Between The West Australian Coach, Car, and Rolling Stock Builders' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and West Australian Master Coachbuilders and Farriers' Industrial Union of Employers and others, as in Schedule I. annexed, Respondents.

AWARD.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:---

1.—Area.

The Award shall apply to the Coach and Motor Building Trade within—(a) a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and (b) municipalities and townsites outside that area where road vehicles are made or repaired.

2.-Hours of Work,

Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in six days, except in the case of females, whose working week shall be ferty-four hours: Provided, however, that if and when the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration prescribes fortyfour hours as the standard hours in the industry in South Australia and Victoria, then this clause shall automatically be varied accordingly, subject to the right of the parties to apply to the Court, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between them, as to the number of hours to be worked on each day and the date on which the change in hours should take effect.

3.---Wages.

Basic Wage at the rate of £4 5s. per week.

The following workers shall be paid at the rate of the amounts against their respective items:--

reprinter's labourer'': A painter's labourer shall include any worker engaged in stripping, rubbing down, cleaning undergears, and all preparatory work connected with painting other than using a paint brush or a spray except for blacking underparts and applying all lead and filling coats other than the finishing coat: Provided, however, that any worker operating a paint machine or spray shall be paid full fradesman's rates whilst so employed. The proportion of painters' labourers shall be one to every three or fraction of three fully paid tradesmen in the painting branch of the trade.

"'Trimmer': A trimmer shall include any male worker who does any trimming or leather work in connection with motors or any vehicle in the coach and car building trade.

"Sectional trimmer": A sectional trimmer is any tradesman other than a *bona fide* trimmer employed in the trimming shop, except in putting in squabs, finishing or cutting out, and can only be employed when a fully qualified tradesman is not available.

fully qualified tradesman is not available. "Assembler": An assembler is one who assembles the finished parts of motor bodies before and after painting, and fixes the body to chassis, cr, in horsedrawn vehicles, the finished parts before and after painting. "Metal panel fixer": A metal pauel fixer is one

"Metal panel fixer": A metal panel fixer is one who is engaged exclusively with work of fixing metal panels on the woodwork of motor cars.

which is engaged exclusively what how of having inclupanels on the woodwork of motor cars. "Painter'': A painter shall include any skilled worker handling a paint brush or spray on to a motor car or any other vehicles in the coach and car building trade: Provided, that polishing in connection with all pyroxylin materials shall be considered the work of painters' labourers and junior workers.

5.—Junior Workers.

The minimum rate of wages payable to junior workers shall be as follows:---

A "Junior worker" is a person other than an apprentice under twenty-one years of age engaged in any of the following classes of work:—Grinding paint, cleaning paint pots, washing down vehicles, taking off and putting on wheels, cleaning old ironwork, smudging springs, bending tyres, heating tyre furnace, assisting putting on tyres, running messages, teasing hair and fibre, cleaning and oiling up leather work, cleaning up shop, and carrying and stacking timber in short lengths, holding up panels or guards and generally assisting in all branches other than using tools of trade.

of trade. Junior workers engaged in teasing hair or fibre shall be supplied with respirators.

Junior workers shall not be engaged until the employer's quota of apprentices, if any, has been exhausted.

In the event of a junior worker becoming apprenticed, the provisions hereinafter mentioned under the heading of apprentices shall apply. In shops where the employer is not in a position to

In shops where the employer is not in a position to train apprentices, junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to each three or fraction of three journeymen employed.

6.-Youth Strikers, Screwers, and Drillers.

Youths may be employed as strikers in the smith shops at the minimum rates applicable to junior workers.

In farriers' shops a junior shall not do floorman's work unless duly apprenticed to the trade of farriery.

7.—Female Machinists.

Basic wage, £2 5s. 11d.

The minimum rates of wages payable to female sewing machinists in the Trimming Department shall be:---

8.—Apprentices.

(a) The employment of apprentices shall be governed by the provisions of Schedule II. attached hereto, except where same are modified or negatived by this clause.

(b) The proportion of apprentices to journeymen shall be one apprentice to two or fraction of two journeymen.

(c) Apprentices shall be allowed in the following trades or avocations:—1, Smithing; 2, Bodymaker; 3, Wheel-wrighting; 4, Machinist; 5, Painting; 6, Trimming; 7, Panel beating (including oxy-welding); 8, Farriery.

