PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse

 Lieut.-Governor, Australia and its Dependencies in

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Board, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

The Schedule.

Armadale-Pemberton Road—(Harvey Road Board District.

That portion of the Perth-Bunbury Road on Lands Lithographs Nos: 383/80 and 411/80, commencing at the Southern boundary of the Drakesbrook Road Board District; thence continuing in a South-Easterly direction along said road, crossing the Northern boundary of the townsite of Wagerup; thence continuing along the said road, crossing the Timber Tramway and the Southern boundary of the Townsite of Wagerup; thence continuing generally in a Southerly direction to bridge at the Harvey River; thence continuing along Road No. 46 in a South-Westerly direction to Wokalup Siding; thence crossing the South-Western Railway, at this point, to its Western side, and following the said railway in a South-Westerly direction to its junction with Road No. 1150; thence continuing in a South-Westerly and Southerly direction along Road

No. 46 to the Collie River at the Southern boundary of the Harvey Road Board District, as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A. 335.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the fifteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between Wunderlich, Limited; J. S. Gray; H. Shashall, and Westralian Potteries, Limited (hereinafter called the employers), of the one part, and Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, Porcelain, and Roof Tile Fixers Employees' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called the Union), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed to do all work on or in connection with the laying and fixing of roofing tiles and slates, also battens, the bedding and laying of hips, ridge capping and roof accessories, and the necessary wiring or nailing of such tiles or slates.

2.—Hours.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, and, subject to the proviso hereinafter contained, shall be divided as follows:—Eight hours per day from Monday to Friday inclusive, and four hours on Saturday: Provided that, at the option of any employer, the forty-four hours may be worked from Monday to Friday inclusive within hours mutually agreed by the employer and the Union.

3.—Overtime.

All time worked after the completion of forty-four hours work in any one week shall be overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter.

4.—Sunday and Holiday Work.

Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays and the following holidays:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, New Year's Day; such double time shall be calculated on the basic wage, plus margin for skill only.

5.—Wages.

Basic wage, £4 5s. 0d. per week.

The minimum rate of wages payable shall be as follows:—

Adults.

- (a) Tile Fixers—Basic Wage, £4 5s. 0d.; Margin for Skill, 16.4d.; Other Allowances, 5s.; Total per Week, £5 6s. 4d.
- (b) Labourers—Basic Wage, £4 5s. 0d.; Other Allowances, 5s.; Total per Week, £4 10s. 0d.

6.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

7.—Contract of Employment.

For the purpose of convenience, the wages set out above are stated on a weekly basis, but it shall be understood between the parties that the contract of employment shall be an hourly one, terminable on either side by one hour's notice, and the worker shall, in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the hour when such notice terminates.

8.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to perform work for which a higher rate is prescribed under this Agreement than for that which he usually performs, shall be entitled to payment at such higher rate for such period as he is actually engaged upon such work.

9.—Proportion of Juniors.

One junior tiler to one adult tiler.

10.—Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the name of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, and the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker and the time during which he has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union at least one day in each week, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. The employer and worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper keeping of such book.

11.—Country Work and Travelling Time.

When any worker is sent by his employer, or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such distance that he cannot return to his home each night, then, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid at the rate of thirty shillings per week of seven days in addition to his regular wage.

The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time, provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day.

12.—Refund of Disbursements.

The employer shall refund to a worker any out-of-pocket expenses incurred on behalf of the employer in respect of telephone calls and purchase of materials.

13.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force for a period of three years, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration at any time after the expiration of twelve months from such date and/or at the end of any succeeding twelve months from the date of any such application to amend this Agreement.

14.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its operation to the area comprised within a radius of thirty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

AGREEMENT.

(Registered 28th June, 1928.)

No. 17 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the twenty-third day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between Malloch Brothers; W.A. Netting and Wire Products Manufacturers, Limited; Cyclone Fence Company, and Westralia Wire Works (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and The State Executive Australasian Society of Engineers' Indus-

trial Association of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its operation to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force for a period of three years, subject to the right of either party at any time after the expiration of twelve months, upon giving one month's notice in writing to the other party to determine the agreement, and (a) to amend same by mutual consent, or (b) to apply to the Court of Arbitration for an Award.

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all persons employed in work classified in Clauses 9 and 11 herein: Provided that this Agreement shall not apply to any persons at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any agreement registered in accordance with "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

4.—Hours.

The hours of work in the industry shall be those usually and customarily worked at the time of the signing of this Agreement. Provided, however, it is agreed between parties, that if the State Court of Arbitration varies the hours of work in the Engineering Industry within the area covered by this Agreement by reason of any application made by the Amalgamated Engineering Union and the Australasian Society of Engineers, that such order for variation shall apply also to this industry.

Provided further, that, should there be a reduction in hours as a result of this variation, it is agreed between the parties that the week's wages set out in Clauses 9 and 11 shall not be reduced.

5.—Overtime.

All time worked by an employee before or after the recognised time of starting and ceasing duty in any factory shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

6.—Sunday and Holiday Pay.

