Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 6 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," that the Governor may from time to time make, alter, vary, or revoke such regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes in the said section mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to amend in the manner hereinafter mentioned in paragraph (1) of Regulation 54 of "The Stock Diseases Regulations, 1926," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1927: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend paragraph (1) of Regulation 54 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," in such manner that the said paragraph as amended shall read as follows:—

"54. (1.) Subject as hereinafter provided, and unless otherwise authorised by the Chief Inspector of Stock, every owner of sheep within the boundaries of the South-West Division of the State shall, on or before the 1st day of February in each year, dip or cause to be dipped in a swim bath prepared from some specific

known to be fatal to ticks and lice, all sheep running upon land whereof he is the owner or occupier. Provided that, in the case of sheep in the Armadale, Murray, Harvey, Drakesbrook, Bumbury, Dardanup, Donnybrook, Balingup, Greenbushes, Bridgetown, Warren, Nannup, Capel, Busselton, and Augusta Road Districts, as constituted under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it shall be sufficient for the purposes of these regulations if the requirements of this paragraph are carried out on or before the 31st day of March in each year."

POOR PERSONS LEGAL ASSISTANCE ACT, 1928.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations the expressions "Committee" and "Minister" shall have the same meanings as those contained in Section 2 of the Act.

2. Any person applying for assistance shall lodge with the Minister an application according to Form "A" or Form "B" in the First Appendix to these regulations, as the case may require, and shall make the declaration contained in such form.

3. For the purpose of deciding whether or not an applicant is a poor person and deserving of assistance, the Committee may make or cause to be made such investigations as it may deem necessary into the financial status and character of the applicant, and may require the applicant to furnish further particulars, or to attend before the Committee for examination.

4. If the Committee is satisfied that the applicant is a poor person and deserving of assistance, and such assistance has been applied for under Section 5 of the Act, the Committee shall lodge with the Minister a certificate according to Form "C" in the First Appendix to these regulations.

5. If the Committee is satisfied that the applicant is a poor person and deserving of assistance, and such assistance has been applied for under Section 7 of the Act, the Committee shall by notice according to Form "G" in the First Appendix, instruct a practitioner, whose name appears in the list of practitioners to be kept by the Minister, to prepare a statement of the applicant's case and to submit the same for the opinion of the Committee; and if the Committee after consideration thereof is of the opinion that the applicant has a case which ought to be taken or defended, the Committee shall lodge with the Minister a certificate according to Form "E" in the First Appendix to these regulations.

6. Whenever the Committee is of opinion that an applicant should receive assistance, it may recommend to the Minister that a practitioner whose name appears in the list of practitioners to be kept by the Minister shall be assigned for that purpose, and if such practitioner is able to act, the Minister shall assign such practitioner accordingly. For the purposes of this regulation the Minister shall furnish the Committee with a copy of the said list of practitioners.

7. Notice to a practitioner that he has been assigned to assist a poor person shall be according to Form "D" or Form "F" in the First Appendix to these regulations, as the case may require, and shall be signed by the Minister.

8. All applications referred by the Minister to the Committee, and all certificates given by the Committee, shall be conveyed to the Committee or the Minister, as the case may be, by the Secretary of the Law Society of Western Australia; and all communications from the Committee to applicants and from applicants to the Committee shall be made through the said secretary.

9. For the purpose of assisting the Minister in keeping the list of practitioners as provided in Section 4 of the Act, the Committee shall obtain the names of those practitioners being members of the Law Society of Western Australia who are willing to have their names inserted in the said list, and when inserted the names of such practitioners shall remain in the said list until withdrawn in writing signed by them, or until removed therefrom by the Minister, who shall be at liberty in his discretion to remove from the said list the name of any practitioner which in his opinion ought to be removed therefrom.

