Between Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia (West Australian Branch) Association of Workers, Applicant, and The Hons. The Minister for Works, The Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, The Minister for Agriculture, and The Chief Sceretary, in the State of Western Australia, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed partics:---

Award. 1.—Hours.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work.

(a) Such ordinary hours shall not exceed eight hours on the first five days of the week and four hours ending noon on Saturdays. Provided that employees shall, if required, work seven shifts, each of eight hours in the week, Sunday time to stand alone.
(b) The hours of labour shall include all time occu-

(b) The hours of labour shall include all time occupied in raising steam, banking fires, starting up or closing down of engines.(c) In connection with shift work on construction

(c) In connection with shift work on construction jobs the first shift in two-shift work shall work eight hours, not including any crib time; all other shifts to be of eight hours, including half an hour crib time, i.e., $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours' actual working time.

2.—Overtime.

(a) With the exception of employees working seven shifts all time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four hours; after the usual stopping time, time and a half, and thereafter double time.

(b) In the case of employees working seven shifts (b) In the case of employees working seven shifts the first four hours in excess of forty-four in any one week shall be paid for at time and a quarter, and thereafter at time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. The provisions of Clause 2 (a) shall apply to seven-shift workers in regard to work performed in excess of eight hours on any one day.

performed in excess of eight hours on any one day. (c) Provided, that employees called to start work within an hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time.

(d) Should a worker be called back after completing a day's work, he shall be paid a minimum of two hours at overtime rates.

(e) For all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, double time rates shall be paid: Provided, that employees working seven shifts a week shall be paid time and a half for Sundays.

3.-Holidays.

(a) Subject to Subclause (c) hereunder, two weeks' leave shall be granted to each employee provided that, with the exception of employees working seven shifts per week, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be taken as they come as portion of the leave.

(b) The balance of one week shall be granted to each employee at the convenience of the Department.

After one month's continuous service, leave in proportion as the length of service is to the full period of leave for the twelve months. (d) Payment for holidays shall be made in accordance with the usual hours worked.

4.—Wages.

Basic wage-£4 7s. 0d. per week.

(23) Workers at Wooroloo shall receive sixpence per day extra.

(24) Any person engaged inside the gas or water space of any boiler flue or economiser in cleaning or scraping work shall, whilst so employed, be paid in addition to his ordinary rate or overtime rate of 6d. per hour.

- (25) Casual workers shall be paid 10 per cent. over the usual rate in this Award for the employee's occupation. A casual worker is one for whom work, over a period of twelve consecutive days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer.
- (26) It is also agreed, subject to Clause 9:---
 - (a) that the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, subject to the following condition, namely, that if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week, no work is available or performed, the em-ployee will only be paid for the time actually worked, at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours) apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and
 - (b) that notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee was employed at an hourly wage.
 - (c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) are in conformity with existing practice, which will continue and be observed.

5,-Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift, shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided, that such minimum rate is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at the work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

6.-Firing and Minor Repairs.

(a) Engine-drivers shall, where it is reasonable, do their own firing and shall also do such minor repairs to the plant as in the opinion of the Engineer in Charge can be done during their shift. Where the reasonable-Machinery shall decide this question.

(b) Drivers of all steam-driven locomotive engines of more than 20 tons gross weight shall have the assistance of a competent fireman not less than 18 years of age. For petrol, crude oil, or other internal combustion locomotive engines, or for steam-driven locomotives of not more than 20 tons gross weight, it shall be at the option of the Engineer in Charge whether a fireman shall be employed.

7,-Rotation of Shifts.

Employees shall be allowed to rotate shifts, and change of shifts shall, as far as possible, be arranged to suit transport facilities.

8.-Payment of Fares.

Employees sent to work occasionally at some place other than where they usually work shall be paid necessary travelling fares.

9.-Shift Workers.-Guaranteed Work.

Employees working seven shifts shall be guaranteed six days work per week.

10 .- Right of entry to Works.

On notifying the Officer in Charge, any officer of the Union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such Union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such Union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises. Provided, that such officer shall not hamper or other-

wise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The Officer in Charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work.

11 .- Retention of Merit Money, etc.

In the case of any employee who is being paid above the minimum rate applicable under previous Award or arrangement to other workers doing the same class of

work, such employees shall not suffer, by reason of this Award only, any reduction of the additional sum so paid over and above the above-mentioned minimum rate.

12 .--- Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Award to members of the Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Workers of Western Australia.

13.-Payment of Wages.

When an employee is discharged before the usual pay day he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post, at the employer's risk, unless the employee desires to collect at the office.

14.-Broken Shifts.

