WHEREAS it is provided by "The Vermin Act, 1918," that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and it is further provided by such Act that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State, to be defined by the Proclamation; and whereas it is desirable to declare Kangaroos to be vermin within the portions of the State hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation add "Kangaroos" to the Third Schedule of the

said Act: Provided, however, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the One-Day Dawn Vermin District.

WHEREAS by Section 14, Subsection 1 (a) of "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purposes of this Act, and specify the boundaries of any such district: And whereas it is enacted by Section 45, Subsection 1 of the said Act that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District to be the Board of any Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District: And whereas it is deemed expedient to constitute that portion of the State comprised within the boundaries of and known as Yilgarn Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as Yilgarn Vermin District: And also to constitute and appoint the Yilgarn Road Board as the Vermin Board for the said Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby constitute that portion of the State comprised within the boundaries of and known as Yilgarn Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as Yilgarn Vermin District, and doth hereby appoint the Yilgarn Road Board the Vermin Board for the said Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act.

Greenmount Road District.

The Greenmount Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect in the Greenmount Road District:—

The passage of heavy traffic over the Amherst Road, Balfour Road, Weld Road, Lionel Road, Harper Road (Wooroloo), Wooroloo-Northam Road, Elliott Road, Sexton Road, Sawyers' Road, and Scott Road, within the Greenmount Road District, during the months of June, July, August, and September in every year is hereby prohibited.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers, sawn or hewn, split and other timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, salt, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight thereof including any load exceeds 10 cwt. per wheel, both inclusive.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

Approach to the Owen Anchorage Stock Jetty.

CHANNEL IN OWEN ANCHORAGE, BETWEEN THE SOUTHERN LIMITS OF SUCCESS BANK AND THE NORTHERN LIMITS OF THE MIDDLE GROUND—RE-SURVEYED AND RE-MARKED.

Notice to Mariners.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners notify, for the information of those navigating vessels to and from the Owen Anchorage Stock Jetty, situated in Owen Anchorage, near Catherine Point, that the route from the Southern extremity of the channel through Success Bank, between Gage Roads and Owen Anchorage (described in Notice to Mariners dated 18th April, 1929), to the Stock Jetty, has now been re-surveyed and re-marked.

The Channel referred to as now marked by the buoys hereinafter described contains in it sufficient depth of water to enable it to be navigated by vessels of a maximum draft not exceeding 17ft. 6in. in a smooth sea.

The buoys now marking this Channel are as follows, viz.:—

Elbow Buoy—A flat-topped black buoy surmounted by a staff and cage; Latitude South 32deg. 6min. 00sec., Longitude East 115deg. 43min. 36sec.

N.W. Middle Ground Buoy—A red buoy surmounted by a conical shape; Latitude South 32deg. 5min. 50sec., Longitude East 115deg. 43min. 56sec.

Nook Buoy—A red buoy surmounted by a conical shape; Latitude South 32deg. 5min. 30sec., Longitude East 115deg. 44min. 22sec.

Success Spit Buoy—A flat-topped black buoy; Latitude South 32deg. 5min. 17sec., Longitude East 115deg. 44min. 32sec.

North-East Limit Buoy—A flat-topped black buoy; Latitude South 32deg. 5min. 12sec., Longitude East 115deg. 44min. 57sec.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 11 of 1928.

Between the West Australian Male and Female Mental Nurses' Association Industrial Union of Workers, Claremont, Applicant, and the Hon. Chief Secretary for Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

Award.

1.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be three years from the 22nd day of June, 1929: Provided, that the provisions of Clause 4, dealing with hours, shall come into operation not later than one calendar month from the date Award is delivered.

2.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all mental nurses and attendants who are employed in any Government Hospital, Mental Ward, or Home for Mental Cases in Western Australia which is within the jurisdiction and/or under the control of the Inspector General for Insane, but does not apply to the Hospital known as "Lemnos," which is exempted from the provisions of this Award.

3.—Definitions.