10. Practitioners who prepare statements of case for the opinion of the Committee under regulation 5, and practitioners who are assigned to assist poor persons under the Act and these regulations, shall be entitled to and shall receive only those fees which are prescribed in the scale of fees in the Second Appendix to these regulations in respect of the services rendered, together with such out of pocket expenses as shall actually and necessarily have been incurred: Provided, however, that in any special case supported by a recommendation in writing of the Judge or Magistrate by whom any matter has been tried, the Minister may in his discretion make such further allowance to a practitioner as he may think reasonable: And provided further, that in matters in which costs have been awarded in favour of a poor person, the fees payable to the practitioner under the said scale, together with any further allowance which may be granted by the Minister, shall not in any case exceed the amount of the costs recoverable from the opposite party.

11. If the practitioner assigned by the Minister and acting for a poor person shall die or become unable to continue so to act, or shall desire to withdraw before the matter in which he is so acting has been finally disposed of, the Minister may assign another practitioner in his place to act for such poor person until the matter is finally disposed of.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE WIRE AND WIRE NETTING ACT, 1926.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amended Regulations under the provisions of Section 7 of "The Wire and Wire Netting Act, 1926," those previously published being hereby cancelled.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations shall apply in respect to applications by settlers for the supply of wire (which term shall include fencing wire and barbed wire) and/or wire netting.

2. Applications for the supply of wire and/or wire netting shall be in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.

3. Upon the approval by the Minister of an application, the settler shall execute a mortgage over his holding as security for the payments for and in respect of the wire and/or wire netting, as prescribed by or under the Act. Such mortgage shall be in the form in the Second Schedule, or as near thereto as circumstances require.

4. The liability of the settler to the State in respect of the wire and/or wire netting supplied shall be discharged if the settler duly pays to the Minister half-yearly for twenty-five years a sinking fund contribution at the rate of Two pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the value of the wire and/or wire netting so supplied, and interest at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the value of the wire and/or wire netting so supplied.

5. Instalments secured under the mortgage shall be due and payable in advance on the first day of January and first day of July in each and every year of the term. The first instalment shall be payable on demand as prescribed in the said form, together with the fees for registering the mortgage, stamp duty thereon, the cost of preparation and registration of any documents necessary to put the settler's title in order, and the freight

on the wire and/or wire netting from the port of its entry into the State, or from the place of manufacture if within the State.

6. If the settler fails to return the documents sent to him for completion, and/or pay the moneys prescribed within 30 days from the receipt of a notice in writing requiring the return of such documents and/or the payment of such moneys, the Minister may cancel the application and its approval.

7. The Minister may confine approvals to any particular districts or localities, and decide the class of wire and wire netting to be supplied.

8. The maximum quantity of wire netting and, if required, the necessary quantity of wire for erection of the fence to carry such wire netting, which may be supplied to a settler in any one year shall not, unless with the special approval of the Minister, exceed five miles.

9. Wire and/or wire netting supplied shall be used within 12 months of its receipt by the settler in the erection of rabbit-proof fences as approved by the Minister, and for no other purpose. Such fences shall be erected on the external boundaries only of the lands mortgaged to secure the advance; provided, however, that where the nature of the ground renders the fencing liable to rapid deterioration, or the natural formation of the country prevents the erection of fencing on the surveyed boundaries, or for any other sufficient reason as may be accepted by the Minister, the Minister may, at his discretion, permit of the erection of such wire and/or wire netting in a position off the surveyed boundaries, but such permit shall be first obtained.

10. The construction of rabbit-proof fences for which wire and/or wire netting is supplied shall conform to the description in the Third Schedule, unless the consent of the Minister to any variation therein is first obtained.

11. Every fence of which any of the wire and/or wire netting supplied forms part shall, at all times during the continuance of the security, be maintained and kept rabbit-proof by the settler to the satisfaction of the Minister, or the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Act, 1918," or of some person for the time being acting in the inspection of such fence with the authority of the Minister or the Chief Inspector.

12. The Minister and the Chief Inspector, and any person acting with the authority of the Minister or Chief Inspector, may at any time during the continuance of the security enter upon the mortgaged premises and view the state of repair of such fence, and may serve upon the settler, or leave upon the mortgaged premises, a notice in writing of any defect therein requiring him within a reasonable time to repair the same, and the settler shall comply with the requisitions of such notice.