Should any employee not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day, he shall be paid for that day if he (duly presents himself for work at the appointed time; unless he can-not be employed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, in which case he shall be notified forthwith of the cause why he cannot be employed and shall be entitled to two hours' pay.

15.—District Allowances.

District allowances as specified below shall be paid to workers in the undermentioned areas :-

(1) Within 100 yards from any water main, pipe, dam, or well controlled or to be laid or constructed by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage:-

- (a) Mundaring up to Merredin, sixpence per day.
- (b) Including Merredin up to Kalgoorlie and Goon-garrie inclusive, and to Coolgardie and Widgie-mooltha inclusive, one shilling and sixpence per day.
- (c) Beyond Widgiemooltha or Goongarrie, one shil-(d) East of Mullewa and including Mt. Magnet, one
- shilling and sixpence per day. (c) Beyond Mt. Magnet, North and East, one shilling
- and ninepence per day.
- (f) Within Government Reserve 14073, Wooroloo, sixpence per day.
- (g) Geraldton and within a distance of 20 miles thereof, threepence per day.

(2) Within an area of five miles from the following places on the coast:-

- (a) Carnarvon, three shillings and eightpence per day.
- (b) Onslow, Point Sampson, Port Hedland, four shillings and eightpence per day. (c) Broome, Derby, five shillings and eightpence per
- day.
- (d) Wyndham, seven shillings and eightpence per day.

16.—Area.

The area comprised within the State of Western Australia.

17.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be for three years from date hereof: Provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, the Court may amend or revise on the application of any party or persons affected by its provisions.

18 .- Scope of Award.

This Award shall apply to workers employed by the Minister for Works, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, the Minister for Agriculture, and the Chief Secretary, in the State of Western Australia, but it shall not apply to locomotive drivers, locomotive firemen, and locomotive cleaners employed on kailway construction work or other works where industrial agreements are in force.

The principle of one mile per day has been adopted, for the completion of the platelaying on the Meeka-tharra-Wiluna Railway, to be worked by two half-mile gangs.

(a) 1st ½-mile gang to comprise 31 men.

(b) 2nd 1/2-mile gang to comprise 31 men plus four loaders.

Victualling of men: The Department undertakes to pay the boarding-house keeper the cost of one extra meal per day over and above the cost of 35s. per week now paid by the men.

In the case of batchers, the Department also undertakes to pay them the same extra in cash as is paid to the boarding-house keeper.

Where there is no shade the Department undertakes to erect tarpaulins to provide shade.

Standing Orders.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in after set out, and do make and order the following:-

By_law No. 1.

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to the following rules, which shall be called the Standings Orders :-

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this By-law, unless the con-text otherwise requires, the word "Mayor" shall in-clude the Councillor chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

The Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and in his absence, or if after being present he retires, one of the Councillors chosen by the Councillors present shall preside.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than three Councillors in addition to the Mayor, or not less than three Councillors in audition to the Mayor, or not less than four (4) Councillors in the absence of the Mayor. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in at-tendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in absence of quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum is not present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the majority of the Councillors present, or the Town Clerk if no Councillor be present, may adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.

Count out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council 6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a Councillor shall call the attention of the Mayor to the fact that a quorum is not present, the Mayor shall there-upon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to come future data. adjourn it to some future date.

Record of Councillors present.

7. At all meetings at which there are not present three Councillors and the Mayor, or four Councillors as the case may be, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the Councillors then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open doors.

[1929.

8. The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council shall by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

Reporters.

At all meetings accredited newspaper reporters 9. shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Council Chamber as may be appropriated for their accommoda-tion, but they shall withdraw upon a vote of the Council so requiring during any portion or the whole of the meeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The admission of citizens, reporters, and visitors to the Council Chamber shall be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or ap-proval, conversation, or interruption to the proceedings of the Council shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this regulation, the Mayor may, at his discre-tion, and without a vote of the Council, require the per-son or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Council Chamber.

Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Council, 11. Any person, not being a member of the Council, who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Council, who does not, immediately upon being called upon by the Mayor so to do, withdraw from the Council Chamber, may by order of the Mayor be arrested and removed from the Council Chamber forthwith by any officer of or other persons appointed by the Council, or by members of the police force acting at the request of the Council the Council.

Business of Council Meetings.

Order of Business.

12. The order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be prac-ticable; but for the greater convenience of the Council, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:-

- (1) Confirmation of Minutes.
 (2) Outward Correspondence ordered by the Council.
- Inward Correspondence.
- (4) Announcements by the Mayor, without discussion. Questions of which due notice has been given, (5)
- without discussion. Petitions and Memorials and Tenders.
- Reports of Committees and Officers.
- Orders of the Day, including considering and ordering upon business left over from the (8) previous meeting, and any business the Mayor
- may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day, and motions of which previous notices have been given. (9) Ordinary business.
- (10) Notices of Motion for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order at Special Meetings.

