Midland Junction-Merredin Road (Greenmount Road District).

That portion of York Road No. 28, on Lands Department Lithograph No. 1C/40, commencing at the junction of the Eastern boundary of the Municipality of Midland Junction with Buninyong Road and Road No. 28; thence continuing in a South-Easterly and North-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Bullarra Road and crossing Woolowra Road through Greenmount Location 16 to the North-Western corner of Lot No. 246; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 246, 245, 244, 243, and 242 to the North-Western corner of Lot 241; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Lots Nos. 241, 240, 239, 238, 237, 236 to the North-Western corner of Lot 235; thence continuing in an Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Lots Nos. 235, 234, 233, and 232 to the North-Western corner of Reserve No. 310; thence continuing in a South-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Reserve No. 310 and Lots Nos. 283, 284, 285, 231, 230, 229, 228, 227, and 226 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot No. 222; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in an Easterly direction, past Reserve A 6922 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot No. 105; thence continuing along Road No. 28 (York Road) in a South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 104, 102, 101, 74, 75, 77 to the North-Western corner of Lot 158; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a North-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 158, 159, 160, and 161 to the Northern boundary of Lot No. 163; thence continuing in an Easterly and a North-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Lots Nos. 163, 164, 154, 82 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot 83; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a North-Easterly and Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 90, 91 to the North-Western corner of Lot No. 92; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in an Easterly and South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 92, 93, 314 to the North-Western corner of Lot No. 315; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 315, 316 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot No. 317; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a North-Easterly and Easterly direction to Location No. 97 to its junction with Road No. 3500; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in an Easterly and South-Easterly direction to the Eastern boundary of Location No. 97; thence crossing Craven Road and continuing along Road No. 28 in a South-Easterly direction to its junction with the Eastern boundary of the Metropolitan Area, as defined in the Traffic Act (viz., at the Western side of Coppin Road at Mahogany Creek in the Greenmount Road District) as shown in blue on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 284.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 18th day of June, 1929, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Esperance Road District.—Alteration of Boundaries with Norseman and Kalgoorlie Road Districts and Reconstitution of the Dundas Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1658/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and annex it to an existing Road District and reconstitute a Road District, and divide a District into Wards; and whereas it is desirable to—

- (1) sever that portion of the Esperance Road District described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Kalgoorlie Road District;
- (2) sever that portion of the Kalgoorlie Road District described in Schedule "B" hereto and annex it to the Esperance Road District;
- (3) sever that portion of the Esperance Road District (as amended) described in Schedule "C" hereto and annex it to the Norseman Road District;
- (4) reconstitute the Dundas Road District with boundaries as described in Schedule "D" hereto;
- (5) redivide the Esperance Road District (when so amended) into six Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "E" hereto;
- (6) divide the Dundas Road District into six Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "F" hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby—

- (1) sever that portion of the Esperance Road District described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Kalgoorlie Road District;
- (2) sever that portion of the Kalgoorlie Road District described in Schedule "B" hereto and annex it to the Esperance Road District;
- (3) sever that portion of the Esperance Road District (as amended) described in Schedule "C" hereto and annex it to the Norseman Road District;
- (4) reconstitute the Dundas Road District, with the boundaries described in Schedule "D" hereto;
- (5) redivide the Esperance Road District (when so amended) into six Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "E" hereto;
- (6) divide the Dundas Road District into six Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in Schedule "F" hereto.

To come into force on the 1st day of July, 1929.

Schedule A.

KALGOORLIE ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of territory from the Esperance Road District.

All that piece of land bounded on the Westward, Northward, and Eastward by part of the present District boundaries from their intersection with the production East of the Northernmost boundary of Pastoral Lease 790/97 to the North-Eastern corner of Pastoral Lease 1296/95 (on the said boundary); on the Southward by lines commencing at the said North-East corner and extending Westward along the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 1296/95 aforesaid, and continuing to the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1157/95B; thence along part of the East, the North, and a West boundary of said Pastoral Lease 1157/95B, parts of the North and West boundaries of Pastoral Lease 1233/95B, the North and part of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 1232/95B, the South boundaries of Pastoral Leases 1172/95, 1247/95, 1254/95, 1253/95, 1249/95, and

1248/95, part of the East and the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 1223/95, South, and part of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 1224/95 to the production East of the Northernmost boundary of Pastoral Lease 790/97; thence West to the starting point.

