Declaration of Main Road.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse TO WIT. McMillan, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Gover-nor and Administrator in and over Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator. its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Licut. Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

The Schedule.

Donnybrook-Boyup Brook-Kojonup Road (Upper Blackwood Road District).

That portion of Road No. 3683 commencing at the North-Eastern corner of Nelson Location 300; thence Southwards along part of its Eastern boundary; thence South-Westerly and South-Easterly, crossing the Boyup Brook, and through said Location 300 to its South-Eastern corner; thence along a public road following the Northern side of the Donnybrook-Preston Valley Railway Reserve to the Western corner of Location 7472; thence following the North, North-Easterly, and Easterly boundary of said Location 7472 to its South-Eastern corner; thence Southwards, crossing the aforesaid Railway Reserve to its Southwards, clossing one allesand Easterly, crossing through Location 50 to the North-Western corner of Location 7364; thence along Road No. 4342 in a general South-Easterly direction along

the North-Eastern boundaries of said Location 7364 and Location 5252 to the Western boundary of Location 304 as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 603.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Vermin Act, 1918," that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and it is further provided by such Act that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any. portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is desirable to declare Kangaroos to be vermin within the portions of the State hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation add "Kangaroos" to the Third Schedute of the said Act: Provided, however, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the Mount Magnet Vermin District.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

Morawa Road Board.

General By-laws.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make Bylaws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Morawa Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following Bylaws:~

Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is to say:

- "The Act"-"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter
- come into force. "Board"—The Morawa Road Board. "Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or build-
- "Board Koom'' shall be the onice, han, of buard ing of the Board.
 "District"—The district under the jurisdiction of the Morawa Road Board.
 "Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be :--

- (a) To attend all Board meetings;
- To attend all Committee meetings; (h)
- (c) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees;
- (d) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes; (e) Answer all questions on the Board's business;
- (f) See that the accounts are audited once a year and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette and any other duties specified under "The Road Dis-
- (g) Prepare and place before the Board the quarterly financial statement at the end of each quarter of the financial year, and enter the same on the minutes as required by the Act;
- (h) Supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's electoral lists; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribu-tion of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the Supervisor, in accordance with the Board's resolution;
- (i) Summon the members to Board and Committee meetings;
- (j) Keep all books entered up to date, in accordance
- (y) Reep an books entered up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;
 (k) Check all accounts sent into the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board a check and the the sector of the Board and the Boar Collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and at-tend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; (1) Report to the Board at its next meeting any offi-
- cer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto;
- (m) To pay into the bank, after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board, when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or over, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, which are paid into Treasury book;
- (n) No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, as directed by the Board, and the Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms;

- (o) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all
- (p) See that all bonds and other finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;
 (p) See that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time and warre to and the security and the security required of servants are prepared. taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;
- (q) Report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties al-
- lotted to him; (r) Exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board.

Duties of Supervisor.

- 3. The duties of the Supervisor shall be:-
- (a) The Supervisor shall have the control of works, plant, and all property of the Board, and shall issue instructions to the employees, and shall see that same are faithfully carried out. Should any employee be guilty of insubordination or disobedience, or be found incapable of per-forming the duties allotted to him, the Supervisor shall report the matter to the Chairman, who shall inquire into the matter and, if necessary, shall suspend the employee and report the
- matter to the next meeting of the Board; (b) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements, as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called; (c) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing
- all public roads and footways is properly car-ried out;
- (d) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober;
- (e) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency;
- (f) To see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any
- departure therefrom; (g) To attend all Board and Committee meetings, if required;
- (h) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least once each six months, or as required by the Board;
- (i) To supply monthly, or as required, to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Duties of Collector.

(a) The Collector shall collect moneys that may be due to the Board, issuing receipts for payment, and entering particulars of all payments in the book for that purpose;

(b) He shall pay all such moneys as are collected from day to day to the Secretary of the Board, who shall check all such entries on receiving the moneys answering thereto, and shall initial such entries.

Appointment of Officers.

5. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by reso-lution passed by the Board. In the event of there being more than one applicant for such appointment, the elec-tion thereto shall be conducted by ballot so as to obtain an absolute majority of the members present.

6. The election of all other officers shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded, in which case the procedure in the foregoing By-law shall he followed.

7. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the election, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least five of the members are present.

8. All complaints against servants of the Board must 8. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receiv-able may be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaint, shall have power to investi-gate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

9. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meetings, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days.

10. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds-"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered neces-sary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members on his own behalt, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was called and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called; provided that any matter or emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the con-sent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Road Dis-Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first dealt with. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence or, after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members of the Board, as the case may be, shall preside.

11. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Morawa, on the 2nd Wednesday in the month, unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board, of which each member has received due notice of the proposed alteration.

12. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman, or the member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

13. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

14. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), or within 30 minutes after time for which meeting is called, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

15. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view of their confirmation. 15.

Voting.

16. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of vote, and such charman shall, in case of ordinary vote, and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

17. The minute-book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

- 18. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:
 - (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last or-dinary, also special meetings (if any).
 (b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
 - (c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.
 - (d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or sub-ject within the jurisdiction or official cognis-ance of the Board by a minute signed by him-self, and such minute shall when introduced take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the Chair as a notion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.
 - (e) Reports of sub-committees.
 - (f) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereby.
 - (g) Reading of correspondence (received) and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
 - (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (i) Passing of accounts for payment.
- Motions of which previous notice has been given. (j) (k) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19).
 (l) General business.

(m) Notice of motions. 19. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the sus-pension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence to all others.

20. Any member wishing to rescind any motion shall act in direct compliance with Section 135 of the Road Districts Act, by giving seven days' notice to each mem-ber or submitting to the Secretary of the Board notice of his intention in time to enable him to give the necessary notice prescribed by the Act to each member.

Petitions.

21. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member preis name at the beginning thereof with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language dis-respectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

22. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Com-mittee appointed for the purpose.

Orders of Debate .- Speakers must not digress.

23. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Unopposed Notices of Motion.

24. The Chairman may call over the notices of appear thereon; and if objection is not taken to a motion being taken as a formal motion, may call upon the mover to move the same, and upon the motion being seconded may then, without discussion, put the motion to the vote.

Consideration of Reports.

25. (a) If in a report of a committee distinct re-

commendations are made the decision of the Board may be taken separately on each recommendation. (b) Any report of a committee or any portion there-of may be amended by the Board in any manner if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(c) The recommendations of any committee when adopted by the Board shall be resolutions of the Board,

Precedence of Chairman.

26. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member present shall preserve strict silence so that the Chairman shall be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

Notice of Motion; Absence of Mover.

27. In the absence of a member who had placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

28. Except as elsewhere provided no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be seconded.

29. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be withdrawn without consent.

When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be moved.

31. When a motion has been proposed and seconded any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated un-less or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

32. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing if the Chairman so directs.

Further Amendment may be moved on Amended Question.

33. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How subsequent Amendments may be moved.

34. If an amendment, whether upon an original quesbeen negatived, then a further amendment moved as foresaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first mentioned amendment was moved and so on, provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

35. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has clapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment-When entitled to priority.

36. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Questions to be given.

37. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply thereto to permit of consideration of such reply and if necessary reference to other persons or documents.

Questions to be put without argument.

38. Every such question shall be put categorically and without any argument.

Replies and objections and subsequent Motions received.

39. No discussion shall be permitted respecting any reply or refusal to reply to any question.

Mode of addressing Board, etc.

Members shall, on all occasions when at a meet-40.ing, address and speak to each other by their official designations, as Chairman or Secretary, as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from so doing by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in Order.

41. No member shall be interrupted if in Order. 42. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order as here-inafter provided or in pursuance of By-law. 42. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amend-ment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment; then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion in the reverse order in which they were moved

they were moved. 43. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put

by the Chairman. 44. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chair-man shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

45. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Limitation as to number of Speeches.

46. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member other than the mover of an original motion shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question or for longer than ten minutes at any in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

All Members to Vote.

47. Upon a vote being taken all members present within the Board room, unless disqualified from voting, shall, and the Chairman unless so disqualified may, upon the question being put, record their respective votes in the affirmative or negative as each shall deem desirable, but if a member other than the Chairman neglects or refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative

Determination of Questions.

48. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus:--Upon a question being put, those in favour shall say "Aye" and those against "No"; and the Chairman shall declare whether the "Ayes" or "Noes" have determined the question; or if the Chairman prefer, he may call for a show of hands for and against the question. The decision of the Chair-man shall be final and conclusive unless such decision he immediately challenged and two members rise and be immediately challenged and two members rise and demand a division.

(b) Where there is only one dissentient, he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

49. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the present when a division is called for who does not in the manner above indicated vote on such motion, not being disabled by law from so voting, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Chairman may repeat Questions.

50. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare the same.

Acts of Disorder.

51. Any member who, at any meeting of the Board or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amend-

ment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or com-mittee upon any subject which the Board or committee have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be held disorderly, or makes use ofany expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

52. (a) The Chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall state the rule or pre-cedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with, then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to Order more than once.

53. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisious of By-law or for any breach of decorum, shall upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room: Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

54. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room on being required so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his removal until the termination of the sitting, and such member shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Disorder.

55. If disorder arise at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the chair. The Board on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business shall be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

56. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility what-ever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

All accounts, bills and vouchers shall be sub-57.mitted to the ordinary meeting, and after being certi-fied as correct shall be paid by cheque.

58. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the ex-ception of money granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys be-longing to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or to any other responsible officer if directed by the Board.

Urgent Works.

59. The Chairman with one member, or, in the absence of the Chairman with one member, or, in the ab-sence of the Chairman, any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

60. Any one member is empowered in cases of very urgent necessity to authorise the expenditure upon declared roads, of a sum not exceeding Two pounds ten shillings. In both these cases such actions should be confirmed at the next meeting.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

61. Every item of expenditure and every liability otherwise than under the authority of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

62. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board

Prevention of Nuisances.

- 63. Any person who-
- (a) Shall keep, or cause to be kept, any abattoir, slaughterhouse, pigsty, manure works, works for boiling meat, bones, blood or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fellmongery, tannery, wool-scouring establishment, glue factory, soap or candle works, fish-curing establishment, place for storing, drying, or preserving bones, bides, hoofs or skins, dairy or other
- (b) shall keep or cause to be kept any house, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cowshed, earth or other closet or cesspool; or
- (c) shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or occupied by him, so as to be likely to become a nuisance or injurious to public health,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Abatement of Nuisances.

64. If any person shall permit or suffer any of the nuisances contained in the foregoing By-law to continue after notice from the Board requiring such person to remedy or abate the same, he shall be liable to a penalty of Five shillings for every day during which such nuisance shall remain unremedied or unabated to the satisfaction of the Board. Such penalty shall not exceed in the aggregate £20.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

65. Any person guilty of the following offences shall on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding £10:-

- (a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other pro-perty under the control of the Board.
- (b) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, or lamp-post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (c) Blasting any road or stone or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard
- and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
 (d) Placing, stacking, or storing within the limits of any township in the open air, any cases, paper, shavings, crates packed with straw or dangerous or inflammable substances so as to be or likely to become a source of danger through fire.

Preservation of Trees.

66. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away or remove from its place any tree or shrub or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves or who shall carelessly, wilfully or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away or remove out of its place or ride or drive against any of the tree guards, fences, or other pro-tection to such trees, shrubs or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Prescribing removal of Verandahs.

67. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways or overhangobstructions on the footways or roadways or overhang-ing the same, shall be removed when ordered within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise, and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a neuralty not exceeding f10. penalty not exceeding £10.

Encroachments, etc., Removal of.

68. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within 14 days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane or public place under the control of the Board. In any case where, after service of notice for such removal any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same, at the cost and charges of the person so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall not be more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Lighting.

69. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or any person who shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction a sum not exceeding £5.

Water Supply.

70. Any person who shall injure or destroy any well, bore, pipe, tank or place of storage for water or any machinery, appliances or property used in connection therewith shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and also shall pay to the Board the sum of such damages.

71. Any person who shall waste or allow water to escape, foul, pollute, or taint any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

72. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank, reservoir, or other water within the district.

73. Any person or persons leaving open the lid of any well in the district shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.

74. Any person who shall remove any water from any well, bore, tank, or other place of storage under the control of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for *bona fide* camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and payment thereon of such reasonable fee as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty uot exceeding £5.

Sand and Timber.

75. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands under the control of the Board without a license shall forfeit and pay on conviction a sum not exceeding \$5.

Barbed Wire.

76. Barbed wire shall not be allowed on the outer or road side of any fence along any road. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Fencing.

77. The owner of any land abutting on any road in any townsite shall fence all such boundaries so abutting with such description of fence as may be directed by the Board, and shall maintain every such boundary fence erected or to be erected in good order. In the event of such fence not being creeted or repaired after due notice has been given so to do the Board may fence or repair such fence and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or owners of the land.

Schedule.

Picket fence on the boundaries of streets or road, consisting of 6in. straight jam posts or sawn timber $5 \ge 4$ at least 18in. in the ground and 4ft. out of the ground, with rails of $4 \ge 2$ and pickets of $3 \ge 3$, and more than 3in. apart. R.O.W. and division fences to consist of the same type of posts with 3ft. netting 2in. mesh with 3 plain wires and 1 barb, placed as follows: 1 plain flush with the ground, 1 plain 3ft. from the ground, 1 plain 6in. higher and 1 barb on top. All posts to be 10ft. apart.

The Board will consider the erection of any other more substantial or ornamental fence.

Bathing.

78. No person shall bathe in any open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District, within the jurisdiction of the Board, without suitable bathing costume or clothing. Every person offending against this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Depasturing of Cattle, etc.

79. Any person who shall turn loose or suffer any kind of animals belonging to him or under his control to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in or upon any road, recreation ground or reserve shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

80. No animal shall be allowed to stray on any roads or places and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road within the district. Any animal suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

Goats.