(d) In the case of a youth who has had previous experience in the industry as a junior worker, the five years' course of apprenticeship specified in the schedule may be reduced to such period as the examiners, taking into consideration the age and previous experience of the youth, may determine. The rates of wages to be paid in such case shall be the rates hereinafter prescribed for the years of service which the youth has yet to serve.

(c) Wages.—The minimum wage payable to apprentices shall be as follows:—

9.—Overtime.

All time worked on any day before or after the regular working hours shall be paid for at not less than the rate of time-and-a-half for the first two hours and double time thereafter. All work done on Sundays and holidays (as provided hereafter) shall be paid for at the rate of not less than double time.

Any worker required to work for more than one hour overtime, without having been notified the previous day shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or be paid the cost of same. Where a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least two hours' overtime.

10.-Holidays.

(a) Twelve days' holiday on full pay shall be granted to each worker upon completion of twelve months' service, of which eight days shall be taken consecutively at a time mutually convenient, or, failing agreement, at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer, but must not be postponed for a further period than two months after becoming due. The other four days shall be Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day. If a holiday on any of these specially named days is observed on a Sunday, another day shall be given in lieu thereof.

(b) Should the period of continuous employment be less than twelve months, the worker shall, except he is dismissed for misconduct, be paid an amount by way of holiday pay in such proportion as is the length of service to the full year's employment.

(c) All accumulated holidays due under the old Agreement at the commencement of this Award shall be held over until Christmas 1928, and these, together with the proportion of holidays due under the new Award, shall be paid to 31st December, after which all holidays will be assessed as from 1st January, 1929.

11.-Piece-work and Sub-letting.

Piece-work and sub-letting shall be abolished in all branches of the trade, except to the extent and under the conditions obtaining at the date of this Award.

12 .--- Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service, except in the case of apprentices, shall be a daily one, terminable on either side by one day's notice, and the worker shall, in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the date when such notice terminates: Provided that the emiployer may dismiss a worker without notice for good cause, and in such case the wages shall be paid up to the time and on the day of dismissal.

(b) Wood-workers shall be allowed one hour to sharpen tools and pack up when severing contract of service.

13.—Tools.

(a) Wood-workers and other branches requiring files and hack saw blades, bench vyces, cramps (above 4 inches), and rasps for the execution of their work, to be supplied with same by the employer.

(b) Apprentices to wood-working shall be supplied with the tools they will require during their first year of apprenticeship by their employer, but the apprentice shall be held responsible for wilful less or damage of same; the tools remaining the property of the employer, to be used subsequently by other apprentices.

(c) Where the wood-worker provides his own tools other than those mentioned in Subelauses (a) and (b) he shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per week extra.

14.—Painters—Special Provisions.

(a) Dry rubbing down,---No surface painted with lead paint shall be rubbed down or scraped by dry process.

(b) Washing of hands.—The employer shall provide for workers in the Painting Branch of the industry, washing facilities and soap suitable as a solvent for paint mixtures in some convenient place for the use of workers before meals and after knocking off work.

(c) Spray painting.—Where painters using sprays are employed, adequate protection for their health shall be provided by the employers. They shall also be provided with respirators.

It shall be considered a breach of this Award for spray-painting operations to be carried on contrary to any orders of or regulations made by the Department of Public Health.

(d) Painters shall be allowed five minutes each day before ceasing work at end of shift for the purpose of washing and cleaning up.

15.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate prescribed by this Award may be paid such lesser rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the secretary of the Union, or, failing such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application, after having given notice to the secrtary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

16.-No Discrimination.

No employer in the employment or dismissal of a worker shall discriminate against members of the Union, nor in the conduct of his business shall he do anything with a view directly or indirectly of injuring the Union.

17.--Posting of Award.

All employers shall keep a copy of the Award posted in a prominent place in the shop, and shall permit formal Union notices to be posted alongside.

18 -Record Book.

A time book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week; the said book shall be open to the inspection of the accredited representative of the Union at any time during the working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the book each week.

19.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid in the employer's time.

20.-Blowers.

Where practicable, blowers shall be installed in and around wood-working machines where dust is created and likely to affect the health of the employees.

21.-Union Representatives.

In cases where it may not be advisable to appoint a shop steward (that is, where the number of workers members of the Union is less than five), the Union's secretary or representative appointed in writing for that purpose may visit and remain upon the premises or business establishment of the employer where the work is being carried on under this Award during any portion of the luncheon hour for the purpose of interviewing and conferring with the members of the Union on matters connected with this Award.

