PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any building, and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building: And whereas it is desirable that such areas should be fixed for the Peppermint Grove Road District as hereinafter provided: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the proper area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith shall, in the Peppermint Grove Road District, be:—

PEPPERMINT GROVE ROAD BOARD.

Firstly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 bounded by lines starting at the N.E. corner of Lot 25 of Section XIV. and running along the Northern boundary of that section to the N.W. corner of Lot 4; thence South to the S.W. corner of the said lot; thence Eastwards along the Southern boundary of the same section to the S.E. corner of Lot 27; thence North along the Eastern boundary of Lots 27, 26, and 25 to the starting point, shall be one rood fifteen perches.

Secondly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 bounded by lines commencing at the N.E. corner of Lot 28 of Section XII.; thence running Westwards to the N.W. corner of Lot 35 of the said section; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 12; thence West to the N.W. corner of Lot 9; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 33 of Section X.; thence West to the N.W. corner of Lot 36; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 7; thence West to the N.W. corner of Lot 5; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 44 of Section VIII.; thence West to the N.W. corner of Lot 48; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 12; thence West to the N.W. corner of Lot 9; thence South to the S.W. corner of Lot 9; thence East to the S.E. corner of Lot 24 of Section VIII.; thence North-East along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 24 and 35 of Section VIII., Lots 16 and 26 of Section X., and Lots 18 and 28 of Section XII. to the starting point, shall be 1 rood 32 perches.

Thirdly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 bounded by lines starting at the N.E. corner of Lot 12 of Section VI.; thence running West to the N.W. corner of Lot 24 of Section V.; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 11; thence West to the N.W. corner of Lot 9; thence South to the N.W. corner of Lot 28 of Section I.; thence South to the S.W. corner of Lot 28; thence East to the S.W. corner of Lot 26; thence South to the S.W. corner of Lot 13; thence East to the S.E. corner of Lot 22 of Section II.; thence North along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 22 and 12 of Section II. and Lots 22 and 12 of Section VI. to the starting point (excluding, however, such portion of the said Swan Location 84 as is contained in deposited Plan 1517), shall be 1 rood 18.4 perches.

Fourthly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 contained in deposited Plan 1517, shall be 28.8 perches.

Fifthly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 bounded by lines starting at the S.W. corner of Lot 21 of Section II. and running North along the Western boundaries of Lots 21 to 13 of Section II. and 21 to 13 of Section VI. to the S.W. corner of Lot 25 of Section VIII.; thence North-East along the Western boundaries of Lots 25 to 33 of Section VIII., Lots 17 to 25 of Section X., and Lots 19 to 27 of Section XII. to the N.W. corner of the last-named lot; thence East along the North boundaries of Lot 27 of Section XII. and Lot 1 of Section XIII. to the N.E. corner of the last-named lot; thence S.W. along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 1 to 9 of Section XIII., Lots 1 to 9 of Section XI., and 1 to 9 of Section IX. to the S.E. corner of the last-named lot; thence South along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 1 to 9 of Section VII. to the N.E. corner of Lot 1 of Section III.; thence East to the N.E. corner of Lot 35 of Section III.; thence South to the S.E. corner of Diagram 3525; thence West along the Southern boundaries of Sections III. and II. to the starting point (excluding, however, such portion of Swan Location 84 as is contained in deposited Diagrams 3590 and 2227), shall be 1 rood 8.9 perches.

Sixthly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 contained in Diagrams 3590 and 2227, shall be 26.3 perches.

Seventhly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of Swan Location 84 bounded by lines starting at the N.E. corner of Section XIII.; thence running West to the N.E. corner of Lot 1 of that section; thence S.W. along the Eastern boundary of the "Fifth" area above to the S.E. corner of Lot 9 of Section VII.; thence East to and around the arc of Lot 18 of Section VII. to the N.E. corner of the said lot; thence in a general Northerly direction along the East boundaries of Lots 19 to 25 of Section VII., Lots 17 to 25 of Section IX., Lots 16 to 23 of Section XI., and Lots 18 to 25 of Section XIII. to the starting point, shall be 1 rood 10.5 perches.

Eighthly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of this District bounded by lines starting at the N.W. corner of Lot 1 of Buckland Hill 129A; thence running South to the S.W. corner of Lot 2; thence along the Southern boundary of this District to the S.E. corner of Lot 8 of Buckland Hill 132; thence North to the N.E. corner of Lot 7 of Buckland Hill 132; thence West along the Northern boundaries of Buckland Hill 132, 131, 130, and 129A to the starting point, shall be 18 perches.

Ninthly:—The minimum area of land to be allotted to any building proposed to be erected in that portion of the Peppermint Grove Road District, being all that portion of this District bounded by lines starting from the N.W. corner of Lot 1 of Buckland Hill 119; thence running South to the S.W. corner of the said lot; thence along the Southern boundary of this District to the S.E. corner of Lot 10; thence North along the Eastern frontages of Lot 10 and Subdivisions 7, 6, 5, and 4 to the N.W. corner of the last-named subdivision; thence West along the North boundary of Buckland Hill 119 to the starting point, shall be 1 rood 2.9 perches.