Schedule B.

ESPERANCE ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of territory from the Kalgoorlie Road District.

All that piece of land bounded on the Northward by lines commencing on the present District boundary at the North-Easternmost corner of Pastoral Lease 790/97, and extending Eastward in prolongation East of the Northernmost boundary of the said Pastoral Lease to again intersect the present District boundary about 125 chains North and about 350 chains West of the South-Western corner of Pastoral Lease 1224/95; on the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by part of the present District boundary to the starting point.

Schedule C.

NORSEMAN ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of territory from the Esperance Road District.

All that piece of land bounded on the Northward, Westward, and Northward by part of the present District boundary from the North-Eastern corner of the Phillips River Road District to the production East of the Northernmost boundary of Pastoral Lease 790/97; thence along said production to the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 1224/95, and along part of the West and South boundary of Pastoral Lease 1224/95B, the South and part of the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1223/95B, the South boundaries of Pastoral Leases 1248/95, 1249/95, 1253/95, 1254/95, 1247/95, and 1172/95B, part of the West and North boundary of Pastoral Lease 1232/95B, parts of the West and North boundaries of Pastoral Lease 1233/95B, a West, a North, and part of the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1157/95B to the production West of the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 1296/95; thence East along said production and North boundary to the Eastern boundary of the State; on the Eastward by part of the State boundary to the shores of the Indian Ocean (Great Australian Bight); on the Southward by the said shores of the Indian Ocean to the South-Western corner of Nuyts Land District, North along part of the West boundary of the said Land District to the production East of the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 627/95; thence West along said production and South boundary, and continuing Westward to and along the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 448/95, and along part of the West boundary of the last-mentioned Pastoral Lease, the Northernmost and part of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 619/95 to an East and West line passing through the North corner of Fitzgerald Location 619; thence along said East and West line to the said North corner; thence along the North-Eastern and the South-Eastern boundaries of Location 619 aforesaid, the South-Eastern boundaries of Location 622, 424, and 419, part of the North-East and the North-West boundary of Location 411, the North-West boundary of Location 1191, the Southern boundaries of Locations 1425 and 414, part of the East and South boundaries of Location 174, the West boundary of Location 670, and part of the Western boundary of Location 101, the South boundaries of Locations 674, 677, 79, and 131, part of the East and the South boundary of Location 264, the South boundaries of Locations 275, 276, 835, 282, 286, 643, and 644 and their production West to the present District boundary, and Northward along said District boundary to the starting point.

Schedule D.

DUNDAS ROAD DISTRICT.

Description of Boundaries.

Bounded on the Northward by part of an East and West line passing through the 39½-mile Post on the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence to intersect with a North and South line passing through Survey Mark M5; thence North along said North and South line to intersect with the production West of the Northernmost boundary of Pastoral Lease 790/97; thence Eastward to and along

