WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of twelve months as from the 1st day of September, 1928.

Moore River—the whole, situate about 45 miles North of Fremantle.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from:—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of every year: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of September until the 30th day of April, inclusive, in every year.

(1) Pallinup Estuary (near Bremer Bay)—the whole; and (2) Salt River (between Cape Knob and Cape Riche)—the whole.

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare that any one or more portions of the State, or any one or more localities, to be respectively defined in such Proclamation, a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Native Game.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 202 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may in his discretion extend the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to any district or portion thereof; and whereas it is desirable to extend such provisions to the townsite of Southern Cross within the Yilgarn Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Order in Council, made under Section 202 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," extend the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to the townsite of Southern Cross within the Yilgarn Road District.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 204/28.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—City of Perth—Victoria Park Ward.—Proposed 24-in. diameter water main, with valves and all necessary apparatus (length 35½ chains), from the 36-in. Hills steel main in Hordern Street, at the intersection of Armagh Street, along the aforesaid Armagh Street in a North-Easterly direction to the intersection of Albany Road, across Albany Road to Ascot Road, along Ascot Road in an Easterly direction to the intersection of Teddington Road and Ascot Road; as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4812.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 31st day of August, 1928.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 692/24.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—Stormwater Drain—Smith's Lake to Loftus Street, North Perth.—Reinforced concrete pipes, 54-in., 30-in., and 27-in. diameter, including manholes and all apparatus complete, length about 2,547 ft., from the existing open drain at North end of Smith's Lake through private property, across Kadina Street; thence Northward to Howlett Street; thence Westerly along Howlett Street to Hardy Street; thence North along Hardy Street to North Beach Road; thence North-Westerly along North Beach Road to the intersection of Loftus Street, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4815.

Busselton Municipality—Description of Area proposed to be added to the Municipality.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of low water mark of Geographie Bay with the production North of the Western side of West Street, and extending Eastward along said low water mark to the Western side of the Busselton Jetty; thence Northward along said side of the jetty to a point opposite to its junction with the Railway Jetty; thence Eastward to the Eastern side of the jetty and Southward along the East side of the jetty to the North-Western corner of Lot 322 (Baths); along the Northern boundary of said Lot 322 and its prolongation Eastward to the Western boundary of Lot 357, part of the Western, Northern, and Eastern boundary of said Lot 357, and again following low water mark of Geographie Bay to the production Northward of the East side of Ford Road; thence South along said production of the East side of Ford Road to the present municipal boundary and Westward along said municipal boundary to the West side of West Street; thence North along the production North of the West side of West Street to the starting point.

Municipality of Busselton—Description of Boundaries.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the production North of the West side of West Street with low water mark of Geographie Bay and extending Eastward along said low water mark to the Western side of the Busselton Jetty; thence Northward along said side of the jetty to a point opposite to its intersection with the Railway Jetty; thence East to the Eastern side of the jetty and South along said Eastern side to the North-Western corner of Busselton Lot 322 (Baths), and along the Northern boundary of the said lot and its production Eastward to the Western boundary of Lot No. 357; and along part of the Western, the Northern, and the Eastern boundary of said Lot 357, and again along low water mark of Geographie Bay to intersect the production Northward of the East side of Ford Road.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Southward to and along the East side of Ford Road to intersect the production East of the South boundary of Sub-Lot 28.

On the South by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending West to and along the South boundaries of Sub-Lots 28 and 27 and continuing along the South side of Fairlawn Road to intersect the West side of West Street.

On the Westward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending North along the West side of West Street and its production North along the West boundary of Reserve 8606 to the starting point.

Schedule "C."

Description of Ward Boundaries.

West Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the municipal boundary from the intersection of low water mark of Geographie Bay with the production North of the West side of West Street to intersect the production Northward of the Eastern boundary of Reserve 9719.

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Southward to and along the Eastern boundary of Reserve 9719 to the Northern side of Marine Terrace, and along said side of Marine Terrace to the centre line of Queen Street; thence along the centre lines of Queen Street and of Causeway Road to the municipal boundary.

