WHEREAS by Section 106 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," it is provided, inter alia, that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation prescribe the minimum dimensions of the several sorts of pearl-shell below which it shall be unlawful to take or obtain the same, and may vary such dimensions for different parts of the coast of Western Australia and the islands thereof, and may prescribe pecuniary penalties for breaches of such Proclamation, and such penalties may be imposed of such Proclamation, and such penalties may be imposed and enforced in like manner as penalties for offences against the said Act: And whereas it is deemed ex-pedient to revoke the Proclamation under this Act dated the 28th day of February, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 6th March, 1917: Now, there-fore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of every power enabling me in this behalf revoke the said Proclamation, and proclaim this behalf, revoke the said Proclamation, and proclaim and declare as follows:--(1) That it shall be unlawful and declare as follows:—(1) That it shall be unlawful to take or obtain in the State pearl-shell of the pearl-shell oysters known scientifically as *Meleagrina mar-garitifera* or of the variety commonly known as "Man-grove Point," which will pass through a circular metal ring with an internal diameter of four inches or the nacre of which will pass through a circular metal ring horizon an internal diameter of three and a half inches. having an internal diameter of three and a half inches; (2) that the pecuniary penalty for any breach of this Proclamation shall be Twenty pounds.

## Description of Ward Boundaries.

#### Town Ward.

4. Hen eggs and duck eggs produced in Western Australia and intended for sale either in the State of Western Australia or in any other State of the Com-monwealth shall be graded according to the grades hereinafter prescribed.

- (a) Small punct, which shall mean eggs not less
  (b) "Pullet," which shall mean eggs not less
- than 1; ozs. and under 1; ozs. in weight; (c) "Hen," which shall mean eggs 1; ozs. and over.
- Duck eggs shall be graded as follows:—
   (a) "Small," which shall mean eggs under 2 ozs. 6.
- in weight; (b) "Duck," which shall mean eggs 2 ozs. or
- more in weight.

7. Every package containing small lots of either hen eggs or duck eggs of mixed grades shall have marked thereon in a plain and conspicuous manner the various grades and the number of eggs in each grade contained in such package.

8. Every package containing either hen or duck eggs which are not graded shall have marked thereon eggs which are not graded shar have marked thereon in a plain and conspicuous manner the words " Por repacking." Before the eggs contained in such pack-age are sold or offered for sale, the same shall be graded and repacked by the person selling or offering the same for sale.

Neither hen eggs nor duck eggs shall be sold as new laid eggs, unless the same are marketed by the producer for sale within seven days after the same were laid.

10. No person shall pack any eggs intended for sale which are not clean. For the purposes of this regulation "Clean eggs" mean eggs which are free from dirt or foreign matter.

11. Any eggs intended for cold stores or any preservative process shall be individually stamped as such prior to being placed in cold stores or to being preserved.

12. If an Inspector shall have reason to believe that any eggs or other products intended for sale are unwholesome or unfit for human consumption, he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the nearest Health Inspector and to the person for the time being having the eggs or other products in his possession or under his control.

13. No person to whom notice has been given by an Inspector that he has reason to believe that eggs or and intended for sale are unwholesome or unfit for human consumption shall sell, dispose of, or permit, numan consumption shall set, dispose of, or permit, cause, or suffer such eggs or other products to be re-moved from his possession or control until the same have been passed by a Health Inspector or have been otherwise declared wholesome and fit for human con-sumption in a proceeding taken under the provisions of Section 165 of "The Health Act, 1911-1919." Any person who contravenes the provisions of this Regulation shall be deemed to have interfered with the Inspector in carrying out his dutics.

## 2.-Allowances, etc.

(1) Casual Hands.—A casual worker shall mean one for whom work over a period of 12 consecutive work-ing days, not counting holidays, is not provided by employer. Casual workers shall be paid 10 per cent. over the rate provided by this Agreement for the par-ticular worker's occupation.

(2) Attending Horses.-Employees attending to and feeding horses in addition to his other work, shall be paid an allowance of six shillings (6s.) per week for one horse and three shillings (3s.) per week for each additional horse up to and including four horses.

(3) Leading Hand Tradesmen.-Any tradesman placed in charge of three or more tradesmen shall be classed as a leading hand tradesman, and be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day above the tradesmen's rate.

(4) Handling Cement .-- (a) Employees engaged tipping dry cement into trucks or handling dry cement in machine mixing to receive one shilling (1s.) per dav extra.