22.—Casual Workers.

Workers with less than six days' continuous service shall be paid ten per cent. in addition to the ordinary daily wage prescribed by this Award.

23,-Place for Meals.

No worker shall be permitted to have a meal in any paint shop, or in such close proximity to any place where painting operations are being carried on as is likley to cause injury to his health.

24 .--- Mixed Functions.

(a) Any worker called upon to perform work carry-(a) Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay for two hours in any day shall be paid such higher minimum for the whole of that day.
(b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade for any portion of a day his wages shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity for the state of th

for that day.

25.-Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purposes of this Award a Board or Boards of Reference. A Board shall con-sist of a Chairman and two representatives, one nomi-nated by each party. The functions of a Board of

- (a) to settle disputes as to matters under this Award, except such as involve interpreta-tions of the provisions of the Award;
 (b) elassifying and fixing wages of any designa-tion, occupation, or calling not specifically provided for in the Award;
 (c) distinguished for the matter is the former than a fixing wages.

 (c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
 Separate Boards may be appointed where deemed necessary and advisable for different branches of the industry, or for different districts.

26.-Term of Award.

The term of the Award shall be three years from the date hereof, with the right of either party to apply to the Court to vary its provisions at any time after it has been in operation for twelve months.

27.-District Allowances.

District allowance, if any, shall be left as hereto-fore a matter for negotiation between employers and the Union.

Schedule II.

Apprenticeship Regulations.

1. No minor shall (except as a junior worker under the provisions of this Award) be employed or engaged in the industry except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained.

2. For the purposes of these Regulations a minor means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who customarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman upon the inaterial and with the tools or implements used in the industry.

3. (1.) Any person desirous of becoming an appren-tice shall notify the Registrar, who shall keep a register of such persons.

(2.) Every employer desirous of obtaining an apprentice shall take as an apprentice only a person whose name is so registered.

(3.) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by the award. In the event of his becoming an apprentice such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

4. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Court.

5. A Board to be called "The Advisory Committee" may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter. Such committee shall consist of the following :-

(a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as Chairman.

(b) Two representatives appointed by the employers.
(c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of employees in the trade.

The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.

(i.) No employer shall refuse employment to any person or dismiss any employee from his employment, or injure him in his employment or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the employee is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reason merely of anything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or employee in the course of his duty as such member.

(ii.) In any proceeding for any contravention of this Regulation it shall lie upon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment, or any employee proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced whilst acting as such member, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this Regulation.

7. (a) Any employer taking an apprentice on pro-bation shall within 14 days thereafter register such pro-bationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations an employer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.

(c) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months. (d) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed

within one month of the termination of the probationary period.

(e) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the ap-prentice, and the Registrar. No employer, guardian or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court. (f) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of

which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and

one copy shall be retained by the Registrar. (g) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another either temporarily or permanently-

- (i.) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or
- (ii.) upon the application of the employer or the ap-

(h) the transfer of every agreement shall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on

shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected. (i) There shall be four copies of the form of trans-fer, of which one copy shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar. (j) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provisions of the award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

industry. 8. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupa-tion, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer. 9. Every agreement entered into by the employer by competent instruction in a gradual and complete

Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be for a period of five years, subject to special provisions for junior workers in the award. 10. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered

into shall contain-

- (a) The names and addresses of the parties to the agreement.
 - (b) The date of birth of the apprentice.

- (f) A condition that technical instruction of the employer and apprentice.
 (f) A condition that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time process. instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
- (g) A condition that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progres-sing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.(h) The general conditions of apprenticeship.

11. Where in any case it is reported to the Court that any employer or group of employers has not in his or their employ the number of apprentices in proportion to the journeymen employed equal to the propor-tion allowed or required by the award, the Court may make such investigation and order as it may deem necessary to ensure that each employer or group of employers shall employ and train a specified minimum number of apprentices.

12. Should an employer at any time before the de-termination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may with the consent of the apprentice and guardian transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to exact the component to find the service of the apprentice of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Court in its award or otherwise according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

13. Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the par-ties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

14. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the pro-ficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the

Court, and the cause thereof. 15. No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for al-leged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprentice-ship, and in the event of the Court refusing same the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension, and, in the event of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

16. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

17. Subject to Regulation 23, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatso-ever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in

the apprenticeship agreement. 18. In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

Where in any case an employer is temporarily 19. unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice for such lesser time per week or per month, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, or industry.