81. (1) No person shall keep any goat within the boundaries of the Morawa townsite unless such goat shall have been registered and the registration fee of sixpence paid to the Secretary of the Board.

(2) Every registration shall be renewed in the month of July in each year.

(3) The Board may refuse to register any goat if, in the opinion of the Board suitable accommodation has not been provided for keeping such goat.

(4) No person shall allow or cause any goat to be depastured upon or tethered upon or to loiter or stray upon any roads, streets or reserves or any vacant land adjacent thereto.

(5) Any goat found wandering upon any street, road or reserve as above may be seized and impounded or destroyed.

(6) The penalty for breach of any of the preceding clauses shall be a sum not exceeding £5 for each breach, in addition to such sums as the Justices may direct as compensation for damages done by such goats.

Crossing Places.

82. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any road or public way requiring access thereto, with horse and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel or gutter having first had and obtained the consent of the Board to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good repair. Any person not complying with this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Damaging Roads.

83. Any person who-

- (a) Cuts or removes without the consent in writing of the Board timber, earth, stone or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain except over a properly constructed approach or culvert a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) Draws upon any road timber, stone or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attaching thereto or any portion of other attachment trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

To protect Bridges from Fire.

84. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board) or shall place any rushes, bushes, or other inflammable substances under, near, or against

any bridge in the district for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Prevention of Trees falling across Roads,

85. No person shall make or leave a fire uear any road or track or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

86. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

All park lands and recreation grounds shall be 87. 87. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes except-ing as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fources buildings and trees or other improvements all fences, buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds and reserves and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

88. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation grounds without the writ-ten permission of the Board.

89. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

90. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recrea-tion grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday.

91. No person shall offer for sale on any reserve, any provisions, refreshments or other goods of any kind, nor carry on any games or boxing or other similar shows nor use any firearms except with the express sanction of the Board and payment of such fee as may be demanded.

92. The Board or any person duly authorised may make charges for admission to any person (a) autorised may make charges for admission to any reserve or defined portion thereof, but such charges shall not exceed 2s. for adults, 1s. for children under 15 years, with free ontry for children (accompanied) under five years, and for horses and vehicles 1s. each.

93. Such person to whom the use of any reserve is given for picnic, sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and a deposit not exceeding £5 shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish. On the removal of such rubbish to the satisfaction of the Board, the deposit shall be returned.

94. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every offence.

Penalties.

95. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them, is required to do or perform any act and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

96. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

97. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district except so much as may be paid to any informer.

Tents, etc.

98. (1) No tent or other structure of calico, canvas or wood or other inflammable material shall be creeted or be allowed to remain by any person or persons within the limits of the Board's area without obtaining the consent thereto of the Board for such times and upon such terms as the Board may decide; and any per-son offending against this By-law shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

(2) All persons having obtained permission to erect tents or other structures as aforesaid on the reserves set apart by the Board must conform to the following conditions :-

- (a) Pay a sum of 3s. 6d. per month in advance, as a license fee and rates for sanitary service.
 (b) To erect in such a position as the officer of the
- (b) To creat in such a position as the onject of the Board may direct.
 (c) Generally to conform to the regulations of the Board respecting sanitary matters, as may from time to time be made by the Board in respect of such reserve.

Provided that the Board retains to itself the right to cancel any such license granted, and to require the owner of such tent or structure erected on such reserves to renove the same, and the same must be removed within 48 hours after receipt of notice to remove, and in de-fault of such removal the Board shall have power to remove the same and charge the expense thereof to the owner.

99. No person shall keep within the Board's area any kind of living swine without license, in writing of any kind of living swine without license, in writing of the Board, but in no case shall such swine be kept with-in 100 feet of any inhabited dwelling house, public street, roadway or river, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to public health; but the Board shall not be compelled to grant such license, and if granted, such license can be revoked at any time by the Board, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

Slaughter-houses.

100. (1) No slaughter-house shall be erected or used within the boundaries of the Board without the previous license in writing of the Board and on payment by the occupier of an annual fee of ± 2 , but such license can be revoked at any time by the Board, and every person who slaughters, cleans, scrapes, skins, dresses, or prepares for market any animal except at a licensed slaughter-house shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law.

(2) Every occupier of a licensed slaughter-house shall keep the same in a clean and proper state and shall re-move all filth and refuse at least once in every 24 hours, and shall provide the same with a sufficient supply of water to cleanse the same.

(3) Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence or for every day during the continuance of such offence, on conviction forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

By-laws for the Management and the Use of the Morawa Road Board Hall.

101. Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of Morawa Road Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such hall, room or furniture is required.

102. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any hall, room or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of any hall, room or furniture. 103. The rent of the hall, room or furniture (including the use of the crockeryware) shall be paid with each application, and shall be as follows:—

Church or hospital charities, 50 per cent. reduction on the above charges at the discretion of the Board, but written application must be made for such reduction. The above charges include the use of electric light and the use of such crockery as the Board possesses. Skat-

ing will not be permitted under any consideration. 104. The hours for which any hall, room or furniture shall be hired shall be:—Day—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. Night—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, after which 10s. shall be paid in addition to ordinary payment.

105. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

106. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any hall, room or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

107. The Board may at any time cancel an agreement made for the hiring of any hall, room or furniture.

108. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall, room or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such hall, room or furniture shall be granted.

109. The hirer of any hall, room or furniture shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, the Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and using of any hall or room. If, in the opinion of the Board, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such hall or room.

110. In the event of the use of the hall or room being stopped under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer by reason of such stoppage.

111. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, sherry or any other intoxicating liquor shall be brought into or consumed in any hall or room except when expressly permitted by the Board.

112. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall or room during any ball or public entertainment or at any gathering of persons in the said hall except in the gent's social room, whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

(a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;

(b) use profane or improper language;

(c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;

- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws;
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatever in the passage-way or any part of the building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board or police constable whether in uniform or otherwise.

114. No offensive personalities or representations of living persons nor anything calculated to produce riot or a breach of the peace shall be permitted in any hall or any part thereof or in any room.

115. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in any hall or room.

116. The Secretary of the Board or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if known as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any part thereof at all times during the term of engagement and shall be given every facility for seeing that these By-laws are duly carried out.

117. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good and decent behaviour in such hall or room and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws, and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockeryware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockeryware not accounted for or in a craeked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

118. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

119. Children under 10 years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the building or any part thereof.

To Clear Town Lots.

120. All owners or occupiers of Town lots shall when requested by the Board in writing, clear such land of trees, scrub, and undergrowth.

Narembeen Water Area-By-laws.

DIVISION I.

Interpretations.

1. (a) In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms "Cesspool," "Drain," "Earth Closet," "House," "Land," "Owner," "Person," "Public House," "Piggery," and "Slaughter House" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911."

(b) The words "Authorised," "By-laws," "District," "Fittings," "Local Authority," "Minister," "Occupier," "Owner," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Ratepayer," "Rateable Land," "Road," "Reservoir," "Stream," "Water Area," "Waterworks," "Watercourse," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in "The Water Boards Act, 1904," hereinafter referred to as the principal Act, or any amending Act, and the By-laws made thereunder.