13. The order of the business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Minutes.

14. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the Mayor as by Section 176 of the Act required.

Questions.

15. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk prior to the meeting.

16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Notices of Motion.

17. Any Councillor may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the Town Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than seven clear days before such last-mentioned meeting.

Motion to Lapse.

18. Every such motion shall lapse unless the Councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

Deputations.

Reception of Deputations.

19. Deputations wishing to be received by the Coun-cil shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the Town Clerk shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned, which shall be authorised, if it see fit, to receive the deputa-tion and to report to the Council. If the Committee is of opinion that the memorial is one that should be brought before the Council, the Committee shall so reshould be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.

20. A deputation shall not exceed six in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

Conduct of Debate.

Councillors to address the Chair-Point of Order.

21. Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon, and the question of order has been disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the Chair may proceed.

Nature of Motion to be stated.

22. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of same before he addresses the Council thereon, and, if so re-quired by the Mayor, shall put the same in writing.

Motions to be seconded-Enforcement of Standing Orders.

23. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless i be seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.

24. At meetings of the Council, speakers in refer-ring to others present thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.

25. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Mayor to speak.

Whenever the Mayor rises during a debate any 26.Councillor then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Council is to be silent so that the Mayor may be heard without interruption.

Councillor not to speak twice.

27. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. And no Councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

Calling to order for speaking twice.

28. The Mayor shall, without waiting for the inter-position of the Council, call to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same ques-tion.

Mover and Seconder speaking to Motion.

29. A Councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Councillor merely seconding a motion pro forma shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

No speaking after Notice put.

30. No Councillor may speak to any question after the same has been put from the Chair.

Time Limit.

31. No Councillor shall speak or address the Council upon any motion or amendment before the Council, or in reply for a longer period than ten minutes with-out the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

Speaking in Reply.

32. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Complicated Resolutions.

33. The Mayor, at his discretion, may, or the Council may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of several resolutions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

34. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Production of Documents.

35. Any Councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection upon Vote of Council.

36. No Councillor shall reflect upon any vote of the Council except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

All Councillors to Vote.-Casting Vote.

37. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, all the Councillors present shall vote. If there be an equal division of votes upon any question the Mayor, or Councillor chosen to preside at such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote, have a second or casting vote.

Digression from Subject .-- Personal Reflections.

38. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion nor impute im-proper motives to any other Councillor, and all personal reflections upon any Councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of Words used by a Councillor.

39. Any Councillor may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Councillor immediately upon the same being used.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expressions.

40. Any Councillor who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the Mayor reflects offensively on any member of the Council shall, when required by the Mayor, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory abology to the Chair, and if he decline or neglect to do so, the Mayor may refuse to hear such Councillor further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Council, or may direct the offending Councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Disturbance.-Conversing aloud.

41. No Councillor shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud or interrupt whilst any other Councillor is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Continued Irrelevance.

42. The Mayor may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor, and may direct such Councillor, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such Councillor shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Crossing Council Chamber.

43. When the Mayor is putting any question, no Councillor shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor shall any Councillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

Mayor may call to order.

44. The Mayor shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call any Councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

45. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor.

Definition of Order.

46. Any Councillor who shall do anything or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any section of this By-law shall be deemed to be out of order.

Decision of the Mayor on Point of Order-Councillor to apologise when called upon.

47. Whenever it shall have been decided by the Mayor that any motion, amendment. or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.

Councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber.

48. Any Councillor who shall persist in any line of conduct which the Mayor shall have decided, or which by any section of this By-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction, or apology required by the Mayor as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the Mayor, withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Removal of Councillor from Council.

49. In the event of any Councillor refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Council Chamber when requested or directed by the Mayor so to do, the Mayor may order such Councillor to be removed from the said Chamber and to be excluded therefrom during the remainer of the then sitting of the Council, and such Councillor may be arrested and removed from the Council Chamber forthwith by any officers of or other persons authorised by the Council, or by members of the police force.

Disorder.

50. If disorder shall arise at any meeting of the Council, the Mayor, acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right quit the Chair, and announce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, when the Council shall re-assemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded

with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the Chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

51. Notwithstanding anything contained in or omitted from the preceding By-laws, it shall be competent and lawful for any Councillor at any meeting (ordinary or special) of the Council, and at any Committee meeting of the Council, to move without notice that a ruling or determination of the Mayor or Chairman be disagreed with.