said Northernmost boundary and continuing Eastward to the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 1224/95, along part of the West and South boundary of the last-mentioned Pastoral Lease, the South and part of the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1223/95B, the South boundaries of Pastoral Leases 1248/95, 1249/95, 1253/95, 1254/95, 1247/95, the South and part of the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1172/95, the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 1232/95, parts of the West and North boundaries of Pastoral Lease 1233/95, the Westernmost and the North and part of the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1157/95 to the production West of the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 1296/95; thence along said production and North boundary to the Eastern boundary of the State; on the Eastward by part of the said State boundary to the shores of the Indian Ocean (Great Australian Bight); on the Southward by lines commencing at the intersection of the State boundary to the shores of the Indian Ocean, and extending Westward along said shores to the South-Western corner of the Nuyts Land District; thence Northward along part of the Western boundary of the said Land District to the production East of the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 627/95, and along said production and South boundary and continuing to and along the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 448/95, and along part of the West boundary of the last-mentioned Pastoral Lease, the Northernmost, and part of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 619/95 to an East and West line passing through the North corner of Fitzgerald Location 619; thence along said East and West line to the said North corner; thence along the North-Eastern and the South-Eastern boundaries of Location 619 aforesaid, the South-Eastern boundaries of Locations 622, 424, and 419, part of the North-East and the North-West boundary of Location 411, the North-West boundary of Location 1191, the Southern boundaries of Locations 1425 and 414, part of the East and South boundaries of Location 174, the West boundary of Location 670 and part of the Western boundary of Location 101, the South boundaries of Locations 674, 677, 79 and 131, part of the East and the South boundary of Location 264, the South boundaries of Locations 275, 276, 835, 282, 286, 643, and 644, and their production Westward to the East boundary of the Phillips River Road District; thence by part of the East and the North boundaries of the Phillips River Road District to a North and South line passing through Koorarawalyee Well (on the Eastern Goldfields Railway); on the Westward by part of the said North and South line (portion of the East boundary of the Yilgarn Road District) to intersect an East and West line passing through the 39½-mile Post on the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence (the starting point).

Schedule E.

ESPERANCE ROAD DISTRICT.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

Seaddan Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the District boundary from its intersection with the East boundary of Phillips River Road District to the Eastern side of the Esperance-Norseman Railway Reserve; on the Eastward by the said side of Railway Reserve to the North boundary of Grass Patch Townsite; thence along part of the Northern, Westernmost, and part of the West boundary of the said Townsite, and again along the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve to the North boundary of Seaddan Townsite; thence along part of the North, the Easternmost, and a South boundary of the said Seaddan Townsite, and again along the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve to the production East of the South boundary of Location 1036; on the Southward by the production and South boundary of Location 1036, the South and part of the West boundary of Location 1339, the South boundary of Locations 975, 976, 977, and 681 to and along the North boundary of Reserve 2783 (Cockatoo Camp), and continuing to the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 710/95; thence along part of the East and the said North boundary and the latter boundary's production West to intersect the District boundary; on the Westward by part of the District boundary to the starting point. (1 member.)

Grass Patch Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the District boundary from its intersection with the Eastern side of the Esperance-Norseman Railway Reserve to the East

boundary of the Dundas Goldfield; on the Eastward by part of the East boundary of the Dundas Goldfield to the production East of the North boundary of Esperance Location 364; on the Southward by the production and North boundary of said Location 364 and its West boundary to its South-West corner; thence to and along the North boundary of Reserve 2791 (The Yates), and continuing to the Eastern side of the Railway Reserve; on the Westward by the East boundary of the Scaddan Ward. (1 member.)

Dalyup Ward.

Bounded on the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundary from its intersection with the Southern-most boundary of Reserve 13977 to intersect the production West of the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 710/95; on the Northward by part of the South boundary of the Scaddan Ward to intersect the production North of the East boundary of Esperance Location 925; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending South to and along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 925 and 920, and the Western boundary of Location 767 to its South corner; thence to and along the West and part of the Southern boundary of Reserve 13977 to the shores of the Indian Ocean (Great Australian Bight). (1 member.)

Central Ward.

Bounded on the Westward by the East boundary of Dalyup Ward, and on the Northward by parts of the South boundaries of the Scaddan and Grass Patch Wards to the South-West corner of Location 364; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said South-West corner, and extending South to the North-West corner of Myrup A.A. Lot 3, and along the Western boundaries of Lots 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 29, 15, 30, 17, 19, and 22, the North-West and part of the South boundary of Location 807, the West and part of the South boundary of Location 816, the West boundary of Location 821 to the shores of the Indian Ocean (Great Australian Bight); on the Southward by part of the District boundary, by the East, North, and West boundaries of the Esperance Ward, and again by the District boundary to the starting point. (1 member.)

Myrup Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the South and the East boundary of the Grass Patch Wards, and by part of the District boundary from the North-West corner of Location 364 to the South-Western corner of the Nuyts Land District; on the Eastward and Southward by part of the District boundary (sea shore) to its intersection with the East boundary of the Central Ward; on the Westward by the East boundary of the Central Ward to the starting point. (1 member.)