(c) "Reservoir" shall mean any reservoir, dam, tank, eistern, or well.

(d) "High Water Mark" shall mean the level of full supply of any reservoir or feeder thereto.

(e) "Feeder" shall mean any watercourse, creek, stream, or other channel with either permanent or intermittent flow whereby water can be conveyed to any reservoir.

(f) "Catchment Area" shall mean all land over, through, or under which any water flows, runs, or percolates directly or indirectly into any reservoir erected or used by the Minister in connection with any water supply prescribed in or proclaimed under any Act.

(g) "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, acting in pursuance of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912."

(h) "Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Minister for the purpose of these By-laws or to administer the said By-laws.

(i) "Domestic Supply." A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for eattle or for horses, or for any steam engine or for washing carriages, where such horses or carriages are kept for hire or are the property of any dealer, or for any hotel, inn, trade, manufacturer, or business whatever, or for watering gardens or for fountains or for any ornamental purpose.

(j) "Private Service." For the purpose of these By-laws "Private Service" includes all the pipes and fittings, and all connections and apparatus of whatsoever nature or kind, and whether used temporarily or otherwise on any part of the premises of the owner or occupier of any premises supplied with water, whether by meter or otherwise, and includes any pipes or fittings the property of the consumer which are used for conveying water from the mains of the Minister whether situated on the premises of the consumer or otherwise.

(k) Farm supply shall include domestic supply, but not industrial or manufacturing supply.

DIVISION II.

By-laws for the preventing of Pollution of the Catchment Area.

2. 'The By-laws in this part apply to all water reserves and catchment areas constituted for the purpose of the principal or any amending Act.

Cleaning and filling up of Cesspools.

3. All existing cesspools within the catchment area shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector, within one calendar month after notice, in writing to that effect has been given to the occupier or owner of the premises concerned.

Situation of Closets.

4. Closets shall not be constructed within fifty yards of high-water mark, and any closet situated within fifty yards of high-water mark shall, within one calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier by the Minister or by the Inspector, be taken down and the cesspit, if such exists, cleansed and a fire made therein, after which the cesspit shall be filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector by the owner or occupier of the house to which such closet or cesspit is appurtenant.

Provision for sufficient number of Pans shall be made.

5. The owner or occupier or every house within the eatchment area shall provide, for the use of the occupants of such house, an earth closet, with a sufficient number of pans approved by the Inspector.

Construction of Closets.

6. (a) Every closet within the catchment area shall be of stone, iron, wood, brick, concrete, or combination of two or more of such materials. Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles, which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district and which shall be of approved size, shape, and style, and every pan shall be emptied and cleansed once every week or as often as may be required by the Inspector.

(b) Each dwelling on the catchment area shall be provided with a closet and urinal erected in such position as directed by the Inspector.

(c) The floor and seat of every closet shall be so constructed that the top of the receptacle shall not be more than one inch below the underside of the seat.

Removal and re-erection of Closets.

7. Closets or urinals already in existence shall, wherever considered necessary by the Inspector, be removed where directed by the Inspector, and such removal or re-erection shall be at the cost of the owner, who shall have the work completed within one calendar month from delivery by Inspector of written notice to owner requiring this to be done.

Nuisance shall not be caused.

8. The owner or occupier of any house within the catchment area shall not permit the contents of any pan used in any closet or urinals to overflow from any cause whatever.

The owner or occupier of any house within the catchment area shall not permit any closet or urinal, or pan appertaining thereto, or used by the occupants of such house, to become offensive or a nuisance, and every such owner or occupier, whenever directed, either verbally or in writing by the Inspector, shall properly and effectively empty and cleanse such closet, urinal, or pan to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

Disposal of Nightsoil, etc.

9. Nightsoil, refuse, and garbage shall be disposed of from time to time as the Minister or Inspector may direct.

Nightsoil, faecal matter, or refuse shall not be buried within the catchment area.

Nightsoil or human urine, whether mixed with any other substance or not, or any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector, shall not be placed, deposited, spread, or permitted to be placed, deposited, or spread in or upon any land or garden within the catchment area, unless written consent thereto has been obtained from the Minister.

Disposal of Manure, etc.

10. Refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter shall not be deposited or be permitted to be deposited within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, such matter may be washed into any reservoir or any feeder.

Situation, etc., of Outbuildings.

11. Buildings of any description shall not be used as or constructed for a stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house, and any animal or bird shall not be housed or yarded within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in such position that storm-waters may wash any manure or refuse therefrom into any reservoir or feeder. Every such structure within the catchment area shall have attached thereto, for containing all liquid and solid manure, a water-tight receptacle approved by the Inspector. Land sloping to a feeder on which any such structure stands shall be excavated to a depth of at least twelve inches, and the soil so obtained shall be used as an embankment around the area so excavated. Such work shall be done by and at the expense of the owner or occupier of such premises.

Cleaning of Outbuildings.

12. The owner or occupier of any stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house situated within the catchment area shall not allow any dung, manure, or other refuse to accumulate in or near such premises, but shall immediately remove or dispose of same in such manner that it cannot pollute any water flowing or which may flow into any reservoir or any feeder, and the Inspector may by written notice to the owner or occupier order the immediate removal and disposal such of any dung, manure, or other refuse from premises, and any person omitting to comply with such notice to the satisfaction of the Inspector shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws and liable to penalties for breach thereof.

Deodorants shall be used.

13. The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Minister or the Iuspector, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

Treatment of Nightsoil.

14. Every nightman or contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, dessicator, or incinerator, or buried in trenches outside the catchment area, or disposed of in a manner approved by the Inspector.

Mode of removal of Receptacles.

15. The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan, of the pattern approved by the Minister or the Inspector, in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say:—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid, as prescribed in the foregoing clause, shall be removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Inspector, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Minister or the Inspector.

The said receptacle shall be emptied and perfectly cleansed once a week at the least or so much more frequently as the Minister or the Inspector may from time to time direct.

Charges for Removal.

16. Every nightman shall be entitled to charge unless other arrangements be made, and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in the contract or approved by the Minister, and shall not ask, demand, or receive more than the sums approved.

Licensing of Nightmen,

17. Nightsoil shall not be removed from any closet, house, or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Minister except by nightmen duly licensed by the Minister.

Private contracts for removal of Nightsoil.

18. Individual householders shall not contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever except with the person licensed by the Minister, and in accordance with these By-laws.

Keeping of Pigs.

19. Pigs shall not be kept or be allowed to stray on any portion of the catchment area.

Straying of Animals.

20. Horses, cattle, sheep, goats, ducks, geese, fowl. or other species of live stock shall not be allowed to stray or depasture over any portion of the catchment area, except with the permission of the Minister.

Keeping of Poultry.

21. Poultry yards or premises for housing of poultry shall be kept at least 25 feet from any dwelling, and shall be kept in clean condition, and disinfected at least once a week with lime. ashes. or other suitable disinfectant.

Abattoirs and Slaughter-houses.