20. Where in any case the Court is of opinion that the number of apprentices being trained is insufficient to meet the requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Court may make such investi-gations and order as it may be deemed necessary to permit or require any employer to employ such further number of apprentices as may be directed. Notice of such order shall be given to the parties to this award.

21. (a) Every apprentice shall attend a Government technical school vocational class or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade: Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where in-struction is given. Provided also that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) The fees for the classes attended by the appren-

tice shall be paid by the employer. (c) The period during which apprentices are to at-tend such technical school or classes shall be four bours per week.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times prescribed by the Court.

(e) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per centum of attend-ances at the technical school or other place of instruc-tion unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.

(f) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(g) The employer shall provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required by the exnecessary aminers, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(h) The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons (n) The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons skilled in the industry. It shall comprise equal num-bers of representatives nominated by the employers and workers in the particular trade. Failing such nomination or nominations the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagragement between the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.

(i) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of hold-ing the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.

(j) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice craft. is indentured.

(k) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the Union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and pro-duce the same for inspection by the Industrial In-spector whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall also be signed by the examiners. certificate shall also be signed by the examiners.

(1) Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these Regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be subject to such conditions as the Court may direct. (m) The examiners shall each be entitled to the

following fees, namely:-For every five, or fraction of five, apprentices examined-One guinea, with a minimum fee of two guineas.

In addition to the foregoing fees, where examiners, in the performance of their duties as such, are re-quired to travel they will be entitled to reimburse-ment of all fares and necessary expenses actually incurred.

(n) Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination following the issue of these Regulations, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of pro-ficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the Clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examina-tion. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forth-with notify the Clerk of the Court thereof. 22. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this award: Provided—

- (a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a (b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds
 - four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the produc-tion of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost if any of such certificate or certificates
- not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer; (c) An apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

The employer shall pay the apprentice, in re-23spect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, craft, oc-cupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence. Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to at-

tend compulsory parades. All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

24. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working hours, where such is prescribed, the time, so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

25. If the examiners or the industrial union or employer concerned, make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School, or other place of vocational training for the teaching of appren-tices, are inadequate, the Court may make such investi-gations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School, or such other place, as it deems necessary.

26. (1.) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages which shall be such amount

cept as to rates of wages which shall be such amount as the Court may determine. (2.) Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court with a recom-mendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures (*i.e.*, increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other

order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary. 27. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness or in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

Upon the completion of the period of training prescribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satis-

faction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shall be provided with a certificate to that effect. 29. The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing-

- (a) a complete record of all applications to become
- apprentices; (b) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers;
- (c) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed;
- (d) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the result of the examiners' reports;
 (e) any other particulars the Court may direct.
- 30. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such

time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen Where the employer is himself a journey employed. man regularly and usually working at the trade he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed.

31. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursu-ance of the provisions of "The Industrial* Arbitration ance of the provisions of "The Industrial' Arbitration Act, 1912-1925,²² shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery, or work upon which any apprentice is em-ployed or could be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or documents of the business relating to the wages and conditions of appren-tices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the above-mentioned matters. above-mentioned matters.

32. With a view to determining whether the number 32. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any em-ployer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said industry, or relating to the em-ployees engaged therein. 33. "Apprentice" means any person of either sex of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any industry trade craft or calling to which these

any industry, trade, craft, or calling to which these Regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.

MUSICIANS (DANCING AND ENTERTAIN-MENTS), PERTH.

No. 22 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 31st day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, be-tween the Western Australia Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Miss E. Philp, Dancing and Entertainment Organiser of Perth; Mrs. Richards, Dancing and Entertainment Organiser of Perth; C. Sheridan, Dancing and Entertainment Organiser Sheridan, Dancing and Entertainment Organiser of Perth; C. Sheridan, Dancing and Entertainment Organiser of Perth; P. Clothier, Dancing and Entertainment Or-ganiser of Perth; C. J. Webster, Dancing and Enter-tainment Organiser of Fremantle; W. Adam, Dancing and Entertainment Organiser of Perth (hereinafter in-cluded under the designation of "the employers"), of the other part whereby it is agreed as between the the other part, whereby it is agreed as between the Union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, that the minimum rates of pay and the terms and conditions of employment of musicians employed by the employers shall be as set out in the schedule hereof as follows:

Schedule of Minimum Rates of Pay and Terms and Conditions of Employment.