13. Where contribution towards the cost of any such fence is payable by an adjoining owner or occupier to the settler such contribution shall be payable to the Minister, and, if received, shall be applied in reduction of the instalments payable or to become payable under the mortgage; and the settler shall irrevocably appoint the Minister his attorney for the purpose of claiming, receiving, or recovering by action at law or otherwise, in the name of the settler, any such contribution as aforesaid; but nothing herein contained or expressed in the mortgage shall be deemed to impose any obligation on the Minister to recover such contribution.

14. In default of punctual payment of any half-yearly instalment at the time provided, and such default continuing for one calendar month, or if on the report of an inspector appointed under "The Vermin Act, 1918," or on any other report which the Minister after consultation with the Chief Inspector under the said Act deems trustworthy, the Minister is of opinion that any of the said wire and/or wire netting is not properly applied and maintained to and for the purpose for which it was supplied, or if any fence of which any such wire and/or wire netting forms part is not kept in a proper state of repair, or if default is made by the settler in the performance or observance of any covenant or stipulation contained in the mortgage, then and in any such case, the Minister may require the payment by the settler of a sum (as principal money) equal to the amount of the value of the wire and/or wire netting supplied, with interest thereon at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum, computed from the day on which the first instalment secured by the mortgage was deemed to have become due, after credit is given for such payments as may have been made by

the settler under the first covenant by the settler in his mortgage, and such sum as aforesaid of which payment is so required shall be paid by the settler to the Minister on demand, and in case of default by the settler in such payment all or any of the powers of the Minister under and by virtue of the mortgage may be exercised by him.

15. If any instalment secured under the mortgage is not paid as it becomes due, the settler shall pay to the Minister interest on the amount of such instalment at the rate of £7 per centum per annum from the due date to the date of actual payment.

16. The settler shall duly and punctually pay all land rents, rates and taxes, and all other outgoings payable for the time being in respect of the lands mortgaged.

17. The surveyed external boundary lines of the settler's holding along which the fence is to be erected with the wire and/or wire netting supplied to the settler shall first be cleared for a width of at least 20 feet, comprising 10 feet on each side of such boundary line. All limbs overhanging the 20 feet width of clearing shall be lopped and all trees leaning thereover shall be felled and cleared. All growth and debris of whatever kind resulting from the clearing operations shall be entirely removed off any part of such 20 feet width. In all watercourses, or in country liable to be flooded, such growth and debris must be removed to the downstream side of the cleared width.

18. If the wire and/or wire netting is not used by the settler for the purposes for which it is supplied within twelve months after its receipt, the Minister may, if he thinks fit, resume possession of the wire and/or wire netting, and in such case the wire and/or wire netting shall be deemed the property of the Minister, and may be disposed of as the Minister may think fit, and the settler shall pay to the Minister on demand the difference between the amount of the value of the wire and/or wire netting when supplied and its value when possession is resumed, and all expenses incurred by the Minister in and incidental to the said resumption to be assessed by the Accountant to the Department of Lands and Surveys, with interest at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum; and the amount so payable by the settler shall be principal money and interest payable under and secured by the mortgage, but on payment thereof the settler shall have the right, at his cost, to have his mortgage discharged.

FERTILISERS ACT, 1928.

Regulations.

1. Every registration under Section 4 of "The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1904," shall become inoperative on a day fixed by proclamation (1st November, 1929), but until such date shall continue in operation as if effected under that Act.

2. An application in duplicate for the registration of a fertiliser, with the certificate annexed, shall be in the form or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the First Schedule, and shall contain the particulars therein indicated. Provided that when any constituent mentioned in the schedule amounts in any fertiliser to less than one part per centum of the whole fertiliser its presence need not be registered.

Provided also that any lime or lime compound present as a constituent of any manufactured fertiliser or bone fertiliser shall not be separately declared.

3. The register shall consist of the original applications for registration bound together and intitled "The Register of Fertilisers."

4. A request for amendment of statement of composition of a fertiliser under paragraph (e) of Section 5 shall be in writing in duplicate signed by the applicant and addressed to the Director of Agriculture, in the form of Form No. 2 in the First Schedule, and such request shall be filed with the original application for registration and noted thereon.

