WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be

a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

The Schedule.

Midland Junction-Merredin Road—Northam Road District.

That portion of the York Road, No. 1071, on Lands Department Lithographs 2/80, 27/80, commencing at the North-Western corner of Location 6684 at the Western boundary of the Northam Road Board District; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Road No. 1071 to the South-Western corner of Location 4960; thence continuing along Road No. 1071 in an Easterly and North-Easterly direction to the North-Western corner of Location 2210 at the Eastern Goldfields Railway; thence continuing along Road No. 1071 in a North-Easterly direction through Baker's Hill to the North-Western corner of Location 6073; thence continuing in an Easterly direction to the Western boundary of the Townsite of Clackline; thence continuing in an Easterly direction, following the Eastern Goldfields Railway and crossing same to its Northern side in Reserve 1494; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction to angle in the Eastern boundary of Reserve 12; thence continuing in a South-Easterly direction, crossing the Clackline-Miling Branch Railway to its Eastern side to the North corner of Reserve 2792; thence continuing in a Northerly direction along Newcastle-Northam Road to the junction of roads at the Southern corner of Reserve 2614; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction to the South-Eastern corner of Lot 15; thence continuing in an Easterly and North-Easterly direction along Road No. 105 to the Southern corner of Location 3597; thence continuing along Road No. 105 in a Southerly, Easterly, and North-Easterly direction to closed road at the Southern corner of Location 919; thence continuing along Road No. 105 in a North-Easterly, Southerly, Easterly, and North-Easterly direction to the junction of Main Roads with the South-Eastern corner

of Lot 20; thence continuing in a South-Easterly direction along main road, crossing the Avon River Bridge to Fitzgerald Street; thence continuing along Fitzgerald Street in a North-Easterly and Northerly direction to Peel Terrace; thence continuing along Peel Terrace in an Easterly direction, crossing the Eastern Goldfields Railway to its Eastern side and continuing to Chidlow Street; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction, crossing the said Railway to its Northern side and continuing along Chidlow Street to York Road; thence continuing along York Road in a South-Easterly direction to its junction with Road No. 1391; thence continuing along Road No. 1391 in a North-Easterly direction, crossing the Northam-Goomalling Railway to its Eastern side; thence continuing along Road No. 1391 in a North-Easterly and Easterly direction along Goldfields Road to the Southern angle of Location 4344 at the Northern side of the Eastern Goldfields Railway; thence following the said railway on its Northern side in an Easterly direction to the South-Eastern corner of Location 4345; thence crossing the North-Western boundary of the Townsite of Meenaar; thence continuing in the said Townsite in a South-Easterly direction, crossing the Eastern Goldfields Railway, to its Southern side at the North corner of Reserve 6616; thence following the said railway in a South-Easterly direction on its Southern side to the North-Western corner of Location 3080; thence continuing in a South-Easterly direction to the South-Eastern corner of Location 3080 at the Eastern boundary of the Northam Road Board District, as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 368.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: And whereas by Proclamation dated the 14th day of April, 1926, Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-Eyes) are strictly preserved within District "G"—the Kimberley Division as defined in "The Land Act, 1898,"—as from the beginning of January to the end of August in each year: And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend for a further period in the present year the close season for Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-Eyes) in the said District: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-Eyes) shall be at all times strictly preserved generally within the boundaries of District "G," namely, the Kimberley Division as defined in "The Land Act, 1898," for a further period in the present year commencing on and including the 1st day of September, 1928, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1928.

