WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road; and whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedulchereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specitied in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

Public Service Act, 1904. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 84 of "The Public Service Act, 1904," that the Governor may make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the carrying out of any of the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient to amend the Regulations governing the admission of Cadet Surveyors, Lands and Surveys Department, published in the Government Gazette of the 25th day of April, 1919, by repealing Regulation 17 thereof and inserting in place thereof a new Regulation 17, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said Regulations by repealing Regulation 17 thereof, and by inserting a new Regulation No. 17 in place thereof, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations as follows:—

Agreement and Bond.

17. Before any person is accepted as a cadet under these Regulations an agreement in the form or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the Appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the Head of the Department concerned; and a Bond in the form or to the effect of Form No. 2 in the said Appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties, to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

PARKS AND RESERVES ACT, 1895.

By-laws for the Control of Reserve 9610 (Recreation and Watering Place), Lake Yealering.

Lands and Surveys Department, Perth, 8th January, 1930. Corr. 416/05. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," of the following By-laws for the control of Reserve 9610 (Recreation and Watering Place), Lake Yealering.

C. G. MORRIS, Under Secretary for Lands.

The term "Board" in these By-laws shall mean the Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," to control the Reserve.
"Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board first obtained and expressed in writing.

By-laws.

Reserve to be Open.

1. The Reserve and Lake will be open to the public on all days, except on special occasions, when sports are held in the enclosed area, when an entrance fee will be charged.

Persons not to drive over the Reserve.

2. No person shall drive upon or over the said Reserve, or any part thereof (other than a carriage way), without permission from the Board first obtained; nor shall any person ride upon or over any cultivated ground or any pathway in the said Reserve.

Boats on the Lake.

All boats used on the lake to be registered with the Board, and all boats plying for hire must be licensed and subject to inspection.

Injuring or destroying Trees.

4. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserve; or cut or remove any dead wood or timber lying in the Reserve, unless with the permission in writing of the Board first ob-

Injuring the Soil or Surface or Fences, etc.

5. No person shall cut up, or damage, or disfigure, or interfere with the soil or turf or surface on any part of the said Reserve, on the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or with any part of the fences, buildings, rockwork, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same, or pollute or interferre with any ornamental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds or animals therein in any manner whatsoever.

Persons misconducting themselves.

6. No person shall misconduct himself or herself in any way by indulging in any riotous, disorderly, or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on the said Reserve; neither shall any person obstruct or interfere with any officer in the employ of the Board in the performance of his duty in the said Reserve.

Lodging on the Reserve in the open Air.

7. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight on the said Reserve, or shall sleep during the day on the said Reserve.

Posting Bills.

8. No person shall post, stick, stamp, steneil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, steneilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, stenented, painted, of otherwise and the tary patterns, bandbill, notice, advertisement, or any document what-soever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, bathing shed, jetty, boat, flagging, road, path, or any place whatever on the said Reserve.

Shooting, etc., on the Reserve and Lake.

9. No person or person shall shoot or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire, or use any explosive substance whatever on any portion of the Reserve, unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Selling Goods on the Reserve.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said Reserve, unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Races, etc., forbidden.

11. No racing matches with horses, dogs or otherwise, nor any game of polo, nor any game which may be considered dangerous to the Board, or may be calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public, or likely to injure the surface of the ground, shall be allowed on the said Reserve, except on such portions as may be specially set apart for such purposes, and shown thereon by boundary posts, such boundary posts to be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board may deem necessary; nor shall any person be permitted to use any portion of the said Reserve for the purpose of training any horse or other animal thereon.

Waste Litter of Picnics to be removed.

12. When any person, party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game or picnic on the Reserve, he or they (as the case may be) shall, immediately prior to leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them the ground by them.

- 14. The Board may, if it thinks fit, fix the day or days upon which, and the bounds or limits within which any games or gymnasties may be permitted to take place upon the Reserve; or they may prohibit any games or gymnasites from taking place upon the said Reserve.

Cattle not to be Depastured.

15. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, camel, donkey, mule, or pig to stray or to depasture upon the Reserve lands without the special approval of the Board in writing.

Lamps for Vehicles.

16. Every person driving or riding any carriage, motor car, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have attached to such vehicle a lighted lamp, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding and afford adequate means of indicating the approach and position of such vehicle; and shall also have attached to any such motor car or other vehicle a lighted lamp, so fixed as to exhibit a light from the rear of such motor ear or other vehicle.

Bells for Motor Cars and Cycles.

