WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from (a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—(1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1930, until the 30th day of April, 1930, and as from the 1st day of August, 1930, until the 31st day of December, 1930, inclusive. (2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1930, until the 31st day of March, 1930, and from the 1st day of October, 1930, until the 31st day of December, 1930, inclusive. (3) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1930, until the 23rd day of March, 1930, and from the 16th day of May, 1930, until the 31st day of December, 1930, inclusive. (4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of May, 1930, until the 30th day of September, 1930, inclusive; provided that, subject to certain provisions (vide separate Proclamation), it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern

corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31, between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday, and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week. (5) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the 1st day of July, 1930, until the 31st day of October, 1930, inclusive. (6) That all those waters mentioned in the Sixth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the 1st day of January, 1930, until the 31st day of December, 1930, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island), and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay, extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter-of-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet, bounded by the following lines:—On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter-of-a-mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar; and thence in a generally West-erly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury).

Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Sixth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, and the Lower Canning Bridge.

Port Hedland and Marble Bar Road Districts—Alterations of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1498/29.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and annex it to an existing Road District; And whereas it is desirable to sever portion of the Marble Bar Road District and annex it to the Port Hedland Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever that portion of the Marble Bar Road District described in the Schedule hereto and annex it to the Port Hedland Road District.

Port Hedland Road District—Transfer of Territory from the Marble Bar Road District.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the left bank of the Ridley River at its mouth and extending Northward and Eastward along the shores of the Indian Ocean to the North-East corner of Pastoral Lease 2403/96; thence along the East boundary of said Pastoral Lease 2403/96, the East and the South boundaries of Pastoral Lease 2401/96, the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 2404/96, an East, the North-East, the Easternmost, a South, an East, a South, again an East and the Southernmost boundary of Pastoral Lease 2402/96; a South and East boundary of Pastoral Lease 1995/96, and part of the Southernmost boundary of the last-mentioned lease to the left bank of the Shaw River; thence along the said bank of the Shaw River and the left bank of the Ridley River to the starting point.

GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in Our said State and its Dependencies, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people, in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said State and its Dependencies, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves, as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir William Robert Campion, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this eighth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty.

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you, and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia in the Magisterial Districts hereinbefore indicated, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in the said Districts, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people in the said Districts according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said Districts, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within the said Districts who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in the said Districts: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the person charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir William Robert Campion, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this eighth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty.

NEWSPAPER AGREEMENT.

No. 28 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-third day of October, 1929, between the proprietors of the "West Australian" and "Western Mail," the "Daily News," the "Sunday Times," "Truth," the "Call," and "Mirror," and the "Westralian Worker," of the first part, and the Western Australian Branch of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, a Union registered under the above Act, of the second part, whereby it is agreed as follows:—

1.—Scope.

The Agreement shall apply to work done on newspapers.

2.—Term of Agreement.

The Agreement shall remain in force for a period of two years from August 1, 1929.

3.—Area.

The Agreement shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

4.—Hours: Time Workers.

The maximum number of hours to be worked each week shall be:

Stereotypers: 36 hours, day or night. Provided the hours in the "Daily News" shall be 38 day work.

Linotype operators: 42 hours day; 40 hours night. Provided, that for all operators (other than six full shift workers) there shall be a reduction of two hours weekly, with reservations relating to overtime on special occasions, as agreed to between the employers and employees of the respective offices, to be ratified by the parties to this Agreement. Provided further, that for operators working abnormal shifts there shall be a further two hours' reduction.

All other employees: 44 hours day work, 42 hours night work. Provided, that for all such employees (other than six full shift workers) there shall be a reduction of two hours weekly, with reservations relating to overtime on special occasions, as agreed to between the employees and employers of the respective offices, to be ratified by the parties to this Agreement. Provided further, that for all employees embraced by this clause working abnormal shifts there shall be a further two hours' reduction.

Time off: All employees working six full shifts per week day or night (i.e., employees who do not get two days or a day and a half off consecutively) shall be allowed one full shift off every two weeks, to be paid for. In the week in which the day or night off is taken the weekly hours shall be reduced by one-sixth of the weekly hours agreed to respectively for each section.

In the event of a permanent employee not being provided with work for the maximum number of hours in each week, he shall receive not less than the minimum wage for his grade provided in the schedule.

Day work shall mean work done between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., and night work shall mean work done between 6.30 p.m. and 8 a.m.

It shall not be necessary for all sections to commence work at the same time, but where individual employees are called in before the usual starting time they shall be paid overtime.

In offices where a regular shift is worked between the hours set down in this Agreement for day work and night work, the wages shall be a rate proportionate to the number of hours day work and night work and the hours shall be those for night work. Provided that one half-day off per month or its equivalent in hours shall be given.

In offices where a weekly as well as a daily paper is issued, time worked on the ordinary weekly issue to be counted as part of the week's work.

Provided always, that in the case of papers other than dailies, special arrangements may be made between the Union and the employer regarding the distribution of the weekly working hours.

5.—Wages of Time Hands.

The minimum weekly rate of wages shall be:

Hand compositors working part time on display machines shall be paid a proportionate rate between the machine time operator and floorhand rates, this provision to apply only when regularly employed for more than two hours on the machine. If employed for four hours or more the time operators' rate shall be paid for the full shift.

Basic Wage.

It is hereby declared that the basic wage at the date of this Agreement is £4 7s. per week for males.

General.

Where an employee in the following grades has not had twelve months' continuous experience in the work in which he is engaged he shall be paid 5s. per week less than the rates set out above: General hands in machine room and general hands in publishing room.

Casuals.

Casuals shall be guaranteed a full shift at night and four hours in the day time. Provided that, in cases of emergency, arrangements may be made between the Union and the newspaper office for a lesser guarantee.

Casuals who are sent for and whose services are not availed of shall be paid a "call" at the rate of two hours' pay at casual rates.

Casuals engaged in publishing on weekly papers, and in the rotary machine section as general hands when the machines are not running, shall be paid 2s. 9d. per hour day work, 3s. 6d. per hour night work. Provided, that special arrangements be made for publishing on the "Sunday Times."

All other casual workers shall be paid 2s. per shift extra day work, 2s. 10d. extra per shift night work.

Casuals working day work, if employed for a full week, shall be paid the prescribed weekly wage, with no extra allowance per shift.