(a) "Attendant" means a mental nurse engaged in nursing, caring for, and/or working with insane or mental patients and who holds a mental nursing certificate, or who is in course of training for a mental nursing certificate as prescribed by the W.A. Government Regulations.

(b) "Charge Attendant" means the one attendant who is appointed by the Inspector General to be a charge attendant in charge of any Ward in the Hospital for the Insane at Claremont, except Wards 1, 2, 3, and 4, X Block.

(c) "Ward" means a collection of rooms set aside for the accommodation of mental patients, and which contain the necessary requirements for the care and supervision of such patients, and which prevent or could prevent the free passage of patients therefrom.

(d) "Head Attendant" means the worker appointed to the position of Head Attendant at the Claremont Hospital for Insane.

(e) "Deputy Head Attendant" means the worker appointed to the position of Deputy Head Attendant.

4.—Hours.

(a) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for the head attendant, deputy head attendant, or deputy matron.

(b) The ordinary working hours for all other workers shall be eighty-eight per fortnight, to be worked in eleven or twelve shifts: Provided, however, that, as regards the hospitals known as "Greenplace" and "Whitby," the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) "Greenplace": The ordinary working hours for the nurses employed at Greenplace shall be forty-seven per week. Such nurses shall be paid an allowance of 10s. per week each to cover the extra hours and also any occasions when they may be called upon outside their ordinary hours of duty.

(ii) "Whitby": The ordinary working hours for workers at Whitby shall be one hundred and seventy-six (176) hours in each four-weekly period.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of eight hours in any one shift shall be classed as overtime and paid for as follows:—First two hours, time and a quarter; thereafter, time and a half.

Provided that, where the overtime is necessitated through the attendance of the staff at concerts, picture shows, or other amusements for the patients, or where the overtime is necessary through the failure of another member of the staff to report for duty when rostered, the above conditions shall not apply, and equivalent time off shall be allowed in lieu thereof. Provided, further, that the conditions of this clause shall not apply to head attendant, deputy head attendant, or deputy matron, nor at Greenplace, for which provision is made in the preceding clause.

6.—Holidays.

(a) Annual: All male and female attendants, including head attendants, charge attendants, and deputy matron, shall be granted four weeks' leave on completion of each year of service: Provided, that a worker of six months' continuous service shall on termination of his engagement receive annual holidays in proportion as his period of service is to the number of days in the year.

(b) Public holidays: In addition to the foregoing annual holidays all workers shall be granted five public holidays, viz., New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or a day in lieu thereof.

(c) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to payment for any holidays which may be due under this clause at the time of resignation or dismissal: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for any offence no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

7.—General Conditions.

(a) While present conditions as to the number and class of patients continue there shall be two attendants on night duty in the following Wards:—No. 1 Hospital Male Ward 3, Claremont Hospital; No. 2 Male Ward.

(b) Every attendant shall be given the opportunity of acquiring by experience a thorough knowledge of hospital duties.

(c) Wherever possible or practicable no male attendant shall be required to work under the orders and directions of a female attendant of junior status to him.

(d) No male attendant shall take charge in any Ward in any Mental Hospital, Mental Observation Ward or Receiving Home for mental cases, unless in possession of a Mental Nursing Certificate, which shall have been issued in conformity with the W.A. Government Regulations governing the issue of such certificates. The same provision shall apply as regards female attendants, when the position of the staff as regards qualifications and experience and numbers will permit.

(e) Rosters shall be for fortnightly periods, except in the case of hospital wards, where the rosters may be for periods not exceeding one month: Provided, however, that in the case of attendants, male or female, who may so desire, special rosters may also be mutually arranged for periods not exceeding one month in the general wards.

8.—Sick Leave.

In the case of illness, provided a medical certificate is provided, full pay shall be allowed for the first fourteen days of such illness in each financial year. Should a longer period of sick leave be required, the question of extending full pay will be at the discretion of the Inspector General, subject to the limitations that such pay shall not exceed the amount provided for in Public Service Regulations: Provided, that no payment for sick leave will be made when the illness is due to worker's misconduct or to an accident met with off duty.

