Lot 2, and Town Lots 482, 567, and 568 to the right bank of the Swan River; thence by said right bank upwards to the Southern side of the Causeway; thence South-Eastward along said side about 13 chains; thence South about 18 chains to a point in prolongation South-Eastward of the South-Western side of Barrack Square; thence North-Westward to a point in said prolongation situate about 3 chains 50 links from the South corner of Barrack Square aforesaid, and thence North-Eastward to the starting point.

## THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

## Carnamah Road Board—By-laws.

P.W. 1080/26.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Carnamah Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

*Part 1.—Interpretation.*

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act or, respectively, that is to say:—

"The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto.

"Board"—The Carnamah Road Board.

"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

"District"—The District under the jurisdiction of the Carnamah Road Board.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

"Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Member"—A member of the Board, and includes the Chairman of the Board.

"Road or Reserve"—Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

"Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

"Footpath" or "footway" shall include any part of the roadway set apart for the sole use of the foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

"Permission of the Board"—The consent of the Board given in writing. All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

*Duties of Secretary.*

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:—

- (a) to attend all Board meetings;
- (b) to attend all committee meetings;
- (c) to take notes of minutes, and prepare reports of committees;
- (d) to conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;
- (e) to answer all questions on the Board's business;
- (f) to see that the accounts are audited quarterly, and the balance sheets prepared and published in the *Government Gazette* yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Districts Act, 1919";
- (g) to prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year;
- (h) to supervise the preparation of the Rate Books and the Board's Electoral Lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the Supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolutions;
- (i) to summon the members to Board and committee meetings;
- (j) to keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;
- (k) to check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for the works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the Receipt Book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;

- (l) to report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto;
- (m) to see that no payments to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary or such other officer as may be acting temporarily in that capacity;
- (n) to readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;
- (o) to see that all other bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;
- (p) to report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him;
- (q) to exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or chairman, control over all servants of the Board;
- (r) to see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts;
- (s) to be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and see that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

*Appointment of Officers.*

3. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

4. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded.

5. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present.

6. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

*Meetings and Proceedings.*

7. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meeting adjourned.

8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified therein for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called for: Provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The Ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provision of the Act shall be first complied with.

9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in

the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is present.

11. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

12. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 minutes after time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

13. The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

#### Voting.

14. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

#### Minutes of Meetings.

15. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

#### Standing Orders.

16. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a) reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any);
- (b) consideration of business arising out of minutes;
- (c) questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board;
- (d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the Chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein;
- (e) reports of sub-committees and officers;
- (f) deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof.
- (g) reading of correspondence received and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto;
- (h) consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts;
- (i) presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment;
- (j) motions of which previous notice has been given;
- (k) motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19);
- (l) general business;
- (m) notice of motions.

17. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all others.

18. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject-matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of 5 per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory sureties.

#### Order of Debate—Speakers must not Digress.

19. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

#### Consideration of Reports.

20. (a) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(b) The recommendations of any committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be the resolutions of the Board.

#### Precedence of Chairman.

21. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking, or offering to speak, shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall reserve strict silence, so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

#### Notice of Motion—Absence of Mover.

22. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until next ordinary meeting of the Board.

#### Withdrawal of Motions.

23. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

#### Motions to be Seconded.

24. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

#### Motions not to be withdrawn without Consent.

25. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

#### Amendment may be moved.

26. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

#### Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

27. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.

28. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

29. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

#### Further Amendment may be moved on amended Question.

30. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

#### How subsequent Amendments may be Moved.

31. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

#### Motions for Adjournment.

32. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If, upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, and the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment, when entitled to Priority.

33. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Question to be given.

34. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without Argument.

35. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

Replies and Objections.

36. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions, except by permission of the Board.

Mode of addressing Board.

37. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the Chairman, and speak to each other by their official designation, as Chairman or Secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in Order.

38. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as hereinafter provided for in pursuance of By-law.

Limitation as to number of Speeches.

39. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observation than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

Determination of Questions.

40. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the Chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the Chairman shall be final, unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division.

(b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

41. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and the votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary.

Chairman may repeat Question.

42. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as it may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

Acts of Disorder.

43. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be disorderly, or makes use of any

expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

44. (a) The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without further argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with, then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to Order more than once.

45. Any member, who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this By-law, or for any breach of decorum shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board Room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room—Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

46. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board Room on being requested so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his retirement until the termination of the sitting, and should such member disobey such order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

Disorder.

47. If disorder arises at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the Chair. The Board, on resuming shall, on question put from the Chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

48. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without the express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

49. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of moneys paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account at such Bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's Bank or Treasury accounts must be signed by the Chairman and any one member of the Board, and in all cases countersigned by the Secretary of the Board.

50. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same.

The regulations numbered 21 to 41 inclusive, made by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council under Section 197 of the Act on the 2nd August, 1922, are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

51. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

52. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

Discount on Rates.

53. The Board may, by resolution, allow a discount of 5 per cent. for prompt payment of rates.

## Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

54. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are forbidden, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds:—

- (a) riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any motor car, carriage, or cart upon or along any footpath;
- (b) placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained;
- (c) burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place;
- (d) leaving any inflammable matter or material in any public place or shed, or on any open space or near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board;
- (e) damaging or destroying any well, dam, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate, or other property belonging to, in charge of, or under the control of the Board;
- (f) placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, abutting on or contiguous to any public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, finger, or lamp post, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;
- (g) opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or road without the permission of the Board first having been obtained;
- (h) rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath or road;
- (i) throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road or public place to the damage or danger of any person;
- (j) having an awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, by hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway, without the permission of the Board;
- (k) blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any road, without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto as shall be given by the Board;
- (l) furiously or negligently riding or driving along any road;
- (m) making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.

55. No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the District without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against these By-laws, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.

## To prevent obstructions on Footpaths and Roads.

56. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, firewood, sand, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road or footpath within the District after sunset nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

57. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or material whatsoever on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve within the District without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

58. Every person shall, after having received from the Board as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or material on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise, during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited.

## Preservation of Trees.

59. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10), and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

## Prescribing removal of Verandahs.

60. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways or over the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah or balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

## Encroachment, etc.—Removal of.

61. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charge of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which shall not exceed £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

## Lighting.

62. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

63. Within the Townsite of Carnamah all vehicles shall, when parking, run front on to the footpath or kerb at an angle of approximately 45 degrees.

## Damaging Roads.

64. No person shall either wilfully or negligently damage or destroy by means of horse team or any other means any road under construction or repair; any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Any person who—

- (a) cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) erects, without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) draws upon any road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto or any portion of other attachment trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

65. Any person taking any plough, cultivator, or other implement over or along any road, and thereby damaging or marking such road in such a manner which in the opinion of the Board may indirectly cause ultimate damage to the road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

66. Any person who draws upon any road any vehicle the wheel or wheels of which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### To protect Bridges from Fire.

67. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board), or who shall place any rushes or other inflammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

#### Prevention of Trees falling across Road.

68. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

68a. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

#### Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

69. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district, for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, or trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, and shall pay to the Board the fees as set out hereunder, and comply with the provisions of these By-laws and any other regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such exclusive rights are granted.

#### Hawking.

70. No person shall be permitted to hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables or any article of merchandise without having first obtained a License from the Board and payment of fees as per Schedule A hereto annexed:—

#### Schedule A.

##### Fees for a Hawker's License.

For a License to hawk fish, meat, poultry, game, fruit, or vegetables—5s.

For a License to hawk merchandise—£5.

A Hawker's License shall be issued for a term of twelve months from date of issue.

#### Penalties.

71. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done and remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

72. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

73. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

#### Throwing dangerous Substances on Footways or Roads.

74. Any person who shall throw vegetable or other offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any footway within the District shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed or broken in or upon any road, footway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without first having obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine upon conviction not exceeding Two pounds in addition to the amount of damages caused thereby.

#### Signboards, etc.

75. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, swing, awning, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without obtaining the consent of the Board, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

#### Heavy Traffic.

76. The owner of every vehicle or engine which together with its load shall weigh more than five tons shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for the damage done.

77. The Board may by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load of material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace and speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert; and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Careless use of Fire.

