Declaration of Main Road.

PROCLAMATION

M.R.B. 497/27.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Board, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road, and in like manner and on the like recommendation declare that any main road shall cease to be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in Schedule A hereto shall be declared to be a main road, and that the road specified in Schedule B hereto shall cease to be a main road: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule A hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road, and that the road specified in Schedule B hereto shall cease to be a main road.

Armadale-Pemberton Road (Bunbury and Dardanup Road Districts).

Schedule A.

All of Road No. 8124, as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 827, and described on Folio 1834 of the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia of the 16th day of August, 1929, as set out hereunder:—A strip of land, 150 links wide, leaving side of Road No. 50 in Wellington Location 27 334deg. 35min. 4 chains 53 links and 318deg. 40min. 16 chains 65.7 links from its South boundary and extending (as shown O.P. 4392) North-Westward through Locations 27, 307, and 10 to a Southern side of the Bunbury-Boyanup Railway Reserve; commencing again on a Northern side of the

said Railway Reserve and extending Northward to Road No. 50 in Location 10 aforesaid. (Plan 411D/40, A.B.3.)

Schedule B.

That portion of the Armadale-Pemberton Road as proclaimed in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 24th day of August, 1928, commencing at the junction of Road No. 8124 and Road No. 50 in Wellington Location 10; thence South-Easterly generally along said Road No. 50 to the junction with Road No. 8124 aforesaid in Location 27 (Litho. 411/80, Plan M.R.B., W.A. 356).

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, on the 26th day of November, 1929, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Government Tramways Act, 1912.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," it is provided that the Minister for Railways may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of tramways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorise the construction of the following tramway, namely:—

Hay Street East.—Commencing at a point in Hay Street opposite the Car Barn 70 links West of the Western alignment of Hale Street and proceeding along Hale Street in a Northerly direction to Nelson Crescent, a distance of 10 chains; thence along Nelson Crescent

in a North-Easterly direction to new Trotting Ground Main Entrance, a distance of 6 chains; thence in an Easterly direction 33 feet out from the boundary of the W.A. Cricket Ground Fence, a distance of 12 chains; thence in a South-Westerly direction 33 feet out from the W.A. Cricket Ground Fence and terminating at the end of No. 1 Dead-End Siding, a distance of 12 chains, making the total length of line 40 chains or thereabouts, and more particularly delineated on Tramway Plan No. 91, Sheet 15.

Public Service Act, 1904.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 84 of "The Public Service Act, 1904," that the Governor may make, alter, or repeal regulations for the carrying out of any of the provisions of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient to amend the Regulations governing the admission of Cadet Draftsmen and Cadet Computing Draftsmen, Lands and Surveys Department, and Land Titles Office, Crown Law Department, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of February, 1927, by repealing Regulation 14 thereof and inserting in place thereof a new Regulation 14, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said Regulations by repealing Regulation 14 thereof and by inserting a new Regulation No. 14 in place thereof, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations as follows:—

Agreement and Bond.

14. Before any person is accepted as a cadet under these Regulations an agreement in the form or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the Appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the Head of the Department concerned; and a Bond in the form or to the effect of Form No. 2 in the said Appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties, to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

When the Cadet shall have satisfactorily completed his cadetship and obtained his certificate of qualification he will, if required so to do, serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years, in accordance with and subject to the provisions contained in Regulations 11 and 12 of the said Regulations, or any amendments, for the time being in force thereof.

4. In consideration of the premises the (n) _____ will during the said term take and accept the Cadet attached to the (o) _____ and employ him and instruct him or cause him to be employed and instructed

as a (p) _____ under and in accordance with the said Regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners notify, for the information of those navigating vessels in Gage Roads, Fremantle, that the 3½ fathom shoal shown on Rottneest Island to Warnbro' Sound Chart No. 1058, 1929 corrections, in Lat. 32deg. 3min. 43sec. South, Long. 115deg. 42min. 54sec. East, has been swept by the shallower and sounded, but no evidence of this shoal was discovered, there being no less than 47 feet of water on or around that area.
