A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Claremont, made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," for the regulation and control of hoardings for advertising purposes. In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Municipality of Claremont doth hereby order as follows:—

By-law No. 119—Repeal.

By-law No. 119, made by the Municipality of Claremont under the powers of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 27th July, 1928, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

By-law No. 119.—Interpretation Clause.

1. In the construction of this By-law—
(a) the word "Hoarding" shall mean a hoarding or other structure erected on private property for advertising purposes, but shall not include such notices as are usually put up offering the premises on which the same are erected for sale or to let, if such notices do not exceed in area ten square feet, but shall extend to all such notices exceeding those dimensions;

- (b) the word "Occupier" shall mean the person having the use and control of a hoarding;
- (c) the word "Owner" shall mean the owner of the land on which a hoarding is erected;
- (d) "Building Surveyor" shall mean the building surveyor for the time being of the Municipality of Claremont;
- (e) the word "Council" shall mean the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Claremont;
- (f) the word "Municipality" shall mean the Municipal District of Claremont.

2. Subject to Section 16 of this By-law no person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding, or continue or maintain any existing hoarding within the boundaries of the municipality for the purpose of advertising, unless and until a plan and specifications made and written in ink, showing clearly the position and size and the method of and the materials to be used (or in the case of existing hoardings, the materials already used) in the construction of and the manner of fixing the same shall have been deposited in duplicate with and approved by the Building Surveyor, and except in accordance with such plan and specifications and unless a license in the form in the schedule hereto has been issued by the Building Surveyor.

3. No license shall be granted in respect of any hoarding erected either before or after the passing of this By-law unless the distance from the face of the hoarding to the alignment of the nearest street or way shall be at least equal to the distance from the level of such street or way to the highest point of such hoarding; provided that in no case shall the height of any hoarding exceeding twenty-one feet. The top of the hoarding shall be finished level and, save as provided in the succeeding clause, in a straight line. The name of the owner of the hoarding may, however, be fixed immediately on top of the hoarding near the centre of the length.

4. Every person erecting a hoarding, or the occupier or owner of a hoarding already erected at the corner of two streets shall cause such hoarding to be rounded off or splayed off to its full height, as may be required by the Building Surveyor.

5. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any hoarding, unless and until the proposed alteration or addition shall have been approved in writing by the Building Surveyor.

6. If any hoarding is at any time in the opinion of the Building Surveyor in a dangerous or neglected condition, and the owner or occupier shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to forthwith remove or refix the same to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor, the Council may remove the same and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or occupier.

7. The occupier of a hoarding shall maintain such hoarding to the satisfaction in all things of the Building Surveyor, and if any paper or other material affixed thereto becomes detached, shall forthwith remove and clear away such paper or other material.

8. If in the opinion of the Council any bill, placard, or advertisement attached to or pasted or painted on any hoarding be objectionable, and the owner or occupier of such hoarding shall, upon receipt of written notice to that effect, fail to remove or cause to be removed, such bill, placard, or advertisement within such time as shall be mentioned in the said notice, the Building Surveyor or other officer authorised by the Council may remove the same, and thereupon the Council may recover the cost of the removal from the owner or occupier.

9. All hoardings existing at the time of the enactment of this By-law which do not comply with the conditions thereby prescribed, shall not be repaired, renewed, altered or re-erected, and no existing hoarding shall be altered or repainted, save only in such manner as will cause the same to conform to the conditions as set out in this By-law.

10. No person shall continue or maintain any hoarding without having an existing license therefor, and, should any person commit a breach of the foregoing portion of this clause and fail to remove such hoarding forthwith after written notice from the Council so to do, the Council by its duly authorised officer may remove the same and recover the cost of such removal from the owner or occupier.

11. All notices required under this By-law to be served on the owner or occupier shall, in the first place,

be given by the Council to the occupier, but if he cannot be found, then any such notice may be served upon the owner.

