied by each house or building, and the position of every drain and privy, and a copy of the specification, have been laid before and approved by the Board, in accordance with Building Regulation No. 2.

2. No person shall commence to build, alter, add to, or do any of the other acts or works mentioned in Building Regulation No. 3, unless he—

- (a) Shall have made application in the form provided in Schedule "A," and
- (b) shall have deposited plans and specifications prepared in accordance with By-law No. 4, and
- (c) shall have paid the appropriate fees as set out in Schedule "B," and
- (d) until there has been issued therefor a Building License in the form set out in Schedule "C," and the plans and specifications have been duly endorsed as approved by the Board.

Penalty for breach, not exceeding £20, and £2 per day for such time as the offence continues.

3. No person who shall have obtained the approval of the Board as provided hereinbefore, in respect of any building or addition or alteration, shall, in the construction of such building or addition or alteration, curtail or otherwise depart from the plans and specifications which have been approved, without the written consent of the Board first had and obtained, and such alterations or departures from approved plans and specifications shall be drawn, described, and endorsed on and in the plans and specifications.

Penalty for breach not exceeding £20, and £2 per day for such time as the offence continues,

4. All plans shall be neatly made in ink (scale 8 feet to 1 inch) on drawing paper, tracing cloth, or sunprint of at least 15in. x 20in. in size. The plans shall show every storey, elevations of external fronts, and one or more sections, showing the heights of storeys, depth of foundations, level of ground, construction of walls, roofs, floors, etc., all clearly figured and dimensioned in feet and inches.

There shall also be deposited in locality plan (scale not less than 16 feet to 1 inch) showing the position of the site, on the block of the proposed building, and showing other buildings existing thereon, with all drains, privies, and other works.

Copies of the locality and ground plans shall be left permanently with the Board. All plans, drawing, and specifications must be signed by the building owner or his duly authorised agent.

All specifications shall be compiled so as to clearly and fully set forth the materials, workmanship, and every detail for the due completion of the work it refers to.

Plans and specifications shall be left with the Board at least seven days before the issue of the Building License.

5. Whenever requested to do so by the Board, the holder of a Building License shall produce for inspection any plan or specification that has been approved by the Board and referred to in such Building License.

6. The level of the ground floor of any building shall not be less than three inches above the level of the adjacent footway or crown of the road, without the written permission of the Board first had. In cases where the road or footpath has not been constructed, the level of the ground floor shall be at such height as the Board shall determine, and for this purpose a cross-section of the building site shall be supplied by the building owner, showing the relative levels of the site and the unmade road.

7. The Board may refuse to approve of any plan or specification which has not, by reason of inflammable material proposed to be used, or for other reason, proper regard to the safety of persons or buildings in the event of fire.

8. The Board may refuse to approve of any plans or specifications which, in the opinion of the Board, are by reason of size or design of construction or architecture calculated to have a depreciative effect on adjacent buildings, or on the locality where the proposed buildings would be erected.

9. No license will be granted for the erection of a building of wood or iron, or with materials other than brick, stone, or artificial stone unless the position and design, or value of such building will not, in the opinion of the Board, be prejudicial to adjacent buildings, or to the locality where the proposed buildings would be erected.

10. No part of a building to be used as a dwelling house shall be placed at a lesser distance than five feet from the side boundaries of the block, nor at a lesser distance than ten feet from the road boundary or any adjacent building, unless the written authority of the Board has been first obtained.

11. No person shall open any footpath or road, or place any materials upon the same, nor erect any staging thereon, unless he first give three days' clear notice thereof in writing, and deposits the sum of £5, and have obtained the written consent of the Board, and shall comply with all conditions as to covering, railings, lights, and other requirements which may be set out in the consent herein referred to.

(a) On the completion of the work, the person to whom the consent has been issued shall, within three days, fill in and repair all disturbances in the road or footpath, and shall remove all materials therefrom. On the work of repair and removal having been done to the satisfaction of the Board, the deposit will be refunded in due course.

(b) If the work referred to in (a) has not been done to the satisfaction of the Board or is unduly delayed, the Board may do the necessary work at the cost and charge of the person to whom the aforesaid consent was given.

