WHEREAS it is provided by "The Vermin Act, 1918," that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animal or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule; and it is further provided by such Act that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation; and whereas it is desirable to declare Goats to be vermin within the portion of the State hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation add "Goats" to the Third Schedule of the said Act: Provided, however, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the Marble Bar Vermin District.

Harvey Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 861/28.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making regulations, which the Governor can exercise under Division 4, Part IV., of the said Act; and whereas it is advisable to empower the Harvey Road Board to prohibit the passage of motor cycles over a specified road within its District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Harvey Road Board, by the By-law in Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of motor cycles over a specified road within its District, and to impose a penalty of not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

Harvey Road Board.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 85/29.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Subiaco Municipality.—Proposed 12-inch and 6-inch water mains from Thomas Street to Hamersley Road via Arthur Street, Coolgardie Street, and Campbell Road (length approximately 14½ chains), with valves and all necessary apparatus, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4888.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 12th day of April, 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-first day of January, 1929, between McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited, and The Swan River Shipping Company, Limited, of the one part, and The Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle, of the other part; witnesseth as follows:—

Definitions.—In this Agreement "Union" means the Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle. "Employer" means McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited, and/or The Swan River Shipping Company, Limited.

Part 1.—Lightermen.

The following wages and conditions shall apply to members of the above Union whilst employed on cargo lighters at the Port of Fremantle within the limits of the Outer Harbour and on the navigable waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers.

1.—Wages.

The rate of pay shall be £5 7s. 6d. per week; (Basic wage per week, £4 5s.; margin per week, £1 2s. 6d.)

2.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All employment shall be by the week. A week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate the employment, or the employer shall pay one week's wages in lieu of such notice, subject to the right of the employer to dispense with the services of the employee for misconduct or negligence without notice at any time.

3.—Hours of Labour.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, forty-seven (47) hours shall constitute a week's work, as follows:—7.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays; 7.30 a.m. to noon Saturdays.

(b) In the case of a lighterman having completed twenty-four (24) consecutive hours' work or time of duty or time standing by, he shall be given eight (8) consecutive hours off duty for the purpose of rest without deduction from his weekly payment. The employee shall, for the purpose of this clause, be deemed to be on duty even if he is allowed time off for meals or for a short period or periods to prevent the work being in fact continuous. The employer, however, may at his discretion relieve a lighterman at any hour except between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m.

(c) In the event of a lighterman not being relieved from duty after working twenty-four (24) consecutive hours he shall be entitled to payment at overtime rates until relieved.

(d) A short period means a period less than four (4) hours.

(e) If an employee absents himself from duty without reasonable cause, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay, that is to say, one-sixth of the weekly pay for each day of absence and a proportionate part of one-sixth for a shorter absence.

(f) In no case shall any lighterman be required to attend to more than one lighter at any time whilst receiving or discharging cargo. In extraordinarily bad weather an additional lighterman or deck-hand shall, wherever practicable, be allotted to assist where hatches or cargo must be frequently covered and uncovered and moorings require extra attention during loading or discharging of cargo.

4.—Overtime.

(a) For all work over the hours of labour in Clause 3 (a) lightermen shall be entitled to overtime payment at the rate of 3s. 6d. per hour.

(b) For all work performed on Sundays and holidays as defined in Clause 6, employees shall be entitled to payment at the rate of double ordinary time in addition to their full week's wages.

(c) Employees called out to work on Sundays and holidays shall be entitled to a minimum of three hours at double ordinary time rate; provided that, where an employee is required on such days in the case of accident or sudden emergency to do work for the safety of the vessel, not being longer than two hours, payment shall be made as for actual time worked, and that where work commenced on the previous day extends beyond midnight only one minimum shall apply.

(d) Where employees having ceased duty at 5 p.m. on week days or noon on Saturdays are required to resume it thereafter on the same day they shall be entitled to overtime payment subject to a minimum up to 8 p.m. of two (2) hours, and thereafter of three (3) hours: Provided that—

(1) where time of duty runs into the day's work, overtime payment shall be made only for the actual time worked prior to the commencement of ordinary hours, and

(2) employees knocked off for the tea meal and resuming immediately thereafter are to receive payment at overtime rates only for the actual time until knocked off.

(e) If a break of time should occur of less than three (3) hours whilst the employees are working between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. such break shall be counted as waiting time, and shall be paid for at ordinary time rates.