9.—Travelling Time.

A worker when travelling on duty away from his or her home station or headquarters shall not by reason or such travelling suffer any interruption of the continuity of his or her pay for ordinary working hours in each day, but no overtime shall be allowed for time occupied in travelling.

10.—Travelling Allowance.

Workers when travelling on duty outside the metropolitan area shall be paid a travelling allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per twenty-four hours; provided, there shall be a deduction of one-fourth of the said allowance for each item of expense of breakfast, dinner, lunch, or bed not necessarily incurred in any day. The allowance shall be computed from the time of leaving the worker's headquarters or home. The items of breakfast, lunch, dinner or bed will not be allowed if the worker leaves headquarters or home after or returns before 8 a.m., 1 p.m., or 6 p.m., and midnight. An additional allowance of twenty per cent. shall be allowed a worker for time spent in the area East of Merredin.

11.—Night Duty.

Prior to going on night duty an attendant shall, wherever practicable, come off duty at 4 p.m. and go on at 11.30 p.m. the same night.

12.—Post-mortem Attendance.

An allowance of 5s. and 2s. 6d. respectively shall be made, and stimulants provided, when required for any attendant and his assistant carrying out mortuary duties in connection with post-mortem examinations.

13.—Charges against Workers.

If a worker is formally charged under Section 187a of "The Lunacy Act, 1903-20," with an offence, he shall be given at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing prior to the hearing in which to prepare his defence; but this shall not prejudice the power under the Act of immediate suspension. The said period of twenty-four hours may be decreased upon the written request of the person charged.

14.—Uniforms.

Uniforms shall be supplied in accordance with the present practice: Provided, that the style of uniform may be altered if so desired by the Inspector General.

15.—Emergencies.

The Inspector General and the Medical Superintendent, or whoever for the time being may be in charge of any Mental Hospital in W.A., may at his or her discretion take such measures as may in his or her opinion be necessary for the protection, safety, or welfare of the patients, the staff, or the institution, and all instructions issued in pursuance of such special measures shall promptly and faithfully be carried out by all members of the staff to whom such instructions may be issued, and this shall be done without regard to whether or not such instructions may be in accordance with this Award.

16.—Higher Duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time engaged upon such higher work: Provided, that the higher rate shall not apply unless five hours in a shift are worked in the

higher capacity, and in cases where the higher duties are caused owing to a worker being absent through sickness, if the absent worker is in receipt of full pay the higher rate shall not be paid for the first four weeks.

17.—Old and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the wages awarded herein may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon between the Union and the Inspector General or his representative, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the rate shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may, in writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

18.—Rates of Pay.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 18 of 1928.

Between The Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch), Applicant, and The Chief Secretary, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

Award.

1.—Term.

The currency of the Award shall be three years from the 22nd day of June, 1929: Provided, that the provisions of Clause 4, dealing with hours, shall come into operation not later than one calendar month from the date the Award is delivered.

2.—Area and Scope.

The Award shall apply to all workers specified at any mental Hospital or Home for Mental Cases under the control of the State Government of Western Australia.

3.—Definitions.

"Head Cook" shall mean a cook who is in charge of the kitchen at the Claremont Hospital for Insane and is responsible for directing the activities of the kitchen staff, and for seeing that the instructions of the secretary and/or housekeeper are carried out.

"Second Cook, Claremont," means the person appointed by the Superintendent to fill that position.

"Head Launderess" shall mean the laundress at the Claremont Hospital for the Insane who is in charge of the Laundry and responsible for directing the activities of the laundry staff, and for seeing that the instructions of the secretary and/or housekeeper are carried out.

4.—Hours.

(1) The ordinary working hours for workers other than housekeeper, laundry workers, and farm hands shall be forty-four hours per week, to be worked in any six days in seven. There shall be no fixed hours for housekeeper and farm hands, but present conditions shall prevail.