22. Abattoirs or slaughter-houses shall not be established or conducted in any part of the catchment area.

Removal and Destruction of Carcases.

23. In the event of the death or of the accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, or sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed by the owner thereof to a safe distance from high-water mark, or any feeder, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately thereafter dispose of same by burning, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, or, if the owner cannot be found, the Inspector shall destroy it.

Receptacles for Refuse.

24. (a) The occupier of every house or premises shall provide and keep in a position approved by the Inspector, such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Minister or the Inspector for the temporary deposit of solid house refuse.

(b) The owner or occupier of such house shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises, and place the same in receptacles, and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacles to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary, or directed by the Inspector, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

(c) The owner or occupier of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used shall cause same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct. The owner or occupier of such premises shall keep such receptacle in good repair, and upon notice from the Inspector immediately replace by a new and improved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

Disposal of and Receptacles for Noisome Things.

25. Rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine, or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter shall not be deposited or be permitted to be deposited in any part of the catchment area, where it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by stormwater into any feeder, but every occupier or owner shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitted with close fitting covers or lids, for the purpose of carting or receiving same.

Location of Vehicles or Receptacles.

26. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kcpt in such convenient place to allow of ready removal as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition, and removed at least once every week, and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

Reserve for Rubbish, etc.

27. Foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid, or refuse, garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing, shall not be pumped, emptied, or swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, have, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Minister or the Inspector for that purpose.

Pollution of Streams, etc.

28. Bathing or washing of clothes or other articles in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks within the catchment area shall not be permitted, nor shall any person wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing.

Entry Private Premises by Officers of Minister.

29. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, or any assistants acting under the directions of the Inspector or other authorised officer, at his discretion. at any reasonable hour, with or without notice, to enter any land, house, or premises for the parpose of ascertaining whether any act or thing is being done or permitted within such land, house, or premises in breach of these By-laws, and to remove or cause to be removed any thing therein or thereon in breach of these By-laws, or to take such steps as he may deem necessary for carrying out these provisions. The cost of such removal or such other necessary act shall be borne by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which such breach shall occur.

Period for Compliance with Notices.

30. Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or other authorised officer shall be determined by the Minister according to the nature of each case.

Cutting of Timber.

31. Any person, whether in possession of a timber cutter's license or not, shall not cut or hew timber on any catchment area unless authorised so to do by the Minister.

Shooting, Hunting, and Fishing Prohibited.

32. Shooting or hunting any game or angling for or catching of fish shall not be permitted within the catchment area.

DIVISION III.

By-laws for Protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

Trespassing Prohibited.

33. Trespassing within the fenced-off ground adjacent to or reserved for Water Supply Works, or the entering without proper authority of any Waterwork not open to the public, shall not be permitted.

Camping and Lighting of Fires.

34. Camping or lighting of fires within the vicinity of any reservoir, except on land set apart for such purposes, shall not be permitted. The lighting of fires on any other reserves or fenced-off land is absolutely prohibited.

Protection of Flora, Shrubs, etc.

35. The removal, plucking, or damaging of any wild flower, shrub, bush, tree, or other plant growing on any land or reserve vested in the Minister, within half a mile of any reservoir, shall not be permitted.

Dogs Prohibited.

36. Dogs shall not be permitted on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any Waterworks.

Disposal of Refuse, etc.

37. Loose paper or other refuse shall not be left on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any reservoir or works, except in the receptacles provided therefor.

Posting or Distribution of Bills, etc.

38. Bills, advertisements, or other notices shall not be posted or distributed on any portion of any reservoir or works, or on any portion of the works or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

Nuisances.

39. Nuisances shall not be committeed on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any reservoir or works.

Protection of Pipes.

40. Vchicles, conveyances, or animals shall not be driven, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger the main conduit or any branch thereof, or be permitted to cross the same except where crossing places have been provided as indicated by sign-boards.

DIVISION IV.

Licensing of Plumbers.

Plumbing Work shall be done by Licensed Plumbers.

41. Any person shall not do or cause to be done, any work within the Water Area in connection with the water supply of any premises, or in connection with any fitting or apparatus connected therewith, unless he shall have first been duly admitted by the Minister as a "Licensed Water Supply Plumber."

Description and scope of Licenses.

42. The conditons upon which licenses will be issued by the Minister are-

- (a) The Minister ale(a) The Minister algorithm water supply plumbers' licenses, operative only in the area to which these By-laws apply, to water supply plumbers upon the applicants satisfying the Minister that they are competent water supply plumbers and that they are fit and proper persons to hold such licenses, and the applicants may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.
- (b) On condition that the certificate of the Department's Board of Examiners has been obtained, the prescribed payments made, and provided the Minister is satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold such license, the Minister will grant water supply plumbers' license, operative in all areas administered by the Minister, excepting the metropolitan area and excepting areas open for sewerage connections; and will also grant water supply and sanitary plumbers' licenses operative in all areas administered by the Minister.

Annual Fee for License.

43. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license except when a license is granted after the tenth day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

Renewal of License.

44. Licenses issued by the Minister under the Bylaws and Regulations shall be current only from the 1st January to the 31st December of the year of issue, and water supply plumbers shall apply for a renewal, and pay the necessary fee before the expiry of the year for which their existing license is current.

List of Licensed Plumbers shall be published.

45. A list of licensed water supply plumbers shall, from time to time, be published at the office of the Minister.

Breaches of By-laws by Plumbers.

46. Any licensed water supply plumber offending against any By-law or Regulation of the Minister, or who shall refuse to give any needful or proper information required by an officer of the Minister, either by himself or those employed by him, or who fails to complete any contract with the Minister or with a private owner within the time specified, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds, and he shall also show cause why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled. Any person who has been removed from the list shall not be re-admitted as a licensed water supply plumber until he shall have served the suspension order or paid such fine, not exceeding Twenty pounds, as the Minister may determine.

Delay in Work.

47. Plumbers shall execute any work they undertake with reasonable despatch; and any inconvenience to the public caused by licensed water supply plumbers by unnecessary delay in carrying out work will be rigorously dealt with by the Minister.

Accidents to Pipes shall be reported.

48. Accidents caused by licensed water supply plumbers to water, gas, or other pipes shall be at once reported, and immediate steps taken to have repairs effected, and the cost of same shall be defrayed by such plumber.

Deposit and Declaration.

49. Prior to issue of the license, the person to whom the same is to be issued shall deposit with the Minister a sum of Five pounds, which shall be retained during the currency of the license as a security for the proper performance of all work done by him, and shall sign a declaration that he accepts such license subject to and in conformity with the conditions thereof and with the Regulations of the Minister, and that he will conform and comply therewith.

Deductions from Deposit.

50. The Minister may deduct from such deposit any fine inflicted or the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed water supply plumber or his work-men, and as often as any amount is so deduced the licensed water supply plumber shall make good the de-posit to the sum of Five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.

Change of Address to be Notified.

51. Every licensed water supply plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change in his address, give notice in writing to the Minister.

DIVISION V.

Water Supply Plumbing.