Esperance Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the North-West corner of East Location 21, and extending East along the North boundary of the said location, part of the West and the North boundary of Location 17, and part of the West and the North boundary of Location 18 to the North-East corner of the last-mentioned location; on the Eastward and Southward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned North-East corner, and extending South along the East boundary of said Location 18 to the shores of Esperance Bay, along said shores to the production Southward of the Western boundary of Location 11; on the Westward by lines commencing at the intersection of the production Southward of the Western boundary of Location 11 with the shores of Esperance Bay and extending Northward along part of said Western boundary to the production Southward of the West boundary of Location 14; thence along the last-mentioned production and West boundary and part of the Northernmost boundary of said Location 14 to the production South-Eastward of the South-Western boundary of Location 16; thence along the last-mentioned production and said South-West boundary and the North-West boundary of Location 16 and the Western boundaries of Locations 17, 18, and 40, part of the Southern and West boundary of Reserve 9677, and Western boundaries of Locations 21 to 27 inclusive, and part of the North-Eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned location to the production South of the West boundary of Location 21; thence along said production and West boundary to the starting point. (2 members.)

Schedule F.

DUNDAS ROAD DISTRICT.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

Norseman Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the production West of the North side of Barnes Street with the production North of the West boundary of Reserve 3316, and extending East to and along the Northern side of Barnes Street to the production North of the East side of Simon Street; thence South to and along said side of Simon Street to the Northern side of Morgan Street; thence East and along said side of Morgan Street to the West side of Goodliffe Street, and North along said side of Goodliffe Street to the production West of the North boundary of Norseman Lot 659; thence East to and along the North boundaries of Lots 659, 667, 691, 699, 723, 731, and 755 to the North-East corner of the last-mentioned lot; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-East corner and extending South along the East boundaries of Lots 755 to 770 inclusive and the East boundary of Lot 805; thence East along the Northern side of Morgan Street, following the Townsite boundary, and South along the East boundary of the said Townsite to its South-Eastern corner; on the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-Eastern corner and extending West along the Southern-most boundary of the Townsite to the Western side of Angove Street, and North along said side of Angove Street to the South-East corner of Sub. Lot. 19, Reserve 6107; thence West along the South boundaries of Sub. Lots 19, 18, and 17, and continuing West to the production South of the West boundary of Sub. Lot 6; on the Westward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Northward to and along the West boundaries of Sub. Lot 6, Reserve 2897, and Reserve 3316, and continuing to the starting point. (1 member.)

Cowan Ward.

Bounded on the Westward, Northward, and Eastward by part of the District boundary, and on the Southward by the shores of the Indian Ocean (Great Australian Bight) to the South-West corner of the Nuyts Land District; thence by part of the West boundary of the said Land District and part of the District boundary to the production South of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 719/95, and along the said production and West boundary and its production North to the telegraph line, and following the said telegraph line Westward to an East and West line passing through Survey Mark N20; thence along said East and West line, passing through the said Survey Mark, and continuing to and along the North boundary of Reserve 2782 to intersect the Western boundary of the District near the North-East corner of Leake Location 102. (2 members.)

Gilmore Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the South boundary of the Cowan Ward from its intersection with the West boundary of the District to the production North of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 719/95; on the Eastward by the production and West boundary of said Pastoral Lease 719/95 to an East and West line passing through the North corner of Fitzgerald Location 1024; on the Southward by part of the said East and West line to the said North corner; thence along the North-East and North-West boundaries of Location 1013, the North-Western boundaries of Locations 1014 to 1018 inclusive, part of the North-East and the South-East boundaries of Locations 1163, 575, and 565, part of the North-East and North-West boundary of Location 506, the North-West boundaries of Locations 505, 469, 468, 465, 527, 1204, 528, 524, 1249, and 1247; thence West to the East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1129/95, and along part of the East, the South, and part of the West boundary of said Pastoral Lease, the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 1124/95, and continuing Westward to the District boundary; thence by part of said District boundary to the starting point. (1 member.)