If employed for a full week at night, casuals shall be paid the prescribed weekly wage, plus 5s., with no extra allowance per shift.

A casual working for 11 consecutive shifts shall be allowed one full shift off on full pay. Provided that, where such time is allowed off and paid for, the extra allowance for casuals of 2s. for day work and 2s. 10d. for night work shall not apply.

Casuals working mixed shifts, i.e., shifts commencing before 6.30 p.m. and ending after 6.30 p.m., shall be paid day rates, provided the work after 6.30 p.m. does not exceed one hour. If it does, then night rates are to be paid throughout, and the guarantee to be four hours.

General Conditions.

The method to be adopted for payment for piece-work or by weekly wages shall be settled by agreement between the employer and the Union, or, failing such agreement, by direction of the Court of Arbitration on application being made thereto by either party.

Employees regularly employed on night work, if called on to work during the day, shall be paid night work rates, and employees regularly employed on day work if called on to work at night shall be paid night work rates.

Employees shall be paid at the rate for the classification at which they are usually employed, and when put to work of a higher grade for more than two hours during a day or night shift, shall receive while so employed the difference in pay between their ordinary rate and higher rate. An employee put to work on a lower grade shall be paid his ordinary rate. Provided, that an employee relieving one of a higher grade during the illness or leave other than annual leave of an employee who is being paid his ordinary wages, shall not be entitled to the higher rate.

Sick Pay.

Permanent employees absent through sickness shall be paid full wages for the first week of absence, after which the legal liability of employer shall cease.

Call.

An employee called to work otherwise than in his usual working hours shall, if he attends, be paid two hours at ordinary rates as a "call," in addition to his ordinary wage.

This clause shall only apply when an employee is not notified before he leaves work that he will be required for special duty. Provided that any man so called shall be paid at least two hours at overtime rates.

If no work is available to an employee when called, two hours shall be paid for.

6.—Piece-work.

The rate of pay for linotype operators on piece-work shall be 5 7/12d. per thousand ems night, with £1 per week added, and 5 1/3d. per thousand ems day work, with 12s. per week added for matter actually set and corrected. Operators to be guaranteed 32 hours' work per week. Standing time shall be paid for any shortage at the rate of 5s. per hour night and 4s. per hour day.

Any time worked in excess of eight hours in any one day or night shall be paid for at overtime rates.

The cast-up shall be according to the point system, provided that the minimum multiplier for any line shall be 40.

Operators shall be paid on the "flat" system, and shall not charge for white lines, leads, or other matter added by the "house."

Time off: Piece operators working six full shifts per week day or night, shall be allowed one full shift off every two weeks, to be paid for at a sixth of the time operating weekly wage. In the week in which the day or night off is taken, the weekly guarantee to the operator taking the day or night off shall be reduced by 5 hours 20 minutes.

Piece-workers working other than six full shifts per week shall be allowed one half-day off per month, and during the week the half-day is taken off, time worked short of the guarantee shall be paid for.

7.—Overtime.

Overtime shall be charged at the rate of: Time and one-third for first two hours, time and one-half for next two hours, double-time thereafter. Special Sunday work shall be paid for at double rates.

For the purpose of computing time or overtime the following periods to operate: Eight minutes or over, to be charged 1/4 hour; twenty-three minutes or over, 1/2 hour; thirty-eight minutes or over, 3/4 hour; fifty-three minutes or over, 1 hour.

8.—Holidays.

Every employee (including piece-workers) shall receive eighteen consecutive working days' holiday in each year on full pay, at times convenient to the employer. Provided always that, should the service be brought to a termination after the expiration of three calendar months, but before the expiration of twelve calendar months, the said eighteen days' holiday shall be commuted to a holiday for one day and a half for each calendar month's service. Provided further, that in case a worker is dismissed for serious and wilful misconduct the provision of this clause shall not apply.

Permanent part-time employees working three or more regular full shifts per week shall receive proportionate holidays. Other permanent part-time employees shall receive only such proportionate holidays as may be agreed to between employer and employee.

One day at Christmas, one day at Easter, and Labour Day shall be paid holidays, and should an employee be required to work on those days he shall receive double pay for the time worked in addition to the holiday pay.

Piece operators shall be paid the time rate for time operators while on holidays and on leave.

9.—Termination of Employment.

Any worker having been employed for three consecutive months in any office shall be entitled to one week's notice that his services are to be dispensed with, and any such worker leaving his employment shall likewise give one week's notice.

10.—Lower Rate.

A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage herein prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and Secretary of the Union. If, within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said Secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the Resident or Police Magistrate within whose Magisterial District the proposed employment shall take place to fix such lower rate of wages. The worker shall give such Secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said Secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by any employer within the district to which this Award applies for such less wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the Secretary of the Union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed in this clause. Provided that no employer shall be at liberty to employ more than one such person at a time for every ten fully-paid journeymen employed.

11.—Record Book.

Each employer shall keep at his office, or at each of them if more than one, a book containing a record of—

- (a) The names of all workers employed by him at such office, and to whom this Agreement applies; and
- (b) The class of work performed, the hours during which the worker is employed, and the wages paid to each such worker.

The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting up daily of such book. Such book may be inspected at any time during the ordinary business hours by the Secretary for the time being of the workers' and employers' unions (if any), and also by any person thereunto authorised by the President of the Court of Arbitration.

12.—Machine Operating.

No person other than an apprentice, compositor, or duly qualified operator shall be employed to operate a linotype or other type-setting machine.

Compositors learning machine operating shall be paid the compositor's time rate of wages, and shall serve a probationary period of twelve months. Such compositor must be able at the end of the first three months of the probationary period to set and correct at a speed of at least 4000 ems an hour; at the end of six months at least 5000 ems an hour; at the end of nine months at least 6000 ems an hour; and at the end of twelve months at least 7000 ems an hour; which shall be the limit of the probationary period. When a compositor shall be able to set and correct an average of 7000 ems per hour based on minion matrices, 13 ems measure, the matter to be solid, he shall be deemed a proficient operator. The test of the operator's proficiency to be his ability to set any of the above numbers at the period stated as tests for a full day on fair copy, and to approximately maintain those averages. Each employer may adopt the usual means of accurately testing the proficiency of a probationer.

