WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the

Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Perth Road District.—Proposed 24 and 12-inch diameter water mains, with valves and all necessary apparatus (length 71½ chains 24-inch and 4½ chains of 12-inch), from the 24-inch main in First Avenue, Mt. Lawley, in a Northerly direction along Carrington Street to the intersection of Carrington and Kennedy Streets; thence along Kennedy Street in a Westerly direction to the 12-inch main at the intersection of Kennedy and York Streets as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4783.

Manjimup Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the South-West corner of Reserve 19552 and extending Eastward along the South and part of the East boundaries of the said Reserve and the South boundary of Nelson Location 8976 to the North-West corner of Location 2359 on the Eastward by the West boundary of Location 2359 and the West boundary of Location 827, the North and the North-Western boundary of Location 1868 to the South-Western corner of the last mentioned location; on the Southward by the Southern boundaries of Manjimup Lots 51, 48, and 45 to the Eastern side of the Bridgetown-Wilgarup Railway extension, and Southward along said side of the Railway Reserve to the production East of the Southern boundary of Lot 273, and along said production and Southern boundary and the Southern boundary of Lot 275 to the Western side of Burton Street; on the Westward by the said side of Burton Street, the North side of Springall Street, the West side of Crown Street, and part of the South and part of the East boundary of Location 2109 to the starting point. mentioned location, the East boundary of Location 148, part of the East boundary of Location 82, and the Easternmost boundary of Location 738 to the South-East corner of the last-mentioned location; on the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner and extending Westward along the South boundary of Location 738, the South boundary of Location 2084, and continuing to and along the North-Eastern and Northern sides of Road No. 3818, the South boundaries of Locations 828, 184, and 1868 to the Eastern boundary of the Manjimup Ward; thence along the Eastern, the North and the Western boundaries of the said Manjimup Ward to the South-East corner of Location 9705; thence continuing Westward along the South-Eastern boundaries of Locations 9705, 2255, 9689, 9688, 9687, 2716, 2715, 2714, 2717, 5824, 2188, 5822, 3828, 5823, 5830, 5178, 5828, and 5829, and continuing along the North side of Road No. 4923 to and along the Southern boundaries of Locations 6300 and 6284, part of the Eastern, the Southern, and the Western boundaries of Location 6283, part of the Western boundary of Location 6285, the Southern boundaries of Location 6281 to the right bank of the Donnelly River; thence along said bank of the river to the district boundary at the South-West corner of Location 5445. (2 members.)

#### Warren Ward.

Bounded on the Westward and Northward by part of the district boundaries and by the boundaries of the North Ward and the Manjimup Ward from the shores of the Indian Ocean at the mouth of the Donnelly River to the South-Eastern corner of Location 738; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner and extending Southward along the Western side of Road No. 306, passing along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 739, 801, 4359, 5001, 1972, 1973, Reserve 9616, Locations 2033, 1711, 1870, 9429, 4424, and continuing along the Western side of Road No. 2154, passing along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 66 and 387, and continuing along the West side of the road to the right bank of the Warren River; thence along the Western side of Road No. 3438, passing along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 7375, 5480, 4335, 3922, 3925, 5020, and through Location 4334, and along part of its South boundary, the South-Eastern boundaries of Locations 8064 and 8063, and continuing along the Western side of said Road 3438 to and along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 9330, 9331, 9332, 9329, 9328, and 9327, to intersect the left bank of Big Hill Brook, on the Southward by lines commencing at the said intersection and extending Westward along the said bank of Big Hill Brook and along the right bank of the Warren River to the production East of a Northern boundary of Location 7356; thence along the said production and Northern boundary and the Northern boundaries of Locations 7355, 8050, 3049, and 8027, and the Eastern boundaries of Locations 4242, 4241, 4221, 4220, 4210, and 4219; thence to and along the Western side of the Railway Reserve to the North boundary of Location 5036; thence Westward along the Northern boundaries of Locations 5036, 9646, 10157, 10158, 10159, 9551, 9552, 9553, 9554, 113, 9522, 5045, and continuing along the Southern side of Road No. 309, passing along the North-Western boundaries of Locations 10122, 10121, 10120, 10113, through Location 8429, along Northern boundaries of Locations 5049, 487, 10079, 10081, through Location 10082, along the Northern boundaries of Locations 10066 and 10065, the North-Western boundaries of Locations 10065 and 10070, the Western boundary of Location 10069, the Northern boundaries of Locations 10067, 5198, 5199, Western boundaries of Locations 5199, 3718, 5192, 7586, 5072, 5078, 5076, part of the Northern and the West boundary of Location 5080, the Western boundary of Location 5191 to the South-Western corner of the last-mentioned location; thence South-Eastward to Survey Mark B5 on the Warren River and following the left bank of the Warren River to its mouth on the shores of the Indian Ocean; thence along the shores of the Indian Ocean to the starting point. (2 members.)