17. No person shall drive or ride any motor car, bicycle, or tricycle unless such machine shall have a bell or other sufficient means of warning affixed thereto.

Warning Bell, etc.

18. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a motor car, bicycle, or tricycle which shall be overtaking any other vehicle or any animal, or foot passenger shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing or attempting to pass such other vehicle, animal, or foot passenger, sound the bell or other sufficient means of warning.

Reckless Driving.

19. No person shall, at any time, drive, ride, or impel any carriage, motor car, bievele, trievele, or other vehicle recklessly or negligently, or at a speed, or in a manner dangerous to the public, or in any circumstances at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour; nor shall any person ride on any roadway or over any portion of the said Reserve at a rate or speed or in a manner dangerous to the public. gerous to the public.

Bieyeles, etc., not to be used on Footways.

20. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, bicycle, or tricycle on or over any footway in the said Reserve.

21. (a) No person shall use any roadway within the said Reserve for the purpose of instructing any other

person how to drive any motor vehicle.

(b) No person shall drive any motor vehicle within the limits of the said Reserve unless he is the holder of the requisite Driver's License under "The Traffic Act, 1919."

(c) No person shall make use of any roadway within

the said Reserve for the purpose of testing or trying

any motor vehicle.

(d) Motor vehicle has the same meaning as in "The Traffic Act, 1919"; all motor ears, motor trucks, bicycles, and horse-drawn vehicles must park on areas prescribed for that purpose.

Penalty.

22. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay on conviction such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Boundaries.

23. BY-LAWS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE KOORDA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Reserve 20236.

Department of Lands and Surveys, /14. Perth, 15th December, 1929. Corr. 1353/14. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, of the By-laws set out here-1897, and amending Acts, of the By-laws set out here-under for the Koorda Public Cemetery, Reserve 20236.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf in the Trustees of the Koorda Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.
- Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in Schedule (" contained in Schedule C.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours' notice to be given to the Secretary prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time to allow of at least eight working hours' notice being given as stated above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves, to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Secretary.
- 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to, or be interred in, the Cemetery.
- 7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cometery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. The Certificate shall be retained, but the Coroner's order

shall be returned to the person producing the same.

10 Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be opened between the hours of

7 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily.
11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

Week-days, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

- 13. Every funeral shall enter the Cemetery by the principal gate, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed by such roads as directed by the Trustees or any of their officers. Any driver or other person neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.
- No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

 14. Children under the age of 10 years entering the Cemetery must be under the charge of some responsible person.
- 15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.
- 16. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any crection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling by any means whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees. Any person infringing this By-law Any person infringing this By-law

shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

19. No person employed by the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person found guilty of accepting such gratuity

shall be liable to summary dismissal.

20. Subject to the By-laws, and to the direction of the Trustees, the Secretary and Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the control of the control o duct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery. For such service he shall receive from the Trustees a prescribed salary per annum.

21. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the name of any deceased person or persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

22. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the form Schedule E.

23. Upon completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the form Schedule E.

- 24. Every such Grant shall be subject to By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon the production of the Order of Burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 25. Every coffin placed in any such brick grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees,

26. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person whom the "Grant" was issued or his registered assign, the written and verified

consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

27. Any person desiring to place or erect or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written con-

23 of the Principal Act (61 Viet., 23).
28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees or their officers shall extend

to the bottom of the grave.

The materials used in any such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse or any material remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

30. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

31. Masons and other tradesmen shall before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary and Superintendent the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if either of the conditions of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with.

32. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Gemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as shall be directed, and no vehicle conveying such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall within three months from the date of the application cause to be placed thereon or thereby at least a number plate of the number of the grave.

35. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or

vault.

No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave

37. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or any other person, shall whilst in the Cemetery be under the supervision of the Superintendent and Secre-

38. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees. Such licenses to be renewed

annually in January.

39. Any person taking part in dressing or attending

to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any grave, but must be removed from the Cemetery as soon as the work is completed.

(b) No soil shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for dressing a grave except with the permission of the Superintendent.

(c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due

despatch and during working hours.

40. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for purpose connected with interment, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the 1st day of January following, and unless in possession of such "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

41. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws made under any Act relating to cemeteries shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of continuing a further breach. a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be fortbwith re moved from the Cemetery, be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 303 of 1929.

In the matter of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and in the matter of an application by the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Narrogin Branch (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), under Section 90 of the said Act, for variation of an Industrial Agreement declared a Common Rule.