(f) In all cases time shall count to and from Victoria Quay, Fremantle; provided that, where a shift commences or ends in Perth, employees shall be entitled to their fare and payment at ordinary rates whilst travelling other than in ordinary hours of labour for any greater period than fifteen minutes in any one day; where the period exceeds fifteen minutes and not more than thirty minutes, payment shall be made as for half an hour, and where the period exceeds half an hour, as for one hour.

5.—Remaining in Perth over night.

When an employee is required to stay in Perth over night the sum of seven shillings (7s.) shall be paid to cover cost of bed and meals.

6.—Sundays and Holidays.

On Sundays and on the following holidays employees shall, unless for payment at double ordinary time rate, be free from duty:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day or such other days as are prescribed under the law of the State to be observed in lieu of the actual holiday mentioned; also Picnic Day (to be held conjointly with the Picnic Day observed by the waterside workers).

7.—Annual Leave.

(a) When an employee completes twelve (12) calendar months' service he shall be given leave of absence on full pay for fourteen (14) consecutive days; provided that, where a public holiday as specified in Clause 6 falls within the period of an employee's annual leave, an additional working day shall be added in lieu thereof.

(b) By mutual consent this leave of absence may be postponed in all or any part and the unused leave accumulated, but it may not be postponed beyond the second year.

(c) Provided that, if the employment be terminated by the employer before six months for any reason not caused by any action or default of the employee (as provided in Clause 2) after three months or before six months' service, the employer shall pay the employee in lieu of leave of absence one full day's pay for each month he has served.

(d) Forty-eight (48) hours' notice of intention to give holidays to employees shall be given to the employees whenever practicable.

8.—Sickness and Accident.

Accident.—The employee benefits, as provided for by the Workers' Compensation Act (W.A.) and amendments thereto.

Sick Pay.—In the case of sickness necessitating absence from work, an employee will be granted full pay up to the first following pay day and thereafter half pay on the production of a medical certificate on each occasion; such sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve days in the aggregate in each year.

9.—Meals.

(a) The present practice, which enables the despatch of tugs and lighters to or from Perth and for continuous towage at any hour without cessation for a recognised meal hour shall continue.

(b) Except as provided for in Subclause (a) an employee for the time being in Fremantle or at Perth may, where the exigencies of the trade render it necessary in the opinion of the employer or his representative, be called upon to curtail his meal hour, or portion of it,

subject to the following provisions: if the time curtailed exceeds half an hour, payment shall be made as for one hour at the rates specified in Subclause (d) hereof, but where the time is half an hour or less payment shall be made for half an hour.

(c) The meal times allowed shall be:—

Breakfast—When employees are required to commence work on any day before 6 a.m. they shall be entitled to a break for a meal between 7 a.m. and 8 a.m.

Dinner—12 noon to 1 p.m., except when towing, when any hour between 12 noon and 2 p.m. shall be allowed, at employer's option.

Tea—If the intention is to continue work after 5 p.m., the tea hour shall be 5 p.m. to 6 p.m., except where the towing of lighters cannot be completed before 6 p.m., when the actual overtime will be paid.

(d) For any meal hour not given payment shall be made as follows:—

(1) Where towing: Dinner, at ordinary overtime rates; tea, at ordinary overtime rates in addition to the overtime otherwise payable subject to the provisions of Subclause (c).

(2) Where the work of discharging or receiving cargo prevents or curtails a meal hour: Dinner, at double ordinary rates; tea, at overtime rates in addition to the overtime otherwise payable.

(e) When lightermen are required to work overtime beyond midnight and to remain on duty during the recognised supper hour they shall, in accordance with the present practice, receive ordinary overtime payment for that hour.

(f) When any employee is required to work overtime he shall be given the longest possible notice of such intention.

10.—Stop-work Meetings.

Except where cargo is being or is to be worked or towages are being or are to be undertaken which will not permit of postponement, or it is necessary for the safety of the vessel that the employee or employees should remain on board, the employer shall allow the employees to attend a stop-work meeting of the Union on the last Tuesday of each month, between the hours of 9 a.m. and noon, without any reduction of wages on that account.

No other stop-work meetings shall be held during working hours.

11.—Oilskins.

Each lighterman and the deck-hand on the tug boat shall be supplied with a suit of oilskins, same to be replaced by the employer when no longer serviceable, and returned to the employer: Provided, that not more than one suit of oilskins will be supplied to any such employee within twelve months of the last issue.

Part 2.—River Tug Boats.

The whole of the conditions of this Agreement, with the exception of rates of wages and overtime payment, shall be applicable to deckhands and firemen employed on the river tug boats "Albatross," "Eagle," and "Koori," to whom the following conditions also apply:—

1.—Rates of Pay.

