WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Grazing Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Grazing Lease 5774/68 (Victoria Location 5286), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 12 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Quarry (Gravel): Now, therefore I, Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of the aforesaid Grazing Lease for the purpose aforesaid.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 29th day of February, 1928, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests File 532/25; L. & S. File 5009/26.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may by an Order in Council declare any Crown lands as Timber Reserves within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the Crown lands, described in Schedule I. hereto, Timber Reserves Nos. 73/25 to 83/25 inclusive within the meaning and for the purpose of "The Forests Act, 1918."

The Proclamations setting apart the various State Forests, under Section 8 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904" (now repealed), as set out in Schedule II. attached, are hereby annulled.

Spark Arresters.

105a. (1.) The owner or any person in charge of sawmilling operations involving the use of a locomotive or stationary steam engine used within the boundaries of a State Forest or Timber Reserve, or of the area of a timber lease, permit, or forest lease, shall, if notified in writing by the Conservator or any officer of the Forests Department, take the following precautions with the object of preventing the outbreak of fires caused by the falling of sparks and cinders from a steam engine:—

(a) Fit any such engine with a spark arrester of a type approved by the Conservator during the period from the 1st day of October in any one year until the 30th day of April in the following year, and maintain such spark arrester in good order and fit for its purpose;

(b) Equip and maintain in good order the ashpan of any such engine to prevent live cinders escaping therefrom.

(2.) The Conservator or any Forest Officer may inspect any such engine for the purpose of ascertaining whether the requirements of these Regulations are being complied with, and if, after such inspection, it is found that the spark arrester has not been fitted, or that the spark arrester, if fitted, is not suitable for its purpose, or that necessary precautions are not being taken to prevent live cinders escaping from the ashpan, may direct that the fire from any such engine shall be withdrawn forthwith, and that the engine shall not be used until the requirements of these regulations have been met. The owner shall afford to the Conservator or a Forest Officer reasonable facilities for such inspection and observe such directions as aforesaid.

(3.) Any person failing to comply with any of the requirements of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

105b. In the event of any fire being caused within the boundaries of a State Forest or Timber Reserve, or of the area of a timber lease, permit, or forest lease, by falling sparks or cinders from a locomotive or stationary steam engine, the Conservator may recover from the owner of such engine damages (to be assessed by the Conservator) for injuries to the forest caused by such fire, together with the costs incurred by the Conservator in suppressing such fire, unless the owner can prove to the satisfaction of the Conservator that the requirements of these regulations have been complied with.

Award of Industrial Board.

1.—Secpe.

This Award shall apply to any person employed as a "Shed Clerk in Charge" by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

The term "Shed Clerk in Charge" shall mean and include any clerk employed in charge of a shed or berth.

2.—Hours.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be forty-four per week, and shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

3.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wages to be paid to Shed Clerk in Charge shall be at the rate of £7 7s. per week. This rate is based upon the basic wage of £4 5s. per week, with a margin or allowance of £3 2s. per week

4.—Overtime.

All overtime work and work on holidays shall be paid for at threepence per hour over the rates prescribed in Awards operative for waterside workers and applicable to members of the Waterside Workers' Federation of Australia at Fremantle.

5.—Engagement.

(a) Shed Clerks in Charge shall be guaranteed continuity of employment at ordinary time rates, but the services of any Shed Clerk in Charge shall be terminable by one month's notice on either side, which condition shall operate in all circumstances, except in cases of summary dismissal for misconduct such as pecculation, drunkenness, or other serious misconduct. Provided that the one month's notice shall not apply to Shed Clerks in Charge who are engaged in a temporary or relieving capacity.

(b) Where any dispute arises between the Commissioners and Shed Clerks in Charge in regard to conditions of engagement, such dispute shall, if not settled by the parties, be referred to this Board for settlement.

6.—Annual Leave.

Shed Clerks in Charge shall be entitled to two clear weeks' leave of absence per annum on full pay at ordinary rates, except in case of dismissal for misconduct.

7.—Long Service Leave.

Shed Clerks in Charge shall be entitled to long service leave in accordance with Regulation No. 12 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 9th November, 1923, the date of computation of service qualifying for such leave to be the 1st July, 1921.

8.—Area.

The area covered by this Award shall be the premises controlled by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners in accordance with "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902."