Except in cases of emergency proficient linotype operators shall not be required to work together on time and piece-work: Provided, that where a machine is used only for setting headings or display lines for advertisements, such machine shall be worked on time: Provided further that time operators may set lines for display advertisements, and for blocks, etc., that cannot reasonably be given out to piece operators, the printer and the father of the chapel being in agreement as to the class of matter covered by this clause before it shall become operative.

An operator shall not be required to do engineer's or attendant's work, except when he is being paid extra for looking after his machine. Provided, in all cases operators shall assist in changing their magazines when called upon to do so.

An operator having to look after his own machine shall be paid 10s. per week extra; where a machine is worked more than one shift the 10s. extra shall be paid to the operator on each shift.

An operator employed on piece required to go on hand work shall be paid the machine time rate. No operator shall be permanently changed from machine to hand work without one week's notice.

13.—Extra Charges, etc.

Instructions shall be written on the first slip of copy.

Indentations and divisions in two-bar matter to be marked.

Corrections, if not on ordinary galley-proof, or if on scraps, to be pasted on proof paper.

No undue advantage shall be permitted to one operator over another.

All lines cast shall be charged full lines.

All catchlines shall be charged by the operator.

Not less than twelve lines shall constitute a "take" of copy. Provided, that the copy given out at any one time, whether referring to different articles or not, shall constitute one "take." In the case of editions thirty minutes before the closing of the formes, six lines shall constitute a "take."

Matter requiring two bars or more of the ordinary measure of the paper to complete one measure (not being tabular matter) shall be charged one-third extra; three or more bars, one-half extra.

Figure matter set solid, land, wool and produce sales, show prize lists, cargoes, catalogues, run-on balance-sheets and subscription lists, cricket, rifle, and quoit

scores, examination lists, and similar matter, shall be charged one-third extra.

Other matter carrying one-third extra: Church notices (if 10 lines run on); shipping (arrivals, departures where run on); mail timetables; all half-measures (except racing weights and similar matter); wireless reports and programmes; auction sales if indented 2 and 3 ems and all capitals.

Matter of and exceeding four lines composed in other than ordinary English (e.g., dialects) shall be charged one-half extra, and foreign languages double for each line.

All matter with a border round, whether formed of rules, letters, or otherwise, shall be charged one-half extra.

Tabular matter cast on one bar shall be charged: Two columns, one-third extra; three columns, one-half extra; four or more columns, double. These charges are to be made whether the matter is with or without headings or rules.

Introductory lines or footnotes not exceeding four lines shall be charged with the table.

Run-out lists with one column of figures, common matter; but if £ s. d.; tons, cwt., qrs., and similar matter, one-third.

University lists containing mostly figures and similar and all-figure matter one-half.

Correcting quarter-page proofs, three lines in addition to ordinary charge; correcting half-page (if full page in width), six lines; full page corrections, twelve lines in addition to other charges; all if done as house-marks.

Matter having to be transposed by the operator (i.e., which is not set up in the order in which it appears in copy) shall be paid for at the rate of one-third extra for all lines so transposed.

Matter set from copy that will not go on the copy tray shall be charged at the rate of one-third extra.

Matter which is classed by the printer and the father of the chapel as illegible or indistinct, or not properly sub-edited, shall be charged one-third extra.

One line extra shall be charged for each word of small caps, italics, black, etc., fed in by hand, but where such words are set on the keyboard one line extra shall be charged for each line containing such words (excepting small caps, which shall be charged one line extra for each word) and for each single line of such type; but where there is more than one line of continuous black or italics, the extra charge shall be double for the first four, single thereafter.

One line extra shall be charged for every two two-line letters, except when set from auxiliary magazine, when the charge shall be one for every three.

One line extra shall be charged for each hand-fed matrix other than two-line letters. Repeat lines not to be charged.

Indented matter, single column, showing 10 ems pica and under on the face, one-third extra; under half-measure one-half extra.

All matter which is not phrased, such as passenger lists and similar matter, one-third extra. Racing results, excluding description, one-third extra.

Slugs of 22-ems measure and over shall be charged one-third extra.

Any other matter which may be specially difficult to compose shall be paid at an increased rate to be determined by the printer and the father of the chapel.

The operator shall charge two lines for every line of house mark corrections done by him. Alterations in standing advertisements constituting less than twelve consecutive lines, when given out on piece-work, shall be charged as house marks.

The insertion of all corrected slugs shall be done by the "house." The "house" may at its discretion correct on time the errors in first proofs due to the operator and deduct two lines from the operator for every line requiring alteration.

All first proof and revise correction marks left undone by the operator in the first proofs shall be done by the operator. All fresh errors imported into corrected matter by the operator shall, if not corrected by him, be charged against him at the rate of house marks.

If a machine be changed by order to a different type, the operator shall not be required to change it again to make corrections, which shall be done by the "house" and the cost of correcting every line requiring correction shall be charged to the operator.

All machine errors—to be countersigned by the mechanic—shall be charged as house marks. Provided

that, where an operator has obviously continued setting without drawing the attention of the mechanic to the faulty working of the machine, the charges shall be disallowed.

Standing time of five minutes and over at any one time shall be charged at the rate specified in Clause 6. In cases where hands are brought in at a special hour and they are required to wait for work to come in, such waiting time shall be charged as from the specified hour of commencement. No standing time to be charged until fifteen minutes have accumulated in any one week. Standing time for machine delays to be countersigned by the mechanic. Standing time for copy to be signed by the printer. When an operator is being paid standing time he may be called upon to perform other work.

Changing.—From machine to machine in middle of take, or where there is any other disability in changing, 12 lines.

14.—Disputes.

Any dispute arising out of this Agreement which cannot be satisfactorily settled between the father of the chapel and the printer, shall be referred to the Union and the "house." If not then settled it shall be referred to the Court of Arbitration in accordance with the Act.

15.—Board of Reference.

1. For the purposes of this Agreement a Board of Reference is hereby appointed consisting of a Chairman and two representatives of the employers and two representatives of the Union nominated by the parties.

2. The parties shall submit the name or names of persons from whom the Chairman may be chosen by the Court of Arbitration, but the Court may appoint any other person as Chairman.

3. The Board shall hold its deliberations in private, unless the majority of the representatives of the parties or the Chairman otherwise decides.

4. A majority of the members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

5. The Board may sit at such times and places as the majority may decide, and may adjourn from time to time and from place to place.