(b) Men handling dry cement in bags shall be al-lowed sixpence (6d.) per day above the minimum rate for so doing.

(c) Men opening and emptying dry cement concrete beard shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra. This amount shall include the allowance of sixpence (6d.) per day referred to above.

(5) Tar Work .- Men engaged on work in which tar is used shall be paid an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the ordinary wage.

(6) Offensive Work.—(a) An allowance of three shillings (3s.) per day shall be paid to all the men who come in contact with the filth during the operation of cleaning out septic tanks and ripple chambers.

(b) Workers employed on offensive work in connection with old sewers or excavating in ground where fumes arise from decomposed material shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter during ordinary working hours. Each case shall be decided on its merits and the decision of the Engineer for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall be final.

(7) Carpenter's Tool Allowance.—An allowance of one shilling (1s.) per week shall be paid as a tool al-lowance to a journeyman. Such allowance shall not be payable while an employee is absent from work or on holiday.

(8) Deep Shovelling.—Shovellers, other than bottom en throwing from six feet below the surface in men trenches from the time that timber is stood, or when working by stages in trenches, or in stone trenches more than six feet below the surface, shall receive sixpence (6d.) per day extra.

(9) District or Camp Allowance.-Workers employed on construction or reconstruction work outside a radius of twelve miles from the G.P.O. shall be entitled to a district or camp allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day over Perth rates, when the nature of the work necessitates men living on the job, or the location of work makes it inconvenient for them to return to their

homes every night. (10) Travelling Time.—(a) When the work necessi-tates that the employees shall live in camp, and in cases where the site for the camp selected by the Officer in Charge is more than a quarter of a mile from the job, then the Department shall allow employees full pay for the time taken in walking from camp to work one way only, and a time limit shall be allowed at the rate of 20 minutes per mile necessarily walked, but where portion of the workers employed on a particular job live in camp, and another portion of the workers travel from their homes to the job, the starting time for all workers on the job shall be uniform.

(b) Employees engaged on construction or reconstruction work situated more than one mile from the nearest tram or railway station shall receive sixpence (6d.) per day in addition to their ordinary pay, unless travelling in the Department's time.

(c) Maintenance men at Fremantle brought out to clean the tank opposite the Fremantle Railway Station shall be allowed walking time to their homes, if the work is not completed in time to enable them to get home by train or tram.

(11) Time for Striking and Pitching Camp.-In cases where the nature of the work necessitates the pitching of a temporary camp, and when such camp is shifted to suit the requirements of the work, then the Department shall allow full pay for the actual time reason-ably taken in striking and pitching camp. The Officer in Charge shall decide as to what is a reasonable time for the striking and pitching, and payment shall be

made accordingly. (12) Broken Time.—(a) Should any employee on construction work not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required next day, he shall be paid for that day if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time: Provided that, if he cannot be employed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, he shall be notified of the cause why he cannot be employed and shall be entitled to two hours' pay.

(b) When workers commence work and are forced to knock off without having worked for more than two to knock on without having worked for more than two hours in any day, they shall be paid as if they had worked for two hours on such day. (c) The decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the Officer in Charge of the job.

(13) Payment of Wages .- When an employee is discharged before the usual pay day, he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post, at the employer's risk.

(14) Wet Ground.-Any employee, working in wet ground, including those working in wet material on a dump, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addi-tion to the ordinary wage: Provided that, when watertight boots are supplied by the Department, there shall be no allowance for wet feet.

The definition of "wet ground" shall apply to wet material on a dump.

(15) Fares .- When instructed to travel on duty, employees shall be provided with necessary fares, except when the Department provides the means of conveyance or makes a bicycle allowance to the employee.

(16) Away from Home Allowance .-- When an employee is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then, or is usually employed, to any place where he is then, or is usually employed, to any place where he cannot return to his abode at night, he shall receive as expenses an amount of one shilling and six-pence (1s. 6d.) per item per day, or reasonable ex-penses. "Item" to mean breakfast, dinner, tea, and ĥed.

(17) Oilskins, etc.-Watertight boots shall be found by the Department when considered necessary by the Engineer, for maintenance men working in sewers, and watertight boots and oilskin coats will be found when considered necessary by the Engineer, for maintenance men when repairing bursts on large mains.