Specification of Pipes and Littings for Private Services. 52. In connection with the laying down, mainten-ance, alteration, or repair of every private service, the following regulations shall be observed by the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such service is:

- (a) All pipes and fittings shall be of lead, or galvanised wrought or malleable iron.
- (b) Where lead pipes are used they shall be of drawn lead of equal thickness throughout, and of at least the respective weights following, viz. :---

- (d) The minimum weight of wrought and malleable iron fittings shall be fixed from time to time by the Minister, and no malleable fittings unless of approved brand shall be used.
- (e) Tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplets, plugs, etc., shall be of the best manufacture, true in section, regular, and of equal thickness, properly and truly cut with the British standard thread, perfectly sound and new, and free from all defects.

The tees, bends, tubes, etc., shall be capable of with-standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

All joints between pipes, tees, bends, thimbles, couplings, elbows, and cocks, etc, shall be made with red lead and flax cr other approved jointing material. All joints on lead pipes shall be of the kind known as "wiped joints," and all connections between lead and iron water pipes shall be made with brass couplings and wiped joints.

- (g) No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through any sewer, drain, ashpit, cistern, or manure bin, or through, in, or into any place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsound, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be polluted or to escape without observation, unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior cast-iron pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.
- (h) All taps, stop-cocks, ball-cocks, valves, service boxes, waste-not regulators, bath taps, or valves or other fittings used in connection with the supply of water shall be of approved types and capable of withstanding a pressure of 300lbs. per square inch, and shall be tested and stamped by the duly authorised officer of the Minister before being fixed. The Minister will fort and stamp the same the same of debarre the

- Waste-not regulators .. 6d. each.
- (i) Every cistern and tank shall be provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the over-flow pipe shall be laid and fixed in a suitable manplace open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Minister.
- (j) No service pipe shall communicate directly with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rainwater, or made or used below the surface of the ground.
- (k) No part of any service shall communicate directly with the water in any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of steam, but the feed water shall be supplied in such a manner that none of the water in the boiler, or such other apparatus, can return into the main or service pipe.
- (1) Every water closet fitting shall be approved of by the Minister, and shall be supplied from the service pertaining to the tenement, through a proper cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall communicate directly with a basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cis-tern of a water closet.
- (m) In every bath the outlet shall be distinct from and unconnected with the inlet or inlets, and the inlet or inlets shall be placed at least one inch above the highest water level of the bath. The outlet of c_{VC} hath shall be provided with a perfectly watertight plug. The Minister will not supply any bath unless the same shall be so constructed as to prevent a waste of water.
- (n) Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall communicate directly with any urinal.

Maintenance of Private Services.

53. (a) The owner or occupier for the time being of any premises supplied with water shall at his own risk and expense, and, subject to the provisions of these By-laws, arrange with a licensed plumber to lay down his private service and keep it in good order and repair, and so that the same shall at all times be in accordance with the By-laws for the time being.

(b) The service pipe being the property of the owner or occupier of the land supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none, the owner, shall upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires re-pairing, immediately arrange with a licensed plumber to repair the same, subject to the provisions of these By-laws, and he shall be responsible for any loss of By-laws, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in the event of con-tinuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Min-ister may stop the water from flowing into such pre-mises, either by cutting off the service pipe, or other-wise as the Minister may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. (c) Without prejudice to the right of the Minister to proceed for any penalty for the breach or non-observance of any of the provisions of this By-law, the Minster may cut off the supply of water to any premises whereon the private service or any part thereof is not at all times laid, fixed, used or maintained in all respects in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws, and may keep the same cut off until such provisions have been fully observed.

Interference within three feet of Meter.

54. Licensed plumbers or other persons shall not under any circumstances disconnect the joints from the meter, or, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within three feet of such meter. Such work shall be done only by the servants of the Minister.

DIVISION VI.

By-laws for General Purposes.

Applications for Services.

55. Applications for water services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the Head or Branch Offices, and shall be lodged not less than seven days before the service is required. Full information, as indicated on the prescribed form, shall be supplied, and the full amount of rates or other charges due on the premises to which a service is required shall be paid on or before application and before the work is commenced.

Supply to Non-rated Premises.

56. Any person or persons requiring a water service to any non-rated property may be supplied on payment of a minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Minister in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to ratepaying consumers, shall apply to minimum charge paying consumers.

Supply of Water not Compulsory.

57. It shall be at the discretion of the Minister to supply water to any individual consumer or to any land whether rated or not.

Separate Services Required.

58. Except with the written permission of the Minister, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Minister may, in special cases, consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses and controlled by a stop-cock on such subservice.

Sizes of Service Pipes.

59. The size of the service pipe shall in each case be fixed at the discretion of the Minister.

Notice of intention to Build.

60. The owner or occupier of any land supplied with water within a Water Area who shall erect or make, for cause to be erected or made any building or addition to any existing building on such land, shall before the commencement of same, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.

Locking of Taps, etc.

61. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Minister, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the said premises.

62. No service pipe shall communicate directly with any eistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of water other than water obtained from the Minister's mains.

Misuse of Water.

63. Any person entitled to a supply of water for domestic purposes only, or entitled only to a supply of water for any specified purpose, shall not use such water for any other purpose except that specified.

Illegal taking or selling of Water.

64. Any person, whether entitled to receive water from the Minister or not, shall not, without the written permission of the Minister, take, carry away, or allow to be taken or carried away, such water from his premises, or sell the same to any other person.

Turning off when Repairing and Tapping.

65. The Minister may, from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of a water area.

Reward-Reporting Leakage.

66. The Minister may in his discretion adequately reward any person (not being the person in fault) who shall communicate timely information to the Minister of any leakages or waste of water, whether the same be accidental, negligently or wilfully occasioned or suffered, or who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of any person or persons who shall steal or cause to be stolen or improperly appropriated the water of the Minister.

Waste of Water.

67. Any person supplied with water by the Minister, whether by meter or otherwise, shall not allow the same to run to waste.

Limiting Supply.

68. The Minister may at such times and for such purposes as he may deem necessary and expedient, prohibit the use of water for garden purposes and all purposes other than domestic and industrial, except with his permission in writing.

Any person contravening this By-lay shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and in the event of a continuing breach to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for each day such breach shall continue.

Fixing of Meters.

69. Any officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose may fix a meter on any service, and shall determine the size and class of meter in each case. Meters will be supplied by the Minister, and may be open or encased, at the discretion of the Minister.

Repairs and Maintenance of Meters.

70. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Minister shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Minister, and the expense incurred by the Minister in so doing, shall on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

Notice of Damage or Non-registration of Meter shall be given.

71. Any person supplied by the Minister with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged, or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the Local Water Supply Office.

Interference with Meters.

72. Any person shall not break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on the meter through which water is supplied by the Minister, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

Period for Reading.

73. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

Averaging of Consumption.

74. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister or any officer appointed by the Minister, may at his option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during such previous period as the Minister may determine, and the quantity so ascertained shall be paid for by the consumer.

Testing of Meters.