6. A member may resign at any time by certification in writing, signed by him and served upon the Registrar of the Court. Either party may at any time vary its representatives and fill any vacancy.

7. All meetings of the Board shall be convened by the Chairman by notice served upon the members thereof.

8. The decision of the Board shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the Chairman and forwarded to the Clerk of the Court, who shall forthwith notify the parties.

9. The decision of the Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties. Provided, that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the Chairman, and the opposite party, and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review within fourteen days of such decision. Provided further, that all parties shall abide by the decision unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

10. The functions of the Board shall be—

(1) To settle and/or determine any matters left to the decision of the Board by this Agreement.

(2) To settle, allow, determine and deal with any matter or thing which the Court may from time to time refer to the Board.

(3) Subject to the jurisdiction of the Court of Arbitration, generally to settle and/or determine any dispute or question arising out of this Agreement except a matter involving the interpretation of any of the terms thereof or any variation in the rates of wages or other term hereof.

16.—Preference to Unionists.

Members of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia shall, all other things being equal, have preference of employment.

17.—Apprentices to Composing and Machining.

Apprentices shall be engaged under the terms and regulations herein set forth:—

1. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement.

2. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice, or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relations to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner,

and he shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the term of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

3. The Board of Reference constituted under Award of Industrial Board No. 6 of 1928 and governing apprentices in the Job Printing Industry, shall function in regard to apprentices covered in this Agreement: provided, that two representatives of the Perth Newspaper Proprietors' Association and two representatives of the Union shall be added to the Board.

4. The functions of the Apprenticeship Board shall be as follows:—

(i) To advise the Court as regards apprenticeship matters in the Printing Industry within the area covered by the Agreement, and in particular on the following heads:

(a) The appointment or re-appointment of examiners.

(b) The preparation of a syllabus for the course of instruction from time to time.

(c) The methods of instruction to be followed.

(d) The conduct of examinations of apprentices.

(e) Schemes for the institution of scholarships and prizes.

To receive monthly or other periodical reports from the instructors for the purpose of amending or correcting any laxity in attendance or conduct of apprentices at classes of instruction.

To assist in selecting the best type of apprentice and to advise upon ability of any person, firm, or company to effectively train an apprentice or apprentices, and to encourage and foster the study of subjects bearing upon the trade or occupation in the evening classes or other classes instituted for the purpose.

To advise the Court and parties interested as to what additional plant is required from time to time for the effective training of apprentices.

To assist in the promotion of classes for instruction in branches of the industry not already provided for.

To formulate and submit to the Court a scheme for the instruction of country apprentices.

To consider and recommend improvements in the training of apprentices from time to time.

(ii) The Apprenticeship Board shall hold its deliberations in private, unless a majority of the representatives of the parties or the Chairman otherwise directs.

(iii) A majority of the members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum; providing that in the case of differences of opinion between members representing the said Union of workers and members representing the said Union of employers, the decision of the Chairman shall be accepted and taken as the decision of the Apprenticeship Board.

(iv) The Apprenticeship Board may sit at such times and places as the majority may decide and arrange from time to time and place to place.

(v) The decision of the Apprenticeship Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties; provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the Chairman and the opposite parties and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review, within fourteen days of such decision; provided further, that all parties abide by the decision unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

(vi) With the consent of the Court either party may at any time vary its nomination of representative member.

5. Every office covered by this Agreement shall be entitled to an apprentice for every four journeymen compositors and operators permanently employed, and one apprentice for every four or fraction of four flat-bed machinists; but no office shall be entitled to more than four apprentices to each section at the one time. Apprentices shall not be allowed to work at night. The usual working hours of apprentices shall be the same as provided in Clause 4 of this Agreement.

The term "permanently employed" in this clause shall mean having been fully employed for a period of three months previously.

6. The employer shall undertake to teach or cause to be taught to compositor apprentices the trade of a newspaper compositor.

An apprentice to letterpress machining shall be taught and instructed in all phases of letterpress machining and all things incidental thereto, including make-ready and mixing and use of inks, black and colour printing, the class of paper and stock used, and the care of cylinder letterpress machines, including the mechanism of such machines. For this purpose the employer shall have and use in his business at least one cylinder machine. An attendance at the Technical College shall be a sufficient compliance with this clause as to colour printing.

The term of apprenticeship shall be six years, provided that when an apprentice is over sixteen years of age at the date of indenture, the period shall be five years; but such apprentice's wages shall be as if he had already served 12 months' apprenticeship.

A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be allowed, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship. On completion of probationary period application for registration shall be made to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.

7. A probationer shall submit himself to a suitable test prescribed by the Government Psychologist; the cost (if any) of such test shall be borne by the employer. Failure to satisfactorily pass such test shall entitle the employer to terminate the proposed apprenticeship.

8. Before being indentured the apprentice shall prove to the satisfaction of his employer that he is physically capable of carrying out the duties of the section he intends being apprenticed to.

The apprentice shall submit to an eyesight test and obtain a certificate of his fitness to be apprenticed to the trade, and a copy of such certificate shall be attached to the notice of registration of the apprenticeship.

An apprentice to composing shall be required to prove that he has passed the seventh standard or an equivalent examination, or to produce a certificate that he has obtained that standard before being registered.

9. The minimum weekly wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

No deduction shall be made from the wages provided in the above scale except as provided in Clauses 44 and 45 hereof.

The above rates shall be paid to all apprentices notwithstanding anything contained in their indentures.

10. An apprentice shall not be allowed to operate a linotype machine until he has passed the third year's test as a hand compositor and has reached the age of 18 years. Should he be put on a machine during the fourth and/or fifth year he shall be given at least four hours' practice a day, and shall receive 10s. per week in addition to the wages above prescribed. An apprentice shall not be fully employed on a machine to the exclusion of a permanent operator.

11. Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within fourteen days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed Form (1 (a) in Appendix), and if at the date of coming into operation of this Agreement an employer is employing an apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

12. The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

13. The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within fourteen days of the termination of the probationary period.