Central Ward.

On the Northward, Eastward, Northward, and again Eastward by lines commencing at the North-West corner of Busselton Lot 322 (Baths) and extending along the North boundary of the said lot to the Eastern side of the Railway Jetty, and Southward along said side of the jetty and continuing along the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve to the Northern bank of the Vasse Estuary, and along said bank to the East boundary of the municipality; thence South along part of the said East boundary to the South-Eastern corner of the municipality.

On the South-Westward and Westward by the Eastern boundary of the West Ward and by part of the municipal boundary to the starting point.

East Ward.

Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the municipal boundary from its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward to its intersection with the Northern bank of the Vasse Estuary.

On the Southward and Westward by part of the boundaries of the Central Ward to the starting point.

4. Casual Workers:

(a) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. per day in addition to an hourly rate calculated upon the weekly wage prescribed in Clause 3 or 3 (a) hereof, as the case may be, and on the basis that 48 hours constitutes a week's work: Provided that the minimum payment to a casual worker for work performed on any one day shall not be less than 5s.: Provided further, that the rate of payment for casual workers for work done on any Sunday or public holiday shall be at the rate of time and a half of the ordinary rate for casual workers. "Public holiday" for this purpose shall have the same meaning as in Section 4 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920."

(b) The maximum number of casual workers allowed to be employed by any employer shall be in the proportion of one casual worker to every 15 or fraction of 15 weekly workers employed under the provisions of this Agreement: Provided that, where a casual worker is engaged to take the place temporarily of a weekly worker, such casual worker shall, for the purpose of this subclause be regarded as and be deemed to be a weekly worker.

5. Hours:—

The hours the different classes of workers may be called upon to work without payment of overtime shall be as follows:—

- (a) Char-a-banc drivers and/or fare collectors—48 hours per week, or 10 hours per day.
(b) Taxi-car drivers—96 hours per fortnight, or 56 hours per week, or 9 hours per day.
(c) All other workers—48 hours per week, or 8 hours per day.

Provided that any time worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift, except in the case of char-a-banc drivers and/or fare collectors who may be worked in three periods each day, one of such periods shall not be less than six hours, and each of the remaining periods shall not be less than one hour.

Where an employee is worked in a continuous shift of 8 hours or more on any day, one half hour per day shall be allowed such employee for a meal time, and such time shall not be included when computing the hours worked each day.

6. Overtime:—

(a) Char-a-banc drivers and/or fare collectors shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first 8 hours of duty in excess of 48 hours in any week, and at the rate of time and a half for all other overtime worked.

(b) Taxi-car drivers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for all overtime.

(c) All other workers shall be paid as follows:—

For all time of duty—Exceeding 48 hours but not exceeding 56 hours in any week, at the rate of ordinary time; exceeding 56 hours in any week, at the rate of time and a half; exceeding eight hours but not exceeding nine hours on any day, at the rate of ordinary time; exceeding nine hours on any day, at the rate of time and a half.

All overtime shall stand alone and shall be paid for in addition to the weekly or casual wage, as the case may be.

18. Definitions.—For the purposes of this Agreement—

(a) "Char-a-banc driver" shall mean any person employed to drive a motor vehicle with seating accommodation for more than seven persons including the driver;

(b) "Taxi-car driver" shall mean any person employed to drive a motor vehicle with seating accommodation for not more than seven persons, including the driver;

(c) "Casual worker" shall mean any person who is engaged as a casual worker and who is dismissed or refused work without any fault of his own, before the expiration of six days from the date of commencing work;

(d) "Day" shall also include night;

(e) "Fortnight" shall mean from the 30th January, 1927, to the 12th February, 1927, inclusive, and each succeeding fourteen days thereafter;

(f) "Fare collector" shall mean any person, except the driver, who collects fares from passengers travelling in char-a-bancs.