(18) Platelayers, Light Tram Tracks.—When men are required to do work in the nature of platelaying (irrespective of the weight of the rail), they shall be entitled to be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the

basic wage. Platelaying shall not be deemed to include merely shifting sets of rails from one place to another.

(19) Tarring, Scraping, or Brushing the inside of Pipes a Diameter of 12 Inches or over:—
(a) Men employed at the above work shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to the ordinary waves. Men employed tarring brushing or scraping the wages. Men employed tarring, brushing, or scraping the inside of dry pipes less than 12 inches in diameter, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to ordinary wages.

Tarring, Scraping, and Brushing outside of Pipes:-(b) Men employed at the above work shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the ordinary labourer's wages.

(20) Water Bags.—Water bags will be provided on any job where in the opinion of the Officer in Charge such are necessary.

#### 3.—Interpretations.

(a) "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage. (b) "Engineer" shall mean the officer occupying for

the time being the position of Engineer for Metropoli-tan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department, or the Hydraulic Engineer in charge of major construc-

tion works. (c) "Department" shall mean the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department.

(d) "Union'' shall mean the Coastal and Eastern Goldfields Government Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Employees' Union of Workers.

(e) "Shaft" shall mean any hole sunk for the purpose of opening up a drive or tunnel, and does not include work known as "eut and cover."

(f) "Miner" means any worker employed in a shaft or tunnel sinking or driving, and includes a worker ex-cavating in rock where explosives are used, and also a worker engaged using hammer and drill, or employed breaking through between open cuts where a worker is employed within a tunnel.

(g) "Timberman" means a worker who hangs cen-(g) removement means a worker who hangs cen-tres and fixes sets and poles off laths, lays keels, fixes frames or lays decking, or who is employed handling timber in shafts when buildings are being underpinned.

(h) "Concretor" means a worker engaged in filling the gauge, mixing on the board, wheeling from the board or packing concrete, or engaged setting reinforcement

for concrete. (i) "Trowel hand" means a worker who finishes concrete floors in w.c.'s, stables, and concrete work in and about house connectings and drains, sewers, and reservoirs.

(j) "Packer" means a worker who packs sand or (k) "Timber cutter" means a worker employed cut-

ting piles, lathes, keels and sets. (1) ''Pipe setter'' means a worker who sets rein-

forced concrete or stoneware pipes. (m) "Pipe jointer" means a worker who joints re-

inforced concrete or stoneware pipes. (n) "Casual worker" is one for whom work over a period of 12 consecutive working days, not counting

(o) "Wet ground" means ground in which in the opinion of the Eugineer it is impracticable for workers

(p) "Gauger" means any employee placed in charge of four or more other workmen.

#### 4.-Hours.

(a) Subject and except where otherwise specifically provided the ordinary working hours shall not exceed cight hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thusday, and Friday, and four hours on Saturday. Provided that, for stablemen, a week's work shall consist of seven shifts of 8 hours when required by the Engineer.

(b) Caretakers provided with residences rent free shall be on duty as required: Provided that one full day off per fortnight shall be allowed. Should a caretaker be required to work on his Sunday off, he shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(c) Caretaker, Loftus Street and Fremantle Yard, shall be on duty as required, and shall be granted the monthly special leave applicable to watchmen.

(d) Watchmen.-A week's work for watchmen shall consist of seven shifts per 56-hour week: Provided that watchmen shall be granted two days' special leave on pay at the completion of each calendar month's service as watchmen. Such leave shall not be allowed to accumulate.

(c) In connection with shift work on construction jobs the first shift in two-shift work shall work eight hours, not including any crib time; all other shifts to be of eight hours, including half an hour crib time, ie., 7 hours' actual working time.

(f) The working hours of employees working con-tinuously underground in tunnels or shafts shall in-clude a crib time and exceeding thirty minutes in each shift.

## 5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, time and a half, and thereafter double time until the usual starting time: Provided that employees called to start work within one hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time.

(b) Provided also, that if a worker is called out at or after 10.30 p.m. and before an hour and a half of the usual starting time on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, he shall be paid double time rate until the usual starting time: Provided further, that workers called out for duty at or after 5 p.m. on Saturday shall be paid double time rate.

(c) Should a worker be called back after completing a day's work, or be called out on a Sunday, he shall be paid a minimum of two hours at overtime rates.

(d) For all work done on Sundays, Good Friday. Easter Monday. Labour Day, Xmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day double time rates shall be paid. This clause shall not apply to stablemen, who shall take such days as ordinary shift days.