1.-The Industry.

This Agreement relates to the Industry of Professional Musicians, being an industry in, or in connestion with the production and organising of balls and dauces, smoke socials, banquets, garden parties, and public receptions.

2.-Parties bound.

This Agreement shall be binding upon the employers in respect of each and every person employed by them in the said industry, whether members of the Western Australia Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, or not, and upon the said Union and the members thereof.

3.—Definitions.

- In this Agreement— (a) "Weekly employee" means a musician engaged by the employer for six performances in each week.
 - (b) "Intermittent weekly employee' means a musician engaged by the employer for two
 - or more performances in each week. (c) "Casual employee" means a musician en gaged by the employer for one performance only in each week.
 - "Orchestra" means an orchestra of three or (d) more players. (e) "Conductor" or "Conductor-Leader" means
 - the conductor of an orchestra who plays and directs an orchestra.

4.—Rate of Wage.

Base, £4 5s. per week. Overtime Rate. Duration of a Ball or a Dance Performance.

(a) Balls and dances from 8 o'clock p.m. to 11 o'clock p.m.;

(b) A musician engaged as a casual employee and for one performance only in any one week on a ball or dance performance shall be paid one pound one shilling

for each performance; (c) A musician engaged for two or more performances in any one week on a ball or a dance perform. ance shall be paid sixteen shillings for each performance;

(d) The duration of any ball or dance performance shall not exceed three hours;

(e) A musician shall be entitled to receive payment at the rate of time and a quarter for all overtime worked in excess of three hours or after 11 o'clock p.m. on a ball or dance performance.

5.—Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Sunday Rate.

For all time worked on a ball or dance performance on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or on any Sunday each musician shall be entitled to receive payment at the rate of double time for all time worked on those days.

6.---Holiday Rate.

For each ball or dance performance on Labour Day, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day each musician shall be paid for each performance at the rate of time and a-quarter.

7.-Musicians not specially engaged for Broadcasting.

In case a musical performance of employees engaged otherwise than specially for broadcasting is broadcasted in whole or in part there shall be paid to each such employee an extra payment of 5s. for each such perform ance; provided that there shall not be payable in the ance; provided that there shall not so require week's aggregate more than 15s. in respect of any one week's employment, whatever the number of performances broadcasted in such week.

8.-Banquets, Public Dinners, Garden Parties, Receptions, and Smoke Socials.

(a) For a performance not longer in duration than three hours, one pound one shilling for each performance to each performer;

(b) For all time worked in excess of three hours each performer shall be entitled to receive payment at the rate of time and a quarter for all overtime worked.

9.—Payments.

(a) Weekly and intermittent weekly employees shall be paid their wages weekly;

(b) Casual employees shall be paid their wages on completion of the engagement.

10.-Notice to terminate Employment.

(a) Weekly and intermittent weekly employees shall be entitled to receive and to give 24 hours' notice to terminate their employment.

(b) The engagement of a casual employee shall terminate on the completion of the engagement.

11.-General Conditions.

(a) In all engagements for less than six consecutive performances outside the city of Perth the employer shall pay tram fares, first-class railway fare, and boat fare as from the Perth Town Hall, and from and to the place of performance, in addition to the prescribed rates; provided that the distance is three miles or over from the Perth Town Hall;

(b) At a ball or dance performance, and where a performance exceeds two and one-quarter hours, an interval of ten minutes shall be allowed, and such interval shall be included in the time worked;

(c) On a carnival or ball night a supper interval of twenty minutes shall be allowed, and such twenty minutes shall not be included as part of the time for the engagement on such carnival or ball night; (d) Weekly or intermittent weekly employees shall

not be required to supply music for any performance; (e) The provisions of this Agreement as to duration of performance, time of performance, and overtime apply to all employees, whether casual, weekly, or intermittent weekly:

(f) When employing a musician employers shall not discriminate against the members of the employees'

Union; (g) The commencing time for a night performance at a ball or dance, shall be at 8 o'clock p.m. and the finishing time shall be 11 o'clock p.m.;

(h) All employees, whether casual or otherwise, sha'l be entitled to receive overtime rates.