12. If the occupier or owner of any hoarding fails to comply with a written order of the Council within the time named in such order, the Building Surveyor or other person or persons authorised by the Council may carry out the requirements of the said order, and any costs incurred may be recovered by the Council from the occupier or from the owner.

13. The fee for a "License" under this By-law shall be at the rate of five shillings per annum for every superficial yard comprised in such hoarding; provided always that the minimum fee per annum for a license shall be Five pounds.

Full fees as for one year shall be charged for all licenses issued before the 30th day of April in each year, but for all licenses issued between the first day of May and the 31st day of October in each year, half fees shall be charged; provided that in no case shall the charge be less than Two pounds ten shillings.

14. Every license issued by the Building Surveyor shall terminate on the 31st day of October in each year.

15. Every person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. All lands within the municipality owned, leased, or controlled by the Royal Agricultural Society, or by the University of Western Australia, shall be exempt from the provisions of this By-law.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

City of Perth.—By-law No. 12.

P.W. 1344/28.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 12:

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the City of Perth doth order that By-law No. 12 be repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. In the interpretation of this By-law "Class A Material" means and includes methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, and any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids which will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73deg. Fahrenheit, Abel close test.

"Class B material" means and includes petroleum and any products of petroleum, turpentine, and other volatile fluids which will flash or emit an inflammable vapour, but at a temperature not below 73deg. F., Abel close test.

"Class C material" means and includes lubricating and other oils which will flash or emit an inflammable vapour, but at a temperature not below 350deg. F., Abel close test.

"Dangerous business" shall mean and include the manufacture of gunpowder, or any detonating or explosive powder, or of matches ignitable by friction, or of any other substances liable to a sudden explosion, inflammation, or ignition, or of turpentine, vitriol, naphtha, varnish, fireworks or printed covers or oil-cloths, or any other manufactures liable by reason of the nature or quantity of the materials employed therein to cause sudden fire or explosion.

2. Not more than 50 gallons of Class "A" material shall be stored in any building or tank, except under the following conditions:—

(1) Quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of Class "A" material may be stored in a room properly ventilated and having walls and floors and ceilings constructed similarly to party structures. The door of such room shall, if possible, open directly into the outer air, but should this not be possible, the floor shall be sunk below the level of the adjoining floors, to the approval of the Surveyor. External doors within 20 feet of any door or window not in the same wall as and parallel to such first-mentioned door shall be tin-clad and constructed in accordance with the Fire Underwriters' specifications.

(2) Quantities exceeding 250 gallons of Class "A" material may be stored in a building, provided the following conditions are complied with but not otherwise:—

- (a) The site of each such building shall first be approved by the Council for that purpose;
- (b) The building shall be constructed with walls of brick or stone set in cement mortar or of cement concrete or reinforced concrete;
- (c) The total cubic capacity below the level of the lowest opening in any wall of such building shall exceed by at least 25 per cent. the total quantity for which permission is granted.

(3) Quantities exceeding 50 gallons of Class "A" material may be stored in surface tanks, provided the following conditions are complied with but not otherwise:—

- (a) The site of such tank shall first be approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (b) Any tank upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be at least two feet higher than the level to which the liquid would rise should it escape from the tank. An opening may be made in the wall or dam to permit access to the tank, but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door, either sliding or opening inwards, made of incombustible material and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear upon such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall or dam.

(4) Quantities not exceeding 1,000 gallons of Class "A" material may be stored in underground tanks constructed of galvanised steel plate, not less than 14 gauge, placed not less than two feet below the surface of the ground or two feet below the lowest floor of any building under which such tank is situated. Sand shall be filled in over such tank to the level of the ground or floor, as the case may be. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor. Filling pipes may be placed

where the Surveyor approves, but so that they shall not cause any obstruction to traffic while tanks are being filled.