78. No person shall make or leave a fire on or near any road, track, or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Lamp Posts, etc.

79. No lamp post, bridle post, telegraph, telephone, or electric light pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person upon any road without the written consent of the Board, and upon such consent being obtained such post, pole, or flagstaff shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, or as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

#### Vacant Lots in Townsites.

80. The owner of any vacant lot in any Townsite shall, upon notice served on him by the Board, clear such vacant lot of trees, scrub, and undergrowth to the satisfaction of the Board. Penalty: Two pounds.

#### Part II.—Hall By-laws.

##### By-laws for the Management and the Use of the Carnamah and Coorow Public Halls.

1. Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Carnamah Road Board, not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall, room, or furniture is required.

2. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any hall, room, or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of any hall, room, or furniture.

3. The rent of the hall, room, or furniture (inclusive of the use of crockeryware) shall be paid with each application, and shall be as follows:—

##### Charges:

Travelling companies—Week nights, £2; after midnight 10s. extra.

Travelling companies—Saturday nights, £3; after midnight 10s. extra.

Travelling companies—Sunday nights, 35s.

Local companies—Week nights, 30s.; after midnight 5s. extra per hour or part thereof.

Local companies—Saturday nights, 30s.; after midnight 10s. extra.

Rehearsals—Day or night, 10s.

Political meetings—Day or night, 20s.

Anterooms (meetings)—Day or night, 5s. per hour.

Sample rooms—Day or night, 10s.

Bazaars, etc.—Daytime, 21s.

Religious services—Free.

In all confetti dances or where confetti is used, 5s. extra.

The above charges include the use of light and the use of such crockery as the Board possesses.



Skating will not be permitted under any consideration.

4. The hours for which any hall, room, or furniture shall be hired shall be:—Day—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; night—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, after which the prescribed fee shall be paid in addition to ordinary payment.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

6. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any hall, room, or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

7. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any hall, room, or furniture.

8. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall, room, or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such hall, room, or furniture shall be granted.

9. The hirer of any hall, room, or furniture shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, the Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and using of any hall or room. If, in the opinion of the Board, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such hall or room.

10. In the event of the use of any hall or room being stopped under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer by reason of such stoppage.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider or sherry, or any other intoxicating liquor, shall be brought into or consumed in any hall or room, except when expressly permitted by the Board.

12. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall or room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or rooms, whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

13. No person shall in any part of the building—

- (a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) use profane or improper language;
- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws;
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passageway or any part of the building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.

14. No offensive personalities or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce riot or a breach of the peace shall be permitted in any hall or any part thereof, or in any room.

15. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in any hall or room.

16. The Secretary of the Board, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if known as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any part thereof at all times during the term of engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these By-laws are duly carried out.

17. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockeryware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockeryware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

19. Children under 10 years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the building or any part thereof.

20. Rooms shall be open on week days from 9 o'clock a.m. to 9 o'clock p.m., and on Sundays by arrangement with the Secretary.

### *Part III.—Building By-laws.*

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Second Schedule to "The Road Districts Act, 1919," Building Regulations 36 and 37, the Carnamah Road Board doth make and publish the following By-laws, and doth order that such By-laws shall apply only to the Townsites of Carnamah and Coorow within Carnamah Road District:—

1. No person shall erect any building or alter or add to an existing building, or shall permit any person to erect any building, or alter or add to an existing building, on land of which he is the owner, or of which he has the control, except such building, alteration, or addition is erected in conformity with these By-laws.

2. No person shall build any structure intended to be used for human habitation or occupation, or capable of being used as such, or shall alter or add to any such existing structure without having obtained a building license from the Board and paying the fees prescribed herein, namely:—

- (a) the fee for Building License;
- (b) the fee for the use of the portion of the street abutting on the building during building operations, and deposit as security for the reinstatement and repair of such portion of such street;
- (c) the charge of the Local Health Authority for providing the necessary pans and lids for the privy.

3. Before such Building License is issued plans and specifications, in the form prescribed herein, shall be submitted to the Surveyor, and a license will not be granted before seven days after the submission of such plans and specifications, unless in special circumstances, of which special circumstances the Surveyor shall be the sole judge.