12 .- Time and Wages Book.

A time and wages book shall be kept by each employer at his place of business, and in such time and wages book there shall be entered the name of each end ployee, the nature of his engagement, showing whether casual or weekly or intermittent weekly, and the amount of overtime worked (if any), and the amount of wages received by the employee each week, or on completion of each casual engagement, and the employees' signature for same.

The employer and the employee shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the time and wages book each week, or on completion of each casual engagement, and the said time and wages book shall be open to the inspection of a duly accredited representa-tive of the employees' Union during business hours.

13.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

14.-Term.

This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date; provided that at any time after the expiry of twelve months from its date, or of any subsequent period of twelve months therefrom, any Court of Arbitration for a variation hereof.

15.-Common Rule.

All parties to this Industrial Agreement hereby agree that application shall be made by the employees' Union to the Court of Arbitration asking the Court to declare that this Agreement shall have the effect of an Award and be a Common Rule over the industry or industries to which it relates.

CLERKS (FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST). No. 21 of 1928.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this twenty-fourth day of August, 1928, between The Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, W.A. Branch, of the one part, and The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows :--

Area and Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the Clerical Staff of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, with the exception of the Secretary, Treasurer, and Wharf Manager.

Definitions.

"Officer," "Worker" shall mean any member of the Clerical Staff of the Fremantle Harkour Trust, male or female, covered by this Agreement. "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of

"'Union'' shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Feder-ated Clerks' Union of Australia. "Secretary'' shall mean the Secretary for the time

being of the Union.

Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays, with the exception of the Wharf Staff and the Store Staff, whose ordinary hours shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays: Provided that this clause shall not apply to the Wharfingers.

Overtime.

Overtime shall mean all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty and shall be paid for as follows:

All time worked on the first five days of the week, at the rate of time and a half; all time worked after noon on Saturdays and all time worked on Sundays and holidays, at the rate of double time. Overtime shall not be paid in any case where it is

necessary for an officer to work in overtime hours in carrying out his ordinary duties, nor in any other case unless authorised by the Secretary.

Meal Money.

If an officer is required to resume duty after the ordinary hours of duty he shall, in addition to the over-time above referred to, be paid 2s. as the price of one meal on each such day.

These rates are based on a basic wage of £4 5s. per week for males and £2 5s. 11d. per week for females. (a) Juniors—

(b) Adults.—The salaries of members of the staff of an age greater than 24 years shall be as per attachet schedule of range of salaries, except where otherwise stated in such schedule.

Annual Increments.

Where au officer is not receiving the maximum of his or her salary, such maximum shall be reached, in the case of male officers, by annual increments of £12 up to £336, and thereafter of annual increments of £24. In the case of female officers, over 21 years of age except where otherwise stated, 1st year £181, second year £191, third year £204. Provided that such advancement shall be approved by the Commissioners upon satisfactory re port from the Secretary of the Harbour Trust to the Commissioners of his or her conduct, diligence, and efficiency, and provided also that the advancement in salary shall not be granted to an officer if the Commissioners determine that such officer has not performed his or her duties satisfactorily for the preceding twelve months, or that such officer has been guilty of misconduct which in the opinion of the Commissioners justifies the postponement or refusal of the advancement.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to limit the power of the Commissioners to pay any officer at a higher rate within his grade or classification than that being paid where they may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the officer.

Higher Duties.

An officer called upon to perform the duties of a position higher in his or her grade or classification than he or she is being already paid, or of a position in a higher grade or classification, for a longer period than one month, shall receive the minimum salary attached to such grade or classification, or the maximum salary of his grade or classification (whichever may be the higher), but only for the period he or she is performing the higher duties.

(a) Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for:--New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Auzae Day, Pienie Day, and all gazetted holidays.

(b) Annual Holidays.

All officers shall be granted a fortnight's holiday per annum in accordance with Clause "b" of Regulation No. 12 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 21st July, 1911.

Preference of Employment.

All officers shall be members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, provided that any officer appointed who at the time of engagement is not a member of the Union shall become a member of the Union within fourteen days.

A record shall be kept showing the name of each worker under this Agreement, and the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from January 1st, 1928, provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement any term or terms hereof may be reviewed by either party giving one month's notice of their desire to do so.