(c) In case of bursts in the water mains, employees called during working hours shall be paid the prescribed rates, but for any overtime so worked the scale of overtime rates will apply until the return to the yard or depot. When men are called out after mid-night double time rates shall be paid until they return to the yard or depot, and sign off.

#### 6.--Holidays.

(a) Subject to Subclause (b) two weeks' leave per annum shall be granted to each employee: Provided, that Xmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Fiiday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be taken as they come as portion of the leave. The balance of one week shall be granted to each employee at the convenience of the Department. Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(b) Employees other than stablemen, caretakers, and watchmen having less than one year's continuous service shall be entitled to holiday pay as follows: After one month's continuous service the proportion of two weeks' leave as the length of service is to the full veried of two works period of twelve months.

(c) Stablemen, caretakers, and watchmen, after 12 nonths' continuous service, shall be granted fourteen working days' holiday with pay each year.

(d) Stablemen, caretakers, and watchmen employed for a period of not less than one month continuously and under twelve months continuously shall receive holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(c) Holiday pay shall be at the rate the worker is in receipt of at the time the holiday is taken.

(f) Casual hands are not entitled to paid holidays.

## 7.-Inspection of Wages Sheets.

The Wages sheets of the Department will be open for inspection at Head Office by the Secretary of the Union, upon reasonable notice being given of his desire to inspect same.

## 8 .- Work on Different Grades.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

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## 9.-Under-rate Workers.

Any employee who acknowledges himself not capable of earning the wage prescribed herein by reason of old age or infirmity, may be paid such less wage as from time to time may be agreed upon in writing between the Engineer and the Secretary of the Union.

### 10.-Starting and Finishing Places.

Employees shall start and finish their day's work at the depot or on the job, as required. For maintenance employees "depot" shall mean the Department's yard 'stores." or '

## 11.-Change and Mess Rooms.

A change room and/or mess room shall be provided on any job at the commencement, where it is reasonably required for the convenience of the workers.

## 12.-Shift Work.

Employees shall be allowed to rotate shifts, and change of shift shall be, so far as possible, arranged to suit transport facilities.

#### 13.—Area.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Prainage Area as defined under the Metropolitan W.S., S., & D. Act.

## 14.—Contract of Service.

It is agreed:

- (a) That the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, subject to the following condition, namely: that if, in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week, no work is avail-able or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of forty-four hours), apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and
  (b) That notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a weekly or on we that notice.
- ployee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee were employed at an hourly wage.

## 2.-Contract of Service.

It is agreed-

- (a) that the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, subject to the following condition, namely, that if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked, at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours), ap-portioned to the time actually worked during the weck; and (b) that notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on
- a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this re-spect the same as if the employee was employed at an hourly wage.
- (c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) are in conformity with existing practice, which will continue and be observed.

#### 3.-District Allowances.

District allowances, as specified below, shall be paid to workers in the undermentioned areas:

Within 100 yards from any water main, pipe, dam, or well controlled or to be laid or constructed by the

- (a) Mundaring up to Merredin, sixpence per day.
  (b) Including Merredin, up to Kalgoorlie and Goongarrie inclusive, and to Coolgardie and Widgiemooltha inclusive, one shilling and witgiemooltha day.

     (c) Beyond Widgiemooltha or Goongarrie, 1s. 9d. per day.
  - (d) In towns East of Mullewa and including Mt. Magnet, 1s. 6d. per day; away from towns 2s. 6d. per day. (e) In towns beyond Mt. Magnet, North and East
  - 1s. 9d. per day; away from towns 2s. 9d. per day.
  - (f) Geraldton and within a distance of 20 miles thereof, threepence per day.

#### 4.—Allowances, etc.

(1) Casual Hands.—A casual worker shall mean one for whom work over a period of 12 consecutive working days, not counting holidays, is not provid d by em-ployer. Casual workers shall be paid 10 per cent. over the rate provided by this Award for the particular worker's occupation.

(2) Attending Horses .- Employees attending to and (2) Attending Horses.—Employees attending to and feeding horses in addition to his other work shall be paid an allowance of 6s, per week for one horse and three shillings per week for each additional horse up to and including four horses.
 (3) Leading Hand Tradesmen.—Any tradesman placed in charge of three or more tradesmen shall be classed as a leading hand tradesmen wide here it.

cassed as a leading hand tradesman, and be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day above the tradesmen's rate.