The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906.

Municipality of Cottesloe.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1467/29.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," doth hereby—

- (1) redivide the Municipality of Cottesloe into four Wards, as described in the Schedule hereto;
- (2) declare that the population of the Municipality of Cottesloe exceeds 5,000;
- (3) increase the Municipal Council by three Councillors to give representation to the extra Ward.

MUNICIPALITY OF COTTESLOE.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

North Ward.

1. Bounded on the Northward by part of the Municipal boundary from its intersection with the shores of the Indian Ocean to the intersection of the North side of North Street with the West side of Servetus Street.

2. On the Eastward by part of the Municipal boundary from the latter intersection to the centre line of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence by the said centre line of the Railway Reserve to the production East of the South boundary of Lot 25 of Cottesloe Sub. Lot 34.

3. On the Southward by the production East of the South boundary of said Lot 25 and the South boundaries of Lots 26, 17, and 4 and their continuation West to the East boundary of Lot 97 of Sub. Lot 35, part of the East and North boundary of said Lot 97 and North boundaries of Lots 96, 95, 64, 63, 62, 61, 60, and 59 and of Lot 58 of Sub. Lot 36, and of Lot 57, continuing West to the East boundary of Lot 90, part of the East and the North boundary of said Lot 90, the North boundaries of Lots 89, 88, 87 and 86, and their production Westward to and through Reserve 3235 and continuing to the shores of the Indian Ocean.

4. On the Westward by the Municipal boundary (shores of the Indian Ocean) to the starting point.

Central Ward.

1. Bounded on the Northward by the South boundary of the North Ward to the centre line of the Eastern Railway Reserve and Southward along said centre line of Railway Reserve to the production Westward of the South side of Vera Street; thence along said production and South side of Vera Street to the Municipal boundary.

2. On the Eastward by part of the Municipal boundary to intersect the centre line of the Eastern Railway Reserve.

3. On the Southward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection, and extending Northward along said centre line of the Railway Reserve to the production North-Eastward of the South-Eastern boundary of Reserve 7249; thence along said production and South-Eastern boundary and Northward along the East side of Marmion street to the production East of the South boundary of Lot 13 of Sub. Lot 65; thence West to and along the South boundary of Sub. Lot 13, and along part of its West boundary and the South boundaries of Lots 9 to 1 inclusive, and continuing through Sub. Lots 118 and 117 to the East boundary of Lot 164 and along part of the East and the South boundary of Sub. Lot 164, and continuing West to the East boundary of Sub. Lot 62 (Class A Reserve 6271); thence along the South boundary of the cricket ground (portion of Lot 63) and the last-mentioned boundary's production West to intersect the municipal boundary.

4. On the Westward by part of the municipal boundary (shores of the Indian Ocean) to the starting point.

East Ward.

1. Bounded on the Westward and Northward by the boundaries of the Central and North Wards and part of the municipal boundary.

2. On the Eastward and Southward by part of the municipal boundary to the production East of the South side of Vera Street.

3. On the Southward by the South side of Vera Street and its production Westward to intersect the centre line of the Eastern Railway Reserve (the starting point).

South Ward.

1. Bounded on the Northward by the South boundary of the Central Ward.

2. On the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by part of the municipal boundaries to the starting point.

The Traffic Act, 1919-26.

Preston Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1375/23.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part LV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to empower the Preston Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Preston Road Board, by the By-law in the Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose, and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

Preston Road Board.

The Preston Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Preston Road District:—

The passage of all vehicles engaged in heavy traffic over all roads situate within the Thompson's Brook Ward of the Preston Road District is hereby prohibited during the months of June, July, August, and September in the year 1930.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy traffic" means: The traffic of all vehicles the load of which exceeds one ton, excluding the weight of the vehicle.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

The Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 14, Subsection 1 (a) of "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purposes of this Act, and specify the boundaries of any such District: And whereas it is enacted by Section 45, Subsection 1, of the said Act that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District to be the Board of any Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District: And whereas it is deemed expedient to constitute that portion of the State comprised within the boundaries of and known as Dundas Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as Dundas Vermin District: And also to constitute and appoint the Dundas Road Board as the Vermin Board for the said Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby constitute that portion of the State comprised within the boundaries of and known as Dundas Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as Dundas Vermin District: And doth hereby appoint the Dundas Road Board the Vermin Board for the purposes of the said Act.

Industrial Agreement.

No. 8 of 1930.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twenty-third day of May, 1930, between the Western Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and A. H. Faulkner, General Storekeeper; Phil Staricoff, Draper and General Outfitter; A. R. Kelly, Tobacconist, Newsagent and Fancy Goods Vendor; J. Leitch & Co.; Warren Co-operative Coy., Ltd., and H. C. Bowen, being persons, firms, or companies carrying on retail businesses in the State of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the Post Office, Pemberton.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the date hereof; provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement hereof, or after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, any term or terms hereof may be reviewed, revised, and amended by agreement of the parties hereto: Provided also, that any party hereto may, after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement hereof, or after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, make application to the Court of Arbitration to vary any term or terms hereof.