14. All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on Form 6 in Appendix and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, and the apprentice. No employer, guardian or apprentice shall enter

into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

15. The agreement shall be executed in triplicate; one part shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

16. Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provision of any industrial Agreement or Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

17. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain:—

(a) The names and addresses of the parties to the agreement;

(b) the date of birth of the apprentice;

(c) a description of the industry, craft, occupation, or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound;

(d) the date on which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship;

(e) a condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and the apprentice to comply with the terms of the industrial Agreement so far as they concern the apprentice;

(f) a condition that technical instruction, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time;

(g) a condition that, in the event of any apprentice in the opinion of the examiners not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense during the fifth year of such apprenticeship to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard;

(h) the general conditions of apprenticeship.

18. The Court may order the transfer of an apprentice from one employer to another, either temporarily or permanently:—

(a) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or

(b) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

19. The transfer of every apprentice shall be on Form 2 in Appendix, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within one month of the date upon which the transfer is ordered to be effected.

20. The document of transfer shall be held, one part by the late employer, one by the new employer, one by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be supplied by the employer to and be retained by the Registrar.

21. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice and guardian, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, qualified and willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the agreement or otherwise, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

22. Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

23. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court of the cause thereof.

24. When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the Clerk of the Court in Form 3 in the Appendix.

(a) No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court, on the application of the employer.

(b) It shall not be obligatory to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him.

Provided, however, that the apprentice may be suspended by the employer for misconduct, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same, the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension and, in the event of the application being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

25. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

26. Subject to regulation 41, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever, may, with the consent of the Court, on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement.

27. In the event of an employer being unable to provide the work for the apprentice, or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement, or arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

28. When in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice on other work in the factory or establishment.

29. Every apprentice shall attend a Government Technical School, vocational classes, or classes of instruction, where provided, for instructions in such subjects as are deemed necessary for his branch of the trade. He shall be allowed the necessary time off during his ordinary working hours to attend such classes. Any apprentice failing to attend such classes when given time off for that purpose shall be deemed to have unlawfully absented himself from his employment and may have his wages reduced accordingly.

30. The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

31. The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes shall be four hours per week.

32. Where instruction is provided for any branch of the trade, the method of training shall be as follows:—

(a) The name of each applicant for apprenticeship, as soon as he is registered as such, shall be forwarded by the Clerk of the Court to the Apprenticeship Board, which shall keep a waiting list of such enrolments.

(b) The full course of instruction shall be designed to cover the whole period of the apprenticeship term. Provided that, in the event of failure to satisfactorily complete such course by the end of the period of instruction, the term may be extended.

(c) Each year's instruction shall be divided into two terms ending June and November respectively.

(d) Each session of instruction shall consist of four hours weekly.

(e) The syllabus covering the whole period of apprenticeship shall be drawn up by the instructors in collaboration with the Apprenticeship Board.

(f) The instructors shall complete the course set down by the syllabus for each term in time to hold the terminal and annual examinations.

(g) All practical work given out by the instructors shall be entered upon a "Work Docket," and this, with the student's first proof and final proof, shall be examined by the instructor, allotted the deserved number of marks, and carefully preserved in a "Dossier" for reference during and at the completion of his student course. These practical tests shall be recorded on a special form, which may be inspected from time to time by members of the Apprenticeship Board, who shall have the right to make periodical visits of inspection during class hours.

(h) The instructors shall forward to the Apprenticeship Board a monthly report of the attendance and conduct of students, and such report to be in the hands of the Secretary of the Board by the seventh day of the following month.

33. Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by the examiners hereinafter provided for.

34. The Clerk of the Court shall notify examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

35. The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry, one shall be nominated by the employers and one by the workers, for each particular branch of the trade.

Failing such nomination or nominations the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, at the request of any one of the examiners, and the decision of such Apprenticeship Board shall be final and conclusive.

36. It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and, where any apprentice fails to show progress, to inquire as to the opportunities provided by the employer for such apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within fourteen days from the date of holding the examination.

37. Such examination shall include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

38. The method of conducting the examination of apprentices in those branches of the trade where technical instruction is provided shall be as follows:—

(a) Except in the case of the first examination, no apprentice shall be examined unless he has gained a pass in the previous examination.

(b) The whole of the practical work of the examination shall be performed at the Technical College class room. (In those branches of the trade where no technical instruction is provided, the examination shall be held at the factory where the apprentice is employed, and it shall then be the duty of the employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of such examination.)

(c) The terminal (June) examination shall be for theory only, and shall be conducted by the instructors during the last week but one preceding the end of the term. The questions shall also be set by the instructors and the written answers checked, and the deserved marks allotted. Those, with each student's practical work for the term under review, shall be handed to the examiners who shall approve, or otherwise, of the instructor's decisions. Any divergence of opinion that cannot be agreed upon mutually shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, whose decision shall be final.

(d) The examiners shall, during the month of June, make their annual visit of inspection to each factory where apprentices are employed and personally interview the employer (or foreman), and also the apprentice, and shall satisfy themselves as to the assiduity of the apprentice in his daily work, and especially as to the facilities afforded him to enable him to make the required progress in his particular branch of the trade.

(e) The examiners shall present a report to the Court as to the progress made by the students during the term and at the same time forward a copy to the Apprenticeship Board. The terminal report shall also cover their inspection of factories.

(f) The annual examination shall take place in November. The test papers shall be set by the examiners in collaboration with the instructors. The practical tests set during the term shall be checked by the examiners, who shall also set each student a special practical test, which shall be performed under their direct supervision at the Technical School class room during the second week of the examination. With these three results before them, viz., the written answers of the theory examination, the term's progressive tests already marked by the instructors, and the special test judged by themselves, the examiners shall draw up their annual report and submit same to the Court at least three days before the date fixed for the final day of the term. A copy of such report shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Board.

(g) Marks shall be awarded for these examinations as follow:—A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70 to 79 per cent. shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

(h) At the conclusion of the student's course he shall sit for his final examination, which shall be conducted entirely by the examiners. A student securing marks totalling 96 per cent. and over shall be deemed to have attained "Honours," and shall be entitled to receive an additional "Honours" certificate. A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and

over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70 to 79 per cent. shall entitled a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. of marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

(i) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating (on Form 4 in the Appendix) the result of his examination, and the final certificate in Form 5 in Appendix.

(j) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this Agreement. Upon any proceedings against him in respect of such breach, the report may be received in evidence.

(k) Any apprentice claiming to have cause for complaint regarding instruction, either in Technical College or in workshop, shall have the right to appeal to the Apprenticeship Board.

39. Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the Examiners as the Court shall allow.

40. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount (if any) by which the wages prescribed by the Agreement for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence. Provided however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

41. All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training, other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

42. When an apprentice attends a Technical College during his ordinary working hours, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

43. If the Apprenticeship Board makes representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical College or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices, are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical College or other such place as it deems necessary.

44. The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original Agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

45. Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court, with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or other such remedial measures as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

Apprentices to Stereotyping.

Every office covered by this Agreement shall be entitled to an apprentice for first four journeymen or fraction thereof and one for every additional four permanently employed. Apprentices shall not be allowed to work at night except in the last year of their apprenticeship. The apprenticeship shall be for a term of five years, and no apprentice shall be allowed to commence his apprenticeship until he has attained the age of 16 years. The wages of an apprentice to stereotyping shall be those set out in this Agreement for apprentices to the composing and letterpress sections. The general conditions covering apprentices to the composing and letterpress sections set out herein will, as far as they are applicable, cover apprentices to stereotyping.

Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
- (e) That technical instruction of the apprentice, if available in ordinary working hours, shall be at the expense of the employer and shall be in the employer's time.
- (f) In the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners appointed by the Arbitration Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed, at the employer's expense, to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
2. And the said apprentice and the said parent covenant with the said employer that . . . the said apprentice during the said term will—
- (a) well, faithfully, and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid:—
- (b) willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer, or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business;
- (c) not do or suffer to be done or committed any waste, damage, or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer, or any firm or company of which he may be a member, or sell or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer;
- (d) not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during working hours;
- (e) not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience;
- (f) not participate or take part or be concerned in a strike or anything in the nature thereof;
- (g) duly perform and observe the covenants, conditions, and stipulations contained in the now current Agreement so far as the same relates to the apprenticeship.
3. It is hereby further agreed by and between the parties thereto:
- (1) The apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any pay for any time during which he shall from any cause whatsoever be absent from the service of the said employer without leave.
- (2) Time lost by the apprentice through absence from any cause whatsoever shall be added to the term of this agreement and so that the amount of such lost time during any six monthly period shall be made up before the next ensuing period of six months shall be deemed to commence.
- (3) If at any time during the said term the said employer shall die or cease to carry on his business aforesaid as now carried on by him, he or his executors, administrators, or assigns shall be at liberty within one month from the date of such death or ceasing to carry on, to assign or transfer the said apprentice to some other employer upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are herein contained. Provided that, if the said employer or his executors, administrators, or assigns as aforesaid shall not within the said period of one month be able to find another such employer able and willing to accept the apprentice, then the said employer or his executors, administrators, or assigns as aforesaid, shall have the right to discharge the said apprentice, and to terminate this agreement by giving to the said apprentice one week's notice in writing.
- (4) That if the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his place of business at the date hereof, the parent and the apprentice may, within one month of such removal, by notice in writing elect to have the apprentice transferred to some other employer within the said radius, if there be one such able and willing to accept the apprentice, and on receipt of notice in writing of such election the employer will use his utmost endeavours to find such an employer and to obtain the transfer of the said apprentice, and it is further agreed, that if at the expiration of three months from the date of such election there shall not have been found another such employer able and willing forthwith to accept the apprentice, then the parent and the apprentice may by a further notice in writing claim to have this agreement terminated.
- (5) If at any time during the said term the said apprentice shall neglect or refuse to obey the lawful commands of the said employer or his representative, or shall commit a breach of any of the covenants on his part herein contained, the said employer shall have the right, subject to confirmation by the Court, to discharge the said apprentice and to terminate this agreement by giving the said apprentice one week's notice of his intention so to do.
- (6) That upon the termination of this agreement by any means before the expiration of the said term and confirmation by the Court, no proceedings shall be taken by any one party against the other or others in respect of anything which has taken place before the date of such termination.
- (7) This agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court.
- And for the further performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

COOPERS (BREWERIES).

No. 29 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912/1925, the first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, between the Swan Brewery Company, Limited, Emu Brewery, Limited, Redcastle Brewery, Limited, and the Northam Brewery Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Federated Coopers of Australia, W.A. Branch Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto hereby covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate throughout Western Australia, with the exception of Wyndham.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from the day of the date hereof and shall continue in force for a period of one year.

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to adult male coopers employed by Breweries within the above area.

4.—Weekly Hiring.

Save as is hereinafter provided, the engagement of workers under this Agreement shall be for a weekly hiring and the employment shall be terminable by the employee by one week's notice and by the employer by one week's notice given on any day or by payment of one week's pay: Provided, however, that during the first fourteen working days following an engagement for employment with any employer, the hiring shall be a hiring from day to day, and one day's notice or payment of one day's pay shall be deemed due and sufficient notice, and in the event of the employment of any such worker being so determined within such period, then he shall be deemed to have been a "casual worker" and entitled to the wages provided by Clause 8 (c) hereof.

5.—Hours.

Forty-four hours shall constitute an ordinary week's work and shall be worked during the period between Monday to Friday inclusive, and between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on days within that period which are hereinafter called "working days": Provided that the employees of Country Breweries (which shall mean breweries outside the Metropolitan Area) may be called upon to perform part of the week's work on Saturday morning between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 12 noon, without payment of overtime, anything in the next ensuing clause hereof notwithstanding.

6.—Overtime.

All work performed outside the hours prescribed by the preceding clause shall be overtime and paid for at the following rates:—

- (a) For working days and Saturdays, time and a half.
- (b) For Sundays double time.
- (c) For the holidays herein prescribed, ordinary rates in addition to the day's pay which the worker would ordinarily receive in respect of such holiday.

7.

Workers required to work and working on after 6 p.m. on any day shall be provided with tea at the

employer's expense, unless at least twenty-four hours' notice has been given to such workers that they will be required to work after 6 p.m.

8.—Wages.

(a) Basic wage—£4 7s. 0d. per week.

(b) The minimum rate of wages payable to weekly workers engaged on work within the scope of this Agreement shall be—

9.

Employees engaged for work in country breweries shall be entitled to payment of the fare and freight on tools necessary to take them to their place of employment on their being first engaged.

10.

(a) Annual leave of ten working days on full pay shall become due to workers with twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at times suitable to the convenience of the employer. A worker who on leaving has not completed 12 months' service shall be entitled to annual leave, or pay in lieu thereof, in proportion as the length of his service is to the full year's employment. Saturday shall not, for the purpose of this paragraph, be deemed to be a working day in Country Breweries.