(5) Quantities exceeding 1,000 gallons of Class "A" material may be stored in underground tanks, provided the following conditions are complied with but not otherwise:—

- (a) The site of such tank shall first be approved by the Council for that purpose;
- (b) The tank shall be constructed to the approval of the Surveyor;
- (c) Batteries of two or more tanks, the aggregate capacity of which exceeds 1,000 gallons, shall be subject to special approval by the Council.

3. Not more than 250 gallons of Class "B" material shall be stored in any building or tank, except under the following conditions:—

(1) Quantities exceeding 250 gallons of Class "B" material may be stored in buildings subject to the conditions prescribed in Clause 2 (2), (a), (b), and (c) of this By-law in respect of Class "A" material but not otherwise;

(2) Quantities exceeding 250 gallons of Class "B" material may be stored in surface tanks subject to the conditions prescribed in Clause 2 (3), (a) and (b), of this By-law, in respect of Class "A" material but not otherwise;

(3) Quantities not exceeding 1,000 gallons of Class "B" material may be stored in underground tanks constructed in accordance with the conditions prescribed in Clause 2 (a) of this By-law in respect of Class "A" material but not otherwise;

(4) Quantities exceeding 1,000 gallons of Class "B" material may be stored in underground tanks subject to the conditions prescribed in Clause 2 (5), (a), (b), and (c) of this By-law in respect of Class "A" material but not otherwise.

4. Not more than 10,000 gallons of Class "C" material shall be stored on any site or in any building, except under the following conditions:—

(1) Such site or building shall first be approved by the Council for that purpose, and, when such site is an open yard or a shed, it shall be enclosed with such wall or bank or be excavated to such depth as the Surveyor may require;

(2) Any building used for such storage shall be constructed with walls of brick or stone set in cement mortar or of cement concrete or reinforced concrete;

(3) The total cubic capacity below the level of the lowest opening in any wall of such building shall exceed by at least 25 per cent. the total quantity for which permission is granted.

5. Rooms used for the storage of Class "A" material, Class "B" material, calcium carbide, or any other highly inflammable or dangerous material shall be properly ventilated and shall have walls, floors, and ceilings constructed similar to party structures. The doors of such room shall, if possible, open directly into the outer air. All internal doors shall be tin-clad and constructed in accordance with the Fire Underwriters' specifications.

6. Not more than 5cwt. of calcium carbide may be stored in any building except under the following conditions:—

(1) The site of such building shall be approved by the Council for that purpose;

(2) The design and construction of such building shall be approved by the Surveyor, and no building shall be used for such storage as aforesaid until such approval shall have been given.

7. (1) No room of greater capacity than 750 cubic feet shall be used for the storage of cinematograph films. The walls of such room shall be at least 9 inches thick and constructed of concrete or brickwork set in cement mortar. The floor shall be constructed of concrete, and the ceiling of brick or concrete arches or reinforced concrete, at least four inches thick, with at least two inches of cover to rods in beams or girders and two inches of cover to the steel of floor slabs. The doors shall be tin-clad, made and fitted in accordance with the Fire Underwriters' specifications, and such doors shall only remain open for such time as is required to remove from or place films in the room.

(2) Safes for the storage of cinematograph films shall not exceed 150 cubic feet in capacity. Such safes shall be constructed with an angle-iron frame, contiguous at wall edges. The angle-iron used shall be at least quarter inch by two inches for small safes and shall be increased proportionately for larger safes; and on safes of larger capacity than 21 cubic feet an additional stiffening of heavy steel at least quarter inch by two inches, and increasing proportionately on larger safes, shall be used at the top and bottom and sides.

(3) Sheet steel vaults for the storage of cinematograph films shall be constructed of at least 12-gauge

steel for the outer shell and 14-gauge steel for the inner shell: the distance between such shells shall be at least 5½ inches, and such space shall be filled with cement concrete, provided that the doors may have 4 inches of cement concrete and a 2-inch sealed air-space, and such air-space may be used to contain locks and bolts.