3.—Definitions.

The term "Shop assistant" includes employees engaged in the receipt, sale, storage, and despatch of goods or wares, also cashiers and docket clerks.

4.—Hours.

The ordinary working hours for shop assistants shall be in conformity with "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," insofar as the provisions of that Act limit the number of hours which shop assistants may be employed during any one day or week, but the time for commencing work in the case of shop assistants at Pemberton shall not be earlier than 8.30 a.m. and the time for finishing work shall not be later than 6 p.m. on the first five days of the week, and commencing time on Saturdays shall not be later than 8.30 a.m. and the time for finishing not later than 12.30 p.m.

(a) The time for commencing work in the case of shop assistants at Manjimup and Northcliffe shall be those usually and customarily worked at this date, but shall not exceed 48 hours per week for males and 44 hours per week for females and junior males under the age of 16 years.

5.—Overtime.

For all time worked after the usual finishing time on Saturdays and for all time worked on Sundays and holidays, double time shall be paid. For all time worked before the usual starting time and after the usual finishing time on other days, the rate shall be:—Males and females, time and a half throughout.

6.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) One holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each of the workers affected by this Agreement on the completion of each year's service. Further it shall be optional for the employee to take one week's holiday at his own expense, to be mutually arranged between employer and employee.

7.—Wages—Adults.

The minimum weekly rate of wage payable to any worker employed as a shop assistant, who is of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, shall be as follows:—

(a) Basic wage:—Males £4 7s. 0d. per week; females £2 7s. 0d. per week.

(e) Temporary employees (i.e.), employed owing to a temporary pressure of business, or for a special reason for a period of less than four consecutive weeks, this clause shall apply to all classes of workers provided for in this Agreement.

Adults.—The rates herein prescribed plus 3d. per hour.

Juniors.—The rates herein prescribed plus 1½d. per hour.

(f) Payment of Wages.—Wages to be paid weekly.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

8.—Higher Duties.

A worker required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

9.—Proportion of Juniors.

One senior male to one junior male for the first three senior males, and thereafter two senior males to one junior male.

Where no senior female is employed one junior female may be employed, and thereafter the proportion shall be one senior female to one junior female for the first five senior females, and thereafter five senior females to four junior females.

(a) Nothing in this clause shall cause those juniors employed at the date of this Agreement to be dismissed in order to conform with this Agreement. Where the number of juniors is in excess of the number provided in this Agreement they may continue to be employed. When a junior who is employed in excess of the number prescribed leaves his employment, or is dismissed therefrom, another junior may not be employed until the correct proportion of seniors is employed.

(b) An employer actually working in or about his place of business shall be considered a senior for the purpose of this clause.

10.—Engagement.

One week's notice in writing on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement; provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

11.—All Workers to be Members of Union.

All workers engaged by the employers shall become members of the Union within three weeks of their engagement.

12.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he or she has been employed. Each employee to enter his time in such book daily. Such book shall be open for inspection by a person appointed by the Union at least one day in each week during working hours.

13.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the Secretary of the applicant Union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the Secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser rate than the said minimum, the Secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said Secretary at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the Magistrate, and the Secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before such Magistrate, and, pending his decision in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate.

The Magistrate may grant to such worker a permit to work at such wage and for such period not exceeding six calendar months as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned and for the period therein stated, until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said Secretary.

The Court of Arbitration, in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," recommends for submission to His Excellency the Governor for approval pursuant to Section 152 of the said Act, the following as an amendment to the Regulations dealing with Building Trades Apprentices made on the 30th May, 1928:—

The Regulations dealing with Building Trades Apprentices, dated 30th May, 1928, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st June, 1928, are hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following Regulations:—

"(1) Where in any case the employer is unable to provide work for his apprentice, or to employ him for his full time, through slackness of work or other good cause, application may be made by the employer to the Board—

(a) to suspend the apprenticeship; or

(b) to employ the apprentice for such lesser period per week or per month, and at such remuneration as the Board may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the Award or Industrial Agreement for the trade, calling, or industry.

On production of proof to the satisfaction of the Board, the application may be granted.

- (2) (a) If the suspension is for a period of less than six months, the Board may, on application, extend the period, but not to exceed in all six months.
- (b) If at the end of six months the employer is still unable to fulfil his contract of apprenticeship, the Board may—
- (a) extend the suspension for a further period of three months but no longer;
- (b) call upon the employer to again observe the terms of the apprenticeship as from the date of expiration of the suspension order;
- (c) cancel the apprenticeship.
- (3) During any suspension, if the employer can employ the apprentice, he shall do so and notify the Board.
- (4) The Board may, in its discretion, for any cause which it may deem sufficient, on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement, abrogate or cancel the agreement, either unconditionally, or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.
- (5) 'Board' as used herein means 'the Apprenticeship Board' appointed under Section 125 of 'The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925.'''