WHEREAS by "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," it is provided that the said Act shall be in force only in such portions of the State as the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare to be districts for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916, that portion of the State comprised within a circle described from the South-West corner of Lot 139 of Swan Location 7, Section B, at Midland Junction (Post Office site) as its centre, with a radius of 12 miles, and also that portion of the State comprised within a circle described from the North-West corner of Lot 1, of Cockburn Sound Location 5 (as delineated in Plan 2513 deposited in the office of Land Titles), as its centre, with a radius of 11 miles, were together constituted as a district for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as the Metropolitan District, and the said Act and the regulations thereunder were declared to be in force in such district accordingly: And whereas by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of June, 1923, the said district was extended by the addition thereto of that portion of the State mentioned and described in such Proclamation: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to reduce the said district as constituted by the said last-mentioned Proclamation by eliminating therefrom that portion of the State which was thereby added to the said district so that the said district shall comprise only those portions of the State as are mentioned and described in the said Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that those portions of the State mentioned and described in the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916,

shall together constitute and be the district known as the Metropolitan District for the purposes of the said Act, and that such district as constituted by the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of June, 1923, shall be deemed to be hereby reduced accordingly, and that the said Act and the Regulations thereunder shall be in force in the said Metropolitan District as the same is now constituted by this Proclamation.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

FURTHER to notice to Mariners issued by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 28th March, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 1st April, 1927, and to Notice issued similarly dated 22nd June, 1928, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 6th July, 1928, the channel across Success Bank has again been sounded and compass bearings of the channel checked.

Navigators have reported that their vessels tended to sheer in the channel about 2,000 feet distant from the Northern entrance buoys. Soundings taken over this spot have revealed a bank, apparently of sand, extending for some 600 feet along the Western edge of the channel, from about 2,000 feet from the Northern entrance buoys to about 2,600 feet along the channel, and extending into the channel to about half-way between its Western edge and the centre line. The least water found on this bank was 18 feet 6 inches at low water.

As it evidently is the existence of this bank that caused the tendency to sheer, which had been reported, mariners are advised to keep as far away from it as possible, and to watch carefully the actions of their ships when passing it.

The compass bearing of this channel has again been checked, and it is found to be 170° True, corresponding with South 5° East Magnetic.

THE following arrangements have been entered into between the Commonwealth Government and the State Government for the performance of duties under the Commonwealth and State Bankruptcy Acts.

*Arrangement for Performance of Duties under
Commonwealth Bankruptcy Act.*

1. That officers of the Public Service of the State of Western Australia may be appointed from time to time to execute in that State the duties of any of the following offices under "The Bankruptcy Act, 1924-1927," namely, the offices of Registrar, Deputy Registrar, Official Receiver, and any other offices under that Act.

2. That appointments to be made in pursuance of this arrangement shall be made by the Attorney General of the Commonwealth, with the concurrence of the Minister for Justice of the State.

3. That all officers appointed in pursuance of this arrangement shall hold their offices during the pleasure of the Attorney General of the Commonwealth and the concurrence of the Minister for Justice of the State, and without salary.

4. That the Commonwealth will pay to the State of Western Australia, in respect of the execution by officers of that State of the duties of offices under "The Bankruptcy Act, 1924-1927," in pursuance of this arrangement, and in respect of any pension, retiring allowance, or allowance to dependants which may become payable to or in respect of any officer appointed under this arrangement such sums as are from time to time agreed upon by the Attorney General of the Commonwealth and the Minister for Justice of the State.

5. That this arrangement shall take effect as from the 1st day of August, 1928.

By-law No. 119—Repeal.

By-law No. 119, made by the Municipality of Claremont under the powers of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and published in the *Government Gazette* dated 31st July, 1914, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

By-law No. 119.

(1) In the construction of this By-law the word "Lessee," as applied to a hoarding, means the person who for the time being has control of the hoarding, or who has the right to post or charge for the posting upon such hoarding of any bills, placards, or advertisements.

(2) No person shall erect or cause to be erected any hoarding whatsoever (subject to Clause 4 of this By-law) within the boundaries of the Municipality.

(3) Every owner or lessee of any hoarding which is in existence at the date when this By-law comes into force (subject to Clause 4 of this By-law), shall remove same within six months on being served with an order signed by the Town Clerk to remove such hoarding.

(4) For the purpose of this By-law that portion of the Municipality owned, leased, or controlled by the Royal Agricultural Society shall be exempt.