75. If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and be desirous of having the meter tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Minister or his officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water, and if upon such testing it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Minister or his officer that the meter registered more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it at such testing, then the Minister shall bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and shall also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the meter upon such testing shall not register more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it, then the consumer shall pay to the Minister all the expenses of and incidental to such testing, providing that the expense of every test shall be fixed by the Minister, subject to a minimum charge of ten shillings for each test; provided also, that the consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the meter for any period other than the period of registration next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.

Authority to enter Premises.

76. Any officer acting under the Minister's authority may, at all reasonable times, enter any house or premises connected or intended to be connected with the water mains, in order to examine whether the water pipes and fittings in such house or premises are in proper order. Any person refusing such admission or in any way hindering such officer in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter prescribed.

Gratuities Prohibited.

77. Officers, workmen, or agents of the Minister shall not solicit or receive any fee or gratuity whatever.

Standard Drawings and Fittings.

78. Approved standard fittings and type drawings will be exhibited at the Minister's office. Due consideration will be given by the Minister to the claims of any other fittings which may be presented for approval, and, if considered satisfactory, the same may be placed among and become one of the approved standard fittings. The Minister may, from time to time, amend, alter, or cancel any or all of the standard fittings or type drawings, and replace them by such other fittings or drawings as he may approve of.

Junction or interference with Pipes or Fittings.

79. Any person shall not make any connection or interference with any pipe or fitting of the Minister or with any water pipe or fitting communicating therewith, at any other place than shall be approved of by the Minister, and the mains shall only be tapped by the workmen of the Minister.

Inspection of Works.

80. Work shall not be undertaken in connection with water supply, or in the extension or alteration thereof, until such time as the necessary printed permit is obtained. Two days' notice shall in all cases be given by the licensed plumber before work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer of the Minister duly appointed to issue permits expressly accepts shorter notice. In no case shall any water pipes or apparatus in connectioon with water supply be used until the said work shall have been inspected and, if necessary, tested by the said officer, and certified by him on the prescribed form. No underground or enclosed work shall be covered up or concealed from view until the same shall have been duly inspected and passed by the Inspector, and for this purpose the person to whom the permit has been issued shall immediately report any work which is ready for inspection or test, and every facility shall be afforded to such officer for making such inspection or tests.

DIVISION VII.

Rates and Charges.

Rating.

81. (a) Within the Narembeen Water Area the water rate shall be within the townsite at a rate not exceeding three shillings in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land, provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding One pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land and for farming land, any holding situated wholly or partly within ten chains of any pipe at a rate not exceeding Five pounds; but no such holding shall be rateable so far as regards that part of it which is more than one nule and a half from the pipe.

(b) The Minister may, in his discretion, allow a discount of not exceeding 20 per centum upon any rates paid within three months of the date upon which such rates become payable, but such discount shall not apply to minimum rates or fees, which shall be paid in full.

(c) In making rates a distinction may be made between occupied and vacant land, and in the event of a dispute as to whether or not land shall be regarded as vacant, the decision of the Minister shall be final in every case. This shall not apply to farming areas.

Rates-How Payable.

82. Rates shall become due and payable yearly in advance on the first day of July. Provided that in all cases where a rate is made after the first day of July in any year the notice of the order for the making and le ying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rates shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

Allowance for Rate.

83. Subject to the provisions of these By-laws every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed piece of land of which he is the owner or occupier that quantity of water which, if calculated at the price specified in the Schedule 1 hereto as being that at which water is supplied in return for the rate in the area in which such property is situated would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on each property, provided that such water is taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

Payment for Excess Water.

84. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate shall pay for the excess in accordance with prices set forth in the Schedule 1 hereto.

Fees-State or Commonwealth Government Departments.

85. For each water service for purposes of any State or Commonwealth Department there shall be payable, as a minimum annual fee in lieu of water rate, the sum of not less than One pound $(\pounds 1)$ when the service is metered, and of not less than One pound ten shillings (1 10s.) when the service is non-metered.

It shall be at the discretion of the Minister as to whether or not a meter shall be fixed in each case.

This By-law shall not apply to water for railway purposes.

Fees for additional Services.

86. In any case where the owner or occupier of any separately rated piece of land requires more than one service to be installed for supplying water to such land, such additional service or services shall, at the discretion of the Minister, be installed on such occupier or owner paying in advance the cost of installation and a fee of not less than One pound per annum, in addition to meter rent, for each additional service. In return for such fee an equivalent quantity of water will be given in each year, in the same way as water is given in return for water rates.

Meter Rents.

87. Every person supplied with water by measure to other than rateable premises or private residences shall pay meter rent in advance according to the following scale:---

Reconnection Fee.

88. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when, in the opinion of the Minister or local officer, necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reasons, a minimum fee of five shillings shall be charged for disconnection and reconnection, provided that where the cost exceeds the minimum fee the actual cost of the disconnection and reconnection, as determined by the Minister, shall be charged, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being, on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee has been paid.

Private Fire Services.

89. Private fire service will be allowed, but every such service shall be sealed, except in cases where the Minister may decide that sealing is unnecessary. For each such service there shall be paid the actual cost of installation, and a fee equivalent to five per centum on cost per annum shall be paid in advance as rental, subject to a minimum fee for each service of Ten shillings per annum. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion except for extinction of fire. In the event of the seal having been broken in case of fire or by accident, or otherwise, the occupier shall give notice, and pay the cost of resealing.

Building Fees.

90. Where water is required for building purposes the Minister may permit the supply thereof at prices as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto and on the following terms:---

- (a) The aforementioned prices shall apply only to supplies to buildings intended for use as ordinary dwellings.
- (b) In the case of buildings other than ordinary dwellings, the supply shall be on such terms as may be agreed upon by the Minister, subject to a minimum fee of One pound for each service.
- (c) All fees shall be paid in advance. If any work is done other than that mentioned at the time of applying to the Minister, the same shall be paid for in advance, or the whole supply will forthwith be cut off.
- (d) It shall be at the discretion of the Minister as to whether or not in any case a supply of water shall be classed as a supply for building purposes, and as to whether or not the supply shall be measured by meter.
- (e) Applications for water under this By-law shall be in writing, stating the nature of the work to be done and the purpose for which water is required.

When Accounts Due and Payable.

91. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment for same shall become due and payable within 14 days after due service of the account, unless otherwise agreed upon.

DIVISION VIII.

Penalties.

Penalty for Breaches.

92. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-naws to which no specific penaity is attached or who shall retuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such by-naw, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall, upon conviction, be hable to a penaity not exceeding £20, and, in case of continuum offence, a further penaity not exceeding £5 for each day arter notice of such offence.

Myrup Ward.

IN pursuance of the provisions of Part VII. of the above Act, the Court of Arbitration hereby determines and declares the basic wage to be paid to adult male and female workers shall be as follows :-

- (a) adult males-the sum of £4 7s. (four pounds seven shillings) per weck;
- (b) adult females-the sum of £2 7s. (two pounds seven shillings) per week:

Provided that in the following areas, namely-

- (a) Yilgarn, Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, Dundas, East Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, Mount Margaret, and East Murchison Goldfields, and Northampton Mining District;
- (b) Murchison, Yalgoo, Peak Hill, and Gascoyne Goldfields,

the basic wage to be paid to adult male and female workers shall be as follows:---

- (a) adult males-the sum of £4 5s. (four pounds five shillings) per week;
- (b) adult females-the sum of £2 5s. 11d. (two pounds five shillings and elevenpence) per week;

No. 8 of 1928.

