WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that the Native Pheasant (Gnow) shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

Regulating Colour of Identification Plates for Carts and Carriages for Year 1930-31.

SUBPARAGRAPHS (d) and (e) to paragraph 6 of Regulation No. 13 are hereby amended by inserting new subparagraphs in lieu thereof, so as to alter the colour for identification plates of carts and carriages for the financial year ending 30th June, 1931, as follows:—