(5) Every person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Claremont, made under Part 15, Section 335, of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," for the regulation and control of wooden buildings for dwellings, and numbered Subsection 7a of Number 123: In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Municipality of Claremont doth hereby order as follow:—

The material to be used in the construction of wooden buildings for dwellings shall be as follows:—

Stumps for foundation to be 5 x 5 jarrah, at not more than 5ft. centre to centre distance apart, and not less than 12 inches in the ground, with 18 inches of 6 x 1 jarrah nailed to the bottom end for sole-plates.

Plates and sleeper plates to be not less than 4 x 2 jarrah.

Floor Joists, 4 x 2 jarrah, at not more than 18 inches centre to centre.

Studs, 4 x 2 jarrah, at not more than 18 inches for lath and plaster, and not more than 2 feet for asbestos or similar material, centre to centre.

Ceiling Joists, 4 x 2 jarrah, spaced same as for studs.

Hanging Beams for all spans of rooms over 7 feet, of not less than 6 x 1½ jarrah.

Hips, Ridges, and Valleys of not less than 7 x 1 jarrah.

Rafters, 4 x 2 jarrah, at not more than 3 feet centres for galvanised corrugated iron and not more than 2 feet centres for tiles, securely tied with at least 3 x 2 jarrah collar ties. All struts and purlins to be 4 x 2 jarrah at least.

All sheeting externally of wooden buildings to be of dressed jarrah weatherboards dado, asbestos sheeting or of similar material. All walls covered with asbestos or similar material shall have not less than 2 x ½ jarrah cover slips over all joints and across to form panels, the size of which shall not exceed 4 feet x 4 feet. Where a jarrah dado is required the dado shall not exceed 3 feet 6 inches in height.

Internal walls shall be of lath and plaster, asbestos sheeting or similar material.

The height of walls shall be in every part at least 10 feet 6 inches from floor to ceiling.

Bracing—All buildings shall be braced diagonally, with not less than 3 x 5/8 jarrah, which shall be let in flush with the studs and plates.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Claremont, made under Sections 179 and 181 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," for regulating the manner and mode of keeping and depasturing goats and the driving of goats through or over any streets, and requiring licenses to be obtained by persons for the keeping and depasturing of goats and fixing the fees payable for and the duration of such license: In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Municipality of Claremont doth hereby order as follows:—

By-law No. 124.—Repeal.

By-law No. 124, made by the Municipality of Claremont under the powers of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and published in the *Government Gazette* dated 29th February, 1924, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

By-law No. 124.

(1) Every owner or keeper of any goat within the Municipality shall, during the month of January in every year (and, if he becomes the owner or keeper later than the month of January, then within seven days of his so becoming owner or keeper) register at the office of the Claremont Municipality his name and address, and the place where the goat or goats are to be kept and depastured, and pay the sum of Two shillings and sixpence as license for each goat intended to be kept. A license to keep and depasture such goat or goats will be issued, subject to Section 3, within three days of such registration. Every license shall expire on 31st December in the year of issue.

(2) Goats must be continuously kept and depastured by the licensee on the premises licensed for the purpose, and such premises must at all times be so enclosed or fenced that no goat can break away from or stray out of the same.

(3) The license to keep and depasture a goat or goats may be issued by the Town Clerk, who may refuse to issue the license in respect to any premises he considers unsuitable for the purpose. A change of premises in which the license is authorised to keep and depasture the animals may from time to time be endorsed by the Town Clerk on the license.

(4) Every goat within the Municipality shall always have on its neck a collar bearing the name and address of the person licensed to keep and depasture it.

(5) No goat shall be driven through or over any street of the Municipality by any person unless such goat have fastened thereto a line or some means to prevent its escape, which shall be held by the person driving the goat.

(6) If any goat be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

(7) The Council shall from time to time provide some secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith, when any such enclosure has been provided, shall notify the same, and the situation thereof, in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

(8) Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the Council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

(9) Whenever a goat having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the Municipal district, registered as aforesaid, is seized hereunder, the proper officer of the Council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

(10) Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this By-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid, which has not upon its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid may, upon the authority of any Justice of the Peace in writing, be destroyed by the proper officer of the Council at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure; and every such goat which has on its neck a collar as aforesaid, upon the like authority and by the said proper officer, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

(11) The owner of any such goat which has been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any Justice

of the Peace that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a Justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly; and such order of a Justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such Justice shall, for the purposes of this subdivision, be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

(12) The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not, or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of one pound (£1).