Upon such motion being seconded, the Mayor or Chairman shall vacate the Chair and the meeting shall forthwith appoint a Chairman. The question before the Chair shall then be debated and decided by a simple majority either in favour or against. Upon a conclusion being reached, the Mayor or Chairman originally in charge of the meeting may again preside.

Order in Debate.

Motions and Amendments.

52. When a motion is under debate at any meeting of the Council, no further motion shall be received, except the following:—

- 1. That the motion be amended.
- 2. That the Council do now adjourn.
- 3. That the debate be adjourned.
- 4. That the question be now put.
- 5. That the Council do proceed with the next business.
- 6. That the Council do resolve into Committee of the whole.

1. That the motion he amended.

Relevancy of Amendment.

53. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To be read.

54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a time.

55. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any Councillor to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

Substantive Motion.

56. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

2. The Council do now adjourn.

Time to move.

57. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn, provided that the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motion for adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five minutes, but no further debate shall be allowed.

No Discussion. Procedure before further Motion.

58. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Question adjourned to next Meeting.

59. On a resolution for adjournment, the question (if any) under debate when motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to next meeting.

One Motion only.

60. At the same sitting no Councillor may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

3. That the Debate be adjourned.

Time to move.

61. Any Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

No Discussion.

62. No discussion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjournment of a debate.

Mover to speak first.

63. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

One Motion only.

64. At the same sitting no member shall move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate after Count-out.

65. If a debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

4. That the Question be now put. Time to move. Put without Debate.

66. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of another Councillor, move without notice that the question be now put, and upon such motion being seconded, the same shall be immediately put without debate.

Two-thirds Majority.

67. A motion that the question under consideration be now put shall not be decided in the affirmative or take effect without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the Councillors present.

Speaking in reply.

68. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put.

Motion to be put at once.

69. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be at once put.

Question includes Amendment.

70. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

5. That the Council do proceed to the next Business. Time to move.

71. It shall be competent for any Councillor at the close of the speech of any other Councillor to move, without notice, that the Council do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be dropped.

72. When a motion be carried that the Council do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

Further Motion.

73. During the same debate a second motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

6. That the Council resolves into Committee. Decision of Council.

74. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered in Committee of the whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice. Matters to be considered by Committee. 75. Such Committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Council.

Conduct of Committee.

76. In Committee of the whole the Standing Orders of the Council shall apply, except that Councillors may speak more than once to the same question.

Adoption of Committee's Resolutions.

77. The Mayor shall report the resolutions arrived at in Committee of the whole to the Council at its next ordinary meeting or upon the resumption of the Council, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

Confidential Business.

78. All matters dealt with or brought before the Council in Committee or before any Committee of the Council shall be treated as strictly confidential. No information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Council prior to the decision of full Council.

Rescission of Resolutions.

Rescission.

79. No resolution of any meeting of the Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered, except in manner provided in Section 165 of the Act.

Repetition of Negatived Motion.

80. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least six members of the Council.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

How moved.

81. In cases of urgent necessity, any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of the majority of the Councillors present; provided also that such majority be not less than four.

Object of Suspension to be stated.

82. Any Councillor moving the suspension of any standing order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Voting.

Method of taking Votes.

83. The Mayor shall, in taking votes. 83. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Division.

84. The Council shall vote by a show of hands, but any Councillor may call for a division upon any question, in which case the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats; all division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

85. The Town Clerk shall be responsible for carrying into effect the decisions of the Council.

86. All employees of the Council shall be under the control and supervision of the Town Clerk, and all orders to the Council's employees shall be transmitted through the Town Clerk.

87. The Town Clerk shall keep an approved Order Book, and shall sign all orders for material of every description whatsoever, required by the Council.

Special Committees.

88. Special Committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. The appointment of a Special Committee shall be made by resolution of the Council, which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Special Committee, and may either state the number of Councillors to be elected by ballot or shall name the Councillors whom it is proposed shall constitute such committee. In the event of a ballot being taken and an equality of votes being recorded in favour of any two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

Convening Committee Meetings.

89. The Town Clerk shall call a meeting of any Committee when requested to do so by the Mayor, the chairman, or any two members of such Committee.

Standing Orders.

90. The Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed and apply in Committees, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to committees being conducted with open doors.

Quorum.

91. At a meeting of a committee a quorum shall consist of not less than two members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated, or there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Miscellaneous.

Penalty.

92. Any Councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, or who shall be guilty of any misfeasance or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law, shall be liable, on conviction before a court of summary jurisdiction, to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 20$.

Enforcement of By-laws.

93. Whenever a Councillor shall have committed an offence under this By-law, the Mayor may forthwith lay or cause to be laid an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.