(b) In addition to the aforementioned annual leave workers shall be entitled to the eleven following paid holidays if in employment when they respectively occur:—New Year's Day; Anniversary Day, January 26th; Brewery Employees' Picnic Day; Good Friday; Easter Monday; Anzac Day, April 25th; Labour Day; King's Birthday; Show Day; Christmas Day; Boxing Day; or such other days as may be substituted by law or custom in lieu thereof. When any of the aforesaid days falls upon a Sunday some other day shall be substituted therefor.

(c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause shall not relate to "Casual Workers."

11.—Lead Patchers.

Old casks shall not be first patched with lead and then filled, but should a cask apparently sound be filled and subsequently and, before leaving the Brewery, be found to be leaking, lead patching may be applied for the purpose of saving the waste.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Metropolitan Weekly Newspapers, Journalists' Agreement.

No. 27 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this 11th day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, between the "Sunday Times" Publishing Company, Limited, Proprietors of the newspaper "The Sunday Times," of the one part, and The Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, a Union registered under the said Act, of the other part: Whereby it is agreed that the following rates and conditions shall govern employment with respect to the said newspaper.

This Agreement shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

This Agreement shall come into force on and be operative as from the first day of September, 1929, and shall continue in operation until the 31st day of August, 1932, and thereafter until a new Agreement is entered into between the parties.

1.—Minimum Rates of Pay.

The minimum weekly rates of pay shall be as follows, and are based on the basic wage of £4 7s. 0d. per week for males and £2 7s. 0d. per week for females; provided that, upon any increase or decrease in the basic wage from year to year, as declared by the Court of Arbitration, the margins contained in the said rates shall be automatically decreased or increased respectively by amounts similar to the increase or decrease in such basic wage, so that the total rates of pay hereinafter provided shall not be altered in any way during the currency of this Agreement.

2.—Cadets.

(a) An employee who is constantly or regularly in training for journalism, or who substantially performs the work of one in training for journalism, and has not had three years' experience in journalism, shall for the purpose of this Award be termed a cadet, and shall become a member of the Australian Journalists' Association within two months of his appointment, unless he makes a statutory declaration to the effect that he has conscientious objections to doing so.

(b) The services of a cadet shall be regarded as continuous, notwithstanding that he may have been employed on more than one newspaper during his period of cadetship.

(c) Except with the consent in writing of the Association, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, not more than one cadet shall be employed to every five members of the employer's classified staff.

(d) The rates of pay for cadets shall be as follow:—

(e) The period of cadetship shall not exceed three years: Provided however that, after the completion of this period of cadetship, should there be no vacancy on the classified staff to which he could be appointed, a cadet may, with the consent of the Australian Journalists' Association, continue in such employment at the rate provided for a third-year cadet until such time as a vacancy for a junior occurs under the percentage grading prescribed in this Award within a period consented to by the Association. In the event of his services being terminated by his employer without just cause in law during such period, or should the Association refuse to consent to a further period, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, the cadet shall receive the difference between the third-year cadet rate and the rate for a junior journalist, from the time of completion of his third-year cadetship until the date of termination of his services. If the cadet leaves his employment of his own accord during or after such periods, no such extra payment shall be made.

(f) No person shall commence his cadetship unless he has a knowledge of English equivalent to the standard of the Intermediate or Junior examination at any Australian university.

(g) A cadet shall be fully and thoroughly taught and instructed by his employer in the profession of journalism. Such instruction shall include:—

(i) Instruction as to the alterations, emendations, and corrections of copy, and especially the copy he supplies.

(ii) Provision to accompany at suitable times, as opportunity occurs, for practical instruction and experience, members of the classified staff when they are employed on various forms of journalistic work.

(h) Each cadet shall be permitted by his employer to absent himself during ordinary working hours for periods not exceeding a total of four hours in any one week, for the purposes of attending shorthand and type-writing classes, University or other lectures, or classes in literature, economics, civics, history, logic and other subjects covered in the course of any Diploma of Journalism granted by any Australian University.

(i) All lecture and other fees, and the requisite books for such studies, shall be provided by the employer.

3.—Casual Journalists.

(a) A casual journalist shall be one who may be employed on the ordinary routine work of the Literary Staff for not more than seven days in any period of one month, except when he is engaged to replace a permanent journalist absent on sick, holiday, or other emergency leave.

(b) Casual journalists shall only be engaged and paid as follows:—

For half day or four hours or less—£1 0s. 0d.

For full day, comprising more than four hours and not more than eight hours—£1 17s. 6d.

For time worked in excess of eight hours in one day—Time and a half.

(c) Casual journalists employed for supplying sporting results only on Saturday afternoons shall be paid lineage rates or a minimum sum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) for the afternoon.

4.—Contributors.

Writers who contribute matter for publication, but who are not on the classified staff, and who do not usually act as general members of the staff, and who are not otherwise provided for, and contributors generally, shall be paid at the following rates:—

For articles (except leading), paragraphs, reports, etc.—2¼d. per line.

For leading articles or verse—3d. per line.

Less 5 per cent., as in Dailies Award.

5.—Correspondents.

District correspondents regularly employed as such shall be paid at least the rate prescribed for a junior journalist.

6.—Classification of Journalists.

(a) Journalists, with the undermentioned exceptions, shall be classified as follows:—Senior journalists; General journalists; Junior journalists.

(b) Classified journalists shall be classified in the following proportions:—Three-fifths of the staff shall be senior, not more than one-fifth shall be junior, and the rest shall be generals. Where the calculation of the percentages results in a fraction, such fraction, if over point five, shall be reckoned to the higher integer, and if point five or less to the lower integer.

(c) The exceptions to the classification mentioned in this clause shall be:—

(i) Editors in chief, casuals, cadets, district and country correspondents, contributors, and journalists employed outside the Commonwealth.

(ii) "Contributor" in this subclause means a person who is not employed as a member of the general staff, or to act as if he were a member of the general staff (and who is not a district or suburban or country correspondent as hereinafter defined), but who in and at his own time prepares matter to be submitted to his employer for acceptance or rejection at the employer's option.

7.—Hours of Employment.

(a) The ordinary working week for journalists shall not exceed forty-four hours.