It shall be unlawful for the holder of any timber concession, timber lease, or sawmill permit, or any person employed at or in connection with any log landing or sawmill, to use, or cause or suffer to be used, any inaccurate measuring tape for the purpose of carrying out the requirements of Regulations numbered 32 and 32a to 32d, inclusive, or any other regulations directly or indirectly involving the measurement of timber.

32m. Any person who commits a breach of any of the Regulations numbered 32, 32a, 32b, 32c, 32d, 32e, 32f, 32g, 32h, 32i, 32j, 32k, 32l, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding fifty pounds.

ENGINE-DRIVERS (BUILDING CONSTRUCTION).

(Registered 10th July, 1928.)

No. 19 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the fifth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between The Master Builders and Contractors' Association Industrial Union of Employers (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and The Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Australia (West Australian Branch) (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to persons engaged in the industry of Building Construction on the driving of power cranes.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force for a period of three years, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration at any time after the expiration of twelve months from such date and/or at the end of any succeeding twelve months from the date of any such application to amend this Agreement.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

4.—Wages.

5.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall operate to reduce the wage of any employee who is at the date of this Agreement in receipt of a wage in excess of the minimum wage herein mentioned.

6.—Hours.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows:—

On the first five days of the week, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., and on Saturdays between 8 a.m. and 11.45 a.m.; provided that the lunch interval on each Friday shall be restricted to forty-five minutes.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter. Any employee who is called upon to work overtime for more than two hours without receiving notice of such overtime on the previous day shall be paid an allowance of two shillings for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any employee who has left the premises in which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour, shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires an employee to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such employee a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by an employee who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time.

(b) All work performed on Sunday and the holidays recited in Clause 8 shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

8.—Holidays.

Workers under this Agreement shall be entitled to the following holidays on full pay:—Anniversary Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Picnic Day (approximately the first Monday in November), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, and three other working days other than Saturdays, to be granted at the convenience of the employers, within one month from New Year's Day.

Provided also, that where an employee's employment is terminated during the course of a calendar year, his employer shall pay to him one day's wages for each calendar month of his service in lieu of the holidays to which he would be entitled under this clause and has not received. In the event of an employee being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other employees, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on holidays on full pay. Where any specified holiday falls on Sunday the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

9.—Casual Workers.

Any employee who is employed for a period of one week or less, exclusive of hours of overtime worked, shall be classed as a casual employee, and shall be paid threepence per hour extra for the time employed: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a worker discharged for misconduct or incompetence or owing to weather conditions.

10.—Record Book.

The employer shall make and keep a record book showing the name of each worker and the hours worked by and the amount paid to each worker. Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the Union during working hours.

11.—Weekly Engagement.

Subject to Clause 9 hereof, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be by the week, and one week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate the contract. Any employee not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, unless he produces or forwards within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill-health necessitating such absence. Provided that an employee shall not in any event be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal accident or personal ill-health, or both, for more than six days in each year of service.

BUILDERS' LABOURERS.

(Registered 12th July, 1928.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the 22nd day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between The Master Builders and Contractors' Association of Employers (hereinafter called the Employers), of the one part, and The Builders Labourers' Union of Workers of Perth, Western Australia (hereinafter called the Union), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Hours.

The working hours shall be forty-four per week, to be worked from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and from 7.45 a.m. to 11.45 a.m. on Saturdays.

2.—Wages.

(1) Basic wage—at the rate of £4 5s. per week.

