WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used and acquired for streets or ways within the Municipality of the City of Perth be declared public highways: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut. Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways, within the solutely dedicated to the public as highways, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

AGREEMENT made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this First day of April, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twentynine, between—

THE WYNDHAM FREEZING, CANNING, AND MEAT EXPORT WORKS (hereinafter known as "the Employer"), of the one part,

and the following Unions, jointly and severally, hereinafter known as "the Unions," of the other part, namely—

THE WEST AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE AUSTRALASIAN MEAT INDUSTRY EMPLOYEES' UNION INDUSTRIAL UNION OF WORKERS, PERTH,

THE COASTAL DISTRICT COMMITTEE AMAL-GAMATED ENGINEERING UNION OF WORKERS.

THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED ENGINE DEIVERS AND FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRAL-ASIA.

THE W.A. BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED COOPERS OF AUSTRALIA, and

THE AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION.

## WHEREBY IT IS AGREED-

1. This Agreement shall apply in respect of the rates of wages and conditions of labour in connection with the tasks hereinafter mentioned at the Wyndham Meatworks.

## GENERAL CONDITIONS.

2. Clauses under this heading are to be operative only where not otherwise provided under the headings of Sections I. to VII.

## DEFINITIONS.

- 3. In this Agreement, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the meanings, respectively, set out against them, that is to say:—
  - (a) WEEK DAYS.—Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays.
  - (b) A WEEK shall mean Monday to Saturday inclusive.
  - (c) SHIFT WORK shall mean work done in time preceding, during, and following ordinary working hours by separate relays of employees.
  - (d) "MUTUALLY AGREED" or "MUTUAL ARRANGEMENT" implies agreed between the Management of the Meatworks and the Union Executive at Wyndham or Perth in writing.

## PREFERENCE.

4. Subject to Clause 5, preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to Members

- of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, provided they are competent and qualitied workmen and do their work to the satisfaction of the Management. The Employer may require a Medical Certificate of fitness in respect of any applicant for employment. The cost of obtaining such certificate to be borne by the Employer.
- 5. With respect to the employment of Watch-keeping Engineers, the Employer reserves the right to employ Members of any Union or Organisation who are qualified to perform the duties of Watch-keeping Engineers.
- 6. Subject to preference to Members of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, the Employer shall have the right—
  - (a) To select employees with due regard to their qualifications for their respective tasks;
  - (b) To allot to employees their respective tasks;
  - (c) In the case of an employee not fulfilling his task satisfactorily, to allot another task at the rate specified for such allotted task;
  - (d) To transfer employees from one department or task to another whenever reasonably necessary to do so. In case of alleged unreasonableness the Board of Control can discuss with the Management;
  - (e) To dispense with the services of any employee for incompetence, drunkenness, or unsatisfactory work.

7. Subject to Clause 6 (c) and (e), a guarantee of 16 weeks' work from date of commencement of operations is given to each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1929 season. The rates applicable under this guarantee shall be the rates for the respective tasks for which employees shall have been engaged. The date of commencement of operations shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.

#### PAID HOLIDAYS.

8. Labour Day, Good Friday, Wyndham Cup Pay, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day.

## PAID HOLIDAY RATES.

- 9. (a) When an employee does no work on a paid holiday he shall be entitled to wages at ordinary rate for a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be. The rate in such case will be similar to that paid on the day prior to the holiday.
- (b) When an employee is required to work on a paid holiday, other than Labour Day dealt with in subclause (e), he shall be entitled to wages at double ordinary rate, with a minimum of a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be.
- (c) When an employee is required to work on Labour Day he shall be entitled to double rates in addition to the payment specified in subclause (a) of Clause 9.

## CLOSE HOLIDAYS.

10. Christmas Day and Sundays.

## ORDINARY HOLIDAYS.

11. Anzac Day, Easter Monday, and King's Birthday.

### HOLIDAY RATES.

- 12. For time or tally worked on holidays the rates shall be-
  - (a) On ordinary holidays, rate and a half;
- (b) On close holidays, double rate; with a minimum of two hours.

## WAITING TIME ALLOWANCES.

- 13. When (after expiry of the 16 weeks' guarantee), owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for any employee who has been brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1929 season, such employee shall be paid a waiting time allowance for each ordinary working day (excluding Sundays and holidays) as follows:—
  - (a) Day wage employees— Ordinary working hours for the day at half their respective task rates.
  - (b) Contract slaughtermen—Half the minimum payment prescribed in Clause 50 (b).
  - (c) Slaughter-house assistants—
     Half the minimum rates prescribed in Clause
     59.

When an employee who is receiving Waiting Time Allowance is required to work "Outside of ordinary working hours" (Clause 21), he shall be paid (in addition to waiting time allowance) the overtime rates applicable to the work done.