5. The invoice to be given by a dealer to a purchaser pursuant to Section 12 shall be in the form of or to the effect of Form No. 3 in the schedule.

6. Paragraph (e) of Subsection (2) of Section 12 shall apply to the following fertilisers in respect of which a statement of the percentage of fine material shall be necessary:—

(a) Bone dust, bone meal, bone fertiliser, bone manure, and blood and bone.

(b) Basic slag and Thomas' phosphate.

(c) Ground limestone and lime sand.

7. Fine material in the case of bone dust, bone meal, bone fertiliser, bone manure, and blood and bone shall include:—

(a) All material which will pass a sieve with circular holes three-sixteenths of an inch in diameter.

(b) All material which will pass an Institute of Mining and Metallurgy (I.M.M.) standard sieve of 20 meshes to the linear inch.

In the case of such fertilisers fine material (a) shall comprise not less than 95 parts per centum of the whole, and fine material (b) not less than 65 parts per centum of the whole.

8. Fine material in the case of basic slag and Thomas' phosphate shall include:—

(a) All material which will pass an I.M.M. standard sieve of 30 meshes to the linear inch.

(b) All material which will pass an I.M.M. standard sieve of 90 meshes to the linear inch.

In the case of such fertilisers fine material (a) shall comprise not less than 95 parts per centum of the whole, and fine material (b) not less than 80 parts per centum of the whole.

9. Fine material in the case of ground limestone and lime sand shall include all material which will pass an I.M.M. standard sieve of 20 meshes to the linear inch. In the case of such fertilisers it shall comprise not less than 80 parts per centum of the whole.

10. Before such will be registered the declared minimum chemical standards of the undermentioned fertilisers shall be:—

Basic slag or Thomas' phosphate Total phosphoric acid (P_2O_5) 14 per cent.

Bone dust or bone meal .. Nitrogen (N) 2.5 per cent. Total phosphoric acid (P_2O_5) 18 per cent.

Blood and bone Nitrogen (N) 5.0 per cent. Total Phosphoric acid (P_2O_5) 9.0 per cent.

Superphosphate Water-soluble phosphoric acid (P_2O_5) 18 per cent.

Ground limestone or lime sand Total lime (CaO) 42 per cent.

Gypsum Crystallised calcium sulphate ($CaSO_4 \cdot 2H_2O$) 85 per cent.

11. In any parcel of fertiliser the permitted limits of deviation from the registered or prescribed physical and chemical standards for such fertiliser shall be as follows:—

Fine material	5	per cent. deficiency.
Nitrogen (N)	0.5	” ”
Phosphoric acid (P_2O_5), total	1.5	” ”
” ” water soluble	0.5	” ”
” ” citrate soluble	0.5	” ”
” ” acid soluble	0.5	” ”
Potash (K_2O), water soluble	0.5	” ”
Lime (CaO)	7.0	” ”

Provided that in the case of a fertiliser containing phosphoric acid in more than one form, any excess of water soluble or citrate soluble P_2O_5 may be set off against a deficiency of acid soluble P_2O_5 , and any excess of water soluble P_2O_5 against a deficiency of citrate soluble P_2O_5 or *vice versa*.

Provided also that in the case of bone dust, bone meal, and blood and bone, any deficiency of nitrogen may be considered as compensated for by an excess of phosphoric acid (P_2O_5) not less than four times the deficiency of nitrogen, and any deficiency of phosphoric acid by an excess of nitrogen not less than one-fourth the deficiency of phosphoric acid (P_2O_5).

12. The method of sampling any fertiliser to be adopted by an Inspector or Analyst under the Act shall be as follows:—

Representative portions of the fertiliser shall be taken from at least one of every ten bags or other packages in a stock or consignment, and the portions so taken shall be well mixed at once, any lumps therein being broken up during the process. Provided that the sample shall always be drawn from at least five packages in any consignment unless the total quantity is contained in less than five packages, when portions shall be drawn from each package. From the mixed material a representative portion weighing not less than 3 lbs. adp. shall be taken and divided into three approximately equal parts and each sealed in air-tight containers. One of these shall be handed to the vendor, one to the analyst, and one retained by the Inspector as a referee sample.