The position of deckhand on the "Koori" and "Eagle" is to be filled by a youth.

For all work done outside ordinary hours of labour the rates for deckhands and firemen will be 2s. 9d. per hour, and for youths under 21 years of age 2s. 3d. per hour.

2.—Raising Steam.

Firemen will be allowed half an hour's overtime for raising steam on week days; also half an hour for banking fires; any portion of such time as falls within overtime hours to be paid for at ordinary overtime rates.

When a fireman is required to attend to banking of fires on days when the tug is off duty he shall be allowed one hour's overtime for each time he is required to attend at the tug for this work.

Part 3.—Watchmen.

The whole of the conditions of this Agreement, with the exception of Clauses 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 9 shall be applicable to night watchmen, to whom the following conditions also apply:—

Wages.

£4 9s. per week; (Basic wage per week £4 5s.; margin per week 4s.)

The ordinary hours of duty for watchmen shall be forty-eight (48) per week of seven days, to be worked in six shifts, with a spread of hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. on any one shift, which shall constitute a shift.

If more than 48 hours are worked during the six shifts for the week, overtime at the rate of 2s. 9d. per hour shall be paid.

If more than 10 hours are worked on any one shift, overtime at the prescribed rate shall be paid.

One night off each week shall be allowed a watchman, unless the rate of 2s. 9d. per hour is paid when called upon to work the seventh shift in any one week.

Casual Employees.

A casual employee is one for whom work for a period of twelve consecutive working days, not including holidays is not provided by the employer, and such employee shall be entitled to the following wages:—Lighterman, 22s. 6d. per day; fireman, 22s. 6d. per day; deckhand, 20s. per day; watchman, 16s. per shift.

Disputes.

There shall be no stoppage of work in the lighterage trade for any cause or reason whatsoever. Should any dispute arise between any employee and the employers, the matter shall be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the Union, and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agreement, the Registrar of the Industrial Arbitration Court of Western Australia or his deputy shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on both parties.

No Discrimination.

The employers shall not discriminate without just cause against any members of the Union who are qualified and bear good conduct records, and who agree to and continue to work on the terms of this Agreement, and as there are vacancies for, and the local representative of the Company will consider any representation made to him by the secretary of the Union. The discrimination referred to is unjust discrimination in favour of persons not members of the Union, not discrimination between members of the Union.

Area.

The area covered by this Agreement is all navigable waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers and the limits of the Port of Fremantle, including Outer Harbour, in the State of Western Australia.

Term.

This Agreement is to operate from the twenty-first day of January, 1929, and shall continue in force until the 31st December, 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-first day of January, 1929, between McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited, of the one part, and the Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

Definitions.—In this Agreement "Union" means The Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle. "Employer" means McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited.

Area.

The following wages and conditions shall apply to members of the crew of the excursion steamer "Zephyr," at the Port of Perth, in the State of Western Australia.

1.—Rates of Pay.

The complement shall consist of two firemen-greasers, one deckhand and two youths, subject to provisions of Clause 4 (c).

2.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All employment (except that of casual employees) shall be by the week. A week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate the employment, or the employer shall pay one week's wages in lieu of such notice, subject to the right of the employer to dispense with the services of the employee for misconduct or negligence without notice at any time.

3.—Payment of Wages.

(a) All wages other than money for overtime shall be paid weekly.

(b) Money for overtime shall be payable on the pay day of the week following that on which it was earned.

4.—Hours of Labour.

(a) The number of working hours shall not exceed forty-eight (48) in any one week.

(b) Time shall be counted when the men are actually working or when the vessel is under way. If an employee absents himself from duty without reasonable cause, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay, that is to say, one-sixth of the weekly pay for each day of absence and a proportionate part of one-sixth for a shorter absence.

(c) The men to be worked at the master's discretion; the full deck and engine room complements only necessarily to be employed when vessel proceeding on trips to Rottnest or elsewhere outside of Inner Harbour.

(d) In computing the week's work, a "call out" shall be counted as four (4) hours, except in the case of work alongside the wharf, which shall count as two (2) hours.

5.—Time Off Duty.

In lieu of Sundays and holidays the members of the crew to be allowed off duty for five intervals of twenty-four consecutive hours in each calendar month, or else be paid for each interval not given a full day's wages.

6.—Weekly Time Off.

Each member of the crew shall be entitled to be absent from the vessel for four (4) consecutive hours each week he has been employed. This time to be given either for the first half of the working day of from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. or for the latter half, and if not given within one month shall be paid for at overtime rates. The time may be allowed to accumulate and be given in whole days or part days, but not beyond the expiration of one month.