(2) The hours of laundry workers shall be 176 in each period of four weeks—to be worked 46 hours in each of three weeks during period and 38 in the remaining week. The maximum hours to be worked without payment for overtime shall be $8\frac{1}{2}$, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and $3\frac{1}{2}$ on Saturdays; such hours to be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays, with a maximum of one hour off for meals, and 7.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.

5.—Overtime.

Except in regard to housekeeper, laundry workers, and farm hands, all time worked in excess of eight hours in any one shift or forty-four hours per week shall be classed as overtime and paid for as follows:—

(a) First two hours, time and a quarter; thereafter time and a half: Provided, that where the overtime is necessitated through the attendance of the staff at concerts, picture shows, or other amusements for the patients, or through failure of another member of the staff to report for duty when rostered, the above conditions shall not apply, and equivalent time off shall be allowed in lieu thereof.

(b) Similar overtime rates and conditions shall apply to any time worked by laundry workers outside of or in excess of hours specified in Clause 4.

6.—Holidays.

(a) Workers specifically mentioned in the wages schedule herein contained shall be granted two weeks' leave on full pay on completion of each year of service, together with board and lodging allowance in the case of any worker who is "living in."

In addition to the above, workers shall be granted the following five public holidays:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, New Year's Day, and Labour Day, or a day off in lieu thereof respectively.

(b) Annual leave may at the request of the worker and, with the approval of the Inspector General, be allowed to accumulate for two years, but no longer.

(c) Any worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months: Provided, that any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to payment for any holidays which may be due under this clause at the time of resignation or dismissal: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

7.—Rosters.

Rosters shall be for fortnightly periods.

8.—Sick Leave.

In the case of illness, provided a satisfactory medical certificate is provided, full pay shall be allowed for the first fourteen days of such illness in each financial year. Should a longer period of sick leave be required, the question of extending full pay will be at the discretion of the Inspector General, subject to limitation that such shall not exceed the amount provided in Public Service Regulations: Provided, that no payment for sick leave will be made when the illness is due to worker's misconduct or to an accident met with off duty.

9.—Charges against Workers.

If a worker is formally charged under Section 187a of "The Lunacy Act, 1903-20," with an offence, he shall be given at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing prior to the hearing in which to prepare his defence, but this shall not prejudice the power under the Act of immediate suspension.

10.—Uniforms,

Uniforms shall be supplied as under:—

Male Staff.

Gardeners—2 serge suits every year; 1 oilskin coat every two years.

Lodgekeepers—1 serge coat and vest every twelve months; 2 pairs trousers every year; 1 helmet every two years; 1 cap every three years; 1 waterproof coat every two years.

Hall Clerk—1 serge coat and vest every twelve months; 2 pairs trousers every twelve months; 1 cap every three years; 1 alpaca coat every 12 months.

Stewards—3 drill tunics every year; 1 serge vest every year; 2 pairs serge trousers every year.

Cooks—4 white drill suits every year; 6 white caps every year.

Female Staff.

Housekeeper—4 dresses, 4 pairs cuffs, 4 collars, 2 caps, 6 aprons every year.

Seamstress—3 print dresses every year.

Female Cook (Greenplace)—4 dresses, 4 pairs cuffs, 4 collars, 2 caps, 6 aprons every year.

Laundresses—4 print dresses, 4 collars, 1 sun hat, 6 aprons every year; W.P. cloaks and boots to be provided for laundry use when required.

Housemaids—4 print dresses, 4 collars, 6 aprons every year.

11.—Higher Duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall, subject to the hereinafter mentioned provisions, be paid such higher minimum for the time engaged upon such higher work: Provided, that the higher rate shall not apply unless a full shift is worked in the higher capacity. In cases where the higher duties are caused owing to a worker being absent through sickness, if the absent worker is in receipt of full pay, the higher rate shall not be paid for the first four weeks.

12.—Emergencies.

The Inspector General and the Medical Superintendent, or whoever for the time being may be in charge of any Mental Hospital in W.A., may at his or her discretion take such measures as may in his or her opinion be necessary for the protection, safety, or welfare of the patients, the staff, or the institution, and all instructions issued in pursuance of such special