12. No person shall erect any verandah (or other projection) over any public way without first having deposited plans and specifications of the proposed erection, and if approved by the Board, the said plans and specifications shall be endorsed as approved, subject, however, to any conditions which may be attached thereto.

No advertising, trade, or other signs shall be displayed on any verandah (or other projection) over any public way save with the written approval of the Board first had.

13. A privy in accordance with the Health By-laws shall be provided before any further work is done (where such is not already on the premises) for the use of all workmen employed on the job.

14. Any person who does any act contrary to or neglects or omits to do any act required to be done within the meaning of these By-laws shall, where no specific penalty is otherwise provided, incur a penalty not exceeding £10 and a further penalty of £1 per day for each day the offence continues.

INTERNAL COMBUSTION AND STEAM ROAD ROLLER DRIVERS EMPLOYED BY MAIN ROADS BOARD, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 6 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between the Main Roads Board, Western Australia, of the one part, and the Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association, West Australian Branch, of the other part. Whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Basic Wage.

This Agreement is based on a basic wage of 85s. per week for Perth.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall remain in force for three years from date hereof: Provided that after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof the Court may amend or revise the Agreement on the application of either of the parties: Provided also, that the rates of pay will be subject to amendment in accordance with the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act Amendment Act, 1925."

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply only to members of the Association employed by the Main Roads Board, Western Australia, in and about the construction of roads in the State of Western Australia.

4.—Wages.

Steam Roller Drivers—£6 per week, plus allowance for necessary early and late attendance for firing up, banking fires, etc., viz.—3 hours Monday, and 1 hour each other working day, at time and a half rates.

5.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in 6 shifts, 5 of eight hours, and four hours on Saturday.

6.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

7.—Interpretations.

(a) "Metropolitan District" shall mean all that area of land comprised within a circle of which the centre is the General Post Office, Perth, and the radius of which is twenty miles; provided that an allowance equivalent to 6s. per week be paid within this district when the nature of the work necessitates the men living in camp at the job, or the location of the work makes it inconvenient for them to return to their homes every night: Provided also, that employees not in camp and

employed within such district on work situated more than one mile from the nearest tram or railway station shall receive an allowance equivalent to three shillings per week in addition to their ordinary pay, unless travelling in the Board's time.

(b) "Geraldton District," "Bunbury District," "Busselton District," and "Albany District" shall mean those areas of land comprised within a radius of three miles from the Geraldton, Bunbury, Busselton, and Albany Post Offices respectively; provided that an allowance equivalent to six shillings per week shall be paid within these districts when the nature or location of the work necessitates the men living in camp at the job.

#### 8.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, time and a half, and thereafter double time: provided that employees called to start work within one hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at time and a half rates until the usual starting time. Double time shall be paid for work required to be done on Sundays, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Good Friday. This clause shall not apply to early and late attendance, as set out in Clause (4) hereof, for Steam Road Roller Drivers.

#### 9.—District Allowance.

As per Clause "28" of A.W.U. Agreement.

#### 10.—Holidays.

An employee, after one month's continuous service, shall receive, inclusive of all public holidays taken, holiday pay equivalent to one day's pay of eight hours for each month of continuous service, and the proportion of a day's pay for a broken period of a month, including any Sundays occurring in such broken period, calculated on the basis of the days in the month in which payment is made. At each Christmas time all paid holidays then due shall be taken. Absence from work for any of the following reasons shall not break continuity of service, and the period shall be considered as service for the purpose of this clause only:—

- (a) Temporary stoppage of work for the Christmas or Easter holidays; provided the employee reports for duty on the date fixed for resumption of work;
- (b) Inclemency of weather, provided that the employee is ready and willing to work if called upon;
- (c) Leave granted by the Officer in Charge or Ganger on account of illness or special necessity up to a period of not exceeding six days in any one year;
- (d) Period occupied in proceeding from job to job, as provided in Clause 13 (b) of A.W.U. Agreement.

#### 11.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment in respect to tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to Members of the Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Workers of Western Australia.

#### 12.—Existing Customs.

Existing customs and practices will be continued unless the contrary is provided in this Agreement.
