## PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Robert Furze  
TO WIT. } McMillan, K.C.M.G., Lieut.-Governor  
R. F. McMILLAN, in and over the State of Western  
Lieut.-Governor. Australia and its Dependencies in  
[L.S.] the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the York Municipal Council has requested that certain land, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of York, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and storm-

water drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieut.-Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage.—Area No. 16, Fremantle District, reticulation sewers of various sizes, with all manholes, inspection shafts, and all other apparatus connected therewith, as shown in red and green on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4795, deposited at the office of the Minister.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. Pth. 7674.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted:—Metropolitan Sewerage—Municipality of Perth, Metropolitan Markets:—Proposed 6-inch diameter stoneware reticulation sewers—(a) Commencing with a new manhole, No. 758, at a point on Section No. 13, Reticulation Area No. 11, 115 feet upstream from existing manhole No. 757, and proceeding North-Westerly through private property for a distance of 176 feet to manhole No. 759; thence continuing North-Westerly for a distance of 176 feet to manhole No. 760; thence West for a distance of 88 feet to existing manhole No. 762 in Prince Street: also North from the said manhole No. 760, through private property for a distance of 100 feet to manhole No. 761, situated 86 feet downstream from existing manhole No. 761 on Section No. 13; (b) Commencing with a new manhole, No. 765, at a point on Section No. 15, Reticulation Area No. 11, 64 feet upstream from existing manhole No. 757, and proceeding South-Westerly through private property for a distance of 86 feet to manhole No. 766; thence North-Westerly through private property for a distance of 290 feet to manhole No. 766A.

The above mains to be completed with manholes and all necessary apparatus, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., 4775.

Uniforms.

Captains with not less than five years' service as Captains under the Board, and not less than fifteen years' service in all, shall be entitled to retain and wear their uniforms, and to wear an ex-captain's badge. Firemen with not less than twenty-five years' service shall be entitled to retain and wear their uniforms. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this regulation.

The Board may, however, in its discretion, withhold the above privileges if the applicant shall at any time have been adjudged guilty of any offence against the Board's regulations.