(2) (a) Leading labourers, scaffolders, riggers, dogmen, gear hands, hod carriers, mortar mixers, persons wheeling to and from the lift or engaged in filling boxes with materials to be lifted with winch, hoist, elevator, or crane required for serving bricklayers, plasterers, or masons; also engaged in the erection of steel stanchions, girders, principals, and the erection of steel structural work when such work is part of the contractor's contract and under his direct control; also men engaged on underpinning and timbering for basements; also furnace work and bakers' ovens 2 4

(b) Persons engaged in mixing, preparing, or delivering or packing or concrete in connection with the erection of structures or buildings, and engaged in preparing or bending or placing into position steel reinforcements in concrete in connection with building operations 2 2½

(c) General labourers, comprising men engaged as builders' labourers not included under Clauses (a) and (b) above 2 1½

No worker who has worked four or more hours in any working day under Subclauses (a) and (b) shall have his wage reduced on such day if put to work under Subclause (c).

3.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter. Any employee who is called upon to work overtime for more than two hours without receiving notice of such overtime on the previous day shall be paid an allowance of two shillings for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any employee who has left the premises in which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour, shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires an employee to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such employee a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by an employee who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time.

(b) All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) The following days shall be observed as public holidays:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Picnic Day.

4.—Area.

This schedule of wages, hours, and working conditions shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles (14) from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

5.—Payment of Wages.

When a worker is discharged at or before the usual time he shall then be paid all wages due to him. Payment of wages shall be made on or before Friday of each week, within fifteen minutes of the usual time for ceasing work. An employer shall not keep more than one day's pay in hand.

6.—Notice.

For the purpose of terminating employment one hour's notice shall be given on either side, except only that the employers may summarily dismiss a worker who is guilty of misconduct.

7.—Country Work.

When any worker is sent out by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such distance that he cannot return to his home each night, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid, in addition to his regular wages, 6s. per day for the first seven days and 30s. per week thereafter. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided that such travelling shall be limited to eight hours in any one day. The employer shall also provide free transport for the employee's tools.

8.—Record Book.

The employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker and the hours worked by and the amount paid to each worker. Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the Union during working hours.

9.—Interviewing Workers.

The secretary or any duly authorised official of the Union shall not be prevented by any employer from visiting and conversing during meal hours with the members of the Union on any job or in any shop.

10.—Posting Notices.

No employer shall prevent an official of the organisation at any time from posting a copy of this Award or any notice of the organisation not exceeding fourteen inches by nine inches in a suitable place on any job.

11.—General.

(a) Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job by each employer for the convenience of the workmen.

(b) The employer shall provide on each job hot water for the purpose of making tea at meal time.

(c) The employer shall provide a place on each job for the safe keeping of the tools of the worker when not in use.

(d) The employer shall provide a shelter for the convenience of the workmen from inclement weather.

(e) Any workmen engaged on repairs to furnace or ovens, underpinning or working in wet ground, shall be entitled to receive payment of 10 per cent. over the rates hereinbefore mentioned.

(f) Employee presenting himself and not engaged.—When notice is given to an employee by his employer or his responsible representative to present himself for work, and he attends where so directed and his services are not required for reasons other than those due to weather conditions, such employee shall be paid five shillings in addition to any expenses necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job.

(g) Wet Places.—When working in any place where water is continually dripping so that the clothing becomes wet with soakage or where there is water under foot so that the feet of the workman become wet.

This subclause shall not apply to natural surface made wet by rain.

12.—Fares.

During the hours of work all travelling time from and to the employer's place of business, or from one job to another, shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

13.—Definition of Gear Hand.

This shall mean any employee who is engaged in the rigging of gear ropes and tackle, of cranes, winches, derricks, and the repairing or splicing of slings or necessary gear in connection with buildings.

14.—Definitions.

The term builders' labourer includes and embraces all persons other than artisans engaged in building construction and/or the erection of edifices or structures and/or engaged in building operations, assisting any tradesman in building construction, and/or any person engaged as a scaffolder, gear hand, rigger, gantry hand, crane hand, and/or as dogman and/or mortar mixing, and structural steel worker in or in connection with building operations.

Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from 22nd June, 1928, and shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years, subject to the right of either party at any time after the expiration of twelve months, upon giving one month's notice in writing to the other party, to determine the Agreement and (a) to amend same by mutual consent, or (b) to apply to the Court of Arbitration for an Award.