UPON hearing the application of Mr R. Bourke on behalf of the Union and Mr. L. L. Carter on behalf of Mannings and others, made in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 90 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the Court doth hereby order that Industrial Agreement dated the nineteenth day of January 1925, and Registered No. 3 of 1925, which was declared to be a Common Rule on the 28th, day of April, 1925, be and the same is hereby varied in the terms of 1925, be and the same is hereby varied in the terms of the annnexed schedule.

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of five miles from the Post Office, Narrogin.

2.--Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the date hereof: provided that, after the expiration of twelve months, any terms or term hereof may be reviewed, revised, and amended by agreement of the parties hereto. 3.—Definitions.

In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indi-

The term "Shop assistant" includes employees in country order departments, cashiers, and carpet and linoleum layers and planners.

The term "Casual hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four hours in any one day.

The term "Weekly hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for a period of four consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a "Weekly hand" has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness, or any cause referred to in paragraph 10 hereof.

4.--Hours.

The ordinary working hours for shop assistants shall be in conformity with "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," in so far as the provisions of that Act limit the 1920," in so far as the provisions of that Act limit the number of hours which shop assistants may be employed during any one day or during any week, but the time for commencing work on any day shall not be earlier than 8 a.m., and the time for finishing work shall not be later than 5.30 p.m. on every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday; 9 o'clock p.m. on every Friday, and 12 o'clock noon on every Saturday; one hour shall have alwayed for meal hour. be allowed for meal hour.

5.—Overtime.

(a) For all time worked on Saturday afternoon and for all time worked on Sundays or holidays, double time

shall be paid. For all other overtime the rate shall be time and a half for the first four hours; thereafter double

- (b) In the computation of overtime each day's work shall stand by itself.
- (c) When Christmas Day falls on any week day other than Monday, and the preceding day is worked as the late night for that week, then for the purpose of computing the overtime of easual hands (but for no other purpose) 6 o'clock shall be regarded as the usual finishing timé.

6.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) A holiday of one week, on full pay, with one week optional shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his or her services. Provided that, when an employee is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two weeks' notice from the employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such employee shall take his holidays: Provided further, that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

7.—Wages.

Basic wage: Males £4 7s. 0d. per week; females, £2 7s. 0d. per week.

- (b) Where no female assistant is employed one junior female assistant may be employed.

 Where one senior female assistant is employed two

junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two senior female assistants are employed three junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three senior female assisants are employed four

junior female assistants may be employed.

Where four senior female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five

junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.

(c) In this clause the word "senior" shall mean a

person of twenty-one years of age or over.

10.-Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided, that an employer at any time may dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such employee does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

11.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he or she has been employed. Such book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union at least one day in each week between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

12.-Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant Union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the Secretary of his desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the Secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident of Police Magistrate for a most convenient Resident of Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said Secretary at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the Magistrate, and the Secretary or his Agent shall be entitled to attend before the Magistrate and, pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant such worker a permit to work for such wage and for such period not exceeding six calendar months as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned and for the period therein stated until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said Secretary.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 21 of 1928.

Beteween The Western Australia Society of Operative Plasterers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Ap-plicant, and The Master Builders and Contractors' Association Union of Employers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:

Award.

1.—Area.

This schedule of wages, hours, and working conditions shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three years from the date hereof.

3.-Hours.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows:-On the first five days of the week, between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with 45 minutes for lunch; on Saturdays, between 7.30 a.m. and

Provided, however, that where none but plasterers are working on the job and where the work is being done ander the piece-work system or by sub-contract, then at the option of the employer, and with the concurrence of the worker, the forty-four hours may be worked in five days each of eight hours forty-eight minutes.

4.—Overtime.

All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for first two hours and double time thereafter. worker who is called upon to work overtime for more than two hours without receiving notice of such over-time on the previous day shall be paid an allowance of two shillings for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any worker who has left the premises in which he is employed, and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour, shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires a worker to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such worker a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by a worker who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time.

5.-Holidays.

Where a journeyman or operative plasterer or apprentice in the trade is required to work on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday, Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Union Pienic Day or on any such day as may be declared for the holding of such holidays, or on any Sunday, he will be entitled to receive payment at double time rates for all time worked.

6.—Classes of Workers.

The following classes of workers only shall be recognised in the trade and calling of plastering:—(a) operative or journeyman plasterers, and (b) apprentices who are employed or engaged in the work of plastering or on any portion of that work which is provided for in Clause 7 hereof.

7.—Definition of Plastering Work.