4. Plans shall be in ink, on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks without injury to the paper, and specifications shall be in typewriting, or in ink manuscript clearly written and on strong paper.

5. Plans shall clearly show ground plans, elevations, and sections as are sufficient to make plain the construction and the dimensions of the proposed structure. The size of the rooms and thickness of the walls shall be written on, in figures.

Specifications shall show clearly, both as to materials and size of same, the construction of the foundations, floors, internal and external walls, ceilings, and roof; also the ventilation of the structure, the number of privies and the construction of same, and shall provide for at least one privy of the prescribed construction, provided with the pan supplied by the Local Health Authority.

The ground floor level of any building to be erected abutting on any footpath shall not be less than ten inches above the level of the kerbing of the footpath upon which the building abuts, nor greater than ten inches above such kerbing, unless provision is made in the plan and specification for safe ingress and egress at all doorways by means of either a suitable ramp or steps.

A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy. Such plan will be retained by the Board.

6. If the plans and specifications submitted are in accordance with these By-laws and the prescribed fees are paid, the Surveyor shall sign them on behalf of the Board, and issue a Building License in the form prescribed herein, and for the period set forth in such license; but if the plans and specifications contain any matter which, in the opinion of the Surveyor, is contrary to the principles of sound or sanitary construction, and such matter is not covered by these By-laws,

the Surveyor shall refer such matter to the Board at its next meeting, and the Board shall have power to decide any matter referred to in Clauses A to K of Section 37 of the Building Regulations, when such matter is not defined in these By-laws; and a Building License will not be granted until the Board decides on such matter; provided that such decision will not be unreasonably delayed.

Where two or more shops or dwellings are built adjoining, the dividing wall shall be of brick or reinforced concrete, and shall be constructed not less than four feet above the height of the walls of such buildings.

7. All shops and/or dwellings to be erected in Macpherson Street or Yarra Street in the Carnamah Townsite must have their frontages constructed of either (a) brick, (b) cement brick, (c) concrete, or (d) stone.

8. On behalf of the Board the Surveyor may authorise the internal linings, partitions, and ceiling of any dwelling, if such building is not nearer than ten feet to any boundary of the block of land on which it stands, to be constructed wholly or partly of inflammable material. Such authority shall hold good for not more than twelve months after the date fixed for the expiration of the Building License, but may be extended by the Board from time to time on the application of the then owner. If no such extension of time is granted, such inflammable material shall then have become erected contrary to the provisions of Section 14 of the Building Regulations within the meaning of the said section, and the Board may at any time proceed in the manner set forth in the said Section 14.

9. No brick, stone, or concrete wall shall be erected nearer than two feet to the boundary of the block of land on which it stands, unless it is a parapet wall rising to a height of not less than one foot above the roof gutter, and the Board will not approve of the subdivision of land which would have the effect of leaving an existing wall in conflict with this provision.

10. No structure of any kind will be erected upon, over, or under any street, footpath, or public way unless the plans and specifications have first been submitted to and approved by the Board, and no verandah or signboard will be allowed over any footpath unless a clear way of not less than eight feet above such footpath is provided.

11. No street verandah shall be erected, except in accordance with a plan submitted to and approved by the Board, and every such verandah shall be supplied with a suitable gutter to carry the water falling on such verandah. If the water from such gutter discharges into the street, it shall be carried into the street gutter by a cast or wrought iron downpipe, of such size as the Board may direct, and such downpipe shall discharge into the street gutter in such manner as the Board may direct.

Any such street, verandah, gutter, and downpipe shall at all times be kept in repair by the owner of the building in front of which it is built, to the satisfaction of the Board, and the owner shall carry out any repairs in such manner as may be ordered by the Board.

12. No privy shall be erected nearer than six feet to the block of land adjoining that on which it stands. Where a right-of-way adjoins such block, unless otherwise in special circumstances approved by the Board, the privy shall be erected so that the service door is three feet from such right-of-way, screened from observation therefrom, and accessible by means of an opening or gateway at one end of such screen.

13. Before the construction of any building is commenced a privy shall be provided on the land for the use of the workmen.