Salmon Gums Ward.

Bounded by lines commencing on the South boundary of Location 228 at its intersection with the production North of the East boundary of Location 106 and extending East along part of the South boundary of said

Location 228, the Eastern boundary of Location 262, and part of the Eastern boundary of Location 243, a South and West boundary of Location 364, part of the West boundary of Location 735, the North boundary of Location 166, part of the Eastern and the North boundary of Location 167, the Northernmost boundary of Location 1197, and the East boundary of Location 106 to the starting point. (1 member.)

Dowak Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the South boundary of the Gilmore Ward; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the North corner of Location 506, and extending Southward along the North-Eastern boundaries of Locations 506, 503, 707, and part of the North-East boundary of Location 502, part of the South-East boundary of Location 379, and South-West boundary of Location 374, the Northern and South-Western boundaries of Location 373; thence by the Eastern side of the Esperance-Norseman Railway Reserve to the Northern boundary of the Salmon Gums Ward; thence by part of the boundaries of the Salmon Gums Ward, and again along the Eastern side of the said Railway Reserve to the District boundary; on the Southward and Westward by part of the District boundaries to the starting point. 34. The East Kimberley Quarantine Area means all that portion of the Kimberley Division bounded by the Southern boundary of such division starting at the point where the 127th meridian of East longitude cuts the

said boundary, and thence running East along the said boundary to the Western border of the Northern Territory; thence along such border to the sea; thence along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Prince Regent River; thence along the right bank of the said river to its source; thence by way of Mount Agnes and the Eastern side of the Caroline Ranges in the direction of Gemini Hills to the said Southern boundary of the said division, and thence along such boundary to the starting point: Provided always that for the purposes of this regulation all pastoral holdings which are partly within and partly without the said Quarantine Area upon that side thereof upon which the boundary thereof runs from the Prince Regent River to the Southern boundary of the Kimberley Division shall be deemed to be wholly within the boundaries of the said Quarantine Area hereby constituted.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this thirty-first day of May, 1929, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, W.A. Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, of the one part, and the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

Area and Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the Clerical Staff of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, with the exception of the Secretary, Treasurer, and Wharf Manager.

Definitions.

"Officer," "Worker" shall mean any member of the Clerical Staff of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, male or female, covered by this Agreement.

"Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust in office.

"Union" shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia.

"Secretary" shall mean the Secretary for the time being of the Union.

Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays, with the exception of the Wharf Staff and the Store Staff and the Exit Officers, whose ordinary hours shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays: Provided that this clause shall not apply to the Wharfingers.

Overtime.

Overtime shall mean all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty and shall be paid for as follows:—All time worked on the first five days of the week, at the rate of time and a half; all time worked after noon on Saturdays and all time worked on Sundays and holidays, at the rate of double time.

Overtime shall not be paid in any case where it is necessary for an officer to work in overtime hours in carrying out his ordinary duties, unless authorised by the Secretary.

Meal Money.

If an officer is required to resume work after 6 p.m. on any of the days, Monday to Friday inclusive, or after 1 p.m. on Saturdays, he shall, in addition to the overtime above referred to, be paid 2s. as the price of one meal on each such day. In the event of an officer working on Sundays or holidays he shall be paid 2s. for each meal when he is unable to leave his duties at 8 a.m., noon, or 4 p.m.

Rates of Pay.

These rates are based on a basic wage of £4 5s. per week for males and £2 5s. 11d. per week for females.

(b) Adults.—The salaries of members of the staff of an age greater than 24 years shall be as per attached Schedule of Range of Salaries, except where otherwise stated in such Schedule.

Annual Increments.