Provided that, if the employee prevents the accumulated leave being given by determining the employment, the employer need only pay the half days not allowed at ordinary time rates.

7.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of forty-eight (48) hours in any week shall be deemed overtime and paid for at the following rates:—

Firemen-greasers and deckhands—3s. per hour.
Youths (under the age of 21)—2s. 6d. per hour.

8. Meals.

(a) The meal times allowed shall be at the employer's option:—Breakfast, any hour between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m.; dinner, any hour between 12 noon and 2 p.m.; tea, any hour between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m.

(b) Where the exigencies of the trade render it necessary in the opinion of the master or officer in charge of the vessel, a member of the crew may be called upon to curtail his dinner or tea hour, or a portion of it, subject to the following provisions: if the time curtailed exceeds half an hour, payment shall be made as for one hour at overtime rate and a quarter, but where the time is half an hour or less, payment shall be made for half an hour.

9.—Sickness and Accident.

Accident.—The employee benefits as provided for by the Workers' Compensation Act (W.A.) and amendments thereto.

Sick Pay.—In the case of sickness necessitating absence from work an employee will be granted full pay up to the first following pay day, and thereafter half pay, on the production of a medical certificate on each occasion; such sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve days in the aggregate in each year.

10.—Annual Leave.

Employees serving the employer for the period of the excursion season (from November to April, or as the case may be) will be granted, in lieu of leave of absence, one full day's pay for each month served.

11.—No Discrimination.

The employer shall not discriminate without just cause against any members of the Union who bear good conduct records, and who agree to and continue to work on the terms of the Agreement, and as there are vacancies for, and that the local manager of the Company will consider any representations made to him by the secretary of the Union.

12.—Disputes.

There shall be no stoppage of work for any cause or reason whatsoever. Should any dispute arise between any employee and the employer, the matter shall be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the employer, a representative of the Union, and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agreement, the Registrar of the Industrial Arbitration Court of Western Australia or his deputy shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on both parties.

13.—Casual Employees.

A casual employee is one for whom work for a period of twelve consecutive working days, not including holidays, is not provided by the employer, and such employee shall be entitled to the following wages:—Fireman, 22s. 6d. per day; deckhand, 20s. per day; Youth (18 to 21 years), 15s. 7d. per day; Youth (under 18 years), 13s. 6d. per day.

14.—Term.

This Agreement is to operate from the twenty-first day of January, 1929, and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of July, 1930.

SEAMEN (TUGS).

No. 10 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-first day of January, 1929, between the Swan River Shipping Company, Limited, and The Adelaide Steamship Company, Limited, of the one part, and The Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

Definitions. In this Agreement "Union" means The Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle. "Employer" means The Swan River Shipping Company, Limited, and/or The Adelaide Steamship Company, Limited.

1.—Area.

The following wages and conditions shall apply to members of the crews of the Harbour Tugs "Wyola" and "Uco" whilst so employed at the Port of Fremantle, in the State of Western Australia.

2.—Rates of Pay.

The leading hand on deck and in the engine room to be paid £1 per month extra as heretofore.

Provided that:—

(a) The employers are only bound to pay the rates set out in this clause and observe the conditions to members of the Union so long as they employ members of the Union, and so long as the members they employ observe the conditions of this Agreement and do not strike for different conditions or exercise what is known as "job control."

(b) Members of the Union who strike to insist on better conditions, or who exercise job control, shall not thereafter be entitled to the rates of pay or conditions set out in this Agreement from the employers who are employing them at the time they strike or exercise such job control.

(c) Where a member is discharged through no fault of his own, and is re-engaged by the same employer within a week, or within a week of the end of the Christmas and New Year holidays, he shall be entitled as a casual employee to payment of an additional rate for the work done on the day he is employed of 10s. per month to the rates set out in Clause 1 for each day he is required to take an enforced holiday for the first three days, and a further sum of £1 a month for each additional three days or part of three days thereafter during the enforced holiday.

This subclause does not apply to employers who pay the full monthly rates set out in Clause 1, whether the members are employed or on duty every day in each month or not, or to an employer who permanently discharges a seaman without any intention of re-engaging him within one month.

3.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All employment (except that of casual employees) shall be by the week. A week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate the employment, or the employer shall pay one week's wages in lieu of such notice, subject to the right of the employer to dispense with the services of the employee for misconduct or negligence without notice at any time.

4.—Payment of Wages.