#### CHANGE OF TASK.

14. When, owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for an employee at his usual task, such employee shall, if so required by the Management, do any other work available and be paid the rate pertaining to his recognised task.

#### TRAVELLING.

- 15. Each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1929 season shall be entitled to—
  - (a) Passage from Fremantle to Wyndham and travelling time allowance.
  - (b) Passage (and travelling time allowance) by first available steamer from Wyndham to Fremantle after termination of work in his department, or when his services are not further required by the Management; provided that his duties have been performed to the satisfaction of the Management.
  - (c) When such employee shall, at the request of the Management, remain in employment until the end of the succeeding season, he shall be entitled to receive payment in lieu of passage and estimated travelling time to Fremantle. This will not deprive such employee of his right to passage and travelling time (as above provided) at the end of such succeeding season.
  - (d) When an employee shall have been requested by the Management to remain in employment (Clause 15 (c)), and the Management afterwards notifies that the employee's services will not be required for the succeeding season, the allowance to the employee, Clause 15 (c), shall be calculated in the proportion that the length of time he is retained bears to a period of twelve months, dating from 30th November of the current season.

16. Travelling time allowance referred to in Clause 15 shall be at the rate of Fifteen shillings (15s.) per day, and shall accrue from day of embarkation to day of landing, both inclusive.

#### HOURS OF LABOUR.

- 17. Unless otherwise specifically mentioned herein, 44 hours shall constitute a week's work—divided into six working days as follows:—Five week days each eight hours, 40 hours; Saturday four hours, total 44 hours. A day's work shall therefore consist of eight hours on week days and four hours on Saturdays.
- 18. Daily rates of wages specified herein relate to a working day of eight hours.
- 19. Unless otherwise mutually agreed, ordinary starting time shall be 7.30 a.m. and ordinary ceasing time shall be 4.30 p.m. on week days and 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.
- 20. Ordinary working hours shall comprise the hours between the ordinary starting time on any day and the ordinary ceasing time, exclusive of meal times and smokos.
- 21. "Outside of ordinary working hours" on any day means between midnight the previous day and starting time, and/or between ordinary ceasing time and midnight; also meal hours and smokos.

## MEAL TIMES.

22. Unless otherwise mutually arranged, meal times shall be-

From 6.30 a.m. to 7.30 a.m. 11.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. 4.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. 11.30 p.m. to 12.30 a.m.

## SMOKOS.

- 23. Smokos of fifteen minutes each shall be paid for as working time, and shall be allowed (at times to be mutually arranged) as follows:—
  - (a) One smoke each forenoon worked, one smoke each afternoon worked, and one smoke after every two hours' continuous work done outside of ordinary working hours. This clause shall not apply to Engine Room and Boiler Room shift workers.
  - (b) When employees are engaged on 12-hour shifts loading out frozen meat, three smokos each of 20 minutes will be allowed and paid for as working time for each 12-hour shift worked at the following times:—

Ordinary time-

9.30 a.m. to 9.50 a.m. 2.0 p.m. to 2.20 p.m.

Overtime-

7.30 p.m. to 7.50 p.m. 9.45 p.m. to 10.5 p.m. 2.15 a.m. to 2.35 a.m.

4.45 a.m. to. 5.5 a.m.

24. When reasonably required by the Management, owing to exigencies of the work, employees shall forego their smoko until a more convenient time.

#### CRIBS.

25. (a) Employees engaged on loading and discharging steamers will be supplied with cribs as follows:—One crib at second smoko after commencing work after tea; one crib at second smoko after commencing work at 12.30 a.m.

(b) Shift workers engaged on 4 p.m. to midnight and midnight to 8 a.m. shifts will be supplied with one crib during their shift.

#### MINIMUM OF OVERTIME.

- 26. Subject to any mutual arrangement, employees called back to work, after a meal time, following ordinary ceasing time, shall be provided with the following minimum periods of work, or shall be entitled to payment for such:—
  - (a) On week days and Saturdays—two hours.
  - (b) On Sundays—four hours.

#### GENERAL.

- 27. The Management shall give the delegate reasonable notice of workers required to work overtime. The delegate shall then be responsible on behalf of the Union for supplying such workers. The Management shall give due regard to distribution of overtime.
- 28. When an employee works at more than one task on any one day he shall be paid for that day at the highest rated of such tasks.
- 29. Day wage employees shall be paid in the employers time and contract and tallymen within reasonable time after ceasing work.
- 30. The employment and rates of pay of boys shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.
- 31. Wages shall be paid fortnightly in eash, or any employee may have his wages lodged to his credit with the State Savings Bank if he so desires.
- 32. Employees shall be provided without charge with accommodation in the quarters erected for that purpose, including stretcher, mattress, and pillow.
- 33. Each employee engaged under this Agreement who boards at the Works canteen agrees to have the amount of 25s. per week deducted from his wages fortnightly.
- 34. When employees under this Agreement are temporarily required to work away from the Works (outside of a two-mile radius) they shall be paid a victualling allowance of 6s. per day, provided it be found inconvenient to send a cook out with such employees.
- 35. All delegates shall be officially recognised by the Management.