(4) Handling Cement .-- (a) Employees engaged tipping dry cement into trucks, or handling dry cement in machine mixing to receive one shilling (1s.) per day extra.

(b) Men handling dry cement in bags shall be al-lowed sixpence (6d.) per day above the minimum rate for so doing.

(c) Men opening and emptying dry cement on the concrete board shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra, which amount shall include the allowance of sixpence (6d.) per day referred to above.

(5) Tar Work.—Men engaged on work in which tar is used shall be paid an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the ordinary wage.
(6) Cleaning out Septic Tanks.—Employees engaged

cleaning out septic tanks shall be paid double time rates.

(7) Carpenter's Tool Allowance.-An allowance of one shilling (1s.) per week shall be paid as a tool allowance to a journeyman. Such allowance shall not be payable while an employee is absent from work or holiday.

on holiday. (8) Deep Shovelling.—Shovellers, other than bottom men, throwing from six feet below the surface in trenches from the time that timber is stood or when working by stages in trenches, or in stone trenches more than six feet below the surface, shall receive 6d. per day extra.

(9) District or Camp Allowance.-Workers employed construction or reconstruction work shall be enon. titled to a camp allowance of sixpence (6d.) per day, in addition to the district allowance prescribed by the Award, when the nature of the work necessitates men living on the job, or the location of the work makes it inconvenient for them to return to their homes every night.

(10) Travelling Time.-(a) When the work necessistates that the employees shall live in camp, and in cases where the site for the camp selected by the Offi-cer in Charge is more than a quarter of a mile from the job, then the Department shall allow employees full pay for the time taken in walking from eamp to work, one way only, and a time limit shall be allowed at the rate of 20 minutes per mile necessarily walked, but where portion of the workers employed on a particular job live in camp, and another portion of the workers travel from their homes to the job, the starting time for all workers on the job shall be uniform.

(11) Time for Striking and Pitching Camp.—In cases where the nature of the work necessitates the pitching of a temporary camp, and when such camp is shifted to suit the requirements of the work, the De-partment shall allow full pay for the actual time rea-sonably taken in striking and pitching eamp. The Officer in Charge shall decide as to what is a reasonable time for the striking and pitching, and payment shall be made accordingly.

(12) Broken Time.-(a) Should any employee on construction work not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required next day, he shall be paid for that day if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time: Provided that, if he cannot be comployed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, he shall be notified of the cause why he cannot be employed and shall be entitled to two hours' pay.

(b) When workers commence work and are forced to knock off without having worked for more than two hours in any day, they shall be paid as if they had worked for two hours on such day. (c) The decision as to whether it is too wet to work

shall rest with the Officer in Charge of the job.

(13) Payment of Wages .- When an employee is discharged before the usual pay day he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after, by registered post, at the employer's risk.

(14) Wet Ground .- Any employee, other than a leading maintenance man or maintenance man, working in wet ground, including those working in wet material on a dump, shall be paid one shilling (1s) per day in addition to the ordinary wage: Provided that, when water-tight boots are supplied by the Department, there shall

be no allowance for wet feet. The definition of "wet ground" shall apply to wet material on a dump.

(15) Fares .- When instructed to travel on duty, employees shall be provided with necessary fares, except when the Department provides the means of conveyance or makes a bicycle allowance to the employee.

(16) Cleaning Tanks.-Any employee working in water while cleaning out tanks shall be provided with

water while cleaning out tanks shar be provided with water-tight boots. (17) Tarring, etc., of Pipes.—(a) Tarring, scraping, or brushing the inside of pipes a diameter of 12 inches or over: Men employed at the above work shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day, in addition to the ordinary wages. Men employed tarring, brushing, or scraping the inside of dry pipes less than 12 inches in diameter, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the ordinary wages. ordinary wages.

(b) Tarring, scraping, or brushing outside of pipes: Men employed on this work shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the ordinary labourer's rates.

(e) No allowance shall be made to maintenance men who, as portion of their duties, are required to tar joints of main on the outside.

## 5.—Interpretations.

(a) "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.

(b) "Engineer" shall mean the officer occupying for the time being the position of Chief Engineer for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage. (c) "Department" shall mean the Water Supply,

Sewerage, and Drainage Department.

(d) "Union" shall mean the Coastal and Eastern Goldfields Government Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Employees' Union.

(e) "District Officer" shall mean any person administering the affairs of the Department in the section where an employee is working.