#### Fees Payable.

14. A Building License will be issued on payment of a fee of 10s.

For permission, during the erection of a building, to occupy any part of a street abutting on such building:—For the first three months, ten shillings per week; for every subsequent three months, one pound per week.

Deposit for the repair of such part occupied:—One pound, and the Board may at any time require the amount of such deposit to be increased to such amount as may be ordered, on giving notice to the builder by post, or leaving the notice at the building, and the Building License shall be suspended until the order of the Board is complied with.

#### Minimum width of Shop Fronts.

15. No plan of any new building or part of a building intended to be used as a shop shall be approved by the Board, unless each such shop designed or intended

to be let as a separate tenement has at least a width of twelve feet internal measurement of frontage to a street, and no alteration of any existing building shall be approved unless the provisions of this By-law are complied with.

16. Application for a Building License shall be made in the Form of Schedule A hereto annexed.

17. A Building License shall be in the form of Schedule B hereto annexed.

18. Any person who contravenes or does not comply with any one of the provisions of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against such By-laws, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Ten shillings.

#### Extracts from Building By-laws.

1. Plans must be in ink on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks without injury to the paper.

2. Drawing must show ground plan and elevation, all clearly figured in feet and inches; scale not less than 8ft. to the inch.

3. A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy; such plan will be retained by the Board.

4. Specifications shall be in typewriting or in ink manuscript clearly written on, in figures.

5. Brick buildings, if built less than two feet from boundaries, a parapet wall must be provided.

6. Weatherboard or iron buildings must be at least 10 feet from the boundaries of adjoining allotments.

7. No person shall commence to build until plans in accordance with the Building By-laws have been submitted and approved by the Board and the necessary fees paid.

8. Application forms and suitable paper to comply with the above conditions may be obtained at the Road Board office on payment of one shilling.

9. A License will not be granted until seven days have elapsed since the lodging of the plans and specifications.

# THE WYNDHAM MEAT WORKS

### 1930 SEASON.

(Registered 17-4-1930)

No. 4 of 1930.

AGREEMENT made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this First day of April, in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty, between—

**THE WYNDHAM FREEZING, CANNING, AND MEAT EXPORT WORKS** (hereinafter known as "the Employer"), of the one part,

and the following Unions, jointly and severally, hereinafter known as "the Unions," of the other part, namely—

**THE WEST AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE AUSTRALASIAN MEAT INDUSTRY EMPLOYEES' UNION INDUSTRIAL UNION OF WORKERS, PERTH.**

**THE COASTAL DISTRICT COMMITTEE AMALGAMATED ENGINEERING UNION OF WORKERS,**

**THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED ENGINE-DRIVERS AND FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALASIA,**

**THE W.A. BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED COOPERS OF AUSTRALIA, and**

**THE AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION.**

WHEREBY IT IS AGREED—

1. This Agreement shall apply in respect of the rates of wages and conditions of labour in connection with the tasks hereinafter mentioned at the Wyndham Meatworks.

### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

2. Clauses under this heading are to be operative only where not otherwise provided under the headings of Sections I. to VII.

### DEFINITIONS.

3. In this Agreement, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the meanings, respectively, set out against them, that is to say:—

- (a) **WEEK DAYS.**—Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays.
- (b) **A WEEK** shall mean Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- (c) **SHIFT WORK** shall mean work done in time preceding, during, and following ordinary working hours by separate relays of employees.
- (d) **"MUTUALLY AGREED" or "MUTUAL ARRANGEMENT"** implies agreed between the Management of the Meatworks and the Union Executive at Wyndham or Perth in writing.

### PREFERENCE.

4. Subject to Clause 5, preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to Members

of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, provided they are competent and qualified workmen and do their work to the satisfaction of the Management. The Employer may require a Medical Certificate of fitness in respect of any applicant for employment. The cost of obtaining such certificate to be borne by the Employer.

5. With respect to the employment of Watch-keeping Engineers the Employer reserves the right to employ Members of any Union or Organisation who are qualified to perform the duties of Watch-keeping Engineers.