(b) There shall be two clear days (one of which may be Sunday) off in each week.

(c) Subject to the next succeeding subclause, the period between the time of entering on duty, as hereinafter defined, and the time signed off as the time of completion, shall be reckoned as actual time worked, except such time as is actually occupied in meal time.

(d) After the expiration of a period of eleven hours in any one day from the time of entering on duty, as hereinafter defined, all time until the time signed off as the time of completion shall be reckoned as overtime and either allowed or paid for as hereinafter provided.

(e) When the weekly maximum number of hours is exceeded in any week, time to the amount of the excess shall be deducted from the forty-four hours to be worked during the next succeeding week.

(f) The time due as arrears shall be allowed continuously: Provided that by agreement between the employer and the journalists the time off may be taken in periods of not less than half a day each.

(g) Notice of time off shall, as far as possible, be given before 5 p.m. on the preceding day.

(h) If time off is not allowed as hereinbefore provided, it shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

8.—Time Book.

(a) A Time Book, in a form to be agreed upon by the parties, shall be provided by the employer and kept on the premises. It shall, among other things, provide for the entries hereinafter mentioned.

(b) Except on country engagements, the working day of a journalist shall commence at the time of his entering on duty.

(c) "Entering on duty" means:—

(i) arrival at the office for the first time in the day for the purpose of performing duty; or

(ii) beginning to perform the first engagement, whichever is the earlier, a reasonable time being allowed in the latter case to cover the period required to reach the engagement from home.

(d) Except as otherwise provided, all journalists shall make the following entries in the Time Book: each of them shall personally, on entering on duty, or as soon thereafter as circumstances reasonably permit, sign on in the Time Book, and write therein the time of entering upon duty as above defined. He shall also, on completing his work for the day or as soon thereafter as circumstances reasonably permit, sign off, stating the time of completion.

(e) Entries so made, if not disputed within twenty-four hours, shall be taken to be correct.

(f) The Time Book shall be open for inspection during office hours by (1) every member of the staff, (2) by the Secretary of the Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, or a member of the said Union authorised in writing to inspect it.

9.—Country Engagements.

On country engagements, time on duty shall be reckoned as follows:—

(a) If the engagement is confined to one day, the whole time during which the journalist is absent from the city.

(b) If the engagement or engagements extend beyond one day, five-twelfths of the time the journalist is absent from the city.

10.—Expenses.

(a) All employees embraced in this Agreement shall be paid reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred while on duty.

(b) If a member's duty compels him to take more than one meal a day away from his home, such meal or meals in excess of one a day shall be paid for by the employer.

(c) Women members employed upon work requiring attendance in evening dress shall be provided with reasonable vehicular facilities.

11.—Holiday Leave.

(a) All journalists regularly employed on salaries, and district correspondents fully employed as such, shall receive three consecutive weeks' holiday after forty-nine weeks' service, with an additional week in each third

year of service on full pay irrespective of sick leave. The fourth week's leave shall apply to those journalists who, in the ordinary course of events, would have been entitled thereto under the conditions existing before this Agreement was entered into.

(b) If a journalist is not employed for a full year, then a proportionate part of the annual leave shall be granted.

(c) The term "full pay" in this clause relating to district correspondents shall be taken to mean pay at the same rate as that of a junior journalist.

(d) Members of the classified staff shall have a clear day off on full pay on Christmas Day, and on Good Friday, or, in lieu thereof, on the day before or after each of these days. This shall be in addition to the ordinary weekly two days off.

12.—Sick and Incapacity Pay.

(a) All members regularly employed on salary, and also all district correspondents solely employed, shall in every year of their employment be paid weekly while absent through illness or bona fide incapacity (upon production of a medical certificate if required), at not less than the following scale:—

i. For every two months or part of two months he has been employed, up to six months, he shall be paid the first week at full pay, the second week at half pay, and the third week at quarter pay.

ii. After he has been employed six months, he shall be paid for the first four weeks at full pay, the second four weeks at half pay, and the third four weeks at quarter pay.

iii. After he has been employed five years, he shall be paid the first two months at full pay, the second two months at half pay, and the third two months at quarter pay.

(b) In the case of district correspondents, "full pay" in this clause means £5 10s. 0d. a week.

(c) Where any other provision has been made for the case of an employee's illness, either alone or in conjunction with any other contingency, that provision shall be substituted in whole or in part, and either generally as to all the employees, or as to any individual case, in the place of the provision for sick pay made by this clause, if there be obtained the written consent of the Union, and of the Company, and the certificate of the Registrar that in his opinion the substituted provision is as beneficial to the members of the Union as the provision hereby made.

(d) If in any particular case the Company is required by law to make any payment or compensation to the journalist who is ill, then, to the extent of such payment or compensation actually made, the provision in this Award for sick pay, or in any substituted provision, shall abate.

(e) For the purposes of this division, the period or periods absent in twelve months shall be regarded as cumulative, and not as applying to separate illnesses and/or incapacity that may occur during the course of the twelve months.

13.—Relieving.

Any journalist or cadet temporarily taking the place of another of higher grade shall, while doing so, be paid at the higher rate: Provided that this does not apply to holidays or sick leave where the absent journalist or cadet is paid by the employer.

14.—Termination of Employment.

Termination of employment of journalists who have been in the employ of the Company for two months or more shall be subject to four weeks' notice: Provided that, in the case of sub-editors the period shall be four months, and in the case of seniors two months, but in cases where a journalist has been guilty of misconduct or refusal of duty, the Company shall be entitled to dismiss such journalist immediately.

15.—Salaries and Conditions to continue.

Any journalist who, prior to this Agreement coming into force, was in possession of status and conditions of employment better than those prescribed herein, shall not have such status or conditions reduced or abrogated in any way.

16.—Names to be furnished.

(a) The names of all journalists employed by the Company, together with a statement as to the grade in which they are employed, shall be entered and, when

necessary, added to or corrected by or on behalf of the Company in a book to be kept by the Company for the purpose.

(b) A copy of such entries shall, on application in writing by the Secretary of the Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia at any time be furnished by the Company to any member of the said Union authorised in writing to receive it.

(c) Any adjustment of the staff through resignation, dismissal, or any other cause shall be notified by the Company in writing to the Secretary of the said Union within two weeks of such adjustment.

17.—Male and Female Employees.

All provision in this Agreement shall apply equally to male and female employees.
