Declaration of Main Road.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road, and in like manner and on the like recommendation declare that any main road shall cease to be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in Schedule A hereto shall be declared to be a main road, and that the road specified in Schedule B hereto shall cease to be a main road: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule A hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road, and that the road specified in Schedule B hereto shall cease to be a main road.

Schedule A.

Midland Junction-Merredin Road (Kellerberrin Road District).

That portion of a public road as shown on Lands Department Lithograph No. 25/80 commencing at the most Southerly angle of Avon Location 7754 at the Northern side of the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve; thence South-Westerly crossing the said Railway Reserve to its Southern side at the most Easterly angle of Location 8101; thence South-Easterly and North-Easterly along the Northern boundaries of Locations

12943, 6298, 6685, 5795, 6823, 7895, 6915, and 3638 to the junction with Road No. 3974 at the North-Eastern corner of said Location 3638; thence North-Easterly along the Southern side of the aforesaid Railway Reserve, passing through the Townsite of Kellerberrin, to the junction with Road No. 3082 at the Eastern boundary of the aforesaid Townsite; thence North-Easterly along the Northern boundaries of Locations 3777, 3947, 3687, 7722, 7974, 7500, 7249, and 3483 to the North-Eastern corner of said Location 3483; thence North-Easterly along part of the Northern boundary of Location 3482 to a point 135 miles 54 chains on the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve; thence Northerly, crossing the said Railway Reserve to its Northern side as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 817.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit (inter alia) all persons from—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the

meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may by Proclamation declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the 1st day of January, 1930, until the 31st day of December, 1930, inclusive: And, further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters, except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, on the 11th day of December, 1929, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Public Service Act, 1904.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 84 of "The Public Service Act, 1904," that the Governor may make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the carrying out of any of the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient to amend the Regulations governing the admission of Cadet Draftsmen (Engineering) and Cadet Draftsmen (Architectural), Public Works and Water Supply Department, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of June, 1921, by repealing Regulation 13 thereof and inserting in place thereof a new Regulation 13, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said Regulations by repealing Regulation 13 thereof and by inserting a new Regulation No. 13 in place thereof, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations as follows:—

Agreement and Bond.

13. Before any person is accepted as a Cadet under these Regulations an agreement in the form or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the Appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the

Head of the Department concerned, and a Bond in the form or to the effect of Form No. 2 in the said Appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties, to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

THE PARKS AND RESERVES ACT, 1895.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," of the following By-laws for the control and management of Reserve No. 20226, Recreation (Golf Links), at Rockingham.

These By-laws shall operate over the Reserve above referred to and particularly described hereunder:—

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the South side of Lake Street with the prolongation of the East side of Fisher Street and extending Eastward to the Southern corner of Sub. Lot 1; thence North-Eastward along the latter's South-East boundary to its Eastern corner; thence Eastward along the Southern boundary of Sub. Lot 2 (Rockingham Jarrah Company's Railway Reserve) to the South-Eastern boundary of the Townsite; thence South-Westward along same, and Westward along the South boundary of the Townsite to a point South of the starting point; thence Northward along the prolongation of the East side of Fisher Street aforesaid to the starting point.

By-laws.

1.—Hours.

The Reserve shall be open to the public at all hours free of charge but subject to the restrictions hereinafter contained.

2.—Injury to Things.

No person shall pluck any of the wild or cultivated flowers or walk on the beds borders or putting greens, nor pull up or dig or otherwise disturb any grass, or climb upon or get through or over the fences, or remove or injure any of the gates, turnstiles, fences, buildings, or flags, nor disturb, damage or destroy any of the property or things within the bounds of the Reserve.

3.—Shooting.

No person shall carry or discharge firearms through or on the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds or animals except as in the next paragraph mentioned.

4.—Dogs, Goats, etc.

All dogs, goats, and poultry found within the Reserve may be destroyed by any of the persons hereinafter referred to as being authorised to prosecute for breaches of this By-law, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace, for any damage done by such dogs, goats, or poultry.

5.—Works.

During the constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining of any beds, borders or greens, links, buildings, or other improvements, no person shall interfere with the workmen, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers, or do or cause to be done any act which will or may be likely to interfere with or prevent such constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining.

6.—Misconduct.

Any person in a state of intoxication or misconducting himself or herself shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve.

7.—Rubbish.

No person shall deposit rubbish or any offensive matter on any part of the Reserve.

8.—Fires.

No person other than the workmen, gardeners, caretakers or rangers referred to in paragraph 5 hereof shall light any fires on the Reserve.

9.—Games.

In the event of the lease or permit of the Reserve being granted to any person or persons or club for the purpose of enabling any particular game or games to be established on the Reserve, then so long as such lease or permit remains in force no game shall be played on the Reserve which may prevent, hamper, interfere, or compete with such person or persons or club in the use of the Reserve for the purposes set forth in such lease or permit, and no person shall do or cause to be done anything which will or may be likely to interfere or compete with such person or persons or club in any manner in commencing, playing, or carrying on such game or games.

10.—Enforcement.

Any member of the Rockingham Road Board, or the Secretary or Acting Secretary, Engineer, or Supervisor to the Rockingham Road Board, or any person authorised under the seal of the Rockingham Road Board, or in the event of the Reserve being leased to any person or persons or club, such lessee or permit holder shall have power to enforce these By-laws and take any proceedings hereunder at any time.

11.—Penalties.

Any person offending against any part of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under Section 14 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61 Vict., No. 23), for the management of the Boyup Brook Cemetery (Reserve 11653).

By virtue of the powers vested in them the Board of Trustees make the following By-laws and Regulations:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A," are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given.

2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, private grave, vault, or tombstone, monument or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefore on prescribed form. Upon such application being approved of the Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the Act (*see* Schedule "B").

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in time to allow of at least five (5) working hours, notice being given to the Secretary at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application and order therefor be handed in at the office in time to allow of at least six (6) working hours' notice being given as above.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and any other particulars mentioned in Schedule "D," shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

5. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Secretary, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining a written approval of the Trustees there-to, and on payment of the necessary fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special exemption be obtained from the Trustees in writing.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon.

7. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than 3ft. from the top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.

8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the Certificate of Right of Burial, as in Schedule "B," or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.

10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial. Such certificate or order shall at the latest be handed to the Secretary upon the funeral entering the Cemetery.

11. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:— Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

12. No burial shall be allowed to take place at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

13. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery.

14. At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.

15. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Secretary by the Trustees from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.

16. No headstones, footstone, kerbing, monument or any other erection of any kind shall be permitted, nor shall any inscription be allowed until the plans and particulars of the same have been approved by the Trustees.

17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and if required by the Trustees or their officers, such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

18. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor or person responsible for the erection.

19. All material, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person responsible therefor.

20. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in previous By-law not being so removed, the Trustees shall have power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the costs of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.

21. All materials required in the erection and completion of any stone or other work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance to the Cemetery and conveyed along such roads or tracks as the Secretary shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

22. The Trustees will not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.

23. Before any such exceptional case, as referred to in the last By-law, be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application setting forth the reason for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Chief Secretary, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If in the opinion of the Trustees it is necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

24. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Secretary.

25. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure, except such as are approved by the Secretary.

26. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

27. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or any other materials removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other graves, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves, except with the permission of the Secretary.

- (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

- (d) Work in all classes to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

28. Children under the age of ten years shall not be admitted to the Cemetery unless in charge of some responsible person.

29. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

30. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any trees, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

31. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

32. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees, and any person so employed accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

33. Subject to the directions of the Trustees, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery.