(f) "Ganger" means any employee placed in charge of a gang of four or more other men.

(g) "Maintenance man" shall mean any employee whose dutics are to read meters, oil meters, effect re-pairs to water main, to patrol and give attention to the preservation and maintenance of the 30in. main and all extensions reticulating therefrom. (h) "Wet ground" shall mean ground in which, in

the opinion of the Engineer in Charge of the work, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet.

(i) "Home Station" shall mean the place or section where usually employed.

(j) "Caulker" shall mean a man who caulks, or recaulks joints on all pipe lines. Maintenance men who caulk at odd times in the ordinary course of keeping the joints tight shall not be entitled to caulkers' rate.

(k) "Leading maintenance man" duties include service laying, meter reading, installing and removing meters, oiling meters, stopping leaks in mains or extensions, and keeping the time and directing not more than three maintenance men, and the term shall apply to any worker in charge of a section of any water main or exsions thereof.

#### 6.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours for all workers other than foremen, groom and general hand, Mundaring Weir, motor drivers and motor drivers effecting repairs, wer, motor drivers and motor drivers effecting repairs, and firemen and greasers, shall not exceed forty-four in any one week—such ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and four hours on Saturday: Provided that, if in the opinion of the Minister for Water Supply it is desirable in the interests of any Water Supply, it is desirable in the interests of any work or section of work that there should be a variation in the number of hours to be worked per week, then the hours may be altered to the extent that eight hours per day for five days in one week and eight hours per day for six days in the following week alternately may be worked.

(b) For the groom and general hand, munitating Weir, a week's work shall consist of seven shifts of eight hours when required by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply.

(c) For foremen, motor drivers, and motor driver effecting repairs the conditions existing prior to the date of this Award shall continue.

(d) Firemen and greasers shall be paid as for the (d) Friemen and greasers shall be plud as for the total number of hours (equal to an average of eight hours per day) for Monday to Friday inclusive, and four hours for Saturday, constituting each respective pay period, whether such time shall have been actually worked or not: Provided that, if the employee is absent from sickness or other personal causes, he shall be paid only for the time actually worked.

#### 7.—Overtime.

(a) Except as regards firemen and greasers, foremen, motor drivers, and motor drivers effecting repairs, all time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid, for the first four hours, at time and a half and double time thereafter: Provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a half the usual starting time shall be paid time and a half until the usual starting time.

Provided also, that if a worker is called out at or after 10.30 p.m. and before an hour and a half of the usual starting time on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, he shall be paid double time rate until the usual starting time: Provided further, that workers called out for duty at or after 5 p.m. on Satur-days shall be paid double time rate.

(b) (1) Firemen and greasers .- Time worked in excess of the total number of ordinary working hours com-prised in each respective pay period shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time for the balance.

(2) Firemen and greasers.—Time worked on Sundays shall stand by itself and be paid at time and a half. For all work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day double time rates shall be paid.

(c) Except for motor drivers, firemen and greasers, for all time worked on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day, double time shall be paid.

## 8.—Holidays.

(a) Firemen and greasers shall be entitled to 14 working days, i.e., two weeks and two days leave with pay each year. The 14 days shall be inclusive of public holidays. All leave shall be taken at time to suit exigholidays. All leave shall be taken at time to suit exig-encies of the service, except during July and August. (b) Employees other than firemen and greasers shall

be entitled for each year of service to holiday leave on full pay aggregating 14 days exclusive of Sundays, i..e, two weeks and two days. Any public holiday al-lowed to be taken in each year shall be deducted from annual leave. The dates on which annual leave is to be taken in each year shall be fixed by the District Officer to writ the correspondence of the work covert during Tab to suit the convenience of the work, except during July and August. Any employee failing to take his leave on the dates so fixed and advised to him shall be deemed to have forfeited same. Payment for holidays shall be made in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(c) An employee shall not be obliged to take his annual leave while he is incapacitated through sickness; Provided that, in such case, the employee may be re-quired to produce a medical certificate to the satisfaction of the Minister.

(d) Employees having less than one (1) year's con-tinuous service shall be entitled to holiday leave as follows:

After one (1) month's unbroken service, holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(c) Any employee resigning, dismissed, or paid off shall receive payment for holidays due.

(f) Holiday pay shall be at the rate the worker is in receipt of at or immediately prior to the holiday

(g) Not less than fourteen (14) days' notice shall be given to any employee of the date on which he is required to take his annual leave.