(a) All wages other than money for overtime shall be paid weekly.

(b) Money for overtime shall be payable on the pay day of the week following that on which it was earned.

5.—Hours of Labour.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided the hours of labour shall not be more than eight in any one day.

(b) Except as hereinafter provided the hours of labour shall be between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

(c) Outside the hours of labour and without payment for overtime any work shall be done that is required for the safety of the tug.

(d) If longer hours are worked because of the illness or incapacity of another man, or for any other special reason, overtime shall be paid for any work done in excess of eight (8) hours.

6.—Living on Shore.

When a member of the crew is required by the ship to sleep and take his meals ashore, he shall be paid daily 6s. 6d. per day, or 1s. 6d. for each meal and 2s. for the bed.

7.—Time Off Duty.

In lieu of Sundays and holidays the members of the crews to be allowed off duty for five intervals of twenty-four (24) consecutive hours in each calendar month, or else be paid for each interval not given at the rate of 20s. for deck-hands and 22s. 6d. for firemen. Notwithstanding the foregoing, as far as practicable, consistent with the work of the port, these intervals are to be given on Sundays or alternate Sundays as at present.

8.—Weekly Time Off.

Each member of the crew shall be entitled to be absent from the tug for four (4) consecutive hours each week he has been employed. This time to be given either for the first half of the working day of from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. or for the latter half, and if not given within one month shall be paid for at overtime rates. The time may be allowed to accumulate and be given in whole days or part days, but not beyond the expiration of one month.

Provided that, if the employee prevents the accumulated leave being given by determining the employment, the employer need only pay the half days not allowed at ordinary time rates.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) Members of the crews serving continuously for one year to be allowed fourteen (14) days' leave of absence on full pay.

(b) Members of the crews serving continuously for six months or more, but not for one year, to be allowed leave of absence on full pay for a time proportionate to their length of service.

Provided that, if any member is discharged just prior to a public holiday or holidays, or before the Christmas and New Year holidays, and re-engaged within one week after such holidays, the service shall be deemed to be continuous within the meaning of this clause.

(c) Provided that, if the employment be determined by the employer before six months through his vessel being put out of commission, or for any other reason not caused by any act or default of the employee after three months or before six months' service, the employer shall pay the employee one full day's pay for each month he has served in lieu of leave of absence.

(d) The leave of absence may be postponed in whole or in part, and the unused leave accumulated, but so that it be not postponed without the consent of the employee beyond the second year.

(e) Forty-eight (48) hours' notice of intention to give the holidays to the employees shall be given to the employees whenever practicable. If it is impracticable, in the opinion of the master, to give the 48 hours' notice, as much notice as can reasonably be given must be given to the employees.

10.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done outside ordinary hours of labour overtime shall be paid at the rate of 3s. per hour.

(b) The overtime shall start to count as from the time the employee out of his ordinary working hours is ordered to attend and does attend until released, including any time he is waiting or standing by after the time he was ordered to attend and was not released.

(c) Where employees having ceased duty at 5 p.m. are required to resume it thereafter on the same day, they shall be entitled to overtime payment subject to a minimum of two (2) hours' overtime for each call back (irrespective of number of jobs): Provided that:—

1. Where time of duty runs into the day's work, overtime payment shall be made only for the actual time worked prior to the commencement of ordinary hours, and

2. Employees knocked off for the tea meal and resuming immediately thereafter, are to receive payment at overtime rates only for the actual time until knocked off.

(d) Where there is a second call out on any night, and the break from the expiration of the first two-hour period to such second call out is less than two hours, such break shall be counted as waiting time and be paid for at ordinary time rates.

(e) All broken time, including that in excess of the minimum, shall be reckoned as heretofore, viz., under 40 minutes, half hour payment; 40 minutes and over, one hour's payment.

11.—Trimming Bunker Coal.

When any member of the crew is required to trim bunkers between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. whilst the tug is coaling in port, he shall be entitled to such additional payment as will represent the difference between a day's pay plus victualling allowance, which for the purpose of this clause is fixed at 2s. 9d. per day, and the minimum rate of pay to wharf labourers at Fremantle.

12.—Meals.

(a) The meal times allowed shall be:—For breakfast, any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m.

(b) Dinner, any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(c) Tea (if working overtime), any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m., and if working is to be continued after 11 p.m., any consecutive 60 minutes for supper between 11 p.m. and 1 a.m.