13. A fertiliser sample shall be prepared for analysis by crushing rapidly to pass a commercial 30 mesh sieve, mixing well and putting a representative portion into an air-tight vessel, from which portions shall be taken for each individual analysis.

Where a sample as received is too moist to pass easily through a 30 mesh sieve, the whole of it shall be weighed, partly dried at a temperature of $80^\circ C.$, and reweighed before crushing, and an allowance in the final calculation made for the moisture removed.

14. The method of analysis to determine the moisture shall be as follows:—

A portion of the prepared sample shall be weighed between two tightly-fitting clamped watch glasses, the clamp and cover glass removed, and the fertiliser dried in an oven at a temperature between 98° and $102^\circ C.$ for one hour. Whilst still hot the glasses shall be clamped together, cooled to room temperature in a desiccator and reweighed. The loss in weight is to be taken as moisture.

15. The methods of analysis to determine the nitrogen shall be as follows:—

(a) Sulphate of ammonia or other ammonium salts. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be dissolved in a measured quantity of water, an aliquot portion distilled with caustic soda or potash, and the vapour condensed in a measured amount of standard acid, the remaining free acid being determined by titration with standard alkali, and the nitrogen content calculated from the quantity of acid neutralised.

(b) Nitrate of soda or other nitrates in absence of organic matter. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be dissolved in a measured quantity of water, an aliquot portion transferred to a flask, and Devada metal added at the rate of six times the amount of salt in the assay. An excess of concentrated alkali is added and the flask connected to a distillation apparatus. After standing about 30 minutes, the liquid shall be distilled and titrated as in (a).

(c) Organic nitrogen compounds with or without ammonia, in the absence of nitrates. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be placed in a Kjeldahl flask with sufficient concentrated sulphuric acid and warmed until reaction moderates. Potassium or sodium sulphate is added and the whole heated till all organic matter is destroyed. The process may be assisted by addition of copper sulphate or mercury, provided that when mercury is used sodium sulphide shall be added before distilling. To the resulting liquid excess of alkali is added, and the whole distilled and titrated as in (a).

(d) Organic nitrogen compounds, with or without ammonia, in the presence of nitrates. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be placed in a Kjeldahl flask, and concentrated sulphuric acid containing about 2 per cent. of salicylic acid added, and the flask immediately shaken for a short time in the cold. Potassium sulphate, and either sodium thiosulphate or zinc dust shall then be added, and the flask heated till all organic matter is destroyed. Copper sulphate or mercury may be used in addition, provided that when mercury is used sodium sulphide shall be added before distilling. Thereafter the mixture is treated as in (c).

16. The methods of analysis to determine the phosphoric acid (P_2O_5) shall be as follow:—

A.—Superphosphate:

(1) Water-soluble phosphoric acid. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be continuously agitated with 50 parts of cold distilled water in an incompletely filled vessel at air temperature for 30 minutes. The mixture shall be filtered into a measuring flask holding not less than 100 parts of water, and the residue on the filter thoroughly washed with cold water and the filtrate finally made up to the measured mark, and shaken. An aliquot portion of the clear filtrate is taken, acidified with nitric acid and boiled. After cooling below $70^\circ C.$ an excess of nitromolybdic acid solution is added and the solution brought to $70^\circ C.$ and maintained at that temperature for 30 minutes or more. After cooling, the precipitate is filtered and washed with cold water carrying 1 per cent. of nitromolybdic acid solution. The precipitate is then dissolved in about 150 cc. of cold 2E (3.5 per cent.) ammonia, one gramme of solid ammonium chloride added, the solution heated to about $80^\circ C.$ and magnesia mixture added drop by drop with constant stirring until an excess is present. The solution is chilled, and after standing at least six hours with occasional stirring, is filtered. The precipitate is converted into magnesium pyrophosphate and weighed. (Factor, 0.6380.)

(2) Citrate-soluble phosphoric acid. This shall be taken as the difference between the total phosphoric acid and the sum of the water-soluble and acid-soluble phosphoric acid.