6. Subject to preference to Members of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, the Employer shall have the right—

- (a) To select employees with due regard to their qualifications for their respective tasks;
- (b) To allot to employees their respective tasks;
- (c) In the case of an employee not fulfilling his task satisfactorily, to allot another task at the rate specified for such allotted task;
- (d) To transfer employees from one department or task to another whenever reasonably necessary to do so. In case of alleged unreasonableness the Board of Control can discuss with the Management;
- (e) To dispense with the services of any employee for incompetence, drunkenness, or unsatisfactory work.

### GUARANTEE.

7. Subject to Clause 6 (c) and (e), a guarantee of 16 weeks' work from date of commencement of operations is given to each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1930 season. The rates applicable under this guarantee shall be the rates for the respective tasks for which employees shall have been engaged. The date of commencement of operations shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.

### PAID HOLIDAYS.

8. Labour Day, Good Friday, Wyndham Cup Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day.

### PAID HOLIDAY RATES.

9. (a) When an employee does no work on a paid holiday he shall be entitled to wages at ordinary rate for a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be. The rate in such case will be similar to that paid on the day prior to the holiday.

(b) When an employee is required to work on a paid holiday, other than Labour Day dealt with in subclause (c), he shall be entitled to wages at double ordinary rate, with a minimum of a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be.

(c) When an employee is required to work on Labour Day he shall be entitled to double rates in addition to the payment specified in subclause (a) of Clause 9.

### CLOSE HOLIDAYS.

10. Christmas Day and Sundays.

### ORDINARY HOLIDAYS.

11. Anzac Day, Easter Monday, and King's Birthday.



## HOLIDAY RATES.

12. For time or tally worked on holidays the rates shall be—

- (a) On ordinary holidays, rate and a half;
- (b) On close holidays, double rate.

## WAITING TIME ALLOWANCES.

13. When (after expiry of the 16 weeks' guarantee), owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for any employee who has been brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1930 season, such employee shall be paid a waiting time allowance for each ordinary working day (excluding Sundays and holidays) as follows:—

- (a) Day wage employees—  
Ordinary working hours for the day at half their respective task rates.
- (b) Contract slaughtermen—  
Half the minimum payment prescribed in Clause 50 (b).
- (c) Slaughter-house assistants—  
Half the minimum rates prescribed in Clause 59.

When an employee who is receiving Waiting Time Allowance is required to work "Outside of ordinary working hours" (Clause 21), he shall be paid (in addition to waiting time allowance) the overtime rates applicable to the work done.

## CHANGE OF TASK.

14. When, owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for an employee at his usual task, such employee shall, if so required by the Management, do any other work available and be paid the rate pertaining to his recognised task.

## TRAVELLING.

15. Each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1930 season shall be entitled to—

- (a) Passage from Fremantle to Wyndham and travelling time allowance.
- (b) Passage (and travelling time allowance) by first available steamer from Wyndham to Fremantle after termination of work in his department, or when his services are not further required by the Management; provided that his duties have been performed to the satisfaction of the Management.
- (c) When such employee shall, at the request of the Management, remain in employment until the end of the succeeding season, he shall be entitled to receive payment in lieu of passage and estimated travelling time to Fremantle. This will not deprive such employee of his right to passage and travelling time (as above provided) at the end of such succeeding season.
- (d) When an employee shall have been requested by the Management to remain in employment (Clause 15 (c)), and the Management afterwards notifies that the employee's services will not be required for the succeeding season, the allowance to the employee, Clause 15 (c), shall be calculated in the proportion that the length of time he is retained bears to a period of twelve months, dating from 30th November of the current season.

16. Travelling time allowance referred to in Clause 15 shall be at the rate of Fifteen shillings (15s.) per day, and shall accrue from day of embarkation to day of landing, both inclusive.

## HOURS OF LABOUR.

17. Unless otherwise specifically mentioned herein, 44 hours shall constitute a week's work—divided into six working days as follows:—Five week days each eight hours, 40 hours; Saturday four hours, total 44 hours. A day's work shall therefore consist of eight hours on week days and four hours on Saturdays.

18. Daily rates of wages specified herein relate to a working day of eight hours.

19. Unless otherwise mutually agreed, ordinary starting time shall be 7.30 a.m. and ordinary ceasing time shall be 4.30 p.m. on week days and 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.