Plastering work shall mean and be deemed to be-(a) all internal and external plastering and cement-

ing;

(b) wood lathing (except where work done by recognised lathers) and metal lathing, or any similar or other substitute such as sackett board, which may be used as a ground for plastering work;

(c) the fixing of pre-cast plaster or any other kind of plaster required to be finished off with plastered

joints;

(d) plastering in sewers, septic tanks, water tanks,

and cooling chambers;

(e) also the following work where such is done by workers engaged or employed as plasterers:— (i) fixing of plain and ornamental tiles on walls and floors;

(ii) top-dressing of concrete work finished in

cement or granolithic; (iii) fancy paving.

The following work is not included in the foregoing definition:

- (i) Work now usually done by workers in fibrous plaster or authorised to be done by workers under any other Award or Industrial Agreement:
- (ii) work done by plumbers,

8.—Allowances to Journeymen and Apprentices.

- (a) Where engaged in sewer work, workers shall be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per day extra for new work and two shillings (2s.) per day extra for repair work.
- (b) Workers when working on a scaffolding similar to or of the nature or kind of what is known as a "boat," scaffolding shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day. An apprentice who has served less than two years shall not be worked on such a scaffolding.
- (c) An employee who is in charge in a shop or on a job of three or more journeymen, and a journeyman setting out work on a job for three or more journeymen, shall be deemed a leading hand, and shall be entitled to receive one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day additional to the rate prescribed in Clause 17 hereof.

9.—Fares and Travelling Allowances.

"Fares" mean fares actually and reasonably incurred and includes, where a bicycle or other method of conveyance, the property of the worker, is used, an allowance equal to the fares which would otherwise be

"City Area": For the purposes of this Award this term means that part of Perth lying between the Swan River and a line drawn along Spring Street; thence along Mount Street to St. George's Terrace; thence to George Street, and along George Street to Wellington Street; thence through Railway Reserve to Fitzgerald Street, and along Fitzgerald Street to Newcastle Street; thence along Newcastle Street to Lord Street, and along Lord Street to Wittenoom Street; thence along Wittenoom Street to Hill Street; thence along Hill Street to the Swan River.

(a) Outside Working Hours:—
(1) Workers shall not be entitled to any fares when employed at any place within the city area;

(2) When employed outside the city area, a worker shall be entitled to receive the excess, if any, representing the difference between the amount actually incurred and the amount which he would have incurred if required to pay the fares outward and inward between his residence and the point of termination of the conveyance within the area.

(b) During Working Hours:

(a) During the hours of work, all time of travel-ling from one job to another or otherwise, in pursuance of instructions of the employer, shall be paid for at ordinary rates and also all fares incurred in connection with such travelling.

10.—Country Allowances.

When any worker is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid in addition to his regular wages six shillings (6s.) per day for the first seven days and thirty-five shillings (35s.) per week thereafter. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided, that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day. The employer shall also provide free transport for the worker's tools.

11.—Piece-work.

A worker undertaking piece-work shall be paid at least the minimum rates prescribed by this Award plus 10 (ten) per cent., but this clause shall not apply unless such worker is actually and actively engaged in the work himself.

12.—General Conditions.

(a) Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job of each employer for the convenience of all plasterers and their apprentices.
(b) The employer shall provide on each job boiling

water for each plasterer and his apprentice to make tea

at meal time.

(c) The employer shall provide a place on each job for the safe keeping of the tools of the plasterer and apprentice, when not in use.

(d) Stands for mortar boards not less than 2ft. 6in. from any ground or where practicable, and safe from a scaffold level, shall be provided for the plasterer by the employer when requested so to do.

(e) Worker presenting himself and not engaged.—When notice is given to a worker by his employer or his responsible representative to present himself for work, and he attends where so directed and his services are not required for reasons other than those due to weather conditions, such worker shall be paid five shillings in addition to any expenses necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job.

13.—Payment of Wages.

When a worker is discharged or ceases work on the job being finished at or before the usual pay time, he shall then be paid all wages due to him. Payment of wages shall be made on or before Friday of each week, within fifteen minutes of the usual time for ceasing work. An employer shall not keep more than one day's pay in hand.

14.—Notice.

The contract of services of all workers other than apprentices shall be an hourly one, terminable by one hour's notice on either side.

15.—Posting Copy of Schedule.

No employer shall prevent an official of the organisation at any time from posting a copy of this Award, or any notice of the organisation not exceeding fourteen inches by nine inches in a suitable place on any job.