(3) Acid-soluble phosphoric acid. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be placed in a vessel with 50 parts of standard neutral ammonium citrate solution warmed to $65^\circ C.$ and shaken frequently over a period of 30 minutes. The mixture is then filtered rapidly, and the residue washed with hot water, the filtrate being rejected. The residue and filter ash are returned to the flask and boiled with 25cc. of strong nitric acid and 5 cc. strong hydrochloric acid. After dilution the solution is filtered, an aliquot portion taken, and the P_2O_5 in solution precipitated as described in par. A (1).

Neutral ammonium citrate solution of specific gravity 1.09 shall be prepared by placing 779 grammes of citric acid crystals in a vessel marked at 4 litres (approximate), and adding thereto two litres of ammonia solution of 0.96 specific gravity. Then stir till the acid is dissolved and make up to the mark with distilled water. Pour into a shallow open vessel and leave exposed over night to allow any free ammonia to escape. Bottle and check neutrality with litmus paper.

(4) Total phosphoric acid. A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be boiled with 20 parts of a fresh mixture of 2 parts of strong hydrochloric acid with one part of strong nitric acid, and evaporated to small bulk. Excess of nitric acid is added, the solution boiled, diluted and filtered. The filtrate is made up to a definite volume, and an aliquot part taken and treated as in A.

(5) Alternative method of precipitation. In determining the water-soluble, acid-soluble, or total phosphoric acid, the acid solution may be alternatively treated in the following manner. The solution is made just alkaline with strong ammonia, then just acid with hydrochloric acid, and 50 cc. of standard ammonium citrate solution added. After making alkaline with ammonia, magnesia mixture is added drop by drop with constant stirring. Finally sufficient strong ammonia is added to bring the whole solution to 2E (3.5 per cent.) strength in ammonia. After standing in the cold for at least six hours with occasional stirring, the precipitation is filtered off, converted into magnesium pyrophosphate and weighed.

B.—Phosphatic Fertilisers containing Organic Matter:

(1) Total phosphoric acid. A weighed quantity of the prepared sample shall be mixed with an equal weight of pure lime in a wide open vessel and the mixture slowly raised to a dull red heat, and kept at that temperature for 15 minutes. The mass is then cooled and treated as under A (4).

(2) Water-soluble phosphoric acid. A weighed portion of the sample shall be treated as in A (1), but the aliquot portion of liquid taken for the analysis

shall be boiled down to small bulk with sufficient aqua regia to destroy any dissolved organic matter, then boiled with a little extra nitric acid, diluted and treated as in A (1) or (5).

(3) Acid-soluble phosphoric acid. A weighed portion of the fertiliser shall be treated with standard ammonium citrate as described in A (3), the filtrate rejected, and the residue dried, mixed with an equal quantity of lime and ignited as under B (1). Thereafter the residue is treated as under A (3).

(4) Citrate-soluble phosphoric acid. This shall be taken as the difference between the total phosphoric acid and the sum of the water-soluble and acid-soluble phosphoric acid.

17. The method of analysis to determine the Potash (K_2O) shall be as follows:—

A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be boiled for 15 minutes with 50 parts of distilled water, the mixture filtered into a measuring flask holding not less than 100 parts of water, and the residue on the filter thoroughly washed with hot water, and the filtrate cooled and finally made up to the measured mark. An aliquot portion of the clear filtrate is taken, and after first adding a few cc. of barium chloride solution to precipitate most of the sulphate, sufficient barium hydroxide solution is added to precipitate all magnesia, iron, phosphate, and sulphate. The liquid is brought to the boil and filtered and the precipitate washed with hot water. To the warm filtrate a few cc. of ammonium hydrate is added and then sufficient ammonium carbonate to precipitate all the barium and calcium in the solution, which is then kept at about $95^\circ C.$ for not less than fifteen minutes and filtered. The filtrate is evaporated to dryness in a platinum or silica dish, moistened with dilute hydrochloric acid, and again evaporated and then heated below the faintest redness until all ammonium salts are driven off. The residue is cooled and moistened with a few drops of hydrochloric acid, warm water added and the solution filtered into a weighed platinum or silica dish. An excess of platinic chloride solution is added and the liquid evaporated on a steam bath to a syrupy consistency. The dish is cooled and alcohol of 86 per cent. strength (sp. gr. 0.833 at $16^\circ C.$) added, and the residue washed by decantation with cold alcohol of this strength, the washings being passed through a small filter. The filter is finally washed with a few cc. of boiling water and the washings caught in the weighed dish. The contents are dried at $100^\circ C.$ and weighed, and the weight of the contents multiplied by the factor 0.1938 to obtain the weight of K_2O .