20. Ordinary working hours shall comprise the hours between the ordinary starting time on any day and the ordinary ceasing time, exclusive of meal times and smokos.

21. "Outside of ordinary working hours" on any day means between midnight the previous day and starting time, and/or between ordinary ceasing time and midnight; also meal hours and smokos.

## MEAL TIMES.

22. Unless otherwise mutually arranged, meal times shall be—

From 6.30 a.m. to 7.30 a.m.
11.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
4.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.
11.30 p.m. to 12.30 a.m.

## SMOKOS.

23. Smokos of fifteen minutes each shall be paid for as working time and shall be allowed (at times to be mutually arranged) as follows:—

- (a) One smoko each forenoon worked, one smoko each afternoon worked, and one smoko after every two hours' continuous work done outside of ordinary working hours. This clause shall not apply to Engine Room and Boiler Room shift workers.
- (b) When employees are engaged on 12-hour shifts loading out frozen meat, three smokes each of 20 minutes will be allowed and paid for as working time for each 12-hour shift worked at the following times:—

Ordinary time—

9.30 a.m. to 9.50 a.m.
2.0 p.m. to 2.20 p.m.

Overtime—

7.30 p.m. to 7.50 p.m.
9.45 p.m. to 10.5 p.m.
2.15 a.m. to 2.35 a.m.
4.45 a.m. to 5.5 a.m.

24. When reasonably required by the Management, owing to exigencies of the work, employees shall forego their smoko until a more convenient time.

## CRIBS.

25. (a) Employees engaged on loading and discharging steamers will be supplied with cribs as follows:—One crib at second smoko after commencing work after tea; one crib at second smoko after commencing work at 12.30 a.m.

(b) Shift workers engaged on 4 p.m. to midnight and midnight to 8 a.m. shifts will be supplied with one crib during their shift.

#### MINIMUM OF OVERTIME.

26. Subject to any mutual arrangement, employees called back to work, after a meal time, following ordinary ceasing time, shall be provided with the following minimum periods of work, or shall be entitled to payment for such:—

- (a) On week days and Saturdays—two hours.
- (b) On Sundays—four hours.

#### GENERAL.

27. The Management shall give the delegate reasonable notice of workers required to work overtime. The delegate shall then be responsible on behalf of the Union for supplying such workers. The Management shall give due regard to distribution of overtime.

28. When an employee works at more than one task on any one day he shall be paid for that day at the highest rated of such tasks.

29. Day wage employees shall be paid in the employer's time and contract and tally men within reasonable time after ceasing work.

30. The employment and rates of pay of boys shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.

31. Wages shall be paid fortnightly in cash, or any employee may have his wages lodged to his credit with the State Savings Bank if he so desires.

32. Employees shall be provided without charge with accommodation in the quarters erected for that purpose including stretcher, mattress, and pillow.

33. Each employee engaged under this Agreement who boards at the Works canteen agrees to have the amount of 25s. per week deducted from his wages fortnightly.

34. When employees under this Agreement are temporarily required to work away from the Works (outside of a two-mile radius) they shall be paid a victualling allowance of 6s. per day, provided it be found inconvenient to send a cook out with such employees.

35. All delegates shall be officially recognised by the Management.

#### DISPUTES.

36. Should any dispute arise as to the construction or meaning of this Agreement, or touching anything arising out of its operation the work is nevertheless to be carried on without any interruption, and the matter in dispute shall be submitted to a conference between the Management and representatives of the Union concerned, such conference to be held at the Meatworks as soon as can be arranged.

37. Should no settlement be arrived at by above conference, the matter in dispute shall then be discussed between the Management and the local Board of Control of the Unions.

38. In the event of a settlement not being arrived at by discussion (referred to in Clause 37), the matter in dispute shall be submitted to the arbitration of an umpire to be chosen by one representative appointed for that purpose by the Employer and one representative appointed for that purpose by the Unions who are parties to this Agreement; and the

decision of such umpire shall be final and conclusive. The umpire may determine by whom the costs of the arbitration shall be paid and may fix such costs.

39. Every reasonable facility will be afforded by both parties to enable arbitration to be completed within 12 hours of the beginning of any dispute in connection with Waterside work.