Where an officer is not receiving the maximum of his or her salary, such maximum shall be reached, in the case of male officers, by annual increments of £12 up to £336, and thereafter of annual increments of £24. In the case of female officers, over 21 years of age,

except where otherwise stated, first year—£181; second year—£191; third year—£204; thereafter £212: Provided that such advancement shall be approved by the Commissioners upon satisfactory report from the Secretary of the Harbour Trust to the Commissioners of his or her conduct, diligence, and efficiency, and provided also that the advancement in salary shall not be granted to an officer if the Commissioners determine that such officer has not performed his or her duties satisfactorily for the preceding twelve months, or that such officer has been guilty of misconduct, which in the opinion of the Commissioners justifies the postponement or refusal of the advancement.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to limit the power of the Commissioners to pay any officer at a higher rate within his grade or classification than that being paid where they may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the officer.

Higher Duties.

An officer called upon to perform the duties of a position higher in his or her grade or classification than he or she is already being paid, or of a position in a higher grade or classification, shall receive the difference between the salary he or she is then receiving and that which is paid to the officer so relieved, but only for the period he or she is performing the higher duties.

Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Anzac Day, Picnic Day, and all gazetted holidays.

Annual Holidays.

(b) All officers shall be granted a fortnight's holiday per annum, in accordance with Clause "B" of Regulation No. 12 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 21st July, 1911.

Long Service Leave.

(c) All officers shall be entitled to long service leave, in accordance with Clause "c" of Regulation No. 12 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 21st July, 1911. Any officer who is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next before his retirement, may be paid for long service leave pro rata to the day of retirement.

Sick Leave.

(d) All officers shall be entitled to sick leave, in accordance with Clause "d" of Regulation No. 12 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, dated 21st July, 1911.

Engagement.

The employment of any officer shall be terminated by one month's notice on either side, such notice to expire on the usual pay day.

Preservation of Accrued Rights.

Nothing herein contained shall affect any rights or privileges accrued to any officer prior to this Agreement.

Preference of Employment.

All officers shall be members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia; provided that any officer appointed, who at the time of engagement is not a member of the Union, shall become a member of the Union within fourteen days.

Record Book.

A record shall be kept showing the name of each worker under the Agreement, and the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from January 1st, 1929; provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement any term hereof may be reviewed by either party giving one month's notice of their desire to do so.

Determination of Special Board.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 49 of 1929.

In the matter of Section 72 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and in the matter of the appointment of a Special Board, on the application of the Commissioner of Railways for Western Australia, to determine a question as to the rights of workers in the Engineering calling to do certain work to the exclusion of workers in the Boilermaking calling.

The determination of this Board is as follows:—

1.—New Locomotive Frames.

The boilermakers shall straighten and anneal frame plates where necessary for marking out by engineers, and shall also perform any subsequent straightening by rolls or annealing.

The engineers shall mark out plates, fabricate, straighten if necessary by peening, assemble, fair up, and check.

The boilermakers shall drive and rivet any hot and cold rivets.

The engineers shall drive and nut bolts or studs.

2.—Repair Work and General Overhauls as regards Loco Frames.

The engineers shall repair by tools of trade or autogenous methods any repairs previously carried out by them, including repairs effected by oxy or other autogenous process.

The boilermakers shall cut away, straighten by platers any frame plates requiring the services of cutters-out, platers, and riveters.

The engineers shall replace any plates or parts which had been removed for repairs.

The boilermakers shall drive and rivet any hot and cold rivets required in repairs to locomotive frames.

3.—Tender Frames, Plate only.

The same conditions apply to repairs to tender frames, plate only, as to locomotive engine frames, plate only.

4.—Cabs.

The engineers shall by tools of trade or autogenous methods carry out all repairs or alterations previously effected by them to cabs, including panels, spectacle plates, tops, and stanchions. They shall also by tools of trade or autogenous methods cut contours, apertures, and holes as required in cabs *in situ*.

The boilermakers will effect all repairs to cabs generally, including spectacle plates, panels, etc., requiring the services of cutters-out, platers and riveters, and any work which has been previously carried out by them. Work to be done *in situ* or removed at the discretion of the management.

5.—Splashes.

The same practice to obtain as to cabs.

To the Hon. Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Chief Justice and Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia.

WHEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that, in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas the said Governor propose to absent myself temporarily from the seat of Government: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument, under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint you, the said Sir Robert Furse McMillan, as from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the seat of Government, and during such absence, to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on my behalf as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.