## 9.--Removals and Transfers.

(a) All employees shall be prepared to remove to any

(a) An employees shall be prepared to remove to any locality where their services may be required.
(b) When a removal or transfer involves a train journey, fares shall be allowed to employees, and, if married, their wives and children under 16 years of age. Also freight charges for the conveyance of a reasonable quantity of furniture and personal effects.
(c) The time occupied in travelling by any employee transferred from one locality to another to suit the requirements of the Department shall be paid as for or

quirements of the Department shall be paid as for ordinary working hours only, but no more than eight (8) hours' pay at ordinary rates shall be allowed for each day's travelling: Provided that, where travelling time immediately follows on working time, the employee shall be paid for such travelling time at ordinary rates up to but not exceeding eight (8) hours on any single journey

(d) No employee shall lose any time by a transfer.

10.-Travelling and Away from Home Allowances.

(a) The time necessarily occupied by all employees (a) The time necessarily occupied by an employees in travelling on duty (including waiting time) shall be paid as from the time of the departure of the train to the arrival of the train at destination at the ordinary rate of wages attached to the departure station, but not to exceed eight (8) hours per day. Overtime rates shall not apply.

(b) In addition the scale of travelling allowance shall be:—Coastal District and Goldfields, two shillings and be:—Coastal District and Goldneids, two snillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per item for meals necessarily pur-chased on a train, and if the charge exceeds two shil-lings and sixpence (2s. 6d.), the actual cost of the meal shall be paid by the Department. "Item" shall mean the expenses of breakfast, dinner, tea, and bed neces-sarily incurred whilst travelling from headquarters on later. duty.

(c) Away from Home Allowance.—Firemen and greasers, when relieving away from home station, shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per day at stations Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 and six shillings (6s.) per day at other stations.

(d) Employees other than Firemen and Greasers .-For each night necessarily absent from home station on duty, the following allowance shall be paid :-- Reasonable out of pocket expenses for meals and bed, with a minimum of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per item.

(e) Clauses 9 and 10 (b), (c), and (d) shall not apply to employees who are mainly employed in travel-ling about and engaged upon the work of maintaining and constructing water supplies on stock routes or else-where away from the Goldfields Water Scheme, except when travelling by rail and without their usual equipment.

## 11.-Transferred Tradesmen.

Tradesmen temporarily transferred shall be paid the ruling rate in the district subject to the conditions therein applying.

## 12 .- Inspection of Wages Sheets.

The wages sheets of the Department shall be open for inspection at the local or head office by the Secre-tary or other authorised member of the Union, upon reasonable notice being given of his desire to inspect same.

13.-Recognition of Secretary of Union.

The Department shall recognise the Secretary of the Union and confer with him on matters affecting the members of the Union and its Award or Agreements.

## 14 .- Leave without Pay to Union Delegates.

Provided three (3) days' notice is given to the local Officer in Charge that leave is required, and the work of the Department is not interfered with, leave of ab-sence without pay shall be granted members of the Union to attend as delegates Conferences for Union business.

## 15.-Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift; provided that such minimum rate is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at the work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid for his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

## 16.-Reduced Pay for Partial Incapacity.

Any employee who acknowledges himself not capable of earning the wage herein prescribed, may be paid such less wage as from time to time may be agreed upon in writing between the Engineer and the Secretary of the Union.

## 17.--Appeals.

(a) When a transfer is ordered by the Department, the employee shall have the right of appeal to the En-gineer and may be represented by the Secretary of the Union. If found after inquiry that a transfer can be or the Department, it shall be done.

(b) Any employee reduced to a lower grade, or dis-missed, shall have the right to appeal to the Engineer, and may authorise the Secretary of the Union to act as his agent.

#### 18.-Shift Work.

In shift work all employees shall be allowed to rotate shifts.

#### 19.-Wages.

All wages shall be paid fortnightly.

#### 20.—Area.

The area situated within 100 yards from any water main pipe, dam or well controlled or to be laid or con-structed by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, and to area comprised within Government Reserve 14073, Wooroloo.

## Part III.

#### Term.

The currency of this Award shall be for a period of three years from the date hereof: Provided, that Clause 3 of Part II. of this Award (District Allowances) may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of either party at any time after the issue of the next basic wage declaration.

## Scope.

This Award shall apply only to workers employed by the Minister for Water Supply and the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.