## DISPUTES.

- 36. Should any dispute arise as to the construction or meaning of this Agreement, or touching anything arising out of its operation, the work is nevertheless to be carried on without any interruption, and the matter in dispute shall be submitted to a conference between the Management and representatives of the Union concerned, such conference to be held at the Meatworks as soon as can be arranged.
- 37. Should no settlement be arrived at by above conference, the matter in dispute shall then be discussed between the Management and the local Board of Control of the Unions.
- 38. In the event of a settlement not being arrived at by discussion (referred to in Clause 37), the matter in dispute shall be submitted to the arbitration of an umpire to be chosen by one representative appointed for that purpose by the Employer and one representative appointed for that purpose by the Unions who are parties to this Agreement; and the

- decision of such umpire shall be final and conclusive. The umpire may determine by whom the costs of the arbitration shall be paid and may fix such costs.
- 39. Every reasonable facility will be afforded by both parties to enable arbitration to be completed within 12 hours of the beginning of any dispute in connection with Waterside work.
- 40. The rates of pay herein mentioned are based on a Basic Wage of £4 5s. per week for males.

## SECTION I.

# SECTIONAL CONDITIONS (pertaining to this Section).

- 41. Being responsible for the quality and condition of products, foremen may attend personally to such of the operations as they may consider necessary to ensure satisfactory results. Such operations include the making-up and attention to cold and hot pickles; the pumping and filterpressing of soups, and the finishing off of extracts, the setting and supervision of tinshop dies; the refining and weighing of tallow and edible fats and other processes of a like nature.
- 42. All freezing chamber employees working outside chambers shall be allowed 15 minutes for cooling down before entering freezing rooms.

## SHIFT WORK.

- 43. Shift of eight hours may be worked in departments where operations are continuous or where they require attention for more than twelve hours in the twenty-four.
- 44. Shift workers shall be entitled to the prescribed overtime rates for work done during Sundays, holidays, meal times or smokos. For other time worked outside of ordinary hours shift workers shall only be entitled to rate and a half for any time worked in excess of eight hours per shift.

### OVERTIME.

- 45. Subject to any special provision herein, over-time rates shall be paid—
  - (a) Outside of ordinary working hours—rate and a-half.
  - (b) Meal times and smokos—double rates.
  - (c) Sundays:

Midnight Saturday to 6 p.m.—double rates. 6 p.m. to midnight—treble rates.

46. Provided that ordinary rates and conditions shall apply during ordinary working hours, and rate and a-half for one hour before ordinary starting time or for one hour after ordinary ceasing time, to men doing preparatory or finishing work on preserving, cook room, cellarman handling meats for canning purposes, in any place set aside for curing purposes, open-air boners, retort and traymen, and chillroom men, as is now customary.

## BEEF SLAUGHTERING.

- 47. Freezers, power-sawn, rate per hd. 3s. 1.16d.

  Dead Cattle .. ,, 8s. 11.85d.

  Slinks .. .. .. 10.48d.
- 48. Work to be performed by slaughtermen in dressing of freezing cattle shall be:—Knocking down, sticking, footing-off, grounding, backing-off, taking out offal, sawing down, dropping hides, finishing off, and wiping up.

- 49. The slaughtering gang shall, if so required by the Management, slaughter up to—
  - 45 cattle per slaughterman per day on week days, and
  - 20 cattle per slaughterman per day on Saturdays.

#### MINIMUM PAY TO SLAUGHTERING GANG.

- 50. On days on which killing is done, the employers shall provide the numbers of cattle indicated hereunder, namely—
  - (a) During the period of 16 weeks' guarantee—
     40 cattle per slaughterman on week days;
     20 cattle per slaughterman on Saturdays;
- (b) After expiry of sixteen weeks' guarantee—30 cattle per slaughterman on week days; 17 cattle per slaughterman on Saturdays; or shall pay the slaughtering gang as for such numbers.
- 51. Three calves shall be reckoned as two cattle. Actual works grading shall determine the definition of "calf."

## BEEF SLAUGHTER HOUSE ASSISTANTS.

- 53. Subject to the provisions of Clauses 57 to 59, as to the minimum wages per day, and subject also to Clauses 45 and 12 as to the overtime and holiday rates, beef slaughter house assistants shall be paid on tally rates based upon the numbers of cattle treated per slaughterman (i.e., grounders and backers of the contract gang).
- 54. The tally rates specified hereunder are at per head of cattle treated per contract slaughterman, and relate to work done in ordinary working hours excepting holidays.