16.—Apprentices.

(a) The Regulations made in pursuance of the Act as applied to the Building Trades shall apply except when herein negatived or modified.

(b) The term of apprenticeship shall be for five

(c) The wages of the apprentices shall be as prescribed from time to time by the Building Trades Apprenticeship Board.

17.—Wages.

Basic Wage—£4 7s. 0d. per week.

The wages of an operative or journeyman plasterer shall be 2s. 9-9/22d. per hour, which rate is made up by the following amounts in addition to the basic

18.—Record Book.

Each employer shall provide and keep a record showing the name of each worker, the time worked each day, the overtime worked each day, and the amount paid, including fares, together with the worker's signature for the same when received. Such record shall be open for inspection by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the employers' or workers' Unions during working hours.

19.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purposes of this Award a Board of Reference, which will consist of a Chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each party. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award the functions of-

(1) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involves interpretation of any of the provisions of the

(2) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

20.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement being reached within twentyfour hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

Award.

1.—Area.

This Award shall apply to all that part of Western Australia West of longitude 123, and South of latitude

2.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to employees engaged in the handling and stacking of wheat at railway stations and/ or sidings, but excluding wheat handling performed in the railway yards at the Ports of Geraldton, Albany, Bunbury, Fremantle and Esperance, and shall not apply to regular flour mill employees if engaged at or in connection with mills.

3.—Term.

This Award shall take effect as from the 20th day of December, 1929, and shall continue in force for a period of three years; provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from this date, either party may make application to the other party to amend or vary this Award: Provided that thirty days' notice is given by one to the other parties to the Award.

4.-Wages.

Basic wage-£4 7s. 0d. per week.

Basic wage—£4 7s. 0d. per week.

Men employed in the terms of Clause 2 of this Award on a daily contract of service shall be paid £1 4s. 0d. per day, being equivalent to £6 12s. 0d. per week, or a margin of £2 5s. 0d. per week over the basic wage.

Wages shall be paid at least once a week.

Piecework.—Where piecework rates are agreed upon not less than the following shall be paid:—

Men employed carrying or conveying wheat in bags from farmer's wagon to stack, or direct to railway truck, or from stack to railway truck, a distance of:-

And thereafter sixpence (6d.) per hundred bags for every additional ten feet carried.

These piece-work rates shall be subject to the following condition:—

(a) The condition is that, if the total wages received for the ordinary hours under the piece-work contract and for its terms be less than £1 4s. 0d. per ordinary working day, the deficiency shall be paid to the employee, but shall not exceed an amount equivalent to 10s. 2d. per hundred bags.

(b) Where bag elevators or similar appliances are supplied by the employer, the rates above speci-fied shall be reduced by one shilling (1s.) per hundred bags.

(c) Where elevators or conveyors are used the earrying distance from stacks to rails shall be calculated from the delivery end of the elevator to

the rails.

Casual Workers: For casual work incidental to the industry to which this Award applies, and not specifically provided for elsewhere, the rate of pay shall be two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) an hour.

5.—Hours.

Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work. Any time worked in excess of these hours, or in excess of eight and three-quarter hours in any one day shall be deemed to be overtime and paid for at overtime rates.

The ordinary hours of work for all workers shall not exceed eight and three-quarter hours in any one day, and may be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m.; or by agreement of the parties, up to twelve noon on Saturday.

6.—Overtime.

All work performed by day workers, or piece-workers, outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at time and a half rates. Provided that for work done on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed by this Award, double time rates shall be paid.

7.-Holidays.

All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays in addition to Sundays, namely, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Boxing Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day.

8.—Roofing of Stacks.

Roofers shall be paid £1 5s. 0d. per day for any continuous part of a day exceeding half the ordinary hours of work, and 12s. 6d. per day for any continuous part of a day not exceeding half the ordinary hours of

Piece-workers shall be paid at the rate of thirty-one shillings (31s.) per thousand bags for roofing a stack, and ten shillings and eightpence (10s. 8d.) per thousand bags for de-roofing a stack

9.—Sheeting of Trucks.

The rate to be paid for sheeting trucks shall be sixpence (6d.) per sheet.

10.—Height of Stacks.

Where an elevator or other similar appliance is not used, the maximum height of a stack up which men shall be required to carry bags of wheat shall be twelve bags.

11.—Smoke-ohs.

Employees shall be entitled to a smoke-oh of fifteen minutes' duration each morning and afternoon on which work is performed, at a time mutually agreed upon each day at each stacking centre.