(d) Where it is necessary, in the opinion of the master or officer in charge of the tug for the purpose of shifting ship or to enable the vessel to start a job during a meal hour, a member of the crew may be called upon to curtail his meal hour or a portion of it, subject to the following provision: if the time curtailed exceeds half an hour, payment shall be made as for one hour at double rates, but where the time is half an hour or less, payment shall be made as for half an hour at double rates: Provided, that a member of the crew may not be sent to a meal under the provisions of this subclause whilst a tow is in progress or whilst the tug is awaiting a tow in Gage Roads or lying alongside any hulk or vessel in the harbour, unless twenty minutes clear is allowed for such meal.

13.—Raising Steam and Banking Fires.

(a) It is assumed that the time required for raising steam and warming up engines is one hour in a day, and that the time required for banking fires and shutting off steam is half an hour in a day, and any portion of such time as falls within overtime hours to be paid for accordingly; such work to be performed by one fireman and one greaser as heretofore; provided that, when having finished the day's work, steam is required for tows more than once in a night the fireman and greaser shall be allowed half an hour's overtime payment for raising steam and banking fires on the second of such occasions.

(b) When a fireman is required to attend to banking of fires on days when the tug is off duty, he shall be allowed one hour's overtime for each time he is required to attend at the tug for this work.

14.—Utensils and Bedding.

(a) The employers will provide for the use of the crew all necessary utensils, to be enamelware or of a similar nature thereto, but not of tin, free of cost to the crew, and also bedding consisting of a mattress, pillow, and two blankets, and a third blanket to be supplied on application; provided that, in the event of the failure of any member of the crew to return in good order any of such utensils or bedding as may have been issued to him, the employers may deduct any sum, being not more than 75 per cent. of the value of such utensils or bedding not returned, from any moneys due to such member of the crew on the termination of his employment.

The mattress supplied to be of flax or other fibre and not of straw or tow.

(b) All the necessary eating and messing utensils, including washing cloths and drying towels, shall be supplied by the employer.

(c) The blankets to be changed monthly.

15.—Victualling.

Crews to be victualled by the employers as at present.

16.—Accommodation.

(a) The living quarters, mess-room, and lavatories shall be washed and cleaned each day by any member of the crew ordered to do so within his hours of duty.

(b) The living rooms or quarters of the crew shall be thoroughly fumigated, cleaned and painted at least once in each twelve months. In the event of the quarters being fumigated, the crew shall be given, when practicable, one clear day's notice at least prior to starting fumigation.

(c) All bedding, clothing, etc., to be loosed up and fumigated while in the quarters. The crew shall not be called upon to occupy the living quarters in any ship until they can safely do so. Whenever the quarters are being fumigated the employer shall provide room to store or keep safely the clothes and other property of the crew on board whilst the quarters are being fumigated.

(d) One bath towel and soap shall be provided by the employer for use by each member of the crew each week, free of cost, so long as the member of the crew uses the towels reasonably and hands them back each week, and subject to the conditions set out in Clause 13 (a).

(e) A bathroom shall be provided for the use of the crew.

17.—Sickness and Accident.

(a) Subject as hereinafter provided, if any employee engaged by the employers party to this Agreement receives any hurt or injury, or contracts any sickness (not being venereal disease or an illness due to his own wilful act or default, or to his own misbehaviour), whilst in the service of the tug, or in the service of any employer, he shall be entitled to receive the wages prescribed in this Agreement from the date of his incapacity up to and including the date of his recovery: Provided that the time for which he shall be so entitled to his wages shall not exceed a period of two months from the date of his incapacity, and provided further that:—

(b) The illness, hurt, or injury which shall entitle a seaman to the benefits provided for in this clause shall—

1. be such as wholly to incapacitate him from the performance of his duty, and

2. so far as can be ascertained by an illness contracted on board of the tug or in the service of the tug or her owners, or a hurt or injury sustained in the service of the tug or her owners.

(c) Where the employer is otherwise liable to pay any compensation or damages to the employee in respect of any such hurt, injury, or sickness, he shall be entitled to deduct therefrom the amount of any wages paid under this clause, but where the amount of the wages paid under this clause is in excess of any compensation or damages otherwise payable, such wages only shall be paid.

18.—Stop-work Meeting.

(a) Except where a towage has to be undertaken which will not permit of postponement, or it is necessary for the safety of the ship for any or all of the crew to remain on board, the crew shall be allowed to attend a stop-work meeting of the Union on the last Tuesday in each month, between the hours of 8 a.m. and noon, without any deduction of wages on that account.

(b) No other stop-work meeting shall be held during working hours.

19.—No Discrimination.