Between the West Australian Local Governing Bodies Officers' Association Union of Workers, Applicant, and the City of Perth, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties.

Award.

1.---Rates of Pay. (a) The minimum rate of pay for officers under 21 years of age shall be set out in Schedule A, attached hereto.

(b) The minimum rate of pay at 21 years of age for male officers shall be at the rate of £221 per annum,

for mide officers shall be at the rate of £221 per annum, and for female employees at the rate of £163 per annum, irrespective of the years of service. (c) The rates of pay for adult officers shall be as set out in Schedule B, attached hereto: Provided that increments thereunder are subject to good conduct, diligence, and efficiency. The certificate of the head of the department shall be accepted as conclusive evi-dence. dence of this.

(d) For the purpose of convenience in classification, the rates in Schedules A and B have been expressed in annual amounts.

(e) Whenever any salary or increment provided for by this Award is withheld from any officer, he shall be informed in writing of the reasons for such withhold-ing within a fortnight of his or her request in writing for such reasons.

(f) Wherever in the said Schedules A and B an increase of pay is indicated, the said increase shall take effect from the 1st November, 1929. The year mentioned in the said Schedules means a year from the 1st November to the next following 31st October.

(g) The rates of pay for piecework shall be as set out in Schedule C hereto.
(h) When an officer is transferred to a position carrying a higher classification, he shall suffer no reduction in salary and shall be considered in the year of service in such higher position with a salary equal to or next below the salary he was in receipt of at the time of transfer.

2.-Hours of Duty.

The hours of duty, except in special cases where different hours are stipulated, are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with a break of one hour for lunch, and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays: Provided that overseers, foremen, etc., supervising employees shall work the same hours as the employees they supervise, and shall also carry out any emergency work considered necessary by the head of the department; all such duty to be without extra pay, except as hereinafter provided.

3.-Overtime and Payment for Overtime.

(a) Officers may be required to perform public duty beyond the usual hours, whenever it is necessary to bring up arrears of work or to meet any temporary pressure of business.

(b) When a portion of the work of any department has fallen into arrear, the staff dealing with such work, or, at the discretion of the head of the department, the whole staff, shall be retained after the ordinary office hours until such arrears are brought up.

Every officer shall, when required by a head of a department, remain after the usual office hours to complete work which the head considers necessary to be done on the same day.

(c) When any officer is required to work in the office in the evening a tea allowance of 2s. 6d. shall be paid: Provided that no tea money shall be payable in cases where overtime is paid for.

Payment for Overtime.

Any work which from its character or from special circumstances cannot be performed during the regular prescribed hours of duty, shall be regarded as "overtime'' work, for which extra payment may be made.

The right of such extra payment shall be determined by the Town Clerk, on the recommendation of the head of the department. In all cases where overtime is worked, a full record thereof shall be kept.

Overtime, if any, shall be paid for at time and a quarter: Provided that this rate shall not apply to work in connection with the compilation of rolls and rate notices, the rates for which are provided for in Schedule C.

4.-Sunday Time.

Officers who are called upon to work on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday shall be paid double time.

Caretakers, foremen, supervisors, inspectors, or other officers who are required to work special hours, and other officers receiving over the rate of £400 per annum, shall not be entitled to the benefits of this clause

5.-Holidays.

All State Government holidays shall be observed and paid for, except in the case of foremen, who shall be allowed such public or other holidays as may be due to the workers under their control.

Caretakers shall be allowed only such public holidays as may be approved by the Town Clerk.

In addition to the foregoing, officers shall, after the completion of one year's service, be allowed two weeks' annual leave, exclusive of intervening public holidays. Such leave to be taken at the convenience of the Town Clerk: Provided that all officers in receipt of over £400 per annum shall receive three weeks' annual leave.

Officers may be permitted, with the approval of the Town Clerk, to allow their annual leave to accumulate up to and including a period not exceeding three years. In the event of any officer resigning his or her position, all holidays accrued shall be paid for.

6.—Sick Pay.

In the event of absence from duty on account of sickness, officers shall receive pay as follows, viz.:--Over three years' service:--Three months' full pay and three months' half pay.

Under three years and over one year:-Two months' full pay in any one year.

Under one year and over six months :-- One months' full pay in any one year.

All officers absent through sickness must report such absence forthwith to the head of the department, and if absent for more than two days at any one time must furnish satisfactory medical certificates as to the nature of the illness, and the necessity for leave of absence. For the purpose of this clause "in any one year"

shall mean from the 1st November to the 31st October.

7.—Quarters.

The existing conditions and customs as regards quarters shall continue to obtain.

8.—Existing Rates

No officer who at the date of this Award is in receipt of a higher rate of pay or other remuneration, or more holidays and other benefits than is herein provided, shall have his or her pay, remnneration, holidays, or benefits reduced as a consequence of this Award.

9.-Temporary Officers.

The wages to be paid to temporary adult male clerks shall be at the rate of not less than £5 per week: Provided that checking, sorting, and general work on rate notices and rolls shall be paid at a flat rate of 2s. 6d. per hour, and provided further, that for the delivery of rate notices a flat rate of 2s. 3d. per hour shall be paid. Temporary adult female officers shall receive not less than £3 10s. per week. For temporary juniors, the rates as per Schedule A, with an addition of 10 per cent. shall apply.

A temporary officer after 12 months' continuous service may, at the discretion of the Council, be placed on the permanent staff.

10 .- Resignations or Dismissals.

All appointments, other than temporary officials. shall be subject to one fortnight's notice from either side: Provided that this shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct.

This clause shall not apply to temporary officers, whose engagement may be terminated by one week's notice, except where the engagement is for a specified period.

11.-Acting in Higher Capacities.

When an officer is temporarily executing the duties of a position carrying a higher salary than that in which he or she is usually employed, for a continuous term of three calendar months or longer, he or she shall be paid during the whole time he or she is performing such duties, the salary attached to such higher position for the year of service which will give him or her a salary next above that which he or she is receiving in the lower capacity

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any other officer under the control of the officer temporarily executing higher duties as specified above.

12.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage herein prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wage, to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the Union, or in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating his desire that such wage be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the Magistrate, and pending the decision therein in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage.

The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of any such application before the Magistrate.

13 .--- Period of Award.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three years, with a right of review after twelve months and the following twelve months.

14 .- Area of Award.

The Award shall extend over and include the boundaries of the City of Perth and any premises or land upon which any undertaking of that Municipality is being carried on.

15.—Definitions.

"A permanent officer," for the purposes of this Award, is one who is appointed by resolution of the Council, and is given notice of such appointment in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

"A temporary officer" shall mean one who is engaged from time to time at the discretion of a departmental head and with the approval of the Town Clerk.