(4) The doors of all such safes and vaults shall have stepped sides and shall be smoke-proof. No cast-iron shall be used in the construction of any such safe or vault, except in such parts as castors, hinges, and flanged door-frames.

(5) Every such room or vault shall be ventilated to the outside air by an opening having a sectional area of at least 50 square inches; provided, however, that if the safes or vault be of less capacity than 150 cubic feet, the vent may have a sectional area of 12 square inches. The vent-pipe shall be of metal of not less than 18 gauge, it shall not subject adjoining property to a fire hazard, and shall be shielded from the weather, and shall be provided with a wire screen of not less than quarter-inch mesh. All motors used for forced ventilation of any safe or vault shall be placed outside such safe or vault and at least 12 inches therefrom.

8. (1) No room shall be used for examining or repairing cinematograph films, unless such room is ventilated to the outside air and is separated from other parts of the building by partitions of non-combustible material and has doors at all openings in such partitions. No such room shall be used for the storage or handling of combustible materials other than films, except as in this clause otherwise provided.

(2) Cinematograph films shall be stored in individual tin-cans or galvanised iron boxes. When containing films such cans or boxes shall be kept closed by tight-fitting covers, except when the films kept in such cans or boxes are actually being examined or repaired.

(3) There shall not be at any one time more than one quart of any compound of collodion or amyl acetate, or of any similar inflammable material, in any examination or repair room.

(4) Lighting in any examination or repairing room shall be restricted to incandescent electric lamps, and all wiring for light or power shall be installed in conduit pipes. Switches with bare terminals shall be enclosed in metal boxes with self-closing doors. Shades over electric globes shall be of non-combustible material. All electric motors used in examination or repair rooms for the purpose of examining or repairing films, and all resistance devices used in connection with such motors shall be enclosed in galvanised iron wire cages of 18 gauge ¼ inch mesh.

(5) Each examination or repair room shall be heated only by hot air, hot water, or steam, and a metal shield or screen shall be provided to prevent films coming into contact with radiators or heated pipes. No hot air floor registers shall be used.

(6) All tables used for examination or repairing of cinematograph films shall be of metal, and the tops of such tables shall be covered with galvanised iron.

(7) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation having the custody or control of any room or place where cinematograph films are stored, examined, or repaired to allow smoking in such room or place; and every such person, firm, or corporation shall display or cause to be displayed in every such room or place a notice with the words "No Smoking" printed thereon, and any person disobeying such notice shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

9. No dangerous business shall be carried on in any building or vault situated less than 40 feet from any public way or any vacant land in other occupation, or situated less than 50 feet from any other building.

Industrial Board—Bacon Curing Industry.

No. 4 of 1928.

Between West Australian Branch Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Foggitt Jones, Ltd.; D. Bantock; Watson's Supply Stores, Respondents.

Award of Industrial Board.

THE Bacon Curing Industrial Board, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties:—

1.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be three years from the 16th of November, 1928: Provided that it shall be competent for any party thereto to apply to alter, amend, or revise the same after the expiration of twelve months from that date.

2.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of thirty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

3.—Wages.

"Pork Labourer": The term "Pork labourers" includes workers (not otherwise specified) employed in the Curing, Smallgoods, or Lard Departments, Tallow House, Drying House, Smoke Fillers, Washers of hams or bacon, ham baggers, and gut and casing runners.

6.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior worker to every three or fraction of three (not being less than one) fully paid workers.

7.—Casual Worker.

Casual worker shall mean a worker engaged for less than one week.

Casual workers shall be paid one-sixth of the weekly wage for the class of work they perform, plus two shillings and threepence for each day (including Saturday) or part of a day on which they are employed.

8.—Mixed Functions.

Where a worker is called upon to perform more than one class of work in any one day he shall be paid for that day at the rate applicable to the highest class of work performed by him.

9.—Hours.

The hours of duty of employees (other than yardmen) on each day shall be continuous, except for the meal time interval, and shall not (without payment of overtime) exceed forty-eight in any one week, nor shall they (without payment of overtime) exceed eight and three-quarter hours on any one ordinary day, or four and a quarter hours on Saturday.