The employer shall not discriminate without just cause against any members of the Union who bear good conduct records and who agree to and continue to work on the terms of the agreement, and as there are vacancies for, and that the local Manager of the Company will consider any representations made to him by the Secretary of the Union. The discrimination referred to is unjust discrimination in favour of persons not members of the Union, not discrimination between members of the Union.

20.—Disputes.

There shall be no stoppage of work in the towage trade for any cause or reason whatsoever. Should any dispute arise between any employee and the employers, the matter shall be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the Union, and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by

those representatives; failing their agreement the Registrar of the Industrial Arbitration Court of Western Australia or his deputy shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding to both parties.

21.—Casual Employees.

A casual employee is one for whom work for a period of twelve (12) consecutive working days is not provided by the employer and such employee shall be entitled to the following wages:—Fireman or greaser, 22s. 6d. per day; deck-hand, 20s. per day.

22.—Special Work.

When a tug proceeds to sea for any special purpose, the terms and conditions of the Federal Arbitration Court Award or Agreement between the Commonwealth Steamship Owners' Association and the Seamen's Union of Australasia, as the case may be, for the time being in force shall apply.

23.—Term.

This Agreement is to operate from the twenty-first day of January, 1929, and shall continue in force until 31st December, 1929.

SEAMEN (COAL HULKS).

(Registered 20/3/1929.)

No. 11 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-first day of January, 1929, between McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited; the Adelaide Steamship Company, Limited; and Johnson and Lynn, Limited, as Managing Agents for the Fremantle Coal Company, Limited, of the one part, and The Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle, of the other part; witnesseth as follows:—

Definitions.—In this Agreement "Union" means The Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle. "Employer" means McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited, and/or the Adelaide Steamship Company, Limited, and/or Johnson and Lynn, Limited, as Managing Agents for the Fremantle Coal Company, Limited.

Coal Hulk-keepers.

Area.

The following wages and conditions shall apply to members of the above Union whilst employed on coal hulks at Fremantle in the State of Western Australia.

1.—Wages.

The rate of pay shall be £5 5s. per week (Basic wage per week, £4 5s.; margin per week, £1).

2.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All employment shall be by the week. A week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate the employment, or the employer shall pay one week's wages in lieu of such notice, subject to the right of

the employer to dispense with the services of the employee for misconduct or negligence without notice at any time.

3.—Hours of Labour.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, as follows:—Mondays to Fridays (inclusive), 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Saturdays, 8 a.m. to noon.

(b) If an employee absents himself from duty without reasonable cause, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay, that is to say, one-sixth of the weekly pay for each day of absence and a proportionate part of one-sixth for a shorter absence.

(c) In no case shall any hulk-keeper be required to attend to more than one hulk at any time whilst receiving or discharging coal, nor shall a hulk-keeper be required to transfer from one coal hulk to another unless in case of emergency, or when no suitable qualified man is available.

4.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done outside the ordinary hours of labour mentioned in Clause 3 overtime shall be paid as follows:—From 5 p.m. to 8 a.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, 3s. 6d. per hour; Saturdays, noon to 12 midnight, 4s. 6d. per hour.

(b) For all work performed on Sundays and holidays as defined in Clause 5, employees shall be entitled to payment at the rate of 4s. 6d. per hour.

(c) Employees called out to work on Sundays and holidays shall be entitled to a minimum of three hours at overtime rate; provided that, where an employee is required on such days in the case of accident or sudden emergency to do work for the safety of the hulk, not being longer than two hours, payment shall be made as for actual time worked, and that where work commenced on the previous day extends beyond midnight only one minimum shall apply.

(d) Where employees having ceased duty at 5 p.m. on week days or noon on Saturdays are required to resume it thereafter on the same day, they shall be entitled to overtime payment subject to a minimum up to 8 p.m. of two (2) hours, and thereafter of three (3) hours; provided that:—

- (1) Where time of duty runs into the day's work, overtime payment shall be made only for the actual time worked prior to the commencement of ordinary hours, and
- (2) Employees knocked off for the tea meal and resuming immediately thereafter are to receive payment at overtime rates only for the actual time until knocked off.

(e) The overtime shall start to count as and from the time the man out of his ordinary working hours is ordered to attend and does attend until released, including any time he is waiting or standing by after the time he was ordered to attend and was not released.

5.—Sundays and Holidays.

On Sundays and on the following holidays employees shall, unless for overtime payment at the rates prescribed in Clause 4, Subclause (b), be free from duty:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; or such other days as are prescribed under the law of the State to be observed in lieu of the actual holiday mentioned; also Picnic Day (to be held conjointly with the Picnic Day observed by the waterside workers).