## TALLY RATES.

55. (a) Tally rates in respect of all cattle treated up to and including—

Thirty cattle per slaughterman on a week day and/ or seventeen cattle per slaughterman on a Saturday—

# MINIMUM DAILY WAGES FOR SLAUGHTER HOUSE ASSISTANTS.

- 57. When for any day on which killing is done (and on which the full number of eattle is not available) the wages earned by a beef slaughter house assistant at the tally rates specified in Clause 55 shall be less than the minimum daily wage specified in the following tables, the respective minimum rates shall apply to that day's work. These minimum rates shall be proportionally increased for work done outside of ordinary working hours or on holidays, as per Clauses 45 and 12.

(pertaining to this Section).

101. Unless otherwise mutually arranged:—

Excluding the lunch and midnight meal-times in respect of twelve-hour shifts.

102. An employee required to work meal hour shall receive two shillings and sixpence additional to the rate then current. Such additional rate shall continue until a meal time or cessation of work occurs.

#### SMOKOS.

103. For each twelve hour shift worked, three smokos of 20 minutes each shall be allowed and paid for as working time. Unless otherwise mutually arranged, the times for these shall be:—

9.45 a.m. to 10.5 a.m. 2.15 p.m. to 2.35 p.m. 7.45 p.m. to 8.5 p.m. 10.0 p.m. to 10.20 p.m. 2.30 a.m. to 2.50 a.m. 5.0 a.m. to 5.20 a.m.

104. When reasonably required by the Management, employees shall forego their smoke until a more convenient time.

105. When reasonably required by the Management that a smoko shall be cancelled, employees shall receive in lieu thereof payment for thirty minutes at the rate then current.

106. When so required by the Management work shall be carried on continuously by twelve hour shifts commencing at noon and midnight.

107. The Management shall give employees one hour's notice of the time at which they will be required to "stand by" on the arrival of a vessel. Working time shall begin from the time the men are notified to "stand by."

117. Forty-four hours (44) shall constitute an ordinary week's work, divided into six (6) ordinary working days of seven (7) hours and twenty (20) minutes each.

119. Forty-four (44) hours to constitute a week's work for Bakers, divided into six (6) ordinary working days of seven (7) hours and twenty (20) minutes each. Should a Baker be called upon to work on Sundays he shall be paid double rates for such time

Meckering District Road and Vermin Board-By-laws for the Control and Management of the Cunderdin Agricultural Hall.

P.W. 586/23.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make Bylaws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas the Meckering District Road and Vermin Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws, subject to
- the context--"Board" shall mean the Meckering District Road and Vermin Board.
- "Secretary" means the secretary for the time being of the Meckering District Road and Vermin Board.
  "Hall" means the Cunderdin Agricultural Hall.
- "Caretaker" means the caretaker of the Hall duly

appointed by the Board.

- 2. Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the secretary not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall, room, or furniture is required, and shall state the time and the purpose for which the hall, room, or furniture is required.
- 3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any room or furniture shall be given in the application for
- the hire of the hall, room, or furniture.

  4. The application for the hire of any furniture or crockery-ware shall state the precise locality to which the said furniture is to be removed; and the Board, when granting the use of any furniture or crockeryware, may fix the date and hour when such furniture or crockery-ware shall be returned to the hall.

When any furniture or crockery-ware has not been returned to the hall at the stated date and hour, then the Board may forthwith have the furniture and/or crockeryware returned at the hirer's expense.

- 5. The rent of the hall or any room or furniture or crockery-ware shall be paid with each application, and shall be as set out in Schedule "A" hereto annexed.
- 6. The Board at any time may demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of engagement.
- 7. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room or furniture shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon, and shall leave the hall or any room clean and fit for other occupation, and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.
- 8. The Board reserves the right to refuse to hire the hall or any room or furniture to any applicant for the hire of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.
- 9. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of the hall or any room or furniture.
- In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the hall or room or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be granted.
- 11. The hirer of the hall or any room shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and use of hall or any room. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions. have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the aforementioned Acts, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of an engagement forbid and prevent the use of the hall or any room.
- 12. In the event of the use of the hall or any room being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the hall or any room, as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.
- 13. No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into, or consumed in the hall or any room, except when permitted by the Board in writing.
- 14. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in the hall or any room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or in any room, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at any banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.
- 15. No person shall in any part of the hall or any room-
  - (a) use profane or improper language;(b) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;

  - be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
  - (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or any part of the hall or any room. Any person who does, permits, or suffers such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws;
  - (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the hirer, the secretary, the caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or Police Constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.
- 16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in the hall or any room.
- 17. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in the hall or any room.
- 18. Skating will not be permitted under any consideration.
- 19. Children under ten years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the hall or any room.
- 20. The hirer of the hall or any room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockery-ware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockery-ware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

21. The secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or Police Constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any room at all times during the term of engagement, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these By-laws.

22. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding

£20 for every such conviction.