#### Pemberton Ward.

Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by the Southern boundary of the Warren Ward to the South-Eastern corner of Location 9327; thence along the left bank of the Big Hill Brook, following the Northern boundaries of Location 9310, 9314, 8733, 8734, 8735, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 8736, 8737, 8745, 8744, Reserve 19239, and Location 5533, part of the North boundary of Location 6578, the North and East

boundaries of Location 6577, the East boundaries of Locations 6576 and 6571, part of the Northern boundary of Location 6559, the Northern boundaries of Locations 6560, 6499 to 6502 inclusive, 10315, 10314, 10307, 10306, 10305, 10304, 10299, and 10298, through Location 10293, along North boundaries of Locations 6620, 6619, 6617, and 6616, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 6616 and 6631 and continuing South-Eastward to the right bank of the Shannon River; thence following the right bank of the Shannon River and the Western shores of Broke Inlet to the shores of the Indian Ocean; on the Southward and Westward by the shores of the Indian Ocean to the starting point. Bounded on the Northward, Eastward, and Southward by part of the district boundaries, and on the Westward by part of the boundaries of the Pemberton, Warren, and North Wards. (2 members.)

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

*Balingup Road Board.*

The Balingup Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Balingup Road District:—

The passage of heavy traffic over Mardawarra Road, within the Balingup Road District, is hereby prohibited during the months of June, July, August, and September in every year.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy Traffic" means:—The traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of timber or of sleepers, or other sawn, hewn, or split timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, metal, salt, lime, cement, farming produce or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight whereof (including any load) exceeds twelve hundred weights per wheel.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

FURTHER to notice to Mariners issued by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 28th March, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 1st April, 1927, and to Notice issued similarly dated 22nd June, 1928, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 6th July, 1928, the channel across Success Bank has again been sounded and compass bearings of the channel checked.

Navigators have reported that their vessels tended to sheer in the channel about 2,000 feet distant from the Northern entrance buoys. Soundings taken over this spot have revealed a bank, apparently of sand, extending for some 600 feet along the Western edge of the channel, from about 2,000 feet from the Northern entrance buoys to about 2,600 feet along the channel, and extending into the channel to about half-way between its Western edge and the centre line. The least water found on this bank was 18 feet 6 inches at low water.

As it evidently is the existence of this bank that caused the tendency to sheer, which had been reported, mariners are advised to keep as far away from it as possible, and to watch carefully the actions of their ships when passing it.

The compass bearing of this channel has again been checked, and it is found to be 170° True, corresponding with South 5° East Magnetic.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

#### PUBLIC CEMETERY, WINCHESTER.

##### By-laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Winchester, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees.

Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct: and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office at Carnamah on the 21st February, 1928.

B.—Clause 3 is amended as follows:—

(a) By the deletion of the words “or in chemical plumbing” where they occur in the paragraph preceding the last paragraph of the said clause.

(b) A new paragraph is added immediately before the last paragraph of the said clause as follows:—

“Chemical Plumbing: In Chemical and Manure Works journeymen plumbers engaged on all repairs and renewals on superphosphate mixing plants and pyrites furnaces shall receive one and one half-pence per hour additional to the rate prescribed.”

(c) The last paragraph of the said clause is deleted and the following paragraph inserted in lieu thereof:—

“Any licensed journeyman plumber called upon to use his license for his employer on work for which a permit from the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department is necessary in the first instance shall, for such time as he is himself actually engaged upon such work pursuant to such permit, be paid 1s. per hour in addition to the ordinary rate herein prescribed.”

C.—A new clause, to be called 3 (a), is inserted immediately before Clause 4, as follows:—

“3 (a). The contract of employment shall be an hourly one, terminable on either side by one hour’s notice, and the worker shall, in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the hour when such notice terminates.”

D.—This Agreement shall have effect as from the eighteenth day of June, 1928. In all other respects the parties hereto confirm the said recited Agreement.