6.—Meal Hours.

(a) Breakfast—Where actually engaged in receiving or discharging coal prior thereto, the breakfast hour shall be sixty consecutive minutes between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 a.m.

Dinner—The dinner hour shall be sixty consecutive minutes between the hour of 12 noon and 1 p.m.

Tea—The tea hour shall be sixty consecutive minutes between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m.

Supper—When an employee is required to work overtime beyond midnight, the supper hour shall be sixty consecutive minutes between 11 p.m. and 1 a.m.

An employee may be called upon to curtail his meal hour or portion of it, subject to the following provisions: if the time curtailed exceeds half an hour, payment shall be made as for one hour, but where the time is half an hour or less, payment shall be made for half an hour at overtime rates.

(b) In cases where coaling operations have ceased for a meal hour and it is necessary for the coal hulk-keeper to attend to cleaning of fires, or attending winches or other necessary work to enable the work to be proceeded with immediately after a meal hour break, one half hour's overtime shall be paid.

7.—Raising Steam and Banking Fires.

(a) One hour shall be allowed for raising steam and half an hour for banking fires, any portion of such time as falls within overtime hours to be paid for at the prescribed overtime rates.

(b) In cases where steam is required from a cold boiler, orders as to when work is to be commenced shall be given to the hulk-keeper by the engineer or superintendent in charge.

(c) When an employee is required to attend to banking of fires on any Sunday or holiday, or during overtime hours, he shall be allowed one hour's overtime for each time he is required to attend at the coal hulks for the work.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) When an employee completes twelve (12) calendar months' service he shall be given leave of absence on full pay for fourteen (14) consecutive days; provided that, where a public holiday as specified in Clause 5 falls within the period of an employee's annual leave, an additional working day shall be added in lieu thereof.

(b) Provided that, if the employment be terminated after three months, and before twelve months' continuous service, for any reason not caused by any action or default of the employee (as provided in Clause 2), the employer shall pay the employee in lieu of leave of absence one full day's pay for each month he has served.

(c) Forty-eight (48) hours' notice of intention to give holidays to the employees shall be given whenever practicable.

9.—Sickness and Accident.

Accident.—The employee benefits as provided for by the Workers' Compensation Act (W.A.) and amendments thereto.

Sick Pay.—In the case of sickness necessitating absence from work an employee will be granted full pay up to the first following pay day, and thereafter half pay, on the production of a medical certificate on each occasion; such sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve days in the aggregate in each year.

10.—Stop-work Meetings.

Except when the coal hulk is engaged in coaling operations, or it is necessary for the safety of the vessel that the employees should remain on board, the employer shall allow the employees to attend a stop-work meeting of the Union on the last Tuesday in each month between the hours of 9 a.m. and noon, without any deduction of wages on that account.

11.—No Discrimination.

The employers shall not discriminate without just cause against any members of the Union who are qualified and bear good conduct records, and who agree to and continue to work on the terms of this Agreement, and as there are vacancies for, and the local representative of the Company will consider any representations made to him by the secretary of the Union. The discrimination referred to is unjust discrimination in favour of persons not members of the Union, not discrimination between members of the Union.

12.—Casual Employees.

A casual employee is one for whom work for a period of twelve consecutive working days, not including holidays, is not provided by the employer, and such employee shall be entitled to wages at the rate of 22s. 6d. per day.

13.—Night Watchman's Duties.

It is recognised that, in addition to keeping hulks clean and tidy, decks free from coal, etc., hulk-keepers are responsible for the safety of their hulks, boilers, machinery, stores, etc., and that particular care must be taken by them at all times to see that the hulk is safely and securely moored and lights lit in accordance with

the regulations. Attendance on his hulk in conformity with such duty, in special circumstances, such as heavy weather, outside of ordinary working hours will entitle a hulk-keeper to a lump sum payment of five shillings (5s.), but if required to stand by the hulk after midnight an additional five shillings (5s.) shall be paid: Provided that, if the hulk-keeper is required to maintain steam, the prescribed overtime payment shall apply whilst steam is required.

14.—Disputes.

There shall be no stoppage of work for any cause or reason whatsoever. Should any dispute arise between any employee and the employers, the matter shall be referred to a board consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the Union, and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agreement, the Registrar of the Industrial Arbitration Court of Western Australia or his deputy shall act as chairman. The decision of the board shall be final and binding on both parties.

15.—Term.

This Agreement is to operate from the twenty-first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and shall continue in force until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty.