18. The method of analysis to determine the lime (CaO) in ground limestone, lime sand, caustic lime, or slaked lime shall be as follows:—

A weighed portion of the prepared sample shall be treated with 20 parts of dilute (5E) hydrochloric acid, and after effervescence has mostly subsided, a little potassium chlorate shall be added and the solution boiled for five minutes. It is then diluted and filtered. To the filtrate is added ammonium chloride and a slight excess of ammonium hydrate, and the liquid brought to the boil and filtered. To the hot filtrate an excess of ammonium oxalate is added, and the liquid kept at about 90° for an hour or more and then filtered, and the precipitate well washed with hot water. The precipitate is ignited to CaO and weighed.

19. The method of analysis to determine the crystallised calcium sulphate in gypsum shall be as follows:—

Part of the prepared sample shall be further ground to pass a 90 mesh sieve and a weighed portion so ground placed in a vessel with 600 parts of recently boiled distilled water. The mixture shall be agitated continuously or at frequent intervals for an hour, allowed to stand over night and again agitated. It is then filtered, made slightly acid with hydrochloric acid, a crystal of potassium chlorate added and boiled. Some ammonium chloride is added, and a slight excess of ammonium hydrate, the solution boiled, and filtered if turbid. To the hot filtrate excess of ammonium oxalate is added, and the liquid kept at about 90° for an hour or more and then filtered, and the precipitate well washed with hot water. The precipitate is ignited to CaO and weighed and the whole of the CaO thus found calculated to $CaSO_4 \cdot 2H_2O$ (Factor 3.07).

20. Analysts under the Act shall be appointed by the Governor in Council on the advice of the Director of Agriculture and the Government Analyst, and their appointment may be cancelled by the same authority.

21. A certificate of analysis under the Act shall be in the form of, or to the effect of Form 4 in the First Schedule.

22. The fees payable under the Act for registration, and matters incidental thereto, and for analyses, shall be as set out in the Second schedule.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 8th day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, between the Board of Management of the Perth Hospital; the Board of Management of the Fremantle Public Hospital; Children's Hospital, Incorporated; Home of Peace, Incorporated; and the Minister for Public Health for the State of Western Australia, as the Minister controlling the King Edward Memorial Hospital and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle (the said Minister for Public Health entering into these presents in respect of the said King Edward Memorial Hospital and Old Women's Home, Fremantle, only) (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch), (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year from the 1st July, 1929,

3.—Definition.

"Head Orderly."—The term "Head Orderly" shall mean a person performing the duties of an orderly and who is responsible for directing the activities of other orderlies.

4.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty-four hours to be worked on any six days of the week shall constitute a week's work for workers employed at the King Edward Memorial Hospital and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle.

(b) Laundry workers:—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work and, except where other hours are mutually agreed upon between the Union and any Institution, shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

(c) In the event of altered hours being required by any Institution and the Union not agreeing to such alteration, the matter may be referred to a Reference Board for decision.

(d) All other workers:—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked on any six days of the week.

5.—Overtime.

(a) Laundry Staff:—All time worked in excess of eight hours on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four hours on Saturdays shall be regarded as overtime, and be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) All other workers:—All time worked on any day in excess of the time for which the worker is rostered shall be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half: Provided that if the overtime is occasioned through the failure of another worker to report for duty, equivalent time off duty may be granted in lieu of paying for overtime.

(c) Workers required to work on the day in which they are rostered off duty shall, at the option of the worker, be paid at the rate of double time for time worked or be paid at ordinary rates and allowed equivalent time off.