The hours of duty of employees (other than yardmen, carters, and drivers) shall be at any time between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on any ordinary day, with not less than three-quarters of an hour interval for a meal, and between 7 a.m. and noon on Saturday.

The hours of duty for yardmen shall not (without payment of overtime) exceed 50 in any one week, nor shall they (without payment of overtime) exceed 8¾ hours on any one ordinary day, or 4¾ hours on Saturday. The hours of duty shall be at any time between 6.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on ordinary days, and between 6.30 a.m. and noon on Saturdays, and any hours not exceeding two in number on Sunday.

The hours of duty of carters and drivers shall be at any time between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any ordinary day, and between 7 a.m. and noon on Saturday.

Provided that the actual starting and finishing times in each factory shall be as agreed upon by the employer and the workers concerned. In the event of their being unable to agree, this Board shall fix such times.

Provided further, that the actual starting times so agreed upon in each factory, except for carters and yardmen and any alteration thereof, shall be notified to the Union.

10.—Overtime.

Workers shall be entitled to payment for overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter at the rate of double time for each hour or fraction of an hour for all periods in excess of forty-eight hours (or fifty in the case of yardmen) in any one week, or in excess of eight and three-quarter hours on an ordinary day or four and a quarter hours on Saturday: Provided that any worker called upon to work after 12.30 p.m. on Saturday shall be paid at double time rate for any work done after that hour.

Should any worker be required to work more than six hours without a meal interval he shall be paid at the rate of double his ordinary wages from the expiration of six hours until the meal interval, and for such purposes the hourly rate of pay shall be deemed to be one forty-eighth of the weekly rate applicable to the employee's function or class of work.

No employee (other than a casual or yardman) shall be required to work on Sunday unless he shall receive payment at double hourly rate (ascertained as above) applicable to the function or class of work he may be called upon to perform.

Should a casual employee be employed for any duty on Sunday he shall receive payment for such Sunday at double the ordinary daily rate hereinbefore prescribed.

11.—Holidays.

(a) All workers (other than casual workers) shall be entitled to the following six holidays without deduction of pay:—

New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Butchers' Picnic Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

Should any of the foregoing holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday the next following working day shall be observed as a holiday in lieu thereof. If the parties are unable to agree, the holidays shall be fixed by this Board.

(b) In addition to the foregoing six days an annual holiday of six working days shall be granted to each worker (without deduction of pay) once in each year of service in the months of January, February, March, April, or May at a time to be actually agreed upon by the employer and the worker concerned; payment for the said holiday shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or the employment terminated: Provided that, where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of this clause.

(c) Any worker not completing twelve months' service shall be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month or portion of a month of service, unless he shall have already taken such proportionate amount of his holidays.

12.—Miscellaneous.

(a) Provided that the continuity of the work is not interfered with workers shall be allowed to have a cup of tea or a smoke once a day during working hours.

(b) Workers employed continuously in the Curing Cellar shall be entitled to be provided by the employer with one pair of clogs, or the equivalent value thereof, once every four months, if required.

13.—Time-Book.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his factory or store, or at each of them, a book containing a record of the names of all workers employed by him, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each worker, the starting and finishing time each day, and the amount of overtime worked and paid for, if any.

Such book shall be open for inspection by the Secretary or by any person appointed by the Union during working hours.

The duties are described in the Royal Commission of appointment as follows:—To summon and hold Privy Councils on His Majesty's behalf and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matters to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required, to approve and sign on His Majesty's behalf any documents requiring His Majesty's signature, and to do on His Majesty's behalf any matters which appear necessary or expedient in the interests of the safety and good government of the Realm save that the Counsellors of State shall not dissolve Parliament or grant any rank, title, or dignity of peerage or act in any matters in which it appears that His Majesty's approval should be previously obtained.”