All time worked on Sundays and the holidays mentioned in the next clause hereof, and Easter Monday, shall be paid for at double time rates, with a minimum payment of at least two hours for each start. The following four days shall be days upon which, if the employer's establishment be closed, payment may be deducted:—Anniversary Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Easter Monday.

7.—Holidays.

Subject as is hereinafter mentioned, each worker shall be entitled to twelve holidays on full pay for each year of service. Such twelve days shall be taken and observed as follows:—Ten consecutive days between December 25th and January 5th, both inclusive, commencing with Christmas Day, and the remaining two days upon Labour Day, Good Friday.

In the event of an employee not completing a year of service, he shall be entitled to receive holiday pay in proportion to the length of his service. In the event of an employee being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other employees, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on holidays on full pay.

8.—Contract of Employment.

The contract of employment shall be a daily one, terminable by one day's notice on either side.

9.—Wages.

Basic wage, £4 5s. 0d. per week.

The minimum rate of wages payable to workers under this Agreement shall be according to the following:—

For the purpose of convenience, the rates in this clause and in Clause 11 hereof are stated on a weekly basis, but the rate payable in each case is a daily rate, which shall be one-sixth (1/6th) of the weekly rate.

10.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of a worker below the wage received by him at the date hereof.

11.—Shift Work.

Junior workers on shift work shall be paid the following rates of wages:—

12.—Junior Workers.

No juniors under the age of 18 years shall be employed in the Galvanising Department. All work on link mesh machines may be performed by junior labour. Junior workers may be employed in the following proportions:—(1) Wire-netting Factories—Two juniors to one senior; (2) All other sections (excluding link mesh machines)—One junior to one senior.

Where an employer is himself a journeyman working at the trade, he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of junior workers allowed.

13.—Washing Facilities.

The employer shall provide suitable washing facilities for employees.

14.—Representative interviewing Employees.

An accredited representative of the Employees' Association shall be permitted to interview the employees, during the recognised meal time, on the business premises of the employer during the day shift. Provided that this right shall not be exercised more than once a week without the consent of the employer.

15.—Meal Time—Shift Work.

Where employees are engaged working the three-shift system, half an hour shall be allowed for meal time in each 8-hour shift, and no deduction from the worker's pay shall be made in respect of this.

16.—Mixed Functions.

When an employee is called upon to perform duties for which a higher rate of pay is fixed, he shall be paid such higher rate whilst so employed.

17.—Travelling Time and Expenses.

When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

When a worker is employed on work at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

18.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom the Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker and the time during which he has been employed. Such book shall be open to inspection, at the office of the employer, by a representative of the Union on one day in each week, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

19.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wages as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary, in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

AN Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 15th day of June, 1928, between the Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, Porcelain, and Roof Tile-Fixers Employees' Union of Workers, Perth, and the Calyx Porcelain Company, Limited (in liquidation).

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers of the classes herein specified, and shall be limited in its effects to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles of the General Post Office, in the City of Perth.

2.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of one year from the date hereof: Provided, however, that should the Company go out of business at any time during that period this Agreement shall terminate forthwith.

3.—Wages.

The following minimum wage shall apply to the undermentioned workers, and are based on a basic wage of £4 5s. per week for males and £2 5s. 11d. for females:—

4.—Overtime.

Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter. Overtime shall be paid for all hours worked outside the usual hours of business. Overtime on oven work to be paid on a basis of pay not less than 1s. 10½d. an hour, except juniors, who shall be paid at

junior rates. Double time shall be paid for working on any of the following holidays:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. This clause shall not apply to oven work or other necessary continuous work.

5.—Holidays.

Eight paid holidays shall be granted to each employee once a year, as follows:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and the King's Birthday: Provided that, should the employment of any worker be terminated before such holidays are due, such worker shall be entitled in lieu thereof to one day's pay for each seven weeks of service: Provided also, that should any worker be dismissed for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

6.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment shall be given to unionists.

7.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage herein prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wages, to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the appellant Union, or, in default of such agreement within 24 hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating that such wage be agreed upon, such rate of wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after 24 hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the Magistrate, and pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for six months from the date thereof, and, after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of any such application before the Magistrate.

8.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up or cause to be entered up and kept a book containing the name of each of his employees to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wage or piece-work amounts paid to each such employee, and the time during which he has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union during working hours.

9.—Present Rates

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, no worker at present in receipt of more than the prescribed rate within mentioned shall suffer a reduction in consequence.

10.—Posting of Agreement.

A printed copy of this Agreement shall be posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in each factory.

11.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to perform work which is prescribed for at a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at such higher rate for such period as he is actually engaged upon.

12.—Visiting Employees.

The Secretary of the Union shall have the right to interview employees at their work during lunch hour on any day at the works.

13.—Piece-work.

Piece-workers shall not be paid less than the prescribed wages for all classes of work on which they are engaged.

14.—Termination of Employment.

One hour's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined: Provided that, at any time an employer may dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties.

16.—Hours.

Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, and shall be worked during the following hours:—Work to commence on Mondays to Fridays at not earlier than 7.30 a.m. and terminate at not later than 5.30 p.m., and on Saturdays to commence at not earlier than 7.30 a.m. and terminate at not later than 12.30 p.m.