#### BASIC WAGE ADJUSTMENT.

40. The rates of pay herein mentioned are based on a basic wage of—

- £4 7s. 0d. per week for Adult Males; and
- £2 7s. 0d. per week for Adult Females.

### SECTION I.

#### SECTIONAL CONDITIONS

(pertaining to this Section).

41. Being responsible for the quality and condition of products, foremen may attend personally to such of the operations as they may consider necessary to ensure satisfactory results. Such operations include the making-up and attention to cold and hot pickles; the pumping and filterpressing of soups, and the finishing off of extracts, the setting and supervision of tinshop dies; the refining and weighing of tallow and edible fats and other processes of a like nature.

42. All freezing chamber employees working outside chambers shall be allowed 15 minutes for cooling down before entering freezing rooms.

#### SHIFT WORK.

43. Shift of eight hours may be worked in departments where operations are continuous or where they require attention for more than twelve hours in the twenty-four.

44. Shift workers shall be entitled to the prescribed overtime rates for work done during Sundays, holidays, meal times or smokos. For other time worked outside of ordinary hours shift workers shall only be entitled to rate and a half for any time worked in excess of eight hours per shift.

#### OVERTIME.

45. Subject to any special provision herein, overtime rates shall be paid—

- (a) Outside of ordinary working hours—rate and a-half.
- (b) Meal times and smokos—double rates.
- (c) Sundays:  
Midnight Saturday to 6 p.m.—double rates.  
6 p.m. to midnight—treble rates.

46. Provided that ordinary rates and conditions shall apply during ordinary working hours and rate and a-half for one hour before ordinary starting time or for one hour after ordinary ceasing time, to men doing reparatory or finishing work on preserving, cook room, cellarman handling meats for canning purposes, in any place set aside for curing purposes, open-air boners, retort and traymen, and chillroom men, as is now customary.

48. Work to be performed by slaughtermen in dressing of freezing cattle shall be:—Knocking down, sticking, footing-off, grounding, backing-off, taking out offal, sawing down, dropping hides, finishing off, and wiping up.

49. The slaughtering gang shall, if so required by the Management, slaughter up to—

## IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 100 of 1930.

In the matter of an application to amend Award No. 10 of 1923 between the Metropolitan Ironmasters' Industrial Union of Employers, applicant, and Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Engineering Union Association of Workers, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (W.A.), respondents.

The 28th day of April, 1930.

UPON hearing Mr. L. L. Carter, on behalf of the applicant, and Mr. H. V. Symons and Mr. T. H. Baird, on behalf of the respondents, and by consent, the Court doth hereby order and direct that Award No. 10 of 1923 be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—

By the addition thereto of the following new clause:—

Clause 15a—Temporary provisions as to Hours, etc.

(1) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the following special provisions shall apply to the period commencing 1st May, 1930, and ending 31st July, 1930:

- (a) In the event of the employer employing the worker for a lesser number of hours than forty-four per week, he is hereby authorised and empowered to reduce the wages as prescribed in Clause 8 pro rata, but the deduction shall not reduce the wages below the amount payable for 29-1/3 hours' work per week on such pro rata basis;
- (b) When the services of the worker are not required on any day or days the employer shall give the worker one day's notice thereof;
- (c) The reduced hours per week mentioned in (a) shall be worked at the convenience of the employer;
- (d) When lesser hours per week are worked, holidays as prescribed by Clause 5 or pay in lieu thereof shall be reduced pro rata;
- (e) The provisions as to overtime in Clause 4 shall not be affected hereby, nor shall the worker's right to a week's notice in the event of his being dismissed permanently from his employment.

(2) The foregoing provisions may be continued from month to month after the said 31st day of July, 1930, by agreement between the parties, a memorandum of which, signed by or on behalf of the parties, shall be filed in the Court. In the event of the parties failing to agree the matter may be referred to the Court.

(3) The provisions of this amendment shall not affect or prejudice the right of any of the parties to the said Award to apply to the Court for an amendment thereof in pursuance of Section 90 of the Act, or for a new Award, should occasion arise therefor.

(4) The term "worker" herein shall, where the context so permits, include an apprentice.

By the Court,