(d) Workers called upon to work, in addition to ordinary duties, in the venereal clinic at night shall, for time so worked during the night, be paid at the rate of time and a half.

6.—Rosters.

Weekly rosters shall be kept posted in a convenient place, setting out the hours of starting and finishing, and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the day each worker is booked off duty. Such roster must be posted not less than twenty-four hours preceding the day on which the roster commences.

7.—Time Book.

(a) A time book, to be open for inspection by the Union Secretary at reasonable time, shall be provided. Each worker must record in such book the exact time he or she starts and finishes duty on each day, and also the time booked off for meals or breaks in shift; provided, that if the "clocking system" be introduced it will, for the purpose of this clause, be considered as a time book.

(b) The wages sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection by the Secretary at the Head Office of the Institution.

8.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. Any worker required to work on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time or be allowed time off in lieu thereof.

(b) A holiday of two weeks on full pay, together with a board and lodging allowance of £1 5s. 9d. per week in the case of those workers who are paid on a living-in basis, shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

9.—Sick Leave.

(a) In the case of illness, provided a satisfactory medical certificate is furnished, full pay shall be allowed as follows:—

Workers with less than six months' service—Nil.

Workers with six months and less than one year's service—14 days.

Workers with one year and less than two years' service—28 days.

Workers with two years' service and over—42 days.

Such sick leave shall be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall be as provided.

(b) The total sick leave in any one triennial period shall not exceed 42 days; the triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which leave is claimed.

(c) No payment for sick leave shall be made when the illness is due to the worker's own misconduct or to an accident met with off duty.

(e) (i) Orderlies performing special duties, such as night calls, shaving for surgical purposes, bath orderly, V.D. orderly, and laundry boiler attendant shall be paid at the rate of 5s. per week extra. Mortuary orderly, 5s. per week extra, but will not be entitled to payment for overtime incurred through mortuary duties.

(ii) When an orderly relieves a worker of duties carrying a special allowance such relieving orderly to be paid the special allowance at the rate of 10d. per day.

(iii) (a) When workers who are not entitled to board and lodging "live-in" a charge of £1 5s. 9d. per week will be made for board and lodging.

(b) Workers whose wages are computed on a living-in basis, and are required to live out, shall receive £1 5s. 9d. per week in addition to the rate specified. If required to lodge out only they shall be paid 8s. 7d. per week in addition to the rate specified.

(c) Where employees who are paid on living out basis are provided with meals by the Institution a deduction shall be made from the wages at the rate of 9d. for each meal provided.

11.—Payment of Wages.

Wages, including overtime if any, shall be paid fortnightly, and such payment shall be made in cash.

12.—Dressing Room.

Reasonable facilities for rest rooms for those boarding-in and dressing rooms for laundry staff living out shall be provided.

13.—Uniforms.

(a) All uniforms, i.e., uniformity in dress, shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them. Aprons shall be provided for all female workers on the Kitchen and General Staff.

(b) Suitable clothing shall be available for men on dirty work.

(c) Boots shall be available for kitchenmen, laundrymen, and washhouse-woman.

14.—Casual Workers.

All persons engaged for a period of less than six days in any one week shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day: Provided, that this shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct.

15.—General Clauses.

(a) No female worker shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about any Institution.

(b) A worker required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day, must be so informed before booking off on the day previous.

(c) All washing to be provided as at present.

(d) Space shall be provided at the workers' quarters for the purpose of posting Union notices.

(e) A worker who is required to do work which carries a higher rate in this Agreement than that which such worker usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.

(f) When a worker is entitled to annual leave under this Agreement, such worker shall be given at least two weeks' notice of the date when such leave is to commence.

(g) Copy of this Agreement shall be posted in a conspicuous position by the Secretary or Chief Resident Medical Officer of every Institution.

(h) Overtime rates shall be calculated and based on the aggregate wage, i.e., the amount paid in cash plus the deduction for board and/or lodging.

(i) If a worker's day off falls on a day prescribed by this Agreement as a holiday such worker shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof.

(j) Letter racks shall be provided in the dining rooms for male and female workers.
